SUN DEVIL REWIND

Freshman forward Matthew Kopperud enters the back portion of the schedule leading the Sun Devils with 13 points (7G-6A) as he continues to fill in for senior forward Johnny Walker, who has been out with an injury the last 10 games. Kopperud remains tied for the most goals in the country with seven.

The Sun Devil offense started the season with some scoring woes during the Michigan trek but has since averaged 4.25 goals in the last eight games. When comparing year-to-year through 12 games, the Sun Devils are averaging about the same goals scored per game (3.00 vs. 3.08) but the three one-goal losses and two ties being the main difference in record from last year to this year at this point.

After starting the 2020-21 season 0-3-1, the Sun Devils fought back with a road sweep at No. #14/15 Wisconsin – the first road sweep of a ranked opponent in program history – and have gone 4-3-1 since the two Michigan series'.

GOPHERS STILL GOLDEN

The Gophers (8-0-0) have remained undefeated throughout the first portion of the 2020-21 season and are currently the only team in the NCAA with an undefeated record. Minnesota most recently played at No. 5 Michigan where they shut out the Wolverines. 4-0.

A key piece to the Gophers success comes from senior goaltender Jack LaFontaine, who was drafted by the Carolina Hurricanes 75th overall in 2016. LaFontaine spent two seasons with Michigan before transferring to Minnesota with a stint in the BCHL in between. LaFontaine currently ranks first in the nation with a .965 save percentage and 1.00 goals against average with two shutouts this season.

The Gopher roster carries 14 NHL draft picks as well as the return of all their top six scorers from last year. Senior Scott Reedy and sophomore Ben Meyer currently lead the returners in scoring with nine points each. Despite the depth of their roster, the Gophers will have to adjust without three of their top defensemen in Jackson LaCombe, Ryan Johnson and Brock Faber, who are with the U.S National Junior Team competing in the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship.

BY THE NUMBERS



Despite winning four of the last eight, the Sun Devil offense continues to put up goals, averagin 4.25 goals per game since Nov. 27 (ranks T-6th).



If the Sun Devils were included in the Big Ten standings, they would currently rank no worse than T-2nd just behind the Gophers with 16 points.



ASU has six players with over 100 games played, including James Sanchez, Jacob Wilson, Dom Garcia, Sean Dhooghe, Johnny Walker and Gvido Jansons.

Each of the Sun Devils' last five games have been decided by a goal with three of the five going to overtime. They are 1-3-1 in those one-goal games.

SUN DEVIL TWEETABLES

- @SunDevilHockey and @GopherHockey have met only twice, with the Gophers winning both to end the 2018-19 regular season.
- @SunDevilHockey has never defeated a No. 1-ranked team, and have only
 played one top-ranked team in program history (vs. #1 Ohio State in 2018-19).
- 3. Three of @SunDevilHockey's top seven point leaders are freshmen, including @kopper303, @oreilly_ryan and Benji Eckerle.
- Freshman @kopper303 is scoring on 31.8% of his shots this season, while sophomore @jmur12 is slightly higher at 38.5%.
- After being one of the least experienced teams in college hockey in recent years, ASU is T7th for most upperclassmen and T4th for most seniors.

BREAKIN' MY HEART

- Prior to the recent victory over Ohio State, four of the last five games have been hard to swollow for the Sun
 Devils, who were one bounce away in each game from being on an eight-game winning streak -- or even a fivegame skid.
- In game two against Notre Dame, the Sun Devils had a two-goal lead heading into the 3rd period. The Fighting Irish fought to three goals in the final 9 minutes of regulation, including the game-winner with five seconds remaining.
- In game one against Penn State, the Nittany Lions came out fast with a 2-0 lead through the first 20 minutes.
 ASU proceeded to tie the game in the final 40 minutes, including the game-tying goal early in the 3rd period.
 The Nittany Lions would score the game-winner four minutes into overtime.
- In game two against the Nittany Lions, it was nearly the opposite of game one as the Sun Devils came out hot with three goals in a span of 1:09 of the first four minutes of the game. PSU then scored two goals to tie the game in the 2nd period, ultimately forcing overtime and scoring the game-winner 1:28 into the extra period.
- Game one vs. the Buckeyes, Ohio State came out with three goals in just over a two-minute span for a 3-0 lead
 entering the first intermission. The Sun Devils would rally, scoring four unanswered goals to hold a lead halfway
 thru the 3rd period before the Buckeyes would tie it in the final eight minutes. It would end in a tie.

POPULAR DESTINATION

- The Sun Devils have fallen fortunate to transfers since the program transitioned to Division I, including players like Dylan Hollman, Robbie Baillargeon, Wade Murphy and David Norris.
- In 2019-20, forwards **JAMES SANCHEZ** (Michigan) and **WILLIE KNIERIM** (Miami) made immediate impacts in their junior seasons. **SANCHEZ** led the entire team and became the first player in program history to reach 40 points in a season, while **KNIERIM** contributed 15 goals and was 5th in scoring for the Devils.
- While CHRIS GRANDO (Boston College) came in a season ago and had to sit out during the 2019-20 season due to transfer rules, he joins SEAN DHOOGHE (Wisconsin) and TANNER HICKEY (Alabama-Huntsville)
 -- all of which were key contributors to their respective programs before transferring -- as the 2020-21 transfers hoping to contribute to the Maroon & Gold transfer reputation.

DEVILS IN THE PROS

- Former netminder Joey Daccord, who helped catapult the program to its first NCAA Tournament berth, recently
 signed a three-year, two-way extension with the Ottawa Senators. Daccord was not only the first Sun Devil
 to sign an NHL contract, but play in the NHL as he made his debut on April 4, 2019. He was also the first Sun
 Devil committed to the program when getting drafted.
- This past season, senior defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk became the program's second player to sign an NHL
 contract and first to sign a free agent deal. Pasichnuk signed with the San Jose Sharks for two years back in
 June.
- Most recently in August, rising junior Josh Maniscalco signed a three-year free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Penguins and has recently received an invite to training camp. Maniscalco recorded 11 goals and 21 assists last year and was ranked 6th among national defensemen in scoring.

WE GOT THE POWER(S)

Coach Powers enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2020-21, and his 13th overall at the helm at ASU. The two-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19 and were on track for a repeat appearance in 2019-20 before COVID-19 ended the season. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 239-124-29 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.



BREAKING GROUND

- On Wednesday, Dec. 16, Arizona State University and Sun Devil Athletics announced all required approvals have been received
 for the commencement of construction on a new Multi-Purpose Arena, which will host university and community events and serve
 as the future home for Sun Devil men's ice hockey, wrestling and women's gymnastics. This project continues the development of
 the Novus Innovation Corridor, and will be sited south of Rio Salado Parkway on the east side of Packard Drive, immediately north
 of the existing Packard Drive Parking Structure.
- Construction is scheduled to begin in January 2021, with full completion projected for December 2022.
- The 5,000-seat venue will be managed and operated by Oak View Group, SCI Architects have designed the arena, while Mortenson Construction will serve as the design builder.
- The second full-size ice sheet will also be accessible to students, the community and youth ice hockey programs at every level, providing an additional public sheet to one of the fastest-growing states for youth hockey participation in the country.
- The seating configuration for the Multi-Purpose Arena includes 20 luxury suites, two group suites, a large club lounge and event-level premium club seats. The club lounge will consist of a Center Ice Club on the main concourse that runs along center ice and can host up to 500 fans. On the 300-level, a social deck will run the length of the east side of the venue, providing an open-air, aerial view of the arena where fans can interact while still experiencing exceptional sightlines to the competition. The arena would also be able to serve as a backup for sports played on hardwood, such as volleyball.
- A 942-seat student section will occupy the entire west side of the venue to provide an enhanced gameday experience for ASU students.
- Over 8,000 square feet is set aside for a ASU state-of-the-art ASU locker room, weight room, lounge and coaches' offices on the
 north side of the arena. Eight additional locker rooms are accounted for on the west side of the arena between the main arena and
 community ice sheet that can be utilized for visiting teams, youth programs, ASU club programs, and live events.
