THE GAME - Sun Devil Football returns to Tempe for a two-game home stand beginning this weekend against the No. 21 USC Trojans on Saturday, Oct. 28 at Sun Devil Stadium. The tilt has huge Pac-12 South ramifications on the line with the winner taking possession of first in the league. The contest will kickoff at approximately 7:45 p.m. Arizona Time and will be broadcast live on ESPN.

THE TROJANS - The Trojans lead the all-time series against Arizona State, 21-12, though seven of ASU's victories in the series have come in games played in Tempe. The Sun Devils are looking for their fourth victory over USC in the last seven contests and the third victory at home in the last four.

The Trojan offense, which averages more than 450 total yards and almost 32 points, gets its production from the arm of QB Sam Darnold (already in USC's career Top 10 in passing and total offense as just a sophomore), the legs of TB Ronald Jones II (averaging 6.2 yards per carry in his carry) and the hands of WRs Deontay Burnett (Top 25 nationally in receiving TDs, receiving yards and receptions), Steven Mitchell Jr. and Tyler Vaughns. USC's defense is led by ILB Cameron Smith (on his way to leading USC in tackles for the second consecutive year), DL Christian Rector (the Pac-12 leader in sacks and recovered fumbles), OLB Uchenna Nwosu and SS Chris Hawkins and Marvell Tell III.

THE PAC-12 - Both teams control their own destiny in the Pac-12 South title race heading into the weekend, with Saturday's winner settling into first place in the division while both have contender Arizona remaining on the schedule.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- » Be the 600th in program history.
- » Be the fourth win over the Trojans in the last 7 contests after USC won 11 straight from 2000-2010
- » Improve ASU to 8-10 against USC at home with wins in three of the last four home games against the Trojans.
- » Give ASU at least a share of first in the Pac-12 South standings.
- » Improve the Devils to 29-9 in games played at Sun Devil Stadium since 2012.
- » Give ASU its 11th win against a team ranked in the AP Poll since 2012 (currently 10-11), after winning just 5 such games from 1998-2011. 11 wins would tie USC for the fourth highest total in the Pac-12 since 2012.
- » Give ASU its first three-game winning streak in Pac-12 games since 2014 (USC, Stanford, Washington, Utah).
- » Be the first time ASU has defeated both USC and Oregon in the same season since 1997.

General

The Sun Devil Athletics media relations staff understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. We pride ourselves in being able to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Sun Devil Football media relations staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the media relations department.

Practice Policies

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Viewing periods will operate under the same procedures as in 2016 for practices that occur at ASU's indoor facility, The Dickey Dome. Only members of the media will be allowed to view the open portions of those practices in the facility. Members of the media will enter the facility once the team has completely entered.

For those wishing to shoot still photography or video tape practices, ASU will allow you to shoot approximately 30 minutes of each practice, unless the drill is team-related and as long as the footage does not include play signals. This is the same policy that used in Spring drills, 2017 and Fall practices, 2016. This period will begin at approximately 9:35 a.m. and end at approximately 10:05 a.m.

Viewing periods are always subject to the discretion of the Sun Devil Football coaching staff and may change suddenly. Following that open viewing period, the members of the media will be escorted out of the facility and reconvene near the end of the practice period at southeast entrance of Sun Devil Stadium for post-practice interviews. Under no circumstances will Periscope technology be permitted.

Interview Policies

All interviews will be conducted post-practice at the new Student-Athlete Facility, located at the north end of Sun Devil Stadium. Additional information on this will come at a later date. Due to high demand, several players and members of the coaching staff might only be available on a limited basis each week. A full availability schedule will be provided to the media each week.

Special in-season interview policies for Head Coach Todd Graham, coordinators Billy Napier and Phil Bennett and selected players will follow at a later date.

All other interviews must be arranged through the Media Relations office. Under no circumstances are members of the media allowed to contact a student-athlete or member of the coaching staff without first contacting a member of the Media Relations staff. All coaches and student-athletes have been encouraged to check in with the Media Relations staff and not indulge any interview requests that have not been arranged through the

proper channels. Every possible attempt will be made to accommodate all media requests.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the media room at the new Student-Athlete Facility in the North end zone for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

Please note that there is a new NCAA rule in effect for 2017-18 that states that every NCAA athletic team must take one day off per week from all team-related activities, including practice, weight training, conditioning, meetings, interviews, etc. This means that one day per week (Monday for Sun Devil football) we will not be allowed to conduct interviews as per NCAA rule. Since this is an NCAA rule and will be monitored by compliance personnel there can be no exceptions made.

Weekly Press Conferences

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Coach Graham will not be available following practice.

All press conferences will be streamed live via the Pac-12 website at <http://pac-12.com/live/arizona-state-university>.

Credentials

Media credentials for Sun Devil home games for the 2017 football season will be handled online through Sports Systems. For access to the online portal request system, please contact Doug Tammaro (tammaro@asu.edu). For road games, please contact Mark Brand (mark.brand@asu.edu) for more information.

Photography/Videography

Media wishing to document practice via photograph or video will be able to do so during this time, so long as said documentation does not record play-calling signals. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice.

For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

Weekly Media Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season. Coach Graham is scheduled to speak at 12:05 PT/1:05 MT each Tuesday. The teleconferences will be recorded and available at Pac-12.com that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

Live Broadcasts

It is not permissible for any non-rightsholder to broadcast over the air, stream over the internet (audio or video), or transmit in any other way, any live event without the consent of the Sun Devil Athletics Department. Live events include varsity contests, press conferences (including but not limited to weekly scheduled and postgame press conferences) and any other group media availability. Exceptions may be made for any major news-breaking event and will be communicated in the media advisory for the event.

Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at <http://video.pac-12.com>).

News Outlet Highlight Policy

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage – on their television newscasts only – for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.



ON THE AIR

Hear the hometown call with broadcaster Tim Healey and color analyst Jeff Van Raaphorst as well as sideline reporter Derek Hagan providing all the action for Sun Devil Football this season. The hometown broadcasts are boosted by Bonneville's powerful sports/talk lineup of Arizona Sports 98.7 FM, ESPN Phoenix 620 AM and 92.3 KTAR News FM. This week's game broadcast will be broadcast on ESPN Phoenix 620 AM.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

The Sun Devils will be featured on national television for the third weekend in a row on Saturday with the team's second ESPN broadcast in three weeks. Beth Mowins will be on the call alongside analyst Anthony Becht while Rocky Boiman will provide insight from the sideline.

The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2017 for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

LAST TIME - USC - 2016

LOS ANGELES (AP) -- Sam Darnold passed for 352 yards and three touchdowns in his first home start, and USC emerged from its rough start to the season with a 41-20 victory over Arizona State on Saturday night.

JuJu Smith-Schuster caught seven passes for 123 yards and a career-high tying three TDs for the Trojans (2-3, 1-2 Pac-12), who emphatically avoided their first 0-3 start to conference play since 2001 with a blowout of the previously unbeaten Sun Devils (4-1, 1-1).

USC racked up 34 consecutive points to take a 41-6 lead during the middle two quarters, and Smith-Schuster scored on catches of 5, 3 and 67 yards. Justin Davis had a 37-yard TD run among his 123 yards rushing for the Trojans.

Arizona State lost starting quarterback Manny Wilkins shortly before halftime when he was hurt while getting sacked by Rasheem Green. Wilkins watched the second half on crutches with a walking boot on his left foot, but coach Todd Graham provided no postgame information on the injury.

After averaging 48.8 points in their first four games, the Sun Devils didn't reach the end zone against USC's inspired defense until Brady White threw a 13-yard TD pass to Raymond Epps with 8:37 to play.

#BYTHENUMBERS

95

ASU is sixth nationally in converting on **95.83 percent of its red zone appearances this season (23-of-24)**, however, the Devils took a knee in the final seconds of the team's victory over fifth-ranked Washington in the red zone - the lone 'blemish' to the team's total this season. The Devils sit 13th nationally in red zone touchdown scoring with 18 touchdowns on those 24 attempts (75.00). The Sun Devils scored on 43-of-47 trips to the red zone in 2016 (91.5 percent), a total that ranked 10th in the nation.

ASU has **16 interception returns for touchdowns under Graham**, compared to posting just four total in the three previous seasons prior to 2012. The total is tied with Ohio State for first in the nation in that time. ASU has added four fumble return touchdowns as well for 20 defensive touchdowns since the 2012 season, good for fourth in the country in that time span behind Ohio State (25), Alabama (22) and Boise State (21). ASU has forced 137 total turnovers since 2012, good for the 17th-highest total nationally.

The Sun Devils are currently **12th nationally in averaging 33:08 minutes of possession a game**, a total that also leads the Pac-12. ASU has 13 scoring drives this season that have lasted 4+ minutes after having just 10 in the entirety of 2016. ASU had just eight scoring drives longer than four minutes in 2015. 9 of the last 13 Sun Devil scoring drives have been 10+ plays compared to just 3 of the first 21 scoring drives this season. ASU had 15 scoring drives last 10+ plays in the entirety of 2016 and is already at 16 this year.

Brandon Ruiz is tied for first among all freshmen kickers in the country with **11 field goals made this season** - good for 21st overall. Ruiz became the first Sun Devil in school history to kick two or more field goals longer than 50 yards in their freshman season. The true freshman is currently ninth nationally in touchback percentage (76.19 percent) and is 8th nationally with 32 total touchbacks. Ruiz is tied for first among all freshmen kickers in the country with 11 field goals this season and is 21st among all kickers.

The Sun Devil pass defense has been on fire in recent weeks, allowing fewer than 200 opponent passing yards in **three consecutive games**. To put that in perspective - ASU had three such games TOTAL in 2015 and 2016. ASU has four games this season allowing under 200 passing yards, matching its total from 2014. It had five such games in 2013 and eight in 2012. 2017 marks the first time ASU has had at least three games in a row allowing fewer than 200 passing yards since opening the 2012 season with seven such games.

D.J. Calhoun is one of just three inside linebackers in the country this season - and the only Pac-12 ILB - **to not miss a single tackle**, despite playing more snaps than any other inside linebacker in that group of four (462). In fact, of all players in the country - regardless of position - that have played at least 50 percent of the defensive snaps this season, Calhoun is one of just 74 players that have not missed a tackle and leads all of those players with 61 total tackles (Georgia's Roquan Smith is second with 53).

- ASU is 3-1 this season in games decided by touchdown or less and 12-7 since 2012 UA comeback. Was 6-16 in such games from 2007 to UA game.
- .@FootballASU is 6th nationally in red zone scoring at 95.8% (23-of-24) trips with lone blemish coming while kneeling at end of UW win.
- The Sun Devils are 10-11 in the last 21 games against opponents ranked in the AP Poll after winning just 5 from 1998-2011.
- ASU is 37-16 since 2012 when committing fewer than 6 penalties and just 6-13 when committing 6 or more.
- ASU will be looking for its first season defeating both USC and Oregon in the same year since 1997.
- .@FootballASU has 13 scoring drives over 4 minutes long this season. They had 10 TOTAL last season and just 8 in 2015.
- 9 of last 13 ASU scoring drives have been 10+ plays compared to 3 of the first 21. Has 12 total compared to 15 10+ play drives in all of '16

- .@BrandonRRuiz is tied for first among the nation's freshmen (21st overall) with 11 field goals made this season.
- .@dj_calhoun remains one of 3 inside linebackers to not miss a tackle this season on 462 snaps - the most of the three that are tied.

**FOOD FOR THOUGHT**

- » The Sun Devils have turned the ball over just six times this season (two on tipped ball interceptions), a total good for ninth nationally. ASU finished 82nd in the country a year ago with 21 turnovers.
- » The Sun Devils are currently 12th nationally in averaging 33:08 minutes of possession a game, a total that also leads the Pac-12. The last time ASU finished with over 33 minutes of possession time per game in a season was 2007, when ASU finished third nationally at 33:08 per game.
- » Chad Adams has been targeted five times in the last three games, allowing just 10 yards total in that span. He has 12 tackles in those games and has posted two of his three highest graded games in his career according to Pro Football Focus.
- » The Sun Devil pass defense has been on fire in recent weeks, allowing fewer than 200 opponent passing yards in the consecutive games. To put that in perspective - ASU had three such games TOTAL in 2015 and 2016.
- » In ASU's three non-conference games this season, the Sun Devils were ranked dead last in the FBS in allowing opponents to convert on 54.55 percent of their third down opportunities. However, in four Pac-12 games, ASU is ranked 10th nationally in allowing just a 26.09 third down conversion percentage in conference-only games.

STRIKE FIRST

- » Arizona State has scored first in 48 of the 72 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is 36-12 when doing so.
- » The Devils are 4-1 this season when scoring first (wins vs. NMSU, ORE, WASH, UTAH).

STRIKE FAST...?

- » 272 of the Devils' 400 scoring drives since 2012 have come in three minutes or fewer (68.0 percent).
- » The fast paced-offense was still in full effect against Oregon, however, with four drives coming under two minutes in that effort.
- » Two of ASU's four scoring drives against NMSU came in under 30 seconds - marking the first time ASU had two scoring drives of 50+ yards occur in less than 30 seconds since the 2014 USC game.

...OR NOT?

- » Despite the Sun Devils' previous modus operandi of quick-hitting scoring drives, ASU has been content with more methodic drives in 2017 with just 13 of 34 scoring drives coming under three minutes (38.2 percent).
- » The Sun Devils are currently 12th nationally in averaging 33:08 minutes of possession a game, a total that also leads the Pac-12. The last time ASU finished with over 33 minutes of possession time per game in a season was 2007, when ASU finished third nationally at 33:08 per game.
- » Since that season, ASU has finished no better than 32nd in possession time per game (2014) and has finished 50th or worse seven times.
- » ASU has 13 scoring drives this season that have lasted four minutes or

longer after having just 10 total in the entirety of 2016. ASU had just eight scoring drives longer than four minutes in 2015.

- » 9 of the last 13 Sun Devil scoring drives have been 10 plays or longer compared to just 3 of the first 21 scoring drives this season going into double-digit plays. ASU had 15 scoring drives last 10 plays or longer in the entirety of 2016 and is already at 16 this season.
- » ASU had three scoring drives over 5 minutes against Stanford and followed that with two drives over 6 minutes against #5 Washington, notable as the Devils had just four scoring drives total in 2016 that lasted longer than five minutes.
- » ASU's 16-play, 8:08-minute scoring drive against Washington was the longest scoring by plays and by duration since Todd Graham's career began in 2012. In fact, it was ASU's longest scoring drive since a 9 minute, 43 second field goal drive against Oregon State in 2008. It was the longest touchdown drive by time since at least the 1999 season (as far back as drive possessions were readily available).

GETTING STARTED ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- » The Sun Devils have outscored their opposition 614--374 in the first quarter under Todd Graham.
- » ASU is currently 23rd nationally in scoring 8.6 points per first quarter this season.
- » The Sun Devils are 27-4 under Graham when holding their opposition scoreless in the first quarter. ASU has posted an impressive 35-3 overall record under Graham when leading at halftime.

DON'T CROSS THAT LINE

- » ASU forced 24 plays against Utah that resulted in negative or no yardage (16 incomplete passes, 6 tackles for loss, 2 plays for no gain) of the 60 total plays in the contest (40.0 percent)
- » This season, ASU has forced 156 plays resulting in negative or no yardage of 471 total (33.1 percent).
- » Under Graham, ASU has forced 1,814 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 5,115 (35.5 percent).

SERIOUSLY, DON'T CROSS IT

- » ASU is currently second in the nation since 2012 in averaging 3.14 sacks per game. Additionally, ASU is first in the Pac-12 and second in the nation (Clemson) with an average of 7.78 TFL per game under Graham (since 2012).
- » Last season, the Sun Devils had at least two players who reached double digits in tackles for loss (Koron Crump, JoJo Wicker and DJ Calhoun) for the 5th time since 2012. ASU has had 17 such individual occurrences under Graham (2012-p) after having just 17 TOTAL reach the mark in 10 previous seasons (2002-11) with at least two players reaching double digits in the category just six times in that span.



#NOFLYZONE

- » The Sun Devil pass defense has been on fire in recent weeks, allowing fewer than 200 opponent passing yards in three consecutive games. To put that in perspective - ASU had three such games TOTAL in 2015 and 2016.
- » ASU has four games this season allowing under 200 passing yards, matching its total from 2014. It had five such games in 2013 and eight in 2012. 2017 marks the first time ASU has had at least three games in a row allowing fewer than 200 passing yards since opening the 2012 season with seven such games.
- » ASU has allowed just 467 total passing yards in the last three games. Again, for perspective, ASU had given up more than that in a SINGLE GAME on seven different occasions in the 29 games prior to the current streak.
- » According to Pro Football Focus, the Sun Devil pass coverage has been rated either the first or second-best in the conference in each of the last three games - the only team in the Pac-12 to be in the Top Two in each of those weeks.

HE'S THE MANNY

- » Despite being pressured on 34.5 percent of his dropbacks - the 13-highest total nationally among 74 FBS QBs who drop back at least 50 percent of the time - Manny Wilkins is 13th nationally with a 88.9 NFL QB rating under pressure - third-highest among all QBs pressured at least 34 percent of the time.
- » His three touchdowns under pressure are tied for 24th nationally among all quarterbacks.
- » Wilkins has shown what he can do in a clean pocket however, ranked sixth nationally with a 73.6 completion percentage when there's been no pressure this season.
- » Wilkins has three touchdown passes over 50 yards this season after not having any in his career previously.
- » Wilkins has a 117.6 NFL quarterback rating on deep passes (passes of more than 20 yards), good for 15th nationally among quarterbacks who drop back at least 50 percent of the time.
- » Since his first quarter interception at Arizona last year (over 7 1/2 games), Wilkins is 190-of-282 (67.8 percent) with 2,171 yards, 11 touchdowns, 3 interceptions (two on a tipped pass) with a 1472.79 passing efficiency in that time
- » Wilkins broke the school record for most consecutive pass attempts without an interception at 192 dating back to last season before his first quarter interception against Stanford, breaking Rudy Carpenter's previous school record of 149 from the end of 2005 to 2006.

GOLD RUSH

- » ASU has 14 rushing TDs this year as it seeks to reach 25 rushing touchdowns for the fourth time in the last six seasons. The current total of three such times is notable as the Devils had just three previous seasons with

at least 25 rushing touchdowns from 1980-2011 (1985, 1986 and 1996).

- » Six times in the Todd Graham era has ASU had gone over five rushing touchdowns in a game. The Devils had three such games TOTAL from 1997-2011.
- » Yards after contact have been a been impressive in recent years with the likes of Demario Richard and Kalen Ballage. 423 of ASU's total 892 rushing yards this season have come after contact (47.4 percent) with Ballage accounting for 214 of those (2.31 yards after carry per rush) and Richard logging 175 on 309 total yards (56.6 percent).

GOLD ZONE

- » ASU is sixth nationally in converting on 95.83 percent of its red zone appearances this season (23-of-24), however, the Devils took a knee in the final seconds of the team's victory over fifth-ranked Washington in the red zone - the lone 'blemish' to the team's total this season.
- » The Devils sit 13th nationally in red zone touchdown scoring with 18 touchdowns on those 24 attempts (75.00).
- » The Sun Devils scored on 43-of-47 trips to the red zone in 2016 (91.5 percent), a total that ranked 10th in the nation. ASU scored a touchdown on 33 of those trips (70.2 percent). That percentage was ranked 22nd nationally and notable as ASU found the end zone on just 51.5 percent of its red zone trips in 2015 - a total that ranked 108th in the country.

SUPER DEMARIO

- » Demario Richard is currently 9th in Sun Devil history with 2,484 career rushing yards and needs 216 more yards to move into the all-time top five at ASU.
- » Richard has nine 100-yard rushing games in his career, three shy of cracking the ASU top-five in the category.
- » Richard had a touchdown rush in three consecutive games for ASU this year, the first three-game stretch reaching the feat in his career.
- » Richard became the 27th Sun Devil to eclipse 3,000 career all-purpose yards and has also brought his career touchdown total to 26, needing just four more to move into ASU's all-time top-10.
- » In 2015, Richard became the fourth Sun Devil in history to have at least seven 100-yard rushing games in a single season, joining Freddy Williams and Art Malone (8) and Woody Green (7, 2 times).

CAME IN LIKE A WRECKING BALLAGE

- » Kalen Ballage had 14 rushing touchdowns last season, making him just the fourth Sun Devil since 2000 to reach double digits and moved him into a tie for the seventh most single season rushing touchdowns in ASU history. He finished 26th in the nation in rushing touchdowns (14) and 34th among all position players with 94 total points scored.
- » Ballage has five rushing touchdowns this season and now has 26 in his career, creeping up on ASU's all-time Top-5 in the category (the threshold being 28 rushing TDs).



- » Ballage became the 26th Sun Devil to eclipse 3,000 career all-purpose yards and his 28 career touchdowns overall are two shy of cracking ASU's all-time Top-10 in the category.

NO RUSH

- » The Sun Devils have held 25 opponents under 100 rushing yards in the Todd Graham era (72 games/34.7 percent), including four of 12 games last year and twice so far in 2017. (Texas Tech and #5 Washington).
- » Last year, ASU held three straight opponents under 100 rushing yards for the third time under Graham (2013, 2015, 2016). The Devils had limited opponents to under 100 rushing yards in three straight games in just five previous seasons dating back to 1986.

TAKING OFFENSE

- » ASU is ranked second in the Pac-12 and 14th in the nation at 35.9 points per game in the Graham era.
- » Arizona State and Louisiana Tech are tied for the active FBS record of 115 consecutive games scoring more than 7 points. The Sun Devils last scored a touchdown or less when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 63 of those games (55.3 percent).

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » ASU has outscored opponents 573-308 in points off takeaways since 2012 and 37-24 this year. ASU has nine takeaways this season and has scored points following seven of those.
- » Since 2012, ASU has scored 70.8 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (97 of 137) while finding the end zone 73 times in that span (53.2 percent).

- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 52.0 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (52 of 100) with 40 touchdowns (40.0 percent).

A HAND IN THE COOKIE JAR

- » The Sun Devils have forced 137 turnovers under Todd Graham, which is tied for the 17th-highest total in the country in that span.
- » ASU has 16 interception returns for touchdowns under Graham, compared to posting just four total in the three previous seasons prior to 2012. The total is tied with Ohio State for first in the nation in that time.
- » ASU has added four fumble return touchdowns as well for 20 defensive touchdowns since the 2012 season, good for fourth in the country in that time span behind Ohio State (25), Alabama (22) and Boise State (21).

TURNOVER FACTORY

- » ASU is ranked 10th in the nation with a .50 average turnover margin per game since Graham took over the helm and is 11th in the nation with a plus-36 total turnover margin since 2012.
- » The Devils are first in the Pac-12 and tied for 7th in the nation with 86 total interceptions in that span.

WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION

- » Since 2012, ASU has an average starting yard line of its own 34.4 in 43 victories compared to 25.3 for their opponents in such contests.
- » Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 31.4 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 28.2 in ASU's 29 losses under Graham.

CLOSE IT OUT

- » ASU has outscored other teams 724-581 in the fourth quarter and overtime under Todd Graham (10.1 points per fourth quarter and OT/+2.0 points per game) and averaged 12.8 points per fourth quarter last season (outscored opponents 155-125).
- » Excluding FCS NAU, the Sun Devils finished 2016 seventh nationally in averaging 19.6 points per second half against FBS opposition and second in the country with 11.9 points per fourth quarter against FBS teams.
- » ASU has started second halves strong this year, ranked 29th nationally in averaging 8.3 points per third quarter.

T.N.T., WE'RE DYNAMITE

- » The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU had 7 such plays against Washington and 58 total this season.
- » The Devils are tied for 11th nationally with six passing plays of over 50 yards this season. It had one in all of 2016.
- » ASU is 31st nationally with six plays over 50 yards this year after having just two total last season.



- » ASU had two 50+ yard scoring passes in the opener, something it had not achieved since the Jael Mary game against USC in 2014. They were the first two 50+ yard scoring passes of Manny Wilkins' career.

KEEP IT CLEAN

- » ASU has averaged just 37.3 penalty yards per game since 2012, good for the fourth-lowest total in the country behind only Navy (25.9), Georgia Tech (35.7) and Army (36.2).
- » Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 313 penalties in 72 games (4.35 penalties per game).
- » ASU is 37-16 since 2012 when it has fewer than six penalties in a game compared to a 6-13 record when it has 6 or more.
- » ASU is current first in nation in fewest penalties and fewest penalties per game (22/3.14) and second nationally in fewest penalty yards and fewest penalty yards per game (217/31.00)

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- » ASU is 28-9 at Sun Devil Stadium since Todd Graham took over in the 2012 season. The 28 wins are the second-most home wins under any Sun Devil head coach behind Frank Kush.
- » In 37 regular season home games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 38.2 points per game. Against non-conference Power Five teams, ASU is averaging 50.0 points per game at home under Graham.
- » The Sun Devils join Baylor and Oregon as the only schools in the country to be ranked in the Top-40 in home points per game in EACH of the previous five seasons.
- » ASU has posted under 20 points in a regular home game just three times in Todd Graham's tenure - a 19-16 overtime victory over Utah in 2014, a 42-14 loss to #19 USC in 2015 and a 13-7 victory over #5 Washington in 2017.
- » The Sun Devils are 285-104-3 (.730) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium since 1958, the 29th-highest active winning percentage in a stadium among all FBS schools.

USE THEM WISELY

- » Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 71 timeouts on defense in third down situations, and have not allowed a first down on the ensuing play and/or forced a turnover on 50 of those occasions (70.4 percent).

HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS

- » ASU has now gone 12-7 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2012 Arizona comeback in Tucson. ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season up until that moment. The Devils are 3-1 in games decided by a touchdown or less this season.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- » ASU is now 14-3 under Todd Graham in games where it does not have a turnover after the Washington victory this season and 2-0 in such games in 2017.
- » The Sun Devils have turned the ball over just six times this season (two on tipped ball interceptions), a total good for ninth nationally. ASU finished 82nd in the country a year ago with 21 turnovers.
- » In 2014, the Sun Devils had six games where they did not turn the ball over and went 6-0 in those contests. That number was notable because in the previous two seasons, ASU had just five combined games where it did not turn the ball over.

TAKING DOWN THE TOP

- » The Sun Devils have gone 10-8 in the last 18 games against ranked teams.
- » In his time at ASU, Todd Graham is 10-11 against AP-ranked opponents after defeating Oregon and Washington this season. Those 10 wins are the 5th-highest total in the Pac-12, one behind USC's total of 11.
- » ASU's victory over No. 5 Washington this season was one of just four victories over a Top-Five team in program history and the first since a fateful 19-0 victory over #1 Nebraska in 1996.
- » Graham has more than doubled the Top-25 win total of Dennis Erickson (3) and Dirk Koetter (2) during their tenures. In the previous 14 seasons, ASU was 5-40 in games against teams ranked in the AP poll.
- » By defeating Pac-12 North Division heavyweights Washington and Oregon in the past three weeks, ASU has now defeated the Pac-12 Conference North Division Champion team of three of the past four years (Washington in 2016 and Oregon and 2014 and 2015).
- » ASU is 28-21 in Pac-12 Conference games since 2012, the second-best total in the Pac-12 South behind USC (34-16).

DIRTY HARRY

- » Possessing deceptive speed and elusiveness, N'Keal Harry has 292 yards after the catch this season on 627 yards (46.6 percent) and is averaging 5.7 yards after catch per reception this season. The 292 yards after catch are second in the Pac-12 behind USC's Deontay Burnett (386) and WSU's Tavares Martin (288).
- » Harry has proved himself as a valuable possession receiver as well and has 51 receptions on 72 targets this season. The 72 targets are third in the conference while his 51 receptions are second
- » At 627 yards thus far this season, Harry is already within striking distance of his freshman total of 659 receiving yards.
- » Harry accounted for a touchdown in four consecutive games (three receiving and one passing) in Games 3-6 and five of the last eight games dating back to last season.
- » The sophomore has started every game at Arizona State, now at 19 straight games - the most among all offensive players. He has a reception in every one of those games.

LIGHT 'EM UP

- » ASU has scored 50 or more points 16 times since Todd Graham arrived in Tempe for the 2012 season.
- » To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11).
- » Against Pac-12 opponents, the Sun Devils have scored 50 or more points 10 times under Coach Graham, after only tallying nine in the conference era prior (since 1978).
- » ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 or more four times ('12-63 NAU, '12-62 Navy, '13-62 USC, '16-68 TTU).
- » The Sun Devils have dropped 50 on Arizona twice in the last three years after doing so just three times in 86 previous contests.

BRING THE WOOD...OR THE WICKER...OR THE LATU

- » Tashon Smallwood is third nationally among all FBS defensive tackles with 22 quarterback pressures this season while JoJo Wicker is sixth among tackles with 18 pressures this season.
- » A.J. Latu is tied for 32nd among defensive ends with 17 quarterback pressures this season as well.
- » The trio has combined for 57 pressures this season, good for sixth among all Power Five defensive lines with at least three players over 10 pressures that play at least 50 percent of the snaps.

- » Tashon Smallwood logged a career best 4.0 tackles for loss with two sacks against NMSU, becoming the first Sun Devil to have 4.0+ tackles for loss since Antonio Longino against Arizona in 2015.
- » After having just 1.5 tackles for loss and no sacks in his career entering the season, A.J. Latu already has 6.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks this season.
- » Four times in the Todd Graham era has a defensive player had at least 10 sacks in a season. ASU had just two players reach the milestone from 2003-2011.
- » For the fifth consecutive season under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils had at least two players that reached double digits in tackles for loss (Koron Crump, JoJo Wicker and DJ Calhoun). ASU has had 17 such occurrences under Graham (2012-present) after having just 17 TOTAL players reach the mark in 10 previous seasons (2002-11) with at least two players reaching double digits in the same season just six times in that span.

IN THE RIGHT HANDS...OR FEET

- » The Sun Devils came into the season as one of just three teams in the country that started the year with no kickers OR punters with D-I experience on the roster, along with Virginia and UAB.
- » Brandon Ruiz set an ASU record with his 52-yard field goal in the opener, his first career field goal to make him the first Sun Devil to have their first career field goal go for 50 or more yards.
- » Ruiz became the first Sun Devil in school history to kick two or more field goals longer than 50 yards in their freshman season.
- » The true freshman is currently ninth nationally in touchback percentage (76.19 percent) and is 8th nationally with 32 total touchbacks.
- » Ruiz is tied for first among all freshmen kickers in the country with 11 field goals this season and is 21st among all kickers.
- » Ruiz has twice been honored as the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week (vs. Oregon, at Utah).
- » Against Washington, the Devils faced the nation's top punt returner in Dante Pettis, tied for the NCAA record for most punt returns for a touchdown and averaging 33 yards per return this season. Sleep-Dalton finished the game with six punts for 40.5 yards while allowing Pettis just three returns for 7 total yards and a muffed return.
- » Sleep-Dalton has four punts inside the 20 in the last 10 punts (40.0 percent on 10 punts). In his four previous games, he had just three punts downed inside the 20 on 19 attempts (15.8 percent).
- » The team is replacing unanimous All-American and 2017 Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez at the placekicking position in addition to current starting punter for the Miami Dolphins, Matt Haack.

AIR IT OUT

- » 38 of Jalen Harvey's 47 career catches (80.9 percent) have gone for a first down (19 of his 22 catches this season) while he has averaged 17.7 yards per catch average in career and 47 yards per catch on two career touchdown receptions.
- » ASU currently has the 39th-highest graded receiving corps in the country this season, according to PFF.
- » John Humphrey introduced himself to the Sun Devil nation in a big way in the opener, catching seven passes for 123 yards and a touchdown. The debut is the second best for a first collegiate game in Sun Devil history, trailing only Calvin Demery's 1969 school record of 201 yards in his first game.
- » The Sun Devils have had 5 different receivers with 100+ yards in five games this season, a total it had never reached in an entire season prior to this year.
- » Only six times in school history has ASU had four different players with at least 100 receiving yards in a game in a single season (2004, 2005, 2012, 2015, 2016, 2017) - notable as four of the six times in history it

has happened have come since 2012 when Todd Graham arrived.

GO D.J., THAT'S MY D.J.

- » D.J. Calhoun is one of just three inside linebackers in the country this season - and the only Pac-12 ILB - to not miss a single tackle, despite playing more snaps than any other inside linebacker in that group of four (462).
- » In fact, of all players in the country - regardless of position - that have played at least 50 percent of the defensive snaps this season, Calhoun is one of just 74 players that have not missed a tackle and leads all of those players with 61 total tackles (Georgia's Roquan Smith is second with 53).
- » Calhoun is tied for first among Pac-12 inside linebackers with 19 combined tackles in the passing game - good for 16th nationally this season. According to PFF, Calhoun has 10 "stops" in the passing game - or a non-productive play for the offense - a total that is second in the Pac-12 and 15th nationally.
- » Calhoun is fourth in the conference and 44th nationally with 8.7 tackles per game. He is tied for 16th nationally and is second in the Pac-12 in averaging 5.7 solo tackles per game.

SAM, I AM

- » Christian Sam is currently ranked 6th in the nation and first in the Pac-12 with 6.4 solo tackles per game.
- » He is 17th nationally and first in the conference in averaging 9.7 tackles per game.
- » He is ranked 17th in the country among inside linebackers with a 13.7 run-stop percentage - good for first in the Pac-12.
- » Sam has 19 tackles in the passing game this season, a total good for 16th nationally among all inside linebackers.

He had a plan to infuse the program with a culture that was about winning in all facets of a student-athlete's life. Graham referred to it simply as, 'The Sun Devil Way.'

Graham, the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, enters his sixth season at the helm of the Arizona State University football program. Under Graham's leadership, every phase of the Sun Devil football program has excelled.

On the field, Graham has led ASU to a Pac-12 South title, four bowl games and distinguished himself as one of three coaches in the history of the program (Frank Kush, Darryl Rogers) to have won 30 or more games (34) in his first four seasons. Individually, Sun Devil football players have accounted for 51 All-Pac-12 awards, numerous All-American awards – including a pair of consensus All-Americans in Will Sutton and 2016 Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez – and more than 30 student-athletes have either been selected in the annual NFL Draft or signed NFL free agent contracts.

In the classroom the Sun Devils have had an impressive 208 student-athletes receive academic honors, including 34 Pac-12 All-Academic citations under Graham. That total includes seven student-athletes who have garnered All-Pac-12 Academic First-Team honors. In 2015, ASU became the first school to have consecutive winners – quarterback Taylor Kelly in 2014 and quarterback Mike Bercovici in 2015 – of the Pac-12's Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year, awarded to senior student-athletes that are standouts both academically and in their sports discipline.

Graham's resolute commitment to help Sun Devil football be the best can also be seen in the recent reinvention of Sun Devil Stadium, a project which Graham has invested in both figuratively and literally. In September 2014, Graham and his wife Penni, and Vice President for University Athletics Ray Anderson and his wife Buffie, each gave \$500,000 in personal funds to the Sun Devil Athletics Momentum fundraising campaign.

The three phases of the \$256 million project is set to be finished in 2018. The most recent stage of the reinvention to be completed – what Graham calls a 'game-changer' for the program – is the 118,669-square-foot student-athlete facility that the Sun Devil football team moved into in July 2017. The new building,

which includes a 5,750-square-foot locker room, set a new standard for such facilities in excellence and innovation in fulfilling all the daily needs of student-athletes.

Throughout his time at ASU Graham has been steadfast when stating his ultimate goal: to bring championships to Tempe. During Graham's tenure in Tempe, the Sun Devils have been close to fulfilling that vision on multiple occasions.

In 2014, Graham's Sun Devil squad posted a 10-3 record, including a 6-3 mark in Pac-12 play, a second-place finish in the Pac-12 South Division and a 36-31 victory over Duke in the Sun Bowl. Tasked with replacing nine starters on defense, Graham led a unit that ranked near the top in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss, forced 27 turnovers and scored five touchdowns during the season.

On the other side of the ball, ASU finished the season ranked 16th in the nation in scoring offense and averaged more than 440 yards per game behind record-breaking quarterback and Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year Taylor Kelly, 1,000-yard rusher D.J. Foster and 1,000-yard receiver Jaelen Strong.

In 2013 Graham's Sun Devils brushed aside the prognostications from skeptics who felt that an early-season string of games against Wisconsin, Stanford, USC and Notre Dame would be a little bit too much to overcome en route to an appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game.

ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number in 2013. ASU put points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

The duo of defensive tackle Will Sutton and linebacker Carl Bradford combined to give ASU the most dynamic defensive tandem in the country as the two combined for 24.5 sacks and 44.0 tackles for loss in 2012. Their collective average of 1.92 sacks per game was the highest in the country by two players on the same team since the 2006 season. Bradford racked up 40.5 tackles for loss in two years under Graham, tied for the fourth most by any player in the nation in that time.

Sutton became ASU's sixth winner of the Morris Trophy and the 18th consensus All-American and first since 2007. Sutton also became the fifth ASU player to win the Pac-10/12 conference Defensive Player of the Year award. After accomplishing all of that as a junior, Sutton returned for his senior season and repeated as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year and Morris Trophy Winner while adding numerous All-American accolades.

Although the 2013 Sun Devils would come up short of their ultimate goal of getting to and winning the annual Rose Bowl Game, they proved they had the right people



on board. And leading that ship a captain in Graham, who was named the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

In his first season at Arizona State, Graham guided the team to an 8-5 record as the program recorded its first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007. ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.

While known for leading programs that have annually been among the nation's leaders in offensive production, Graham gained national acclaim for his coaching prowess on the other side of the ball after leading defenses that helped West Virginia (2002) and Tulsa (2003) engineer two of the top single-season turnarounds in recent memory. With head-turning accomplishments like those it is easy to see why Graham believes that defense wins championships.

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils' extraordinary improvement on defense played a paramount role in the team's rise improvement in 2012. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal in 2012 as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

Graham was named the 23rd head football coach in program history on December 14, 2011, arriving in Tempe from the University of Pittsburgh.

Graham became well-known on the national scene following a four-year stint at Tulsa (2007-2010) where he led the Golden Hurricane to a 36-17 mark, which included three bowl wins and three seasons of 10-plus wins. Tulsa was one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2007 and 2008.

The native of Mesquite, Texas, had seasons at Tulsa which included records of 10-4 (2007), 11-3 (2008) and 10-3 (2010) and in his final season the Golden Hurricane won games at Notre Dame and then topped No. 24 Hawaii 62-35 in its own bowl game. The Notre Dame win was dubbed the biggest upset of the 2010 college football season by ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit.

One distinguishing characteristic of Graham-coached teams has been their propensity for lighting up the scoreboard. On two occasions Tulsa led the nation in total offense (2007 at 543.9 yards per game and 2008 at 569.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in 2010. His 2010 Tulsa team also led the nation in interceptions (24) and was third in turnovers gained (36). His 2007 squad not only led the nation in total offense at 543.9 yards per game, it set 29 school records, 15 conference marks and four NCAA records. Tulsa routed Bowling Green 63-7 in the GMAC Bowl, the largest bowl margin of victory in NCAA history.

Graham's 2008 team again led the nation in total offense (569.9 yards per game) while ranking second in scoring (47.2 points per game), fifth in rushing (268 ypg) and ninth in passing (301.9 ypg). His team finished 11-3, capped by another large bowl win, a 45-13 victory over No. 22 Ball State in the GMAC Bowl.

Including ASU's 62-28 win over Navy in the 2012 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, Graham's offense has enabled three different teams (two at Tulsa) to score 60-plus points in a bowl game, making him the only coach to accomplish the feat multiple times.

Prior to taking the head job at Tulsa, Graham led Rice to its first bowl game in 45 seasons in 2006 and earned Conference USA Coach of the Year honors that same season.

Graham began his coaching career in 1988 as an assistant at Poteet High School/Middle School in Mesquite (1988-90) and then helped lead East Central University from a .500 program to NAIA national champions in his third year as he served as defensive coordinator from 1991-93. One year later he was at Carl Albert High School in Midwest City, Okla., and then spent time from 1995-2000 at Allen High School in Allen, Texas. While at Allen, north of Dallas, he also served as athletic director and led a program that had no district wins in the year prior to his arrival to five playoff berths in six seasons (1995-2000).

Graham was hired as the linebackers coach at West Virginia in 2001 and one year later he was promoted to defensive co-coordinator as the Mountaineers went from 3-8 to 9-4, the top turnaround in the country in 2002.

Graham was an all-state defensive back at North Mesquite High School and, after graduating in 1983, he played for East Central University in Ada, Okla., where he was a two-time NAIA All-American defensive back.

Born Dec. 5 1964, Graham earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education from East Central University. He and his wife, Penni, have six children: Bo, Natalie, Hank, Haylee, Dakota and Michael Todd Jr.

- » Graham won 39 games as the head coach of the Devils in his first five years, a total that was the most for a five year span since ASU won 41 from 1978 to 1982.
- » He became the only ASU head coach to be bowl eligible in each of his first four seasons with the program.
- » He led ASU to three consecutive eight win seasons for the first time since 1971-73 in his first three seasons at the helm.
- » There were 28 head coaching changes made after the 2011 season and of that group of coaches that remain with those programs, Graham has posted the fourth-best record at 43-29, ranking behind only Urban Meyer (67-7), Kevin Sumlin (49-23) and Jim Mora (45-27).

TODD-BITS OF INFO

- » Over the past 11 seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then finished with 2.9 per game in 2013 and 3.0 per game in 2014 to finish 17th and 13th, respectively, in the country. ASU would earn the NCAA statistical trophy in the category in 2015, leading the nation with 3.54 sacks per game before against finishing in the top 50 nationally in 2016 with 2.53 per game.
- » In 11 seasons, Graham is 30-30 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in such games in 2012, 3-2 in 2013 and 4-2 in 2014. In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16 in true road contests.
- » In nine of the last 11 years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012 (eighth nationally), 31.36 per game in 2013 (seventh nationally) and 32.38 per game in 2014 (fourth nationally) and 39.85 per game in 2015. (15th nationally).

NOT WASTING TIME

- » In his first four seasons, Todd Graham had an average of 8.5 wins per year at ASU, which ranked him number one all-time in Sun Devil lore.
- » ASU's 31 regular-season wins under Coach Graham (2012-15) were the most regular-season wins in a four-year span since 1980-83, and the team's 34 total wins were the most since 1975-78.
- » Graham became the third-quickest coach to reach 30 wins, doing so in 43 games (Frank Kusk and Darryl Rogers each did so in 40).
- » As far as Bowl Games go, Graham has wasted no time establishing himself in the record books as his four appearances with the Sun Devils are already tied for second among all ASU coaches and his two wins are tied for second.

ELITE COMPANY

- » Head Coach Todd Graham had a school-record 28 wins in his first three seasons as head coach at ASU, one more than College Football Hall of Fame Coach Dan Devine (1955-57).
- » Coach Graham has recorded 10 wins in five of his 10 seasons as a head coach (Tulsa 2007, 2008, 2010; ASU 2013, 2014.) Since 2007, Coach Graham currently sits tied for No. 6 nationally in most 10-win seasons with five at FBS institutions, ranking behind only Nick Saban, Chris Peterson, Urban Meyer, Mark Richt and Gary Patterson.
