#### Opponent Outlook

No. 39 Oregon State (1-1)

- Oregon State opened the 2021 season with two-straight meets at home, starting with a loss to Boise State and following that up with a win over Washington last weekend.
- The Beavers scored above 49.000 for the first time this season against Washington last Saturday, surpassing that mark on vault and floor in the victory to open Pac-12 play.
- The Gym Devils are looking for their first win over the Beavers since 2006. The last matchup in Tempe was a narrow loss for ASU, finishing just .025 below OSU.

#### Player of the Week

The Gym Devils earned two Pac-12 weekly awards with sophomore Hannah Scharf being named the gymnast of the week and freshman Jada Mangahas getting the coaches choice. For Scharf, this is her second conference weekly award after being named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week in 2020. Additionally, this is the first time a Sun Devil earned the Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week title since 2009 when Beate Jones got the nod.

Freshman Sarah Clark was named the Pac-12 Freshman/Newcomer of the Week after her strong performance in the win over No. 10 BYU last weekend.

#### Oh, Canada

Sophomore Hannah Scharf, from Ontario, Canada, has been shining bright for the Gym Devils. She is currently ranked No. 14 in the all-around on Road to Nationals. At UCLA, she won the all-around title and did not score less than a 9.850 in any event. She had the best meet of her career last week against BYU, earning career highs in the all-around (39.500), on beam (9.925) and on floor (9.900). She won all three of those titles as well.

#### Cairo: All-American & History-Maker

Entering her senior season, she is coming off of another strong year where she won seven event titles and eight scores of 9.900 or better, the most of any Gym Devil. She scored a 9.950 on bars against Washington, the highest score by any ASU gymnast in 2020. On Road to Nationals, she finished the season ranked No. 19 on the uneven bars. Additionally, she earned Pac-12 honors for bars, her third-straight season being recognized by the conference.

In addition to her strong performances, Leonard-Baker brings strong postseason experience. She has advanced to the NCAA championships as an individual in 2018 (all-around) and in 2019 (uneven bars). In 2019, she scored a 9.900 to earn second-team All-America honors on top of her regular season All-America nod that season.

#### Returners

Arizona State returns a strong group of 11 returners in 2021, let by three-time All-American Cairo Leonard-Baker. Three sophomores competed in the all-around in multiple meets last season: Juliette Boyer, Gracie Reeves and Hannah Scharf. Their contributions were significant, with 12 event titles between the three. They also earned five scores of 9.900 or better, two from Boyer (one on floor and one on bars), one from Reeves (vault) and one from Scharf (vault). Both Boyer

and Scharf were named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week once during the season, and Boyer and Reeves both earned Pac-12 honorable mention nods in the all-around.

Of the 11 returners, nine have made lineups for various events. Junior Megan Thompson was a staple in the beam lineup, leading off almost every meet. She also saw time on the floor, often leading off in that lineup as well. Sophomore Isabel Redmond competed on vault, bars and beam in different meets. Additionally, sophomore Jordyn Jaslow will return form injury ready to compete for the first time with strong talent ready to showcase.

#### **Newcomers**

Seven freshmen join the Gym Devils in 2021 with a plethora of skill and experience to bring to the lineup. With a total of 21 new routines between them, the freshmen are ready to compete. The Gym Devil fans will see a lot of this talented group of newcomers in 2021.

Three freshmen have the potential to compete in the all-around: Cassi Barbanente, Jada Mangahas and Emily White. With strong J.O. Nationals experience, Barbenente and Sarah Clarke bring depth to the lineup, with Clarke focusing on bars, beam and floor. On vault, Anaya Smith has a 10.0 start value that the Gym Devils look forward to showcasing, as well as a strong floor routine. Skye Harper and Cienna Samiley will both contribute as well, Harper on beam and floor and Samiley on bars and beam.

#### **Preaseason Rankings**

Sun Devil Gymnastics earned a No. 21 preseason ranking in the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA) preseason poll, matching their final ranking of the 2020 season.

ASU was picked to finish in sixth place in the Pac-12 Women's Gymnastics Preseason Coaches Poll. In 2020, the Gym Devils finished the regular season in fourth. Utah was picked to finish on top.

#### **Last Season**

When the 2020 campaign was canceled prior to the last regular season meet of the year due to COVID precautions, Arizona State had a 7-6-1 record, the second season in a row with a winning record. The Sun Devils wrapped up the year ranked No. 21 after jumping 13 spots from the second-to-last week of the season. The Sun Devils also finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings. Four of those wins came against ranked opponents, including a win over No. 10 Cal, Arizona State's first ranked win over a top-10 opponent since 2014.

The Gym Devils scored a 196.000-plus five times, including the last four meets in a row of the season. Two of those scores are in the top 20 team scores in the ASU record book. The best team score was a 196.875, which Arizona State scored in a tie with No. 13 Washington. The team scored a 9.900 or better 16 times in 2020, five coming from freshman.

Vice President for University Athletics and Athletics Director Ray Anderson named Jay Santos the head women's gymnastics coach on May 27, 2016.

In his fourth season as the head coach in 2020, Santos helped a young team, with seven making their collegiate debuts, reach new heights. They finished with a winning record (7-6-1) for the second-straight season, including a win over No. 10 Cal. Due to COVID-19 concerns, the season was cut short the week before the Pac-12 Championship, meaning NCAA regionals did not happen as well. However, the team went out on a high note, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

Santos led the Gym Devils to a another successful season in 2019, the first since 2014 to have a winning record (11-10) in the regular season. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. They scored a 196.000 or better six times and had a team RQS (Regional Qualifying Score) of 196.320 at the end of the year. To start off the postseason, the Sun Devils took fifth at the Pac-12 Gymnastics Championships, the best team finish since 2006. The team qualified for their second-straight trip to NCAA Regionals. Cairo Leonard-Baker qualified for nationals as an individual on bars, earning Second Team All-America honors.

Santos has led ASU to arguably one of the most substantial turnarounds in recent collegiate gymnastics history. In his first season as head coach in 2017, Santos quickly elevated the program. The Gym Devils scored 195 in four separate meets, the first time that has happened since the 2014 season. Santos' 2018 squad improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, capping the season ranked at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). Ranking in the top-20 of the national standings for 12 consecutive weeks, Arizona State made its first team NCAA regional appearance since 2014 while sending individual all-around qualifier and regular season All-American Cairo Leonard-Baker to nationals. Courtesy of his efforts at the helm of the program, Santos was named the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

Santos coached Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation – the highest national ranking in the history of the program. He earned NCAA Central Regional Head Coach of the Year honors.

Santos has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Ohio State. Santos also spent eight years coaching at Somersault Gymnastics Center in Stoughton, Mass., serving as the women's team director and head coach for his last four years. Santos served as a nationally-rated men's gymnastics judge from 1997-2001, working numerous college dual meets as well as Junior Olympic state and regional championships.

Santos earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration in Operations Management from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1995, and was a member of the Minutemen's gymnastics team from 1990-95. At Amherst, he was a three-time co-captain and founding member of the department's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

Santos' wife, Jessica Santos, serves as the Sun Devil gymnastics program's associate head coach. They have two sons, Mason and Cooper.



Jessica Santos was named associate head coach for Sun Devil Gymnastics on May 27, 2016, joining her husband Jay Santos, who was named head coach of the Sun Devil Gymnastics program on the same day.

Since joining the team, Santos has helped bring Arizona State to new heights. In her fourth season with the program, Santos helped a young team finish with a winning record (7-6-1) for the second-straight season, including a win over No. 10 Cal. Due to COVID-19 concerns, the season was cut short the week before the Pac-12 Championship, meaning NCAA regionals did not happen as well. However, the team went out on a high note, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

In 2019, the team earned the first winning record (11-10) in the regular season since 2014. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. In 2018, the team improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, finishing the season at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). All-American Cairo Leonard-Baker has qualified for nationals in each of her two seasons. In 2017, they had the best season since 2014, capping it off by scoring the best Pac-12 team total since 2004.

Santos helped coach Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation – the highest national ranking in the history of the program. She has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Pittsburgh.

Jessica earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees in Athletic Coaching Education at West Virginia University in 2005 and 2007, respectively. She competed for the Mountaineers from 2001-05 and was the last gymnast at WVU to score a perfect 10.0 in competition. Jessica then served as the Mountaineers' volunteer assistant coach during the 2006 season. A member of the National Association of Women's Gymnastics Judges, Jessica has been a Certified Level 10 judge since 2007.

Jess and Jay Santos have two sons, Mason and Cooper.

Kristin White was named the new assistant coach for the Gym Devils on May 26, 2020. After two seasons as an assistant coach at Iowa State, White is moving to the desert. Her primary responsibilities with the Cyclones were balance beam and floor, including choreographing floor routines.

During her three years at Iowa State, she helped the team finish ranked in the top 25 each season. In 2020, the team ended the year ranked No. 16 on floor, moving up 23 spots from where they finished the previous year. On beam, the Cyclones finished at No. 24 on beam in 2020, improving nine spots from 2019's No. 33 rank.

After graduating from Oklahoma in May 2010 with her Bachelor's Degree in Human Relations, White stayed in Norman, and joined the OU coaching staff as a graduate assistant. She graduated with her Master's Degree in Adult and Higher Education in 2012.

As a student-athlete at Oklahoma, White helped lead Oklahoma to a trio of Big 12 team championships from 2008-10, and a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2010. That season, White closed out her OU gymnastics career with a pair of All-America honors on balance beam and in floor exercise.

White is from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Her husband is Trent White and they have two dogs, Jake and Bella.
