@SunDevilMensTennis Travel to PNW for Last Road Trip

EUGENE/SEATTLE – After a quick trip to Salt Lake City last week, the Arizona State men's tennis team is back out on the road, this time taking a trip up to the Pacific Northwest to take on conference foes No. 41 Oregon and Washington.

ASU (11-7) looks to secure solid footing and go on its first win streak in conference play. The Sun Devils rode into Pac-12 play with an eight-game win streak, but went on to face two of the top-ranked programs in the country in No. 3 Stanford and No. 4 Ohio State. Although they have faced eight ranked opponents with more on the tap, a tough schedule is something coach Matt Hill had planned all along.

Michael Geerts is also looking to right the ship on the road, as he suffered an uncharacteristic loss against Utah. The Belgian has been on a hot streak of late, going 11-2 in his last 13 matchups – including an upset of No. 2 Mikael Torpegaard of Ohio State – to secure two Pac-12 Player of the Week honors so far this season.

The senior has been a consistent cog in the Devils' success, notching 11 solo wins in dual match play so far this season.

While Geerts holds the highest winning percentage on the team, two more members of ASU's squad follow closely behind him with No. 66 Benjamin Hannestad boasting a 6-4 record, and Andrea Bolla tallying eight wins and five losses.

Anchoring court two, Hannestad's unbeaten record against ranked men in 2018 will be put to the test again this weekend, as the Ducks placed two in the ITA/Oracle rankings while the Huskies have one.

Bolla has been on a hot streak as of late, notching six victories in his last seven matchups. Pairing together with Makey Rakotomalala, the tandem debuted in the ITA/Oracle rankings at No. 86 in the latest poll. The pair marks the first doubles partners to break the rankings since Benjamin Hannestad and Tim Ruehl in the Nov. 15 update.

The Sun Devils have favorable series histories over both opponents, holding a dominating 13-2 record over Oregon and a 15-7 record over Washington.

Both teams battled it out in Husky territory last weekend, with the No. 41 Ducks coming out on top. Oregon took the doubles point with two quick victories, but Washington swiped two victories of their own in singles play to stake a 2-1 lead. It came down to a 3-3 tie with Oregon outlasting Washington with a 4-3 thrilling victory.

The last time ASU traveled up to the Pacific Northwest was in their 2008 season, sweeping the road trip against No. 40 Washington and No. 38 Oregon.

Team Notes

Rankings Are Here, Rankings Are Here!

ITA released its newest team ranking on March 6, and the Devils remain in the poll at at No. 36. The Devils are 3-2 in the last five, but dropped a close match with Utah last weekend to remain winless in conference play.

ASU roared into conference play with an eight-game win streak, but were halted by two of the top-ranked teams in the country in No. 2 Stanford and No. 4 Ohio State. The Devils look to right the ship against No. 41 Oregon and Washington this weekend.

Oracle/IT(YAY)

ITA released its third singles poll of the season on April 4, and the usual suspects found themselves on the list. No. 49 Michael Geerts and No. 66 Benjamin Hannestad remained on the list after ranking 35 and 40, respectively, in the last poll.

Makey Rakotomalala regained a spot in the rankings at No. 112 last time, but a rough streak saw him drop this time around.

Bring It On

ASU is playing one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation in its comeback season, and that is something first-year mentor Matt Hill plans on making a tradition. The Sun Devils will face Big Ten champion Ohio State and began its season hosting No. 25 Duke, Big 12 champion No. 10 TCU and SEC co-champion No. 7 Texas A&M. Ohio State who has won the Big Ten title seven times, including a title in 2017.

Get to Know the Ducks

Oregon holds a 13-6 record and on a four-game win streak. The Ducks have faced off against six ranked teams so far this season, including a familiar foe in Cal and fellow Pac-12 opponents UCLA and USC. The squad from Eugene is 2-4 in games against ranked opponents, notching wins over Wisconsin and Utah State.

The Devils own a dominating 13-2 overall series record against the Ducks, with the two programs last facing off in 2008 right here in Tempe. ASU swept the matchup 7-0 and hasn't dropped a contest against Oregon since 2004, when the Devils dropped a tough matchup in Eugene, 4-3.

Get to Know the Huskies

Even though Washington holds a 10-9 record, looks can be deceiving as they have played some of the top-ranked teams in the nation so far in No. 1 Wake Forest, No. 4 UCLA, No. 9 Oklahoma State and No. 12 Baylor among others. They are winless in matchups against ranked opponents.

The Huskies are coming off a back-and-forth 4-3 loss against Oregon last weekend. Thomas Wright, Will Kirkman, Benjamin Hannestad, Michael Geerts and Makey Rakotomalala arrived at Arizona State for the Spring 2017 semester, taking classes and practicing as a team before the team would officially become a program the following spring. The remaining four were all incoming freshman this fall, joining the team in August.

Up Hill Battle

Coach Matt Hill is no stranger to adversity. Upon taking the helm at South Florida in 2012, the Bulls hadn't been to the NCAA Division I Championship since 2009. Hill's team finished 8-14 in his first season, but the tide quickly changed under his mentorship, as they compiled a 12-10 record the following year and then found themselves in the Championship for the first time in five years the next season. The team made it to the second round and were eliminated by Florida, but Hill's team made the tournament the next two years as well, finishing as high as the Sweet 16 in 2015.

USF were back-to-back-to-back AAC Champions in Hill's final three years in Tampa, compiling a 82-47 record. He was a three-time American Conference Coach of the Year and mentored a three-time American Athletic Conference Player of the Year in Roberto Cid.

Southwest Regional Champions

The doubles pair of Benjamin Hannestad and Tim Ruehl won the 2017 ITA Southwest Regional Championship in the fall, and then Hannestad decided he wanted more and took home the singles title. Held at both Malibu's Ralphs-Straus Tennis Center and the Crest Tennis Courts and hosted by Pepperdine, Hannestad and Ruehl defeated Pedro Iamachkine and Lautaro Pane of Pepperdine 6-4, 6-3 to earn the doubles title, and then Hannestad closed the deal with a 6-4, 3-6, 6-4 win over Nicolas Moreno de Alboran of UCSB.

USC and UCLA had dominated the tournament in the past, winning every singles titles since 2009 and five doubles championships. Hannestad defeated three Pac-12 competitors on the way to his singles title.

Bolla, Shot Caller

Andrea Bolla is on fire as of late. The Italian has six victories in his last seven matchups, snapping a six-game win streak in Salt Lake City last weekend. Bolla has outscored his opponents to the tune of 91-57 in that span. He has also clinched three victories for the Devils with his singles wins, tying Ben Hannestad for most on the squad.

He and doubles partner Makey Rakotomalala have also found success as a tandem, becoming the first Devils pair to break the ITA rankings since Hannestad and partner Tim Ruehl did it on Nov. 15. The two debuted as a pair at Pepperdine with a 6-2 victory and haven't slowed down much since, notching six victories and just three losses.

The two had a huge victory against No. 2 Stanford, handing the 27th-ranked tandem of Axel Geller/Tom Fawcett an easy 6-2 loss to even the advantage and put Geerts/Ruehl in perfect position to eventually clinch the doubles point.

Geerts the Dub

Senior Michaël Geerts has continued his tear since hitting the collegiate scene, racking up two Pac-12 Players of the Week honors so far this season. The Belgian suffered an uncharacteristic loss against Utah, but is still 11-2 in his last 13 matchups.

Geerts is 11-5 on court one for the Devils, and has two match-clinching points on the season. He is also 2-1 in three-set matches, including an upset of No. 2 Mikael Torpegaard of Ohio State. The senior has been a consistent cog in the Devils' success, stepping up to claim three wins against ranked opponents this year.

Head Coach Matt Hill



Before arriving at ASU, Hill spent the previous four seasons as the head coach of the University of South Florida, leading the Bulls to three consecutive AAC team championships and a No. 17 final ranking among Division I programs this past season. USF advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season in 2016 after qualifying just twice in 10 previous campaigns prior to Hill's arrival.

Prior to his time at South Florida, Hill had two successful stops at a pair of nationally ranked SEC programs in Mississippi State and Alabama. Hill will be the Sun Devil program's first head coach since Lou Belken led the program from 1983 through 2008.

The 2016 Bulls reached a program-best ranking of No. 13 in the nation before finishing in the Top 20 at No. 17. Hill coached two-time All-American Roberto Cid to a ranking of No. 2 in the nation, the best ranking of any tennis player, men's or women's, in program history. USF also played one of the toughest schedules, notching 16 wins over ranked opponents and playing just four matches against unranked foes.

In 2015, Hill guided the Bulls to their best finish as USF advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA tournament after winning their second-straight conference championship while Oliver Pramming earned Most Outstanding Player honors.

The Bulls won the inaugural American Athletic Conference tournament in 2014 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Hill coached Cid to the first-ever All-America honor in USF history as he made an impressive run in the NCAA singles tournament.

An accomplished recruiter, Hill took over the USF program and immediately brought in five players in his first recruiting class that were either ranked among the top 100 juniors in the world or had already earned professional ATP points. His 2013 and 2016 recruiting classes were both ranked in

the top 10 in the nation.

Additionally, Hill oversaw the start of a capital fundraising campaign geared toward a \$3 million renovation of the tennis facility and personally helped secure over half a million dollars toward that goal.

During Hill's five years as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, he helped the Bulldogs improve from a No. 58 ranking in 2008 and a No. 72 ranking in 2009 to top 20 finishes in his final two seasons, including a No. 11 final ranking in 2012 – the program's best finish since 1998. The Bulldogs posted the program's best record (20-7) since that same 1998 squad went 21-5.

MSU earned a No. 20 final ranking in 2011 after producing a 14-9 record, while winning the SEC Western Division title with an 8-3 mark. Hill was instrumental in helping five Bulldogs to All-SEC honors, while supporting Per Nilsson to SEC Coach of the Year honors. He was recognized for his efforts by being named ITA Southern Region Assistant Coach of the Year and SEC Assistant Coach of the Year.

Hill's recruiting prowess shined with the Bulldogs as he served as the team's recruiting coordinator, bringing in seven players that were either ranked in the top 100 among the world's juniors or became ranked in the top 125 players in the country upon arriving at Mississippi State. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked 13th in the nation.

While at MSU, Hill and the Bulldog staff had one of just three programs with five singles players ranked in the Top-75 nationally while his efforts in promoting the team helped grow the fan base by over 600 percent with the Bulldogs ranked in the top 5 nationally in average attendance during the 2009 and 2011 seasons.

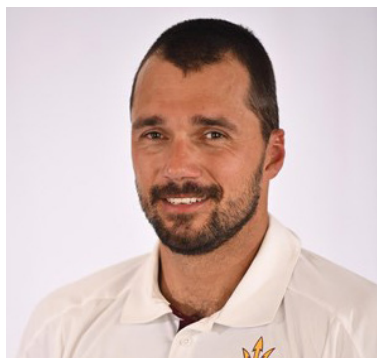
Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Hill served as a volunteer assistant coach at Alabama for two seasons. He helped the Crimson Tide improve from a No. 56 final ranking the season before he joined the staff to a No. 14 ranking in 2007, his second year with the program. Hill helped coach five nationally ranked players and helped Alabama reach two NCAA Tournaments during his stint, including a trip to the round of 16 in 2007.

A native of Holt, Mich., Hill earned a degree in business marketing with a specialization in professional tennis management from Ferris State University in 2005 and a master's degree in human performance from Alabama in 2007. Also a member of the tennis team while at Ferris State, Hill helped lead the Bulldogs to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals for the first time in school history.

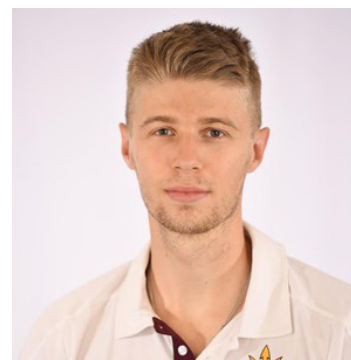
Kokta joined Matt Hill's staff after a two-year stint at Purdue where he was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers improve their record from 4-20 to 17-10 in the span of a year.

Prior to his appointment at Purdue Kokta was at Baylor where he served as volunteer coach at his alma mater for three seasons. During his three seasons, Baylor captured a pair of Big 12 Conference regular season titles and won the Big 12 Championship in 2014. The Bears advanced to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships in 2012 and 2013, followed by a quarterfinal appearance in 2014.

Prior to his collegiate career Kokta was ranked as high as No. 8 in singles and #3 in doubles in the ITF's juniors rankings. He reached the semifinals of the Australian Open juniors in singles, the semifinals of Wimbledon juniors in doubles, and was the European junior doubles champion. After juniors, Kokta was ranked as high as #356 ATP in singles and #480 in doubles.



Dom Cotrone is a volunteer assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and former USF tennis standout. The Bradenton, Fla. native played under Coach Hill from 2012-16. Cotrone became the second All-American in USF history, advancing to the round of 16 at the NCAA singles tournament during his senior season while posting a 13-7 singles record.



Jan Meyer is a graduate student assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and former Azusa Pacific University tennis standout. The Heiligenhaus, Germany native entered his season as the No. 1 player in the nation. Meyer was the 2015 PacWest Player of the Year and was also earned ITA All-American status as both a singles and doubles player and was a CoSIDA Academic All-American.
