FIRST SERVE

- USC is ranked 15th in the latest AVCA Coaches Top 25 poll. The Trojans face their 10th and 11th ranked opponents this week; second and third in a row.
- The Women of Troy are 156-33 (.825) all-time at Galen Center; 5-1 in 2018.
- The Trojans play six of their eight October matches at home.
- When USC plays Arizona State on Friday, it begins a seven-day stretch in which it will play four matches; likely all against ranked foes.
- The Trojans are one of five 4-2 teams tied for second place in the Pac-12.
- Former USC OH **Alyse Ford** is now a senior for the Sun Devils. She ranks second on the team with 3.02 kps.
- USC is led by So. OH **Brooke Botkin** (4.35 kps) and Jr. All-American OH **Khalia Lanier** (4.30 kps). Fr. setter **Raquel Lázaro** (11.25 aps) runs the Trojan offense. Sr. libero **Victoria Garrick** (4.76 dps) anchors the defense.

LOS ANGELES – The 15th-ranked USC women's volleyball team (12-5, 4-2 Pac-12) hosts the Arizona schools for a pair of contests against Top-25 foes. The Trojans take on No. 25 Arizona State (13-5, 4-2) on Friday (Oct. 12) at 7 p.m. PT and then meet No. 23 Arizona (14-4, 3-3) on Sunday (Oct. 14) at 1 p.m. Both matches will be shown on the Pac-12 Networks' channels.

USC is one of five Pac-12 teams currently tied for second place in the league standings with a 4-2 record (ASU, Oregon, Washington, Washington State). The match with the Sun Devils is the beginning of a seven-day stretch through which the Women of Troy will play four teams. It's likely all four of those opponents will be ranked. The Trojans are 5-4 against foes with an AVCA ranking, but those losses have come to the teams currently ranked in the top 20 including against Nos. 1 and No. 2 on the road.

USC HEAD COACH BRENT CROUCH



Brent Crouch is in his first season as head coach at USC. He was hired on Jan. 8, 2018, following four seasons as the head coach at Portland, where he was named the 2016 West Coast Conference Coach of the Year.

Crouch inherited a winless UP program and guided the Pilots to their winningest season in 25 years in just his season at the helm. He started at Portland in 2014 after the Pilots went 0-27 the previous season. The team was 7-23 in his first year and went 16-15 in 2015; and 17-13 in 2016. His 2017 squad, which was hampered by injuries, was 15-15, with five losses in five-set matches. He was 55-66 overall in four years.

Portland's 48 victories from 2015-17 marked the program's best three-season total since 1984-86. The Pilots' 10-8 third-place WCC finish in 2016 was their most league wins since 1985 and was the highest conference finish since 1989. Crouch led Portland to the program's first-ever victories over Top 10, Top 15, and Top 25 opponents; and coached three All-WCC first-team players. He also helped establish the beach volleyball program at UP in 2016.

Prior to Portland, Crouch was an assistant at Saint Mary's College for four years (2010-13) with the indoor program and head coach of the inaugural beach team in 2013. While there, the Gaels' indoor team went 73-40, finished in the WCC's top three each season, and earned a berth into the 2012 NCAA Tournament, and advanced to the second round. Crouch led the beach Gaels to an 8-2 record for the best mark among Northern California programs; with a No. 9 ranking and a bid to the AVCA pairs championship for the team's top pair.

Crouch served as an assistant with the U.S. Collegiate National Team that won gold at the 2016 U22 Global Challenge; and as both an indoor and beach coach in the USA Volleyball High Performance program.

For five years (2004-09) Crouch was a head coach at various levels. He led the RoShamBo Girls' Volleyball 14 team, which was part of the Skyline Juniors Volleyball Club in Dallas, Texas, and guided the Wave VBC 17s team in Encinitas, Calif. His Wave squad finished third in the 2008 Junior Olympics Open Division and won gold at the Southern California National Qualifier. He was also head coach of the San Diego City College men's team (2006-08) and head coach of Oregon's men's club team (2004-05).

Crouch played for Texas A&M's club team (1993-97) and earned a bachelor's degree in history (1998) and a master's in philosophy (2000) from Texas A&M. He later received his doctorate in philosophy from Oregon in 2006. On the beach, Crouch competed in the AVP and CBVA from 2005 to 2007.

As a professor, Crouch has taught philosophy at Oregon, San Diego City College, and Saint Mary's College. Born on Jan. 8, 1975, he and his wife Marcy have two sons; Jonathan and William. Marcy is a physical therapist and received her doctorate in physical therapy from USC.

USC IN BRIEF: The Trojans are one of five teams stuck in a tie for second place in the Pac-12 standings. At 4-2, USC is toe-to-toe with Arizona State, Oregon, Washington, and Washington State. Despite having five losses on its record, the Women of Troy hold the nation's No. 6 RPI ranking thanks to having endured an incredibly difficult non-conference schedule. USC was 8-3 in those matches and earned wins over No. 4 Florida and No. 5 Kentucky. The Trojans fell to No. 3 BYU but also claimed victories over No. 13 Creighton and No. 23 San Diego. Under first-year head coach **Brent Crouch**, USC boasts a formidable offense with All-American OH **Khalia Lanier** leading the charge (4.30 kps). She is joined on the pins by sophomore standout **Brooke Botkin** (4.35 kps) and junior transfer **Emily Baptista** (2.60 kps). Freshman setter **Raquel Lázaro** has been named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week three times and is fourth in the league at 11.25 assists per set. On defense, the Women of Troy turn to senior libero **Victoria Garrick** (4.76 dps); one of just 17 Trojans ever to collect over 1,000 career digs. In the middle, transfer **Jasmine Gross** is fourth in the Pac-12 with 76 total blocks this season.

LAST TIME OUT: USC earned a 3-0 sweep of Oregon State but suffered its first home loss in a 3-0 decision to No. 20 Oregon. Against the Beavers, **Raquel Lázaro** posted her eighth-career double-double with 35 assists and 16 digs. The Trojans stayed close with the Ducks, but were unable to take a set off of Oregon, which went 6-0 to sweep both schools on its trip through Southern California.

AVCA POLL POSITION: The Trojans opened 2018 ranked No. 10 after finishing the 2017 campaign in the No. 7 spot. Overall, the Trojans have appeared in the poll **504 times** and have held a spot among the poll's top 10 teams **316 times**, which ranks seventh all-time. The Trojans have also held the No. 1 ranking **47 times** previously, which is sixth all-time.



PAC-12 POW(ER)S: USC players have received Pac-12 Player of the Week honors **75 times** (third most among league teams). Since 2011, when the Pac-12 began honoring separate offensive and defensive players of the week and named a freshman of the week, Trojans have earned **19** offensive awards, **10** defensive awards, and taken home **17** freshman honors. In the first week of the 2018 season, sophomore OH **Brooke Botkin** received her first-career league honor as the Offensive Player of the Week and freshman setter **Raquel Lázaro** was chosen for Freshman of the Week honors. Lázaro repeated as the Freshman of the Week in week two and received her third FOW honor on Sept. 24.

DOUBLE DOWN: Eight Trojans on this year's squad have recorded career double-doubles. Junior OH **Khalia Lanier** has **six** this season and leads all players with **31-career** double-doubles. Sophomore OH **Brooke Botkin** has recorded **six** double-doubles in 2018 and has **seven-career** double-double matches. Freshman setter **Raquel Lázaro** logged her first-career double-double with 53 assists and 22 digs against Creighton and has **eight-career** double-doubles.

CROUCHING TIGER: First-year USC head coach **Brent Crouch** led the Trojans to a win over No. 5-ranked Kentucky in his first match at the helm (Aug. 24). In his previous position as Portland's head coach, he led the Pilots to their first-ever wins over ranked opponents including the very first ever; a victory against San Diego (Nov. 14, 2015). The following year, Crouch helped led UP to its first-ever upset of a top-10 opponent on a 3-2 victory at San Diego (Nov. 10, 2016).

TERMINAL 3: USC is the only Pac-12 squad with two players in the top 10 for kills. So. OH **Brooke Botkin** (4.35 kps) and Jr. OH **Khalia Lanier** (4.30 kps) rank third and fourth respectively. USC is also one of only three teams (Stanford, Oregon) with three players in the top 25. Jr. OPP **Emily Baptista** (2.60 kps) ranks 25th in the Pac-12. Together, the three Women of Troy account for **11.25 kills per set**.

CAN YOU DIG IT?: Senior libero **Victoria Garrick** became the 17th player in program history to collect 1,000 career digs in the Trojans' 2017 NCAA second-round match against San Diego. She now has **1,347** career digs and moved into the program's top-10 career ladder in a match against Cal on Sept. 30; passing All-American outside hitters **April Ross** and **Jennifer Kessy**. Next on her radar, she needs **127** digs to surpass **Kelly Kuebler** and overtake seventh place (1,471 digs; 1992-95). Garrick is one of just six Trojans sever to record at least 500 digs in a single season and ranks among greats including **Debora Seilhamer**, **Natalie Hagglund**, **Taylor Whittingham**, **Alli Hillgren**, and **Katie Haller**. She had 519 digs in 2017 to rank 10th in USC's single-season record books.

KILLER K: Junior OH **Khalia Lanier** became the program's 17th player to record 1,000 career kills in the final match of 2017. She is the first Trojan to reach the 1K mark in just her freshman and sophomore seasons. Only one other Trojan collected more than 1,000 kills in her first two seasons with the program. All-American OH **Asia Kaczor** did so but transferred to Troy and reached the milestone as a junior and senior. Lanier now has **1,273** career kills and needs **200** to overtake 10th place on USC's career ladder (1,472; **Megan McCallister**, 1987-90).

HELPING HAND: Freshman setter **Raquel Lázaro** dished out 55 assists in her collegiate debut. It was the highest single-match total by a Trojan setter since 2012 (**Hayley Crone**). She later posted 53 assists to go with 22 digs to post her first-career double-double. She is **second** in the Pac-12 in total assists with **709** and ranks fourth in the conference with **11.25 assists per set**.

1,000 SHIPS: USC's win over ASU on Oct. 5, 2016, was the program's 1,000th all-time victory. The Trojans became just the 17th program in NCAA Division I history to reach the 1K milestone. USC is the owner of six national championships (three AIAW and three NCAA) and has won eight conference crowns including two since the inception of the Pac-12 (2011 and 2015).

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Trojans are **156-33 (.825)** all-time at the Galen Center. When it comes to the volleyball court, the Women of Troy are less than hospitable to their visitors. The Trojans went 12-1 in home matches in 2011 and completed the 2012 home schedule with a 17-1 mark. In 2007, USC was 19-0 at home on the way to an appearance in the NCAA national semifinal match. The Trojans are 17-3 all-time at Galen Center in NCAA tournament matches. The three losses were to Hawai'i (2008 and 2009) each time in the second round; and to Washington in the 2013 NCAA Regional Final.

THE GALEN CENTER

Over 130 years ago, USC's founders envisioned an on-campus arena to further unite the Trojan community. On October 12, 2006, dream became reality with the opening of the **Galen Center**; the new home to USC's basketball and volleyball programs.

In late 2002, successful banker and longtime USC fan **Louis Galen and wife Helene** pledged a \$10 million donation for the project. The Galens later added an additional \$25 million and upped their original donation to \$15 million. Their total of \$50 million was the final push needed to break ground on the new facility.

On October 31, 2004, ground was broken across from the University Park campus. Los Angeles City Council members Bernard Parks and Jan Perry were alongside Louis and Helene Galen and a contingency of Trojan supporters for the historic groundbreaking ceremony.

After nearly two years of construction, the first event held in the Galen Center was a women's volleyball match between USC and Stanford on October 12, 2006. A few weeks later, Galen Center hosted its first-ever concert featuring Al Green. The first men's basketball game held at the arena took place on November 16 between USC and South Carolina. A capacity crowd of 10,258 attended a men's basketball game between USC and Arizona on January 31, 2008, to set the venue's all-time attendance record.

Galen Center construction cost an estimated \$147 million, which included the arena, offices, and state-of-the-art practice pavilion. The center puts USC teams on an appropriately impressive stage and allows its student-athletes to put their talents on display in the 255,000 square-foot arena. Trojan athletes and visiting teams have access to state-of-the-art locker rooms, weight room, and medical training rooms.

The adjacent 45,000 square-foot pavilion features practice areas with three sections and enough space for four full basketball courts or nine volleyball courts as well as seating for 1,000 spectators. The ground floor of the pavilion houses offices for coaches and administrative personnel. Galen Center also has its own ticket office, concession stands, and merchandise stores, and houses the USC Athletic Department Hall of Fame.

Built with the entire community in mind, the Galen Center has opened its doors to youth and high school sporting events, concerts, commencement ceremonies, community events, lectures, meetings, shows, pageants, and more. It has also hosted numerous MPSF, Pac-12, and NCAA championship events including the 2012 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championship. In 2013, the Galen Center served as host of one of four NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Regional Championships.

The USC women's volleyball team is particularly comfortable in the Galen Center. Since its opening, the Women of Troy are **156-33 (.825)** as the home team. In 2007, the Trojans went undefeated at home (19-0) and advanced to the NCAA semifinal match. In 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2015, USC lost just once at home in each season.

TRANSFERS OF POWER: The Trojans welcome a pair of coveted transfers in 2018. Both juniors and both All-West Coast Conference selections in 2017, USC added the services of MB **Jasmine Gross** and OH **Emily Baptista**. Gross ranked fourth in the NCAA in blocks as a sophomore (1.79 bps) and holds several Pepperdine match and single-season records for blocks. Baptista was the leader of the Pacific offense in 2017 and once notched a career-high 26 kills for the Tigers.

TROJAN OLYMPIANS: USC's proud Olympic heritage includes representation by at least one player or coach in all but three Olympic Games since 1964 (1972, 1976, 2004). A total of 19 USC Olympians have competed in women's volleyball and beach volleyball combined. In the last summer games, USC was represented by three-time All-American **April Ross**, who paired with Stanford All-American Kerri Walsh Jennings, to win bronze medals in beach volleyball. Ross also holds a silver medal from the 2012 London Games with partner **Jennifer Kessy**. Trojan All-American libero **Debora Seilhamer** also participated in the 2016 Rio Games where she led Puerto Rico to its historic first-ever berth in the Olympic tourney.

#1 BLINDSIDE BROTHER: OH **Brooklyn Schirmer** didn't come to school alone. Elder brother **Bernard Schirmer** transferred to Troy from Mount Sac and is a sophomore offensive lineman on the football team.

#2 SISTER, SISTER: MB **Madison Murtagh**'s elder sister **Mackenzie Murtagh** played volleyball at San Francisco from 2010-13, where Madison also played as a freshman in 2015-16. Following her transfer, Murtagh joined another volleyball sister as she reunited with **Victoria Garrick** at USC, whom she played club volleyball with at Red Rock VBC in Redwood City, Calif.

#4 SKIPPING PRACTICE: In 2017, libero **Victoria Garrick**'s TEDx Talk on the need for attention to mental health among student-athletes spread through the volleyball community. Garrick has since advanced her message through her own podcast entitled *Skipping Practice*. In it, she has casual conversations with athletes, celebrities, and other personalities on a bi-weekly basis.

#6 DISNEY DISH: OPP **Emily Baptista** is about as big a Disney fan as there is. When her transfer from Pacific to USC became official, one of the first things she did was purchase a Disneyland annual pass. During one early childhood visit, she discovered she was too short to ride the Big Thunder Mountain Railroad. She was so upset, she only ate foods that would make her grow and credits that moment for making her as tall as she is despite the shorter stature of her parents. Baptista's favorite movie is *The Nightmare Before Christmas*, which makes the Haunted Mansion ride one of her favorite attractions during the Halloween and Christmas seasons. Her favorite princess is Jasmine from Aladdin.

#7 HER MAJESTY: OH **Brooke Botkin** graduated from high school a full semester early to join the Trojans in the spring of 2017. In the fall of 2016, she was named Homecoming Queen of Pearland HS in Pearland, Texas, a suburb of Houston.

#8 BLOOD MONEY: Setter **Ashley Humphreys** comes from a long bloodline of volleyball talent. Her mother Wendy Rush was a four-time All-American setter at Stanford (1984-87) and a member of the Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame. Humphreys' aunt Kari Rush was an All-American and team captain for the Cardinal in 1983. Her sister won the NCAA championship with Stanford as a setter



in 2016. Ashley hadn't always wanted to play volleyball, but a little financial incentive from her parents gave her the push she needed to pursue the sport she eventually thrived in.

#9 ALBANIA MANIA: Setter **Cindy Marina** is also a setter for the Albanian Women's National Team. Marina helped Albania capture unprecedented bronze medals at the 2018 European Volleyball League championship.

#10 SPANISH IMPORT: Setter **Raquel Lázaro** is the first USC women's volleyball player to hail from the country of Spain. She is also the first international player on the Trojans' roster since 2016 when Italian setter **Alice Pizzasegola** played at Troy.

#11 PORTLANDIA: MB **Jasmine Gross**' parents **Aaron Gross** and **Susan Campbell** are each head tennis coaches at the University of Portland where USC head coach **Brent Crouch** coached from 2014-17. Father Aaron coaches the men's team and mother Susan is the head coach of the women's team.

#12 QUICK DROP: MB **Brittany Welsh** transferred to USC from Louisiana State. A native of Southern California, she returned to her home state, but did so in a flurry. Welsh joined the Women of Troy for just three days before she was whisked off for a two-week European trip with the team in May of 2017.

#13 GRANDIOSE: Libero **Raegan LeGrand** is the cousin of former Stanford All-American libero Gabi Ailes. LeGrand is plenty familiar with the Pac-12 having watched her cousin perform in the league growing up. Ailes' shoes are big ones to fill, but LeGrand is up to the task after being named the 2015-16 Gatorade Nebraska Volleyball Player of the Year.

#14 YOU'RE KIDDING: Libero **Reni Meyer-Whalley** knows what it's like to be the middle kid. She is one of nine children and is right in the middle of her eight siblings whose ages range from 15 to 35. In all, she has five brothers; Ryan (35), Zane (26), Quade (25), Hayze (22), and Trae (15); and has three sisters; Kristin (32), Elyza (31), and Stevie (15). Older sister Kristin was a defensive specialist and libero for Boston College (2004-07) and also wore the No. 14.

#14 RECORDS FOR RENI: Libero **Reni Meyer-Whalley** is the daughter of world-renowned record label executive Tom Whalley. Tom Whalley was the chairman and CEO of Warner Bros. Records and served as an artist and repertoire (A&R) executive at Interscope Records. He later started a record label called Loma Vista Records.

#15 HEAVENLY HEIGHTS: At 6-4, MB **Abby Hansen** is one of the tallest members of the Women of Troy. Hansen has her sights set on other heights and puts a lot of stock in her faith. She was president of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at Desert Vista HS in Phoenix, Ariz.

#16 FATHER FIGURE: OH **Khalia Lanier** is the daughter of NBA Hall of Famer **Bob Lanier**. He was the first overall pick in the 1970 NBA draft and went on to become an eight-time all-star during his career with the Detroit Pistons (1970-80) and Milwaukee Bucks (1980-84). He entered the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992 and served as an interim head coach of the Golden State Warriors from 1994-95. Khalia lists her father as her biggest sports hero and wears the No. 16 as tribute to his athletic career. Bob Lanier's No. 16 is retired by both the Pistons and the Bucks.

#20 HORSEY SHOW: Libero **Jenna Adams** used to be an exhibition rider and show horses in her youth.

#20 SCHOOL OF CHOICE: Libero **Jenna Adams** played her freshman season at Ohio State in 2016. Following her first campaign, she surveyed several schools on the West Coast to consider for her transfer in order to be closer to home in San Mateo, Calif., and eventually selected USC. Adams had plenty of influence in her process with uncles and grandparents who played sports at UCLA, San Diego State, and Pepperdine.

THE PAC-12 CONFERENCE

The roots of the Pac-12 Conference date back more than 100 years, to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Imperial Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon Agricultural College (now Oregon State University). All four are still charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In 1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was Commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and the PCC continued as a nine-team Conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Association of Western Universities (AAWU) was formed with Thomas J. Hamilton appointed Commissioner of the new league. The original AAWU membership included California, Stanford, USC, UCLA, and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as Commissioner of the Pac-8.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Since then, the Conference has been considered the premier league in women's athletics, securing the most NCAA titles in women's sports of any conference nearly every year.

Thomas C. Hansen was named the Commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009, when he was succeeded by current Commissioner Larry Scott.

Colorado accepted its invitation to join the Pac-12 on June 11, 2010, and on June 17, 2010, Utah agreed to join the Conference. The Buffaloes and Utes officially became the 11th and 12th members of the Conference on July 1, 2011, the first additions to the league since 1978.

It was during the 2010-11 academic year that Scott helped deliver monumental changes that transformed the Conference into a modern 12-team league. In addition to expanding, institutions agreed to equal revenue sharing for the first time in the Conference's history, created two football divisions - the North and the South, and established a Football Championship Game for the first time. He also secured landmark media rights deals with ESPN and FOX that dramatically increased national exposure and revenue for each school, in addition to establishing Pac-12 Networks which guaranteed enhanced exposure across all sports.

Currently, the Pac-12 sponsors 11 men's sports and 13 women's sports, with women's lacrosse a new addition for the 2017-18 academic year and beach volleyball having been added in 2015-16. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and two women's sports.

The Pac-12 Conference offices are located in the heart of San Francisco in the SOMA district.
