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ASU BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

TIPPING OFF...

BLOCK PARTY

Arizona State has relied on a stingy defense to help them out to a 2-1 start. No place is this more evident than when looking at their block totals for the season. The Sun Devils are averaging 7.3 blocks per game, which is the eighth-highest total in the country. Warren Washington leads the way with 7 blocks, the 19th-most nationally. Devan Cambridge is not far behind, tallying six blocks (29th in the country). Alonzo Gaffney has contributed four blocks to the total, making ASU one of four teams in the country to have three players with 4+ blocks.

HITTING THE GLASS

The Maroon & Gold rank in the Top-25 nationally in rebounds per game, averaging 47.0 boards per contest. Six different Sun Devils average over 4.0 rebounds per game, including the starting back court of Frankie Collins (4.7) and DJ Horne (7.0). Warren Washington is tied for the team lead with 7.0 rebounds/game.

WARREN WAS SOARIN'

Sun Devil big man Warren Washington had his best game as a Sun Devil against Texas Southern, recording his eighth career double-double. He finished with 14 rebounds while adding 10 points, his second-straight game in double figures. Washington also had four blocks and provided a strong presence in the paint.

GOING DEEP

Head Coach Bobby Hurley emphasized a belief in his depth prior to the season and he has shown that trust so far this season. 11 Sun Devils have seen significant minutes, with that number soon to be 12 when Jamiya Neal returns from injury.

TALENTED TRANSFERS

Coach Hurley brought in another class of transfers that are already making an immediate impact. Desmond Cambridge Jr. (Nevada), Frankie Collins (Michigan), Devan Cambridge (Auburn), and Warren Washington (Nevada) make up 247 Sports No. 14-ranked incoming transfer class.

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS

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2022-23 SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

Bobby Hurley and the Sun Devil men's basketball team will be challenged through the 2022-23 campaign. With non-conference matchups including trips to 2022 NCAA Tournament teams Texas Southern and San Francisco as well as to SMU, Arizona State is one of only a handful of Power 5 teams with three true road games before conference play. The Sun Devils will play 13 games before the holidays, including seven games away from home. Beginning with a Dec. 31 home showdown with Arizona, the Maroon & Gold will play 18-straight games against Pac-12 foes to finish the season as part of the 20-game conference slate. All 31 of Arizona State's games will be televised, with Coach Hurley's squad making appearances on ESPN, FOX, CBS, and Pac-12 Network in addition to several major network affiliates.

BALLIN' LIKE COLLINS

Through three games in a Sun Devil uniform, Frankie Collins has shown what makes him such a dangerous offensive threat. He averaged 16.3 points, 5.0 assists, and 4.7 rebounds in 34.7 minutes of action. He also has a team-best six steals through three games. In his debut, Collins finished with a team-high 21 points and made four three-pointers, all of which were needed in a 62-59 win over Tarleton. He played a facilitator role in the very next game, leading the team with eight assists while operating an efficient offense in a 84-68 victory over NAU. Collins attempted to will his team to a victory on the road, scoring or assisting on the team's final 11 points, including all accounting for all seven points in overtime.

LEGENDS CLASSIC

ASU will compete in the Legends Classic Nov. 16-17 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn in a field that includes Michigan, VCU and Pitt. Coach Hurley's Sun Devils have had some solid success in November. The program captured Las Vegas titles at the 2017 Continental Tire Invitational and at the 2018 MGM Resorts Main Event. It has posted wins vs. Rhode Island and St. John's in Connecticut, Utah State, Mississippi State, Xavier and Kansas State in Las Vegas, Tulane in Orlando and North Carolina State in Brooklyn. ASU defeated Nov. 15 Xavier -- who would go on to earn a NCAA No. 1 seed in the 2018 NCAA Tournament -- on Nov. 24, 2017 in the championship game of the Continental Tire Invitational, a day after beating eventual Elite Eight participant Kansas State. ASU's 2018 title at MGM Resorts Main Event included wins over two eventual NCAA Tournament teams in No. 15 Mississippi State and Utah State.

SUN DEVILS IN THE NBA

Arizona State Men's Basketball's presence at the professional level continues to grow, with five Sun Devils playing at the NBA level. James Harden (76ers), Lu Dort (Thunder), Josh Christopher (Rockets), Zylan Cheatham (Pelicans), and Rob Edwards (Bucks) are all on a roster within the NBA system during the 2022-23 season. The last time the program has had this many individuals in the NBA to start a season was 2013, when Carrick Felix and Jeff Ayres joined James Harden on an opening day roster. If all five were to make it to the NBA at one point this season, it would be the most Arizona State has been represented in the league since back in 1994.

HEAD COACH BOBBY HURLEY EIGHTH SEASON | DUKE '93

One of the most recognizable names in college basketball history became the 14th men's head coach of the Sun Devil program, as Vice President of Athletics Ray Anderson named 1992 NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player Bobby Hurley as the Sun Devil head coach on April 9, 2015. What has followed is aggressive scheduling, lots of fast-paced hoops, playing hard, several big-time wins both home and away and back-to-back NCAA Tournaments for Arizona State for the first time since Byron Scott, Fat Lever and Alton Lister were wearing Sparky on their short shorts (1980-81 to be exact). The 2020 NCAA Tournament was canceled but the Sun Devils were in position to notch their third straight appearance, a first for program in nearly 60 years.

In his seven seasons as head coach, Sun Devil Men's Basketball has matched its highest ranking in school history (third in the Associated Press Poll in December of 2017), notched its best two average attendances in history (10,603 in 2017-18 is the ASU record), reached the NCAA Tournament for just fourth time in 23 seasons in 2018 and then followed it with back-to-back appearances for the first time since 1980-81, notched its best two non-conference wins in school history (vs. No. 1 Kansas on Dec. 22, 2018 and at No. 2 Kansas on Dec. 10, 2017) and defeated two eventual 2018 No. 1 seeds in a span of a few weeks (Kansas and Xavier).

Following a three-year drought without a First or Second Team Pac-12 All-Conference selection, ASU has had at least one in each of the past five seasons under Hurley. Hurley has coached two Pac-12 Sixth Man of the Year winners in addition to the 2019 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year (Lu Dort). A pair of Sun Devils have been selected to the Pac-12 All-Tournament team and one was an All-Defensive Team selection during Hurley's tenure.

Coach Hurley's team continued to improve as the 2021-22 season progressed, as the Sun Devils ended the season winning seven of their final eight regular season games. Arizona State relied on their defense, allowing opponents to shoot only 40% from the field. This was the lowest mark since the 1971-72 season and third-best defensive effort in program history. Hurley added another signature win to his resume when the Sun Devils defeated No. 3 UCLA in triple overtime. It was the third time ASU had defeated a Top-3 team under Hurley. In the non-conference, the Maroon & Gold went on the road and defeated eventual NCAA Tournament participant Creighton. Rare Season sweeps of Oregon and Utah highlighted the Pac-12 Conference schedule.

The 2019-20 season saw ASU (20-11) post its first seven-game Pac-12 win streak since the 1980-81 team won 11 straight. The Sun Devils came back from 22 down (37-15) to beat Arizona, and took down eventual Pac-12 Champion and No. 14 Oregon at Desert Financial Arena in late February. ASU notched its third straight 20-win season for just the third time in program history. Not bad for a team picked to finish sixth in the annual preseason media poll.

Hurley in 2018-19 led ASU to a 23-11 overall mark and 12-6 in the Pac-12, good enough for second in the league for just fourth time in 41 years of Pac-10/12 play after being picked sixth in the preseason media poll. ASU defeated No. 1 Kansas on Dec. 22, the first win over No. 1 at home in program history and just the second all-time. ASU notched its first NCAA Tournament win since 2009 and posted 23 wins for just the eighth time in school history. Prior to its two straight appearances, ASU had made the NCAA Tournament three times in the previous 22 seasons (1996-2017). ASU averaged 80.04 points per game in 2017-18 and 2018-19, tops in the Pac-12. It had not made March Madness in back-to-back years since 1980-81, yet ASU was the only Pac-12 school to make the NCAAs in 2018 and 2019.

ASU had two-game sweeps of Arizona (first since 2008-09), Oregon State (first since 2009-10) and Cal (second straight). ASU beat No. 15 Mississippi State on Nov. 19 and Utah State on Nov. 21 to win the 2018

MGM Resorts Main Event at T-Mobile Arena, its second straight exempt tourney title after not winning one since November of 1994.

In 2017-18 ASU averaged a school-record 10,603 fans, as the 4,103 extra bodies from 2016-17 to 2017-18 was the second-best increase in all of college hoops. In the 2018-19 season 168,602 fans entered Wells Fargo Arena -- an average of 10,538, second-best in school history. ASU raced out to a 12-0 record and was the last undefeated team in the nation, topping eventual No. 1 seeds Xavier and Kansas that had the Sun Devils dribbling out the clock in in double-digit wins that they trailed at the half in both. The Sun Devils led the Pac-12 in scoring, as the senior trio of Tra Holder, Shannon Evans and Kodi Justice made Sun Devil hoops fun and fast.

His first season at ASU saw the Sun Devils notch eight top-100 RPI wins, including wins over SEC co-champion Texas A&M, Ohio Valley top seed Belmont and two Pac-12 NCAA Tournament teams (Oregon State and USC). ASU's strength of schedule was 23rd and its non-conference schedule was 13th. ASU earned come-from-behind road wins against Creighton (79-77 on Dec. 2) and UNLV (66-56 on Dec. 16).

Hurley, an NCAA champion with Duke in 1991 and 1992, led Buffalo to a school record-matching 23 wins in 2014-15, its first Mid-American Conference title and a trip to the 2015 NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The Bulls fell to West Virginia in the second round, snapping an eight-game win streak that was Buffalo's longest in a decade. After going to Division I status in 1991-92, Buffalo averaged 12.9 wins in its 22 seasons prior to Hurley, but was 42-20 in his two years, which included playing 29 games on the road.

He coached the MAC Players of the Year in back-to-back seasons and led Buffalo to its first outright MAC East Division title in 2013-14. Buffalo went 10-7 on the road in 2014-15, including games at Kentucky and Wisconsin when it led at the half in both contests.

In 2013-14 Hurley was named a finalist for the Joe B. Hall Award, which is given to the nation's top first-year head coach. Javon McCrea was named the MAC Player of the Year and became UB's all-time leading scorer during his senior season as the Bulls won 19 games in Hurley's first year at the helm.

Hurley joined UB from the University of Rhode Island where he served as associate head coach under his brother Dan.

A first-team All-American in 1993, he is best remembered for arguably being the best point guard in NCAA history. Hurley led the Blue Devils to three Final Four appearances and consecutive national championships in 1991 and 1992, and set the NCAA record for career assists with 1,076.

He was selected seventh in 1993 by the Sacramento Kings and played five years in the NBA with the Kings and Vancouver Grizzlies.

Hurley joined the Philadelphia 76ers as a scout in 2003 before venturing into private business. He was hired as an assistant coach at Wagner College in 2010 and spent two seasons with the Seahawks, playing a critical role in rebuilding the program. He helped lead Wagner to a 25-6 record during the 2011-12 season -- its best record in school history -- before joining Rhode Island, where he was associate head coach.

His father, Bob, Sr., is a legendary coach in the high school ranks, leading perennial power St. Anthony's to 26 state championships and more than 1,000 wins in 39 years of coaching. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010. Hurley's brother, Dan, is the head men's basketball coach at UConn, after successful tenures at UConn and Wagner College and an outstanding prep school coaching career.

Hurley and his wife, Leslie, have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney, and a son, Bobby.



ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH JERMAINE KIMBROUGH SECOND SEASON

Sun Devil Men's Basketball Assistant Coach Jermaine Kimbrough has been promoted to Associate Head Coach by Bobby Hurley. Kimbrough joined the staff in the Spring of 2021 and hit the ground running, establishing himself as a force on the recruiting trail and an excellent developer of players.

Kimbrough was a main reason for the midseason turnaround during the 2021-22 campaign, as the Sun Devils won seven of their final eight games of the regular season. This included completing a sweep of Oregon and Utah. It was sparked by a huge win over No. 3 UCLA, knocking off the Top-5 Bruins at a packed Desert Financial Arena. Kimbrough helped the team get prepared on the road, with ASU pulling off several impressive wins in tough environments. Arizona State defeated Creighton, Washington State, Colorado, in addition to the Ducks and Utes on the road.

The impact of Kimbrough's defensive mindset was apparent right away, with the Sun Devils holding 18 opponents under 40 percent shooting. ASU finished third in field goal percentage defense (692-of-1736/.399) -- behind only Arizona (.382) and USC (.389) -- and second in three-point defense (222-of-713/.311).

Arizona State finished with ten wins in conference play in Kimbrough's first season in Tempe, only the eighth time the program has reached double digit conference wins since the 1994-95 season. The Sun Devils had a Pac-12 All-Conference selection for the fifth consecutive year, with Kimbrough's expertise in player development helping keep the streak alive.

A native of northeast, Ohio, Kimbrough spent the previous two seasons at Loyola-Chicago and the three prior seasons at the University of Wyoming.

Kimbrough played a key role in helping the Ramblers to a 21-win season in 2019-20 and then the success of 2020-21 team that reached the Sweet Sixteen and went 26-5. Over the last four years, Loyola has compiled 99 wins. Center Cameron Krutwig finished second in the voting for Larry Bird trophy as the 2019-20 MVC Player of the Year, earning first team all-league accolades, while freshman guard Marquise Kenney was chosen as the MVC Sixth Man of the Year. Tate Hall was hailed as a Third Team All-MVC pick and Lucas Williamson picked up MVC All-Defensive Team recognition.

During his three-year stint at Wyoming, Kimbrough helped lead the Cowboys to a pair of 20-win seasons, including an appearance in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) in 2016-17, and developed two All-Mountain West Conference selections, Justin James and Hayden Dalton, who were honored on multiple occasions.

Before heading to Wyoming, Kimbrough, a 2001 graduate of Virginia Tech, spent one season at the University of Nevada, where he helped the Wolf Pack to a 24-win campaign in 2015-16. That season, Nevada captured the CBI title and also delivered four All-Mountain West Conference individual honors.

Kimbrough spent the bulk of his career at Cleveland State University, where he served nine seasons as an assistant coach under Gary Waters. During his tenure with the Vikings, Kimbrough was a key part of four postseason appearances, including a NCAA tournament and three trips to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), and CSU racked up five 20-win campaigns. He helped recruit an abundance of talent to Cleveland State, including Norris Cole, who was a 2011 NBA Draft pick, as well as NBA players Bryn Forbes, Trey Lewis and Ike Nwamu.

Upon graduation, Kimbrough moved right into the coaching ranks, first serving as an assistant at Howard College from 2001-03 before moving on to Cleveland State as director of operations. After a season at CSU, he spent one year (2004-05) as the director of operations at Massachusetts and then one season at Purdue Fort Wayne (then IPFW) as an assistant coach before returning to Cleveland State.

Kimbrough began his playing career at St. Catherine College before transferring to Virginia Tech, where he played two seasons (1998-2000) before graduating with a degree in psychology. He was a prep standout at Shaker Heights High School in Cleveland, earning all-league honors on four occasions and all-city accolades three times. As a senior, he was a second team all-state designee after pouring in 26 points per game.



ASSISTANT COACH GEORGE ARAMIDE SECOND SEASON

George Aramide enters his second season as an assistant coach after officially joining the Sun Devil staff back in the fall of 2021.

Aramide worked with the Sun Devil front line, helping develop the big man on the Under his tutelage, major improvement was evident in Enoch Boakye, Alonzo Kimani Lawrence, and John Olmsted. One of the two Pac-12 All-Conference honorees was a big man coached by Aramide. Arizona State finished with 131 blocks, compared to just 97 for their opponent. The presence provided by the front line was a big reason why the Sun Devils held opponents to the lowest shooting percentage since the 1972-73 season.

Originally from London, he played professionally in Spain and attended Thompson Rivers University in Kamloops, Canada. He started the Runndunk Basketball AAU Club in 2011 and helped more than 60 players find full scholarships in his first seven years as the squad won the Canadian National Invitational Tournament in 2018 and was crowned the Best AAU team in the country.

He coached current college players Enoch Boakye and DePaul's Nick Ongenda as he helped open George Harris Preparatory High School in 2017, which has placed more than 30 players on full scholarships to universities in Canada and the United States. In 2020, George Harris Prep ranked among the top teams in Canada.



ASSISTANT COACH BRANDON ROSENTHAL FIRST SEASON

Rising coaching star Brandon Rosenthal was been promoted to Assistant Coach by Bobby Hurley, filling out the final spot on the Sun Devil Men's Basketball coaching staff for the 2022-23 season. Rosenthal has served as the Director of Scouting and Player Development for the past three seasons. He has over a decade of experience thriving in a variety of roles at both the collegiate and professional level.

"This is a natural progression for a guy who has NBA experience as a coach," Hurley mentioned. "He's worked here with me for several years and I really trust his knowledge of the game. He adds a lot of value in practice helping us be prepared on Gameday."

As the Director of Scouting and Player Development, Rosenthal was essential to the success of the program, providing support in a variety of areas. In his scouting role, Rosenthal was in charge of breaking down opposing personnel and assisting with creating gameplans. On the player development side, Rosenthal worked closely with several players who have made a considerable jump since arriving in Tempe.

A signature of Head Coach Bobby Hurley's teams has been their performances in close games. This hasn't changed since Rosenthal joined the staff in 2019, with Arizona State consistently proving to be one of the most prepared teams in late-game situations. In Rosenthal's three seasons, ASU is an incredible 24-13 in games decided by two possessions or less (six points).

The impact of Rosenthal and the coaching staff was no more apparent than at the end of last season, when the Sun Devils won seven of their last eight games in the regular season. Rosenthal also had a big hand in preparing Arizona State for their matchup with No. 3 UCLA at Desert Financial Arena, a game the Sun Devils won 87-84 in triple overtime.

The 2020-21 season was heavily affected by COVID-19, but this did not stop Sun Devil Men's Basketball from accomplishing some impressive feats. Rosenthal's second season in Tempe saw ASU win a Pac-12 Tournament game for only the sixth time in program history and the first instance in which they did it in back-to-back tournaments.

In his first season with Sun Devil Men's Basketball, Rosenthal contributed to an impressive regular season effort. Arizona State went 20-11, including an 11-7 conference record, clinching the No. 3 seed in the Pac-12 Tournament. Sparked by a midseason seven-game winning streak, the 2019-20 team was a lock for a NCAA Tournament bid before it was canceled due to COVID-19.

A Sun Devil has been named to one of the Pac-12 All-Conference Teams (two First Team) in each of the past three seasons, a testament to Rosenthal's work with player development. In 2021, guard Josh Christopher became the first Sun Devil to be selected in the NBA Draft since 2013. Christopher had a standout freshman season with Rosenthal's help, leading to him being taken by the Houston Rockets with the 24th overall pick in the 2021 NBA Draft. He was the Sun Devil taken in the first round since James Harden in 2009. Christopher came out of Arizona State ready for the next level, immediately making an impact in Houston as a Rookie.

Prior to his time with Arizona State, Rosenthal spent three seasons with the Phoenix Suns organization where he served in various roles including video scouting and player development. He spent his first season in the organization as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns' G-League affiliate the Northern Arizona Suns.

During the 2018-2019 season, he was responsible for opponent scouting, helping organize and initiating the scouting process and creating self-scouts to evaluate the team's schemes and player development.

At the start of the 2017-2018 season Rosenthal was promoted to the Suns' staff, where he worked closely with other members of the staff on the programming, design, and implementations of the Suns' player development program. He also was responsible for scouting all 29 of the Suns' opponents' personnel and assisting with game planning. He created a defensive accountability system designed to help assist with improving the team's defensive system and evaluation of their individual and team performance.

During the 2016-2017 season, Rosenthal coached with Ty Ellis and the Northern Arizona Suns during their inaugural season. The team was highly regarded as one of the best defensive teams in the G-League and recognized for their development of several NBA's players.

Known for his attention to detail and tireless work ethic, Rosenthal earned a strong reputation for helping develop players. He oversaw the development of the team's young trio of point guards, Askia Booker, Josh Gray, and Shaq Harrison. All three players were invited to participate in the 2017 NBA Summer League, with Gray and Harrison earning their first NBA call ups the following season.

Before joining the Phoenix Suns organization, Rosenthal spent the 2015-16 season with the Houston Rockets as a basketball operations video assistant under Head Coach Kevin McHale and Interim Head Coach JB Bickerstaff. While with the Rockets and Sun Devil alum James Harden, the Rockets advanced to the 2016 NBA playoffs. Rosenthal helped initiate the first shooting analytics database in the NBA. The data collected

helped assist the staff and players with developing specific shooting routines for each player. He also worked closely with the staff on opponent scouts and skill development.

Before joining the Rockets, Rosenthal spent three years at Santa Clara University with Head Coach Kerry Keating. He began as the team's video-coordinator, transitioning into Director of Basketball Operations and serving as the team's interim assistant coach.

Santa Clara would go on to win the College Basketball Invitational in 2013. During that span Rosenthal worked with Kevin Foster and Jared Brownridge, two of the West Coast Conference's all-time great scorers and currently first and second respectively in three pointers made in conference history.

Rosenthal has also served as a graduate assistant with Andre Cook at St. Edwards University (2010-12), and assisted with Rod Baker and the Rochester RazorSharks of the Premier Basketball League. In his lone season with the team, the RazorSharks would advance to the league finals.

Rosenthal played and served as an undergraduate assistant at St. John Fisher College for one of the all-time winningest Division III coaches Rob Kornaker. The team compiled an 82-34 record (2006-10), winning multiple Empire 8 league titles and earning four postseason trips, including two appearances in the NCAA Division III tournament.

Rosenthal earned his Bachelor's Degree in Sport Management from St. John Fisher College in 2010 and a Masters of Arts in Teaching Degree from St. Edwards University in 2012.

The Tucson, Ariz. native and Catalina Foothills graduate is also the co-owner of Rising Coaches, an organization created for coaches by coaches which offers collaborative assistance, networking and avenues for career growth. The organization's online platform, conferences and clinics are attended by thousands of coaches each year.
