#### SUN DEVIL REWIND

Last weekend, the Sun Devils traveled back east with a two-game sweep of Holy Cross and Bentley. After a third-period rally to force overtime and defeat the Crusaders, sophomore netminder EVAN DEBROUWER picked up his third shutout of the season Saturday night at Bentley.

Junior forward WILLIE KNIERIM continued his scoring run against Holy Cross, with eight goals in his last eight games and five in his last four. Senior BRETT GRUBER is currently riding a five-game point streak with two goals and four assists, including a two-point game against Bentley most recently. Senior defenseman BRINSON PASICHNUK is one point shy of reaching 100 points as a Sun Devil after having seven points in his last five games.

Between the pipes, DEBROUWER is sporting a 1.97 goals against average and .939 save percentage in his last six starts.

The Sun Devil penalty kill has negated the last 32 opposing power play opportunities dating back to Jan. 5 vs. Michigan Tech.

The Sun Devils and Seawolves have quite the history, playing each other in ASU's first-ever NCAA Division I game. Anchorage ended up winning their first and only match-up, 3-2, in overtime.

## **SCOUTING THE SEAWOLVES**

At the helm, head coach Matt Curley and the Seawolves are currently in the final playoff spot for the WCHA playoffs and all four of their wins come against WCHA opponents. Last weekend, Anchorage faced Bowling Green, dropping both games including one in overtime.

Their freshman class has stood out with 33 goals and 37 assists this season. Freshman forward Rylee St. Onge leads the team in goals (8) and points (15). Three Seawolves are tied with 14 points a piece including senior defenseman Tomi Hiekkavirta with 13 assists.

In net, the Seawolves have split time between junior Kris Carlson and sophomore Kristian Stead, each holding two wins for Anchorage. In 18 games, Carlson has a .917 save percentage and 2.76 goals against average.

#### SUN DEVIL TWEETABLES

- These two teams met in @SunDevilHockey's first-ever NCAA Division I game in 2015 with the Seawolves winning, 3-2, in overtime.
- Four of the five seniors being honored this weekend have played or been part of the program for all four seasons -- only three others have done so in program history.
- 3. Over his last six games, goaltender Evan DeBrouwer has posted a 1.97 goals against average and .939 save percentage.

### SENIOR SUN DEVILS

- Riley Simpson: After two years on the ice for the Sun Devils, senior Riley Simpson encountered a
  life-altering decision during the summer between his sophomore and junior seasons. To avoid future
  complications, Riley made the decision to hang up his skates and undergo surgery on his spine. But
  his ASU legacy wasn't over, as the Alberta native transitioned into a student coach for his final two
  seasons. Over the past two years, Riley has become an integral part of the coaching staff, facilitating
  practices, film review and game breakdown while providing an alternative perspective behind the
  scenes.
- #10 Tyler Busch: As one of the freshmen who stepped right into a starting role, forward Tyler Busch wasted no time making his mark as a Sun Devil. In his first collegiate game, Tyler netted his first NCAA goal against then-No. 9 Notre Dame on the road. He proceeded to score in his first four college games all against ranked opponents including the game-winner in ASU's first-ever win over a ranked opponent versus No. 18 Air Force. The Alberta native proceeded to score the game-tying goal against No. 10 Ohio State in the waning seconds to force overtime and most recently scored the overtime game-winner against No. 8 Clarkson this season. Like others, he will depart with his name littered all over the record books, including third all-time in games played, tied for third in career points, third in career goals and third in career assists.
- #27 Brett Gruber: As one of seven Sun Devils to now have played all four years in the Maroon & Gold, forward Brett Gruber will leave ASU with his mark left on the program in a variety of top-10 single-season and career records. Playing in the second-most games all-time, Brett missed just five games in his career all coming this season due to a minor injury. The Wisconsin native currently ranks tied for third in career points, second in career assists, third in assists in a single season, and eighth in points in a single season. He is currently on a five-game point streak with two goals and four assists in that span.
- #28 Steenn Pasichnuk: Known as the older, larger and more physical Pasichnuk brother, Steenn
  has crafted his role as a Sun Devil over the course of his four-year career. Missing just three games in
  his last two seasons, Steenn carved out a role on the fourth line as a momentum shifter and physical
  presence for head coach Greg Powers. Typically sent out to negate opposing team's top lines, the
  Alberta native has been a catalyst on ASU's penalty kill, which has ranked as one of the best in the
  country the last two seasons.
- #39 Brinson Pasichnuk: Departing as one of the most decorated Sun Devils in program history, defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk will leave with the most games played by a Sun Devil, most career points, second in career goals scored, first in career assists, first in game-winning goals, and all program career and single-season offensive records by a defenseman. Named the program's second captain in program history, Brinson is also the only Sun Devil to record an NCAA Tournament goal with his third-period tally last season. With a goal/assist tonight, the Alberta native will also become the only Sun Devil to eclipse 100 points in program history.
- #45 Max Prawdzik: After four years at Boston University, graduate transfer goaltender Max found a new home in the desert. Donning the Maroon & Gold for just one season, Max brought NCAA experience and energy to a young Sun Devil goaltending room. This season, the Massachusetts native started four games with a 3-0-0 record including the team's first win of the 2019-20 season and 3.17 goals against average.

## **FAMILIAR FOES**

- In 2014-15, Sun Devil defenseman JACOB WILSON and forward FILIPS BUNCIS played together with Seawolf defenseman David Trinkberger with the Sioux City Musketeers (USHL). The following season, WILSON and Trinkberger played together again.
- Sun Devil forward JOHNNY WALKER and Anchorage forward Alexander Frye had a stint together in 2015-16 for the Chicago Steel (USHL).
- Arizona State forward JAX MURRAY and Anchorage forward Tanner Schachle combined for 91 points in 2017-18 for the Fairbanks Ice Dogs (NAHL).

## **POWERING UP**

Coach Powers enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2019-20, and his 12th overall at the helm at ASU. The 2018-19 was one for the record books, as the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year finalist led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 231-113-26 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
