USC TO HOST 2019 PAC-12 CONFERENCE WOMEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

GENERAL INFORMATION

WHAT: Pac-12 Conference Women's Golf Championship (33rd Annual)

WHEN: Monday-Wednesday, April 15-17, 2019

HOST: USC will host the 54-hole Championship

COURSE: Palos Verdes Golf Club, Palos Verdes Estates, Calif.
Par 71 (35-36), 6,131yards

WHO: Women's golf teams from 11 Pac-12 institutions will compete for bragging rights at the 2019 Pac-12 Women's Golf Championship.

ADMISSION: Admission to the 2019 Pac-12 Championship is free.

MEDIA CONTACT: USC's Paul Goldberg (pgoldber@usc.edu) and the Pac-12's Dave Hirsch (dhirsch@pac-12.org) will serve as the media contacts for the 2019 Pac-12 Women's Golf Championship. Championship information, including schedules and tee times, the event program, results, news and records are available on the Pac-12's golf championship website (<http://pac-12.com/womens-golf/championships>).

TELEVISION: Pac-12 Networks will air live coverage of the finishing holes in the final round of the championships on Wednesday, April 17 at 2 p.m. PT.

PRACTICE ROUND: Teams will participate in a practice round on Sunday, April 14 beginning at 8:30 a.m. Student-athletes and coaches will be available to the media following the practice round.

OFF THE TEE... #Pac12Golf

USC will serve as host of the 33rd Annual Pac-12 Women's Golf Championships at Palos Verdes Golf Club in Palos Verdes Estates, Calif., April 15-17. Only three times in the previous 32 Pac-12 Women's Golf Championships has the host team also captured the team title - 1999 Stanford (Stanford Golf Course), 2004 UCLA (Saticoy CC, Somis, Calif.) and 2008 USC (Palos Verdes Golf Club) ... The Pac-12 features six top 20 teams (*Golfweek* rankings) in No. 2 USC, No. 3 STANFORD, No. 9 UCLA, No. 11 ARIZONA, No. 15 ARIZONA STATE and No. 19 WASHINGTON ... According to Golfstat rankings, the Pac-12 boasts five of the nation's top 12 individuals in Stanford's **Andrea Lee**, UCLA's **Mariel Galdiano**, USC's **Jennifer Chang**, UCLA's **Patty Tavatanakit** and Stanford's **Albane Valenzuela**.

No. 2 USC - The Trojans have posted nine top-3 finishes in as many tournaments this season with five wins, a second-place finish and three third-place finishes ... Four Trojans boast scoring averages under 73.00 - **Jennifer Chang** (72.00), **Malia Nam** (72.29), **Alyaa Abdulghany** (72.47) and **Gabriela Ruffels** (72.82) ... Chang, Abdulghany and Ruffels have each finished atop the leaderboard this season ... Chang has six top-10 finishes, Nam has five top-10 placings, while Ruffels has posted four top-10 finishes.

No. 3 STANFORD - The Cardinal has posted five top-five finishes, including each of the last four events with a pair of wins at the Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge and the Bruin Wave Invitational ... A veteran team, five of Stanford's top six players are either a junior or senior ... Juniors **Andrea Lee** (71.38 avg) and **Albane Valenzuela** (72.44 avg) pace the Cardinal. Lee posted a win at the PING/ASU Invitational. It was her eighth career win, tying the Stanford mark held by Mhairi McKay (1994-97).

No. 9 UCLA - The defending Pac-12 champions were the only team to go under par at last year's championships ... The Bruins will need to defend their title without Lilia Vu who tied for medalist honors with teammate **Patty Tavatanakit**. Vu turned professional after earning her LPGA tour card in the fall ... Junior **Mariel Galdiano** (71.75 avg) has four top-10 finishes, including wins at the Golfweek Conference Challenge and the Stanford Intercollegiate. Tavatanakit (71.63 avg) also has four top-10 finishes during her sophomore campaign, which includes a season-opening victory at the ANNIKA Intercollegiate ... Senior **Beth Wu** (73.42 avg) claimed a win this season as she tied for medalist honors at the PING/ASU Invitational.

No. 11 ARIZONA - The defending national champions won three tournaments this season and finished third three times. Junior **Bianca Pagdangan** (72.77 avg) and freshman **Yu-Sang Hou** (72.91 avg) pace the Wildcats this season. Pagdangan topped the field at the El Tigre Invitational with a 9-under 207 and finished in the top five in three other tournaments. Hou tied for medalist honors at the Pac-12 Preview and posted three runner-up finishes. Junior **Haley Moore** (73.77 avg) has posted four top 15 finishes, including each of the last three tournaments.

No. 15 ARIZONA STATE - The Sun Devils finished among the top-five six times this season, including a victory at the Wildcat Invitational and three runner-up finishes, most recently the PING/ASU Invitational ... Junior **Olivia Mehaffey** (72.85 avg) has four top-10 finishes in 9 events, including a win at the Bruin Wave ... Sophomore **Raquel Olmos** (73.71 avg) has posted a pair of top-10 finishes, including second place honors at the Windy City (-9).

No. 19 WASHINGTON - Senior **Wenyung Keh** (72.95 avg) paces the Huskies with nine of her 21 rounds under par and has posted five top-15 finishes in seven events ... Senior **Sarah Rhee** (73.79 avg) has three top-10 finishes and has claimed the lone individual victory for the Huskies when she topped the field at the Edean Ihlanfeldt Invite (8-under 208) ... Senior **Julianne Alvarez** (73.63 avg) claims a pair of top-10 finishes.

OREGON - The Ducks have finished fifth or better in six of nine tournaments, including a pair of second-place outings at the recent Bruin Wave and Wildcat Invitational ... Sophomore **Petra Salko** (73.39 avg) has finished in the top-10 in three of her last four outings, including a second-place finish at the Bruin Wave ... Senior **Kathleen Scavo** (73.69 avg) has three top-8 finishes in three of her last four events, including a tie for fourth in the recent Sliverado Showdown ... Freshman **Tze-Han Lin** recorded Oregon's lone individual victory this season when she tied for medalist honors at the Pac-12 Preview.

OREGON STATE - The Beavers have posted six top-5 team finishes, including a victory at the Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational ... Sophomore **Ellie Slama** (71.69 avg) has posted top-12 finishes in eight of nine outings this season, including a victory at the Trinity Forest Invitational. Slama has posted par or better in 20 of 26 rounds. Senior **Olivia Benzin** (72.77 avg), has lowered her stroke average by nearly two strokes from last season. Benzin has three top-4 finishes and has shot par or better in five of her last seven rounds.

CALIFORNIA - The Golden Bears finished second in four of their last six tournaments ... Senior **Cindy Oh** (72.83 avg) has posted three top-five finishes. She's improved her scoring average from last season by nearly four strokes (76.4 avg in 2017-18) ... Freshman **Katherine Zhu** (73.16 avg) has posted five top-10 finishes.

COLORADO - Six top-10 finishes in eight tournaments for the Buffaloes in 2018-19 ... The Buffs look to overcome the departure of Robyn Choi who earned her LPGA tour card after the fall season ... Senior **Kristy Hodgkins** (74.00 avg) has posted the team's low score in six of the last eight tournaments. Her top finish being a third-place showing at the Pac-12 Preview.

WASHINGTON STATE - The Cougars have finished in the top-8 in four events ... Junior **Marie Lund-Hansen** (73.56 avg) and senior **Madison Odiorne** (74.30 avg) lead Washington State. Lund-Hansen had her best outing of the season at the Dr. Donnis Thompson Invitational where she finished 3-over 219 to finish tied for second

AUGUSTA NATIONAL WOMEN'S AMATEUR: Eleven Pac-12 golfers were among the field of 72 who participated in the inaugural Augusta National Women's Amateur last week. **Yu-Sang Hou** and **Haley Moore** of Arizona; **Sofia Anokhina**, **Alessandra Fanali** and **Olivia Mehaffey** of Arizona State; **Ellie Slama** of Oregon State; **Andrea Lee** of Stanford; **Alyaa Abdulghany**, **Jennifer Chang** and **Allisen Corpuz** of USC; **Wenyung Keh** of Washington. The first two rounds were played at the Champions Retreat. After the 36-hole cut, the top 32 players took on the fabled Augusta National for the final round. Moore was the top finisher among the Pac-12 golfers, posting even-par to tie for seventh.

ANNIKA AWARD: The ANNIKA Award presented by Stifel, is presented annually to the top female U.S. collegiate golfer; the winner voted on by players, coaches and members of the golf media. Named for and presented by former University of Arizona golfer Annika Sorenstam, the ANNIKA Award is comprised of two primary components: a silver pedestal, which will display a commemorative plaque listing each yearly winner; and a hand-crafted, glass presentation trophy presented to the winner, with a copy given to the player's College or University. In the five years of the award, a Pac-12 golfer has been the recipient twice - UCLA's Alison Lee (2014) and Bronte Law (2016). The Pac-12 was well represented on the March ANNIKA Award Watch List with five among the top 10 and seven among the top 20 - No. 1 **Andrea Lee**, STAN; No. 3 **Patty Tavatanakit**, UCLA; No. 4 **Mariel Galdiano**, UCLA; No. 5 **Albane Valenzuela**, STAN; **Yu-Sang Hou**, ARIZ; No. 12 **Malia Nam**, USC; No. 15 **Gabriela Ruffels**, USC.

PALMER CUP: Five Pac-12 golfers were tabbed to participate in the 2019 Palmer Cup. UCLA's **Mariel Galdiano** and USC's **Jennifer Chang** and **Malia Nam** represent the United States, while UCLA's **Patty Tavatanakit** and Stanford's **Albane Valenzuela** will represent the International team. The annual Ryder Cup-style competition will be played July 7-9 at The Alotian Club in Roland, Ark.

TOURNAMENT SCORING: The top-four individuals from each team with the lowest scores for any 18-hole round constitute the scoring members of the five member team for that given round. The team championship will be awarded to the squad with the lowest total combined score for all rounds.

RECAPPING THE 2018 SEASON

UCLA collected its seventh Pac-12 Conference title, posting a 54-hole total of 860 (-4), to claim the league crown. With a decisive 12-stroke victory over runner-up USC (291-288-293-872), the Bruins claimed the seventh largest margin of victory in the tournament's 31-year history. The Bruins claimed the top two spots in the individual race as well with freshman **Patty Tavatanakit** and sophomore **Lilia Vu** both posting a score of 8-under for the tournament, with Tavatanakit taking the top spot in dramatic fashion through a one-hole playoff.

The high-caliber of Pac-12 women's golf was evident on selection day for the NCAA Regionals as 10 teams earned postseason bids. Six teams earned a seed of No. 4 or higher (ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE, STANFORD, UCLA USC, WASHINGTON). Five teams (ARIZONA, STANFORD, UCLA, USC, WASHINGTON) advanced to the NCAA Championships where Arizona, Stanford, UCLA, and USC qualified for Match Play. The Wildcats knocked off UCLA, Stanford, and Alabama to capture their third NCAA title, and first since 2000. Wildcat junior **Haley Moore** sunk a clutch birdie putt on the first playoff hole to secure the NCAA team title for Arizona. It was the 19th women's NCAA golf title for the Pac-12.

UCLA junior **Lilia Vu** was named both the Pac-12 Women's Golfer of the Year and the WGCA Player of the Year. UCLA's **Patty Tavatanakit** secured Freshman of the Year honors and was named WGCA Freshman of the Year. UCLA's **Carrie Forsyth** was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year after guiding the Bruins to the 2018 Pac-12 championship, and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA tournament.

Stanford's **Andrea Lee** and UCLA's duo of Vu and Tavatanakit were honored by both the WGCA and Golfweek as First Team All-America selections, while both the WGCA and *Golfweek* bestowed second team honors to Arizona State's **Olivia Mehaffey**, USC's **Jennifer Chang**, and UCLA's **Mariel Galdiano**. *Golfweek* also tabbed third team honors to Colorado's **Robyn Choi**, Arizona's Moore, and Stanford's **Albane Valenzuela**. USC's **Andrea Gaston** picked up Coach of the Year honors by *Golfweek*.

NCAA REGIONALS: May 6-8, 2019. The NCAA Women's Golf Committee will select 72 teams and 24 individuals for regional competition including automatic qualifiers (27) and at-large teams (45). The selections will be announced Wednesday, April 24. The low six teams and three individuals not on those teams will advance to the finals. The regional sites are as follows:

Auburn University Club, Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, host)
Tumble Creek Golf Club, Cle Elum, Wash. (University of Washington, host)
Forest Akers Golf Courses-West, East Lansing, Mich. (Michigan State University, host)
Jimmie Austin OU Golf Club, Norman, Okla. (University of Oklahoma, host)

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: May 17-22, 2019 – The Blessings Golf Club, Fayetteville, Ark. (University of Arkansas, host). All 24 teams and 12 individuals will complete 54 holes of stroke play. Following 54 holes of competition, the top 15 teams along with the top nine individuals not on an advancing team will advance for one additional day of stroke play to determine the top eight teams for match-play competition and the 72-hole stroke-play individual champion. The top eight teams after 72 holes of play will be placed into a bracket with the No. 1 seed playing the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed versus the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed versus the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed versus the No. 5 seed competing in match play. A total of five points will be available with one point being awarded for each individual match. Winning teams will advance to the semifinals and subsequently the finals. The first team to win three points within a match will advance, or in the case of the final match be declared the national champion.

NCAA SUCCESS... The Pac-12 has won 19 NCAA team titles, while 16 different individuals have garnered medalist honors. Bring on Match Play... In the four years since the NCAA went to the Match Play format for its championship, the Pac-12 is a perfect 4-0, with national titles coming from four different members - Stanford (2015), Washington (2016), Arizona State (2017) and Arizona (2018).
