#BYTHENUMBERS

All-American Spencer Torkelson now has mutiple hits in 34 of his 82 career starts (.415). Torkelson is batting .384 on the season on 43-of-110 hitting with six home runs, seven doubles and 32 RBIs. His 43 hits are tied for first in the Pac-12 (37th nationally) with Sun Devil teammates Trevor Hauver and Hunter Bishop. He is tied for second in the Pac-12 with 32 RBIs, which sits 48th nationally. Torkelson has multiple hits in a teambest 15 of ASU's 27 games this season and at least one RBI in 16 of those (multiple RBIs in 9). Torkelson is batting .410 with runners in scoring position

Alec Marsh has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 25 of his last 26 appearances dating back to his freshman season. Marsh has a posted a quality start in 11 of his last 15 starts since assuming the mantle of Mr. Friday Night midway through the 2018. Marsh is tied for the national lead with seven victories this season and a perfect 7-0 record. His 0.94 ERA is currently 12th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 - though he has pitched 18 more innings than the league leader. Of 83 pitchers with over 40 innings pitched this season, only six have a sub-1.00 ERA, of which Marsh is one.

Hunter Bishop leads the nation with 16 home runs this season - seven more than any other player in the Pac-12. He is the national leader in slugging percentage (1.010) and total bases (104) as well. The 104 total bases are 31 more than any other player in the Pac-12. Bishop's 41 RBIs this season lead the Pac-12 and are sixth nationally while his .417 average is third in the league and 17th nationally. The 41 RBIs are nine more than any other player in the Pac-12. Bishop leads the NCAA with 45 runs this season - six more than any other player in the Pac-12.

In each of the last two weeks, Romero has accounted for both a win (Cal Baptist, Arizona) and a save (Oregon, Arizona). Romero is 2-0 with a two saves this year with a 0.99 ERA over 27.1 innings pitched. He is 15th in the nation in ERA and third in the Pac-12 in the category Romero has struck out 24 batters to just five walks while allowing just three total earned runs on the year - second in the Pac-12.In his last four appearances (2 wins, 2 saves), Romero has stranded 17 baserunners.

Photography/Videoography

Accomodations for B-Roll purposes at practice can be made through Jeremy Hawkes (jdhawkes@asu.edu). During games, credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times. Shooting areas are designated camera wells on the far side of both the visitor's and home team's dugouts. At no point during game action should a member of the media be on the field of play. Contact Jeremy Hawkes for any details regarding shooting game action.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted nontelevised competitions, including those that are live streamed. ESPN networks (i.e., ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU) will also televise all NCAA College World Series games from Saturday, June 17, through Wednesday, June 28. No other broadcast network or Internet entity, other than ESPN, may air these games, nor show highlights of these games until the ESPN broadcast is off the air. Broadcast networks / television stations may use up to three (3) minutes (per newscast) of video footage from any one game or five (5) minutes total of video footage from all games played on that particular day of competition for up to 72 hours following the game / broadcast. No media entity (commercial or noncommercial) is allowed to display any game video on its website. If a commercial broadcast entity wishes to license video footage beyond the previously described time period (72 hours), all requests to obtain clips or copies of NCAA championships / events (e.g., game / program records, melt / highlight tapes) need to go through the NCAA / T3 Media online footage request system, which can be found at the following website: http://www.t3licensing.com/video/home/ncaa.do.

2019 Media Coverage

The vast majority the Sun Devils' 34 home games will be available to fans via the Pac-12 Network or the Pac-12 Live Stream online and a total of 15 games overall are scheduled to be televised live through the Pac-12 Networks.

The Sun Devil Sports Radio Network is scheduled to broadcast 32 Sun Devil Baseball games this season between NBC Sports Radio AM 1060. Fans can listen to the broadcasts on the radio or via the Tuneln app on the sundevils.com. Links to the streaming audio can be found on the online baseball schedule.

Tim Healey is set to serve his 21st season as the "Voice of the Sun Devils" on baseball broadcasts and will be joined for the third-straight season by color analyst Max Rossiter, who was an all-conference catcher for the Devils from 2012-13.

- ASU's 25-2 start through 27 games is the second-best start in program history.
- ASU's .551 team slugging percentage is second in the NCAA. The Sun Devils are third nationally in runs (268), scoring (9.9), batting average (.336) and on-base percentage (.429).
- ASU has hit 45 home runs this season good for fourth in the league and already nearing its total for the
 entire 2018 season.
- The Sun Devils have scored double digit runs in 12 of the team's 27 games this season. For perspective, ASU scored double digit runs just 8 times in 55 games last season.

- He is leads the team in advancing runners, doing so 48 times on 79 opportunities (.608).
- Spencer Torkelson was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for the Opening Week of the 2019 season. It was the second time in his career earning the honor.
- Defensively, Torkelson has also made impressive strides. He has yet to post an error on 229 chances (4th in the Pac-12) while he leads the league in helping to turn 21 double plays this season.

- Bishop leads the nation with 16 home runs this season seven more than any other player in the Pac-12. He is the national leader in slugging percentage (1.010) and total bases (104) as well.
- The 104 total bases are 31 more than any other player in the Pac-12 (teammate Trevor Hauver has 73).
- Bishop's 41 RBIs this season lead the Pac-12 and are sixth nationally while his
 .417 average is third in the league and 17th nationally. The 41 RBIs are nine
 more than any other player in the Pac-12.
- Bishop has scored 45 runs this season six more than any other player in the Pac-12 and also good for the national lead as well.
- He is also a 10-for-13 on stolen base attempts second in the Pac-12.
 Bishop's .552 on-base percentage is second in the league and 6th in the
 country. He has adrawn a team-best 26 walks third in the Pac-12 and 20th
 nationally.
- Bishop is second on second on the team in advancing teammates 44 times on 72 chances (.611).
- He is the only player that has reached base in each of ASU's 27 games this season and posted the longest hitting streak at 13 games.
- He leads the team with 11 multi-RBI games (two more than any other player) and is second on the squad with 14 multi-hit games.

- Had a streak of 28.1 consecutive innings pitched in series openers/Fridays ended with a solo home run against Arizona.
- Marsh is tied for the national lead with seven victories this season and a perfect 7-0 record.
- His 0.94 ERA is currently 12th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 though
 he has pitched 18 more innings than the league leader. Of 83 pitchers with
 over 40 innings pitched this season, only six have a sub-1.00 ERA, of which
 Marsh is one.
- Marsh has allowed just five earned runs this season, two fewer than any other Pac-12 weekly starter on the year.
- His 42 strikeouts are currently fifth in the league as well.
- Marsh is first among Pac-12 pitchers with 48.0 innings pitched this season.
- Marsh has been absolutely dominant when runners reach base against him, holding opponents to just 10-of-65 hitting (.154) with runners on the base path.
- The junior is not hesistant about pounding the strike zone, recording a first-pitch strike 62.5 percent of the time this season while falling into 2-0 counts just 26 times on 192 batters faced on the year (.135).
- Marsh dominates when getting ahead of the count, holding batters to 1-15 hitting (.067) on 0-2 counts and 2-of-29 hitting (.069) on 1-2 counts with 20 combined strikeouts between the two. 2-2 counts have been deadly when facing Marsh this season, with opponents going 0-for-21 with 13 strikeouts.
- Opponents are just 4-for-35 (.114) against Marsh with runners in scoring position
- Marsh struck out 10 batters on Opening Night, the first time an ASU player had reached double digits in a game since Seth Martinez in March of 2016. Marsh also became the first Sun Devil in at least 20 years to throw 10 strikeouts on Opening Night. Since at least 1998 (as far back as readily accessible records go), no Sun Devil had struck out more than eight batters on Opening Night until Marsh's performance.

#LINSANITY

Lyle Lin has embraced his new role as the team's designated hitter this season,

- currently second the Pac-12 and 48th in the nation with 32 RBIs.
- Lins 32 RBIs are an incredible tally considering the junior had just 18 RBIs total during the 2018 season, despite starting every game. He has multiple RBIs in 8 games.
- Lin is 12-for-16 this season in bringing runners from third home with less than
 two outs, a notable area of struggle for the junior was was just 2-for-12 in the
 category last season despite starting every game in the middle of the lineup.
 The 12 RBIs in that spot this year are five more than any other Sun Devil.
- Lin has advanced baserunners 40 times on 72 chances (.556).
- Lin recorded the game-winning RBI (the RBI that put ASU ahead for the remainder of the game) in all three of ASU's games against UC Davis.
- Lin became the first Sun Devil since 2014 to hit a grand slam with his round-tripper in the second game of the UC Davis series.

Put Me In, Coach

- The consummate team player, fans can expect to find Carter Aldrete all over the diamond this season. Aldrete has seen time in right field, second base, third base and on the mound this season
- Aldrete is currently 6th in the Pac-12 with 29 RBIs this season. Of those 29 RBIs, 16 have come with two outs.
- Has four home runs on the season, already a career-high and tied for 10th in the Pac-12.
- Aldrete is second on the team in advancing runners home from third with less than two outs, doing so 7 times.
- Had a monster game in Game 2 against Notre Dame, posting his first multihome run game of his career while adding a career-best six RBIs in the process.

Just Like He Drew It Up

- Despite missing three weeks to injury, Drew Swift returned to the lineup and continued to show he is one of ASU's most improved hitters.
- He has six doubles this season, already a career-best, despite missing several weeks to injury
- Swift has been a part of 10 double plays this season, despite the time missed, and sits just outside the Top-10 in the Pac-12 in the category.
- Became the first Sun Devil since Jake Peevyhouse in 2014 to have three doubles in a game, doing so against San Diego.

A Lot to Alika

- Alika Williams has quietly continued to put up impressive numbers as a sophomore, embracing his role as a cleanup hitter with a .371 batting average with 28 RBIs - already a career high in the category. He had just 20 total RBIs last season.
- Williams has homered twice this year and recorded nine doubles. He is slugging .526 on the season - just outside the Pac-12's top-10 in the category and nearly .200 points higher than his freshman total of .333.
- The sophomore's nine doubles are already a career high and currently tied for third in the Pac-12.
- Williams is currently 7th in the Pac-12 with a .479 on-base percentage
- Williams is currently 6th in the Pac-12 with 61 defensive assists this season.

Putting in the Work

- On the year, Gage Workman is batting .324 with 21 runs scored, three home runs, a triple and five doubles for a solid .472 slugging percentage.
- After not having a home run in the first four weeks of the year, Workman
 erupted for three in the Washington State series (two coming as a left-handed
 batter and the other as a right-handed batter).
- The sophomore is 13th in the Pac-12 with 55 defensive assists this season.
- Collegiate Baseball News Freshman All-American in 2018
- Collected seven triples as a freshman, tied for the fifth highest total in the country and second on the team behind the national leader in the category, teammate Gage Canning.
- Did not ground into a double play all last season, the only ASU regular that can make that claim.

Filling the Boyd

- Boyd Vander Kooi is current 3-0 on the season and second on the team with 34 strikeouts in 35.2 innings pitched.
- Vander Kooi has 17 strikeouts looking on the season, good for 4th in the Pac-12 Conference while his 34 strikeouts are tied for 12th.
- Vander Kooi is tied for third in the Pac-12 in fewest double allowed, giving up just two this season.
- Made 10 appearances as a freshman last season, including five starts, finishing

the campaign with a 3-3 record.

- His 3.00 ERA tied him for the lowest on the team among those with at least 36 innings pitched as a freshman last season
- Stuck out 35 batters, allowing just 12 earned runs in 36.0 innings pitched.

- Trev Lightly and Carry a Big Stick
 Perhaps no player on the Sun Devil roster has shown as much improvement this season as sophomore Trevor Hauver.
- The leadoff man has a .500 on-base percentage this season a total good for 5th in the Pac-12 and in the Top-50 nationally.
- Hauver has drawn 24 walks on the season currently 5th in the Pac-12 and 38th nationally.
- Hauver is batting .391 on the year, fifth in the Pac-12 and in the Top-50 nationally and has been the the Top ASU player in games in several categories, posting a seven-RBI game, a five-hit game, a four-walk game and a two-home run game.
- He is the only player to record a five-hit game this season, doing so against Long
- Hauver has scored 39 runs this season, second in the league and 6th nationally.
- Hauver has also showed plenty of pop in the bat, second on the team with 7 home runs this season - fourth in the Pac-12.
- As a leadoff batter in an inning, Hauver has reached base 24 times this season on 52 chances (.462).
 - Hauver has been very productive for his teammates as well, successfully advancing runners 31 times on 57 chances (.544). Of ASU's day-to-day starters, Hauver's 14 runners left stranded this season are the fewest on the team.

Pay the Tolman

- Erik Tolman has been thrust into several crucial spots as a true freshman this season and responded best when the lights were on.
- Tolman is 3-0 with a save this season and third on the team with a 1.40 ERA less than 2.0 innings pitched away from being fourth in the Pac-12
- Tolman has struck out 25 batters and in 25.2 innings pitched.
- Opponent's .141 batting average against Tolman this season would be the lowest in the Pac-12 he had 1.2 more innings pitched this season.
- Tolman has allowed just four extra-base hits this season all doubles.

- Chaz Montoya has quickly developed a role as the team's stopper in several crucial scenatios this season.
- Montoya leads the squad with 14 appearances in 27 games, posting a 2.03 ERA in 13.1 innings pitched with 13 strikeouts.
- Montoya has inherited 17 runners this season, allowing just one of them to score
- In his 14 appearances, Montoya has retired the first batter he has seen on 12
- Montoya had a streak of 11 straight games not allowing a run ended in the series finale against Arizona.
- Montoya is 2-0 on the season with a team-high two saves as well.

A Ferri Tale

- Forced to sit on the bench with injury for the majority of his first two seasons, catcher Sam Ferri has quickly established himself as a gamechanger as a regular
- Ferri is batting .291 on the season with 18 RBIs and nine extra-base hits on his 23 total hits this season.
- More importantly has been his effect on the game behind the plate, where he is sixth in the Pac-12 with five runners caught stealing this season and just one error on 180 chances.
- Ferri notched his first career home run in walk-off fashion, a solo shot in the bottom of the ninth to help clinch the series over Washington State.

Sam I Am

- Sam Romero has quietly put up impressive numbers this season, giving ASU solid midweek starts while being able to turn it around and eat some quality innings on the weekends as well.
- In each of the last two weeks, Romero has accounted for both a win (Cal Baptist, Arizona) and a save (Oregon, Arizona).
- Romero is 2-0 with a two saves this year with a 0.99 ERA over 27.1 innings pitched. He is 15th in the nation in ERA and third in the Pac-12 in the category
- Romero has struck out 24 batters to just five walks while allowing just three total earned runs on the year - second in the Pac-12.
- In his last four appearances (2 wins, 2 saves), Romero has stranded 17

Romero is tied for third in the Pac-12 in allowing just two doubles this season.

Opponents are batting just 4-for-26 (.153) against Romero with runners in scoring position.

The Brady Bunch

- Brady Corrigan has quickly asserted himself as one of ASU's go-to players out of the pen, appearing in 14 of ASU's 27 games this season.
 - Corrigan has inherited a team-high 20 runners this season, allowing just three of them to score.
- Corrigan has a 3.22 ERA in 22.1 innings pitched with 30 strikeouts with a 2-0 record and a save while sitting third on the team.

Bend But Don't Break

- Opponents haven't been without their chances to score runs this season, but the Sun Devil defense and pitching rotation have been exceptional on the year in getting out of innings with minimal damage caused.
- ASU has stranded 239 opponent baserunners this season (8.9 per game), including stranding 15+ in games against Washington State and Oregon.
- Opponents are batting just .203 against the Sun Devils with runners in scoring position. Comparitively, ASU is batting .340 against opponents.
- The Sun Devil pitching rotation is holding opponents under .240 hitting on the season with any runners on the basepath.
- Leading that charge is Chaz Montoya (4-for-44, .167), Erik Tolman (5-for-37, .135) and Alec Marsh (10-for-65, .154).

Chicks Dig The Long Ball

- ASU's power numbers this season have been at another level with ASU already posting 45 home runs through 27 games - a total that is currently fourth nationally.
- Nine different Sun Devils have gone yard this season, with seven of those doing so 3 or more times.
- ASU's 44 home runs are 12 more than any other team in the Pac-12 (Cal is second with 33).
- The Devils' .551 slugging percentage as a team is nearly 72 points higher than any other program in the conference.
- ASU had 50 home runs last season, a mark that the current roster is well on pace to demonlish as the season goes on.

On The Ground

- The Sun Devil pitching staff has been exceptional at inducing soft contact this season and allowing balls to go into play for the defense to handle, currently leading the Pac-12 with 1,048 defensive chances this season.
- The frequent groundouts (243) have put the pressure on a Sun Devil defensive infield that had struggled with errors in recent seasons but the group has responded admirably to the extra chances this season.
- ASU has record 278 defensive assists this season, a total that leads the Pac-12.
- The roster has turned 24 double plays on the year, second in the Pac-12 and 12th in the country.
- ASU is 70th nationally in fielding percentage (.973), which is not where the team wants to be but is a far cry from the team that was 230th last season and 184th the season before.

Today's Devils Are Tomorrow's Major Leaguers

- Most players taken in the MLB Draft since 2010 (57)
- ASU's 110 Major Leaguers since 1959 are the most in the nation
- The first-ever player drafted by the MLB was Sun Devil alum Rick Monday
- ASU is the only school at any level to have multiple No. 1 overall picks in June MLB Draft history
- Most unique first round players taken in the June MLB Draft with 20 - (excludes compensation picks and re-draftees)
- Most players drafted in a single year (15 in 2008)
- 437 MLB Draft Picks, more than any other school in the country.

Movin' On Up

 As has become commonplace at Arizona State, five Sun Devils heard their names called in the MLB Draft following the 2018 season. The Sun Devils have had five or more players drafted in 47 of MLB Drafts held since 1956 and five or more players have gotten the call in 14 of the last 16 seasons.

Keeping the Tradition Alive

- Two Sun Devils made their debuts in the MLB during the 2018 season, bringing ASU's total to 110 all-time the most among all NCAA schools since 1959. Ryan Burr (White Sox) and Adam McCreery (Braves) each saw their first Big League action when the rosters explanded this past season.
- The Sun Devils have now had at least one major league player on their varsity roster each year from 1961 through 2015, which is the longest current streak in the nation.
- Thirty-five ASU baseball players have made their MLB debuts since 2002.

Making an Impact

- Since 1999, Sun Devils in the major league have the second-highest WAR among all colleges in the country with a Sun Devil WAR of 152 coming in behind only Long Beach State (214), according to Baseball America.
- The 2008 Sun Devils boasted a trio of eventual first-round picks in 1B lke Davis (2008, 1st round), 3B Brett Wallace (2008, 1st round) and RHP Mike Leake (2009, 8th overall), plus also OF Jason Kipnis (2009, 2nd round). Davis, Leake and Kipnis all had moments in the sun in the big leagues.
- The program's brightest light is 2B Dustin Pedroia (2004, 2nd round). He and OF Andre Ethier (2003, 2nd round) teamed up in 2002 and 2003.
- Pirates RHP Trevor Williams (2013, 2nd round) is the most prominent ASU alum in his peak years.



TRACY SMITH - HEAD COACH - FIFTH SEASON (23rd OVERALL)

Tracy Smith, the 2013 National Coach of the Year, was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014, and enters his fifth season at the helm of the Sun Devil baseball program.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 50 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school.

In 22 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 80 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 73 draftees since 2000 and 33 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 48 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past eight seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In 2018, Smith eclipsed 700 career wins as an NCAA head coach while also overseeing one of the most prolific freshman campaigns in collegiate baseball history as Spencer Torkelson became the first freshman to ever lead the nation in home runs, finishing with 25 on the season.

Torkelson knocked two more home runs than any other player and just one shy of the NCAA freshman record. Torkelson was just the sixth player to reach 25 home runs since the BBCOR batting technology changes took effect in 2011 and the only freshman in the NCAA to reach the milestone in that time.

Against Washington State, he surpassed the previous Sun Devil freshman record of 11 home runs set by Barry Bonds in 1983. Torkelson finished tied with Bob Horner (1978) for second in ASU single-season history, just two shy of Mitch Jones' school record 27 in 2000.

Torkelson slugged .743 on the season (25 homers, 12 doubles), the third-highest total for any freshman in the NCAA in the past two decades and the highest for a freshman in the BBCOR era (since 2011). Only Rickie Weeks (.849 in 2001) and Jeremy Baltz (.771, 2010) have posted higher freshman slugging percentages in the past 20 years.

Smith saw five of his student-athletes taken in the 2018 MLB Draft, including fifth-round selection Gage Canning to the Washington Nationals. Canning wrapped the season as one of the elite five-tool players in the country, finishing with a .369 average and a Pac-12 leading 87 hits on the season. Canning was the national leader in triples with 11, and now has 25 in his career at ASU – good for third in school history and the most since Ed Irvine tied the school record of 26 between 1977-79.

Canning reached base in 54 of 55 games for the Sun Devils this season and logged a hit in 47 of those. He led the team with multiple hits in 26 games and had 11 games with three or more hits, becoming the first Sun Devil player to have at least 10 games with 3+ hits since Brett Wallace did so from 2007-08.

With one more home run, Canning would have become the first player in the BBCOR batting era (since 2011) to record double digit numbers in doubles, triples AND home runs. He finished the season with nine homers, 17 doubles and 11 triples, slugging .648 for the season – good for third in the Pac-12 and 38th nationally.

Defensively, Canning was flawless after shifting to center field and logged just one error on the season on 144 chances for a .993 fielding percentage.

The 2017 campaign saw Canning emerge as one of the elite players in the Pac-12. The California-native led the team in virtually every hitting category, including batting average (.332), runs (37), doubles (12), triples (8), home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.538). He was the only player in the Pac-12 to finish with a double-digit number of doubles while also posting at least six home runs and six triples.

On top of dominating the leader boards at ASU, Canning's eight triples were the most by a player in the conference and second-most in the NCAA. Canning also recorded 120 total bases on the season, good for third in the conference. The outfielder really hit his stride in the middle of the season, as he went on a 12-game tear in which he hit at a .538 clip, including five three-hit nights and a four-hit performance.

Smith also helped oversee the emergence of Hunter Bishop as one of the exciting young freshmen in the country on the year. The freshman finished his 2017 campaign with an impressive .301 batting average, five doubles, four triples and five home runs. He ranked second on the team – behind only Canning – in batting average, runs scored (27), triples, home runs and slugging percentage (.484). Bishop started 31 games in the outfield season to become just the sixth ASU freshman in the past 15 years to start over 50 percent of the season in the outfield, most recently done by Canning last season. His 10 multi-RBI games were also a team-best.

In 2016, Smith piloted the Sun Devils to a regional final for the first time since 2013. The Sun Devils' 36 wins were the most in the previous three years and they finished tied for third in the Pac-12. Five players were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft, marking 14 total players who have been taken in the draft during Smith's tenure.

Eight Devils earned All-Pac-12 honors on the season, including first team selections David Greer, Seth Martinez, Brian Serven and Colby Woodmansee. All four players would go on to be selected in the MLB draft with Greer (third team), Martinez (second team) and Woodmansee (third team) earning Louisville Slugger All-America accolades.

HFAD COACH

In his first season at ASU, Smith led the Sun Devils to a postseason berth, a third-place finish in the Pac-12 and 30-plus wins.

He became one of five active coaches, and one of eight all-time, to bring three different Div. I schools to NCAA Regional play as he guided the Sun Devils to a No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional in 2015.

A exceptional recruiter, Smith was instrumental in Sun Devil Baseball's signing of the nation's top recruiting class in 2016, which included eight players who had been drafted by the Major League out of high school. His 2017 class was also rated in the Top-5 nationally and was the No. 1 class in the West.

He has amassed a 698-535-1 career record in 21 seasons as a head coach at three different schools, including nine seasons at both Miami (Ohio) and Indiana, and one year at Arizona State. His 698 victories rank in the top 50 among active coaches in the NCAA, and his 21 seasons represent the sixth-fewest number of years on that list.

Smith instituted a change in culture at Arizona State and his demand for excellence both on and off the field was represented as the Devils led the Pac-12 in both all-conference and all-academic honorees in 2014.

Nineteen players have earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors in Smith's first two seasons, tied for the most in Sun Devil history for a two-year span. ASU's 10 selections in Smith's first season led the Pac-12.

His emphasis on defense became evident right away as ASU vastly improved its fielding percentage and lowered its number of errors committed in Smith's first season. The Devils finished fourth in the Pac-12 in both categories in 2015 after ranking near the bottom of the conference from 2010-14.

An accomplished fundraiser, Smith played a huge role in helping transition the Sun Devil Baseball program into Phoenix Municipal Stadium. His vision saw a renovated clubhouse, complete with an alumni locker room and an academics center, as well as an increased prominence on the program's historical accomplishments. Capital improvements included a state-of-the art video board, batting tunnel, a weight room and training room, creation of a grass berm and patio installations, and premium seating options. Smith also played a huge role in facility upgrades at both Indiana University and Miami (Ohio) and was instrumental in the approval and design of both Miami's Stanley G. McKie Field at Joseph P. Hayden Jr. Park and Indiana's Bart Kaufman Field.

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

Smith came to Tempe with 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach, including nine at Miami University (Ohio) and nine at IU, where he was two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year. He led both programs to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances and more than 600 combined career victories.

He tallied more than 40 wins in his final two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.

Smith took an IU program that had finished 10th in the Big Ten six times in an eight-year stretch between 2000 and 2007, and led the Hoosiers to an NCAA Regional in 2009 and to the College World Series in 2013. IU notched a program-best 21 conference wins in 2014 and secured eight first team All-Big Ten selections to tie a conference mark for most first team honorees from one school.

Smith's Academic Progress Rate as a head coach increased each season until it reached a perfect 1000 in two-year stretch between 2008-10.

IU saw eight players on 12 occasions be named All-Americans under Smith, including four in 2014, which was the highest total in program history and the second straight season that IU produced three or more All-Americans.

Smith mentored two Big Ten Players of the Year, three Big Ten Pitchers of the Year and a pair of Big Ten Freshman of the Year in nine seasons at IU, and at least one Hoosier earned Freshman All-America honors in six of the past seven seasons in Bloomington.

He has landed three players on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team and mentored numerous players at all positions, including outfielder Alex Dickerson, who was named Big Ten Player of the Year and won the Big Ten Triple Crown in 2010, right-handed pitcher Aaron Slegers, who was named 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, and catcher Kyle Schwarber, who was named an All-American by five major college baseball groups in 2014.


In nine years at the helm of the RedHawks baseball program, Smith compiled eight straight 30-win seasons, two NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals six times.

He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.


