### Straight From Coach Hill

#### On whether returning from Los Angeles Sunday and leaving for Ojai Tuesday affected the team:

We're in match rhythm right now because we've been playing a lot and we're liking what we're seeing on the courts. I don't think it's going to be too much of a factor. The guys are in good shape and physically and mentally ready. It was good to come home and get some school stuff taken care of, so now we're refocusing on the tennis aspect of things.

#### On if playing Cal three times this season is an advantage or disadvantage:

It's a really good thing because we pride ourselves on being really prepared for matches. We videotape every match we play, and so we've got two sets of film on Cal which is always a good thing because we'll be able to utilize that film to be as prepared as possible for the match. The more information for us, the better.

#### On Andrea Bolla's successful play as of late:

Andrea is a really hard worker on the training court, so it's great to see that hard work paying off. He's continuing to learn about himself as a player and his game, and I feel like he's really figuring that out for the first time particularly on a hard court. We're excited about not only where he's at right now, but where we believe he can go. We believe he can be by far one of the best players in college tennis, so it's great to see him on that path.

#### On Andrea Bolla and Tim Ruehl's play in doubles this season:

They compliment each other so well because Tim is incredibly gifted as it comes to reading the game, his anticipatory skills and hands at the net while Andrea has so much power and can hit any shot on the court. It's fun to see them play together because they work together so well personality-wise and have a high level of respect for each other.

#### On how he thinks the team fared in their tough regular season schedule:

We believed we would have a really strong group, so we scheduled accordingly and will always schedule difficult matchups. This year was particularly difficult with so many matchups on the road, but I thought we did a really good job with the cards we've been dealt. We've had a lot of adversity thrown our way this year, and I think the guys did an awesome job of absorbing that to push forward and come together as a group.

We're starting to solidify a really solid foundation for a culture that I think we're going to be able to build off of for a really long time. If you told me that would take an upwards of two years, I never would've thought that. They've done an incredible job this year, and I'm really excited for the postseason starting this week. We're really just getting started as it relates to what we're trying to do and accomplish here.

## Team Notes

### Rankings Are Here, Rankings Are Here!

The latest rankings for doubles are out and the duo of **Nathan Ponwith** and **Dominik Kellovsky** maintained their spot on the list, this time at No. 12. The tandem played a crucial role in securing doubles points all season-long, clinching seven of the 19 doubles points on the season. The pair peaked in performance after taking down the No. 1 doubles pair from Baylor in March and have gone on a 6-1 tear ever since, losing only to the No. 5 pair out of USC in that span.

Ponwith was also recognized as No. 74 by the ITA as a singles player, maintaining a ranking for the seventh-straight week. Ponwith put up impressive wins on the season, taking down No. 37 Mattias Siimar to clinch the Sun Devils' comeback 4-2 win over No. 13 Michigan. The Scottsdale-native has a team-leading 13 singles victories including wins in four of his last six matchups.

The tandem of **Makey Rakotomalala** and **Justin Roberts** also reappeared in the rankings this week after going a perfect 2-0 in doubles play last time out to total 10 wins on the season as a pair. The ITA ranked them at No. 77 after earning a No. 55 nod in the March 5 edition of the poll earlier this season.

### Double the Trouble

The Sun Devils have shown major improvement in doubles play in just one season's time, securing the first point in 19 of their 25 regular season matches including over some notable opponents in No. 1 Wake Forest, No. 6 Baylor, No. 10 TCU, No. 10 USC, No. 13 Michigan, No. 14 UCLA and No. 20 Oklahoma State. The squad notched 11 doubles points in 25 matches last season.

Transfers **Justin Roberts** and **Dominik Kellovsky** have played large roles in upping the Sun Devils' game, as Roberts owns 10 doubles wins in tandem with **Makey Rakotomalala**. Kellovsky and his partner Nathan Ponwith are second on the team in wins with 12 on court one with three wins over ranked opponents including the No. 1-ranked pair.

**Tim Ruehl** and **Andrea Bolla** have also dominated the doubles game dating back to the fall season, going a team-leading 15-3 overall while also battled to the quarterfinals of the ITA Fall National Championship in Surprise, Ariz. The pair are 2-0 this season against ranked opponents, taking wins over the No. 15 and 24 ranked doubles pairs in the country and are also a nine-match win streak, last losing over a month ago on March 15 against No. 13 Michigan.

### At the Top It Isn't Lonely

Arizona State's top two courts have been on a roll lately in court one **Nathan Ponwith** and court two **Dominik Kellovsky**. Both experienced relatively slow starts to the year, as Ponwith dropped four of his first five and Kellovsky his first four.

Ponwith has notched a win in four of his last six decisions in singles play and looks to extend that hot streak in the his first Pac-12 Championships as a Sun Devil. Kellovsky has experienced similar upward momentum, taking wins in four of his last six after starting off the season 0-4.

### Bolla, Shot Caller

**Andrea Bolla** has been on a roll as of late, riding a five-match winning streak into this weekend. Four of those matches were in straight-sets including both of his victories over opponents from No. 10 USC and No. 14 UCLA. Bolla showed major resiliency in his win over Trojan Riley Smith, taking his first set 6-4 but going down 4-5 in set two late. The Italian kicked things into overdrive, winning three-straight games to clinch the match 6-4, 7-5 and a perfect 2-0 weekend in singles and doubles over two of the top teams in the conference and country.

The victories cap off a successful regular season for Bolla, who experienced exponential growth between this season and last. After totaling just eight singles wins in 2018, the Italian has 10 entering the Pac-12 Championships including six of his last eight decisions. He has also experienced huge success on the doubles court with partner Tim Ruehl, leading the team in victories with 15 as a pair.

## **Pac-12 Player of the Week**

---

**Tim Ruehl** was recognized for his performance in the Sun Devils' matchups against Duke and No. 1 Wake Forest, a weekend in which he went a perfect 2-0 in singles play and 1-1 in doubles play.

Ruehl takes the first such accolade of the season, marking the first on the year for the Sun Devils and the seventh in program history. Combined with Michaël Geerts' two Player of the Week honors last year, ASU has three PotW awards since reinstatement in 2017, nearly doubling their four they totaled before being discontinued as a sport in 2008.

The German notched his first career win over a ranked opponent, defeating No. 80 Rrezart Cungu of Wake Forest 2-6, 6-2, 6-2 on Saturday. His win in tandem with Andrea Bolla – together they were ranked the No. 22 doubles pair in the nation – was against Duke to the tune of a 6-1 victory.

## **Bring It On**

---

ASU continues the new year with one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation in their second season, and that is something second-year mentor **Matt Hill** plans on making a tradition.

The Sun Devils opened the year against some of the top competition in college tennis, as three top-15 opponents coming to compete in the Tempe Collegiate Classic with matchups including No. 7 Mississippi State, No. 9 TCU and No. 15 Illinois. As the season continued, ASU faced two of the current top five in eight-time Big Ten champion No. 1 Ohio State -- for the second year in a row -- and No. 3 Wake Forest. Following matchups included tennis powerhouses like No. 6 Baylor, No. 8 USC, No. 9 TCU, No. 11 Texas A&M, No. 13 UCLA, No. 14 Stanford, No. 22 Michigan and No. 23 Oklahoma State to round out ASU vs. the Top-25.

## **Mr. Worldwide(s)**

---

With just one Devil from the United States, the men's tennis team is one of the most diverse teams within ASU Athletics. Every single Devil represents a different nation, as the eight men hail from nine different countries across the world: Italy, Czech Republic, the Bahamas, the Dominican Republic, France, Germany, the U.S. and Great Britain.

## **Up Hill Battle**

---

Coach **Matt Hill** is no stranger to adversity. Upon taking the helm at South Florida in 2012, the Bulls hadn't been to the NCAA Division I Championship since 2009. Hill's team finished 8-14 in his first season, but the tide quickly changed under his mentorship, as they compiled a 12-10 record the following year and then found themselves in the Championship for the first time in five years the next season. The team made it to the second round and were eliminated by Florida, but Hill's team made the tournament the next two years as well, finishing as high as the Sweet 16 in 2015.

USF were back-to-back-to-back AAC Champions in Hill's final three years in Tampa, compiling a 82-47 record. He was a three-time American Conference Coach of the Year and mentored a three-time American Athletic Conference Player of the Year in Roberto Cid.

## **New Kids on the Block**

---

Entering the 2019 season, Sun Devil men's tennis welcomes three highly sought after transfers to the new season, as they look to add veteran leadership and depth to the roster. Scottsdale native **Nathan Ponwith** returns back home after a two-year stint at the University of Georgia. During his time with the Dawgs, Ponwith earned 2017 SEC Freshman of the Year and First-Team All-SEC honors as Georgia's court one. In addition, Ponwith amassed an SEC record for most Freshman of the week honors in a single season with five to round out his sensational freshman campaign.

Another key newcomer that will compete in a major role for the Devils is **Dominik Kellovsky** from his home country of the Czech Republic. In his time overseas, he completed a large part of his time in the Pro Circuit accumulating a 70-97 record in singles and 110-80 record in doubles.

Graduate Student **Justin Roberts** returns back under head coach Matt Hill after completing two seasons with him at the University of South Florida. As a junior, Roberts was instrumental in clinching USF's fourth straight conference title when he defeated Danny Kerznerman of UCF. On top of that, Roberts added an American Athletic Conference Player of the Week honors to his resume after an upset win over No. 16 Mississippi State.

## HEAD COACH MATT HILL



Before arriving at ASU, Hill spent the previous four seasons as the head coach of the University of South Florida, leading the Bulls to three consecutive AAC team championships and a No. 17 final ranking among Division I programs this past season. USF advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season in 2016 after qualifying just twice in 10 previous campaigns prior to Hill's arrival.

Prior to his time at South Florida, Hill had two successful stops at a pair of nationally ranked SEC programs in Mississippi State and Alabama. Hill will be the Sun Devil program's first head coach since Lou Belken led the program from 1983 through 2008.

The 2016 Bulls reached a program-best ranking of No. 13 in the nation before finishing in the Top 20 at No. 17. Hill coached two-time All-American Roberto Cid to a ranking of No. 2 in the nation, the best ranking of any tennis player, men's or women's, in program history. USF also played one of the toughest schedules, notching 16 wins over ranked opponents and playing just four matches against unranked foes.

In 2015, Hill guided the Bulls to their best finish as USF advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA tournament after winning their second-straight conference championship while Oliver Pramming earned Most Outstanding Player honors.

The Bulls won the inaugural American Athletic Conference tournament in 2014 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Hill coached Cid to the first-ever All-America honor in USF history as he made an impressive run in the NCAA singles tournament.

An accomplished recruiter, Hill took over the USF program and immediately brought in five players in his first recruiting class that were either ranked among the top 100 juniors in the world or had already earned professional ATP points. His 2013 and 2016 recruiting classes were both ranked in the top 10 in the nation.



Additionally, Hill oversaw the start of a capital fundraising campaign geared toward a \$3 million renovation of the tennis facility and personally helped secure over half a million dollars toward that goal.

During Hill's five years as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, he helped the Bulldogs improve from a No. 58 ranking in 2008 and a No. 72 ranking in 2009 to top 20 finishes in his final two seasons, including a No. 11 final ranking in 2012 – the program's best finish since 1998. The Bulldogs posted the program's best record (20-7) since that same 1998 squad went 21-5.

MSU earned a No. 20 final ranking in 2011 after producing a 14-9 record, while winning the SEC Western Division title with an 8-3 mark. Hill was instrumental in helping five Bulldogs to All-SEC honors, while supporting Per Nilsson to SEC Coach of the Year honors. He was recognized for his efforts by being named ITA Southern Region Assistant Coach of the Year and SEC Assistant Coach of the Year.

Hill's recruiting prowess shined with the Bulldogs as he served as the team's recruiting coordinator, bringing in seven players that were either ranked in the top 100 among the world's juniors or became ranked in the top 125 players in the country upon arriving at Mississippi State. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked 13th in the nation.

While at MSU, Hill and the Bulldog staff had one of just three programs with five singles players ranked in the Top-75 nationally while his efforts in promoting the team helped grow the fan base by over 600 percent with the Bulldogs ranked in the top 5 nationally in average attendance during the 2009 and 2011 seasons.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Hill served as a volunteer assistant coach at Alabama for two seasons. He helped the Crimson Tide improve from a No. 56 final ranking the season before he joined the staff to a No. 14 ranking in 2007, his second year with the program. Hill helped coach five nationally ranked players and helped Alabama reach two NCAA Tournaments during his stint, including a trip to the round of 16 in 2007.

A native of Holt, Mich., Hill earned a degree in business marketing with a specialization in professional tennis management from Ferris State University in 2005 and a master's degree in human performance from Alabama in 2007. Also a member of the tennis team while at Ferris State, Hill helped lead the Bulldogs to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals for the first time in school history.

### **MICHAL KOKTA // ASSISTANT COACH**

Kokta joined Matt Hill's staff after a two-year stint at Purdue where he was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers improve their record from 4-20 to 17-10 in the span of a year.

Prior to his appointment at Purdue Kokta was at Baylor where he served as volunteer coach at his alma mater for three seasons. During his three seasons, Baylor captured a pair of Big 12 Conference regular season titles and won the Big 12 Championship in 2014. The Bears advanced to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships in 2012 and 2013, followed by a quarterfinal appearance in 2014.

Prior to his collegiate career Kokta was ranked as high as No. 8 in singles and #3 in doubles in the ITF's juniors rankings. He reached the semifinals of the Australian Open juniors in singles, the semifinals of Wimbledon juniors in doubles, and was the European junior doubles champion. After juniors, Kokta was ranked as high as #356 ATP in singles and #480 in doubles.



### **DOM COTRONE // VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT**

Cotrone is a volunteer assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and a former USF tennis standout.

The Bradenton, Fla. native played under Coach Hill during the 2016 season. Cotrone became the second All-American in USF history, advancing to the round of 16 at the NCAA singles tournament during his senior season while posting a 13-7 singles record.

Cotrone played in tandem with current Sun Devil Justin Roberts, with the two recording a 16-5 record in tandem during his final season at South Florida

Cotrone amassed a 10-19 singles record and 30-15 doubles record on the pro circuit, notching four professional doubles wins. Two wins came in 2015 at the USA F18 Futures and USA F22 Futures, while Cotrone recorded the other two in 2016 at the Italy F30 Futures and USA F37 Futures.
