Headed East, Women's Tennis Opens ITA Kickoff Weekend Against Wisconsin

TEMPE – After a successful opening weekend for Sun Devils Women's Tennis (2-0, 0-0 Big 12), the team travels east to take part in ITA Kickoff Weekend taking place in Chapel Hill, N.C and facing off against Wisconsin on Saturday at 12 p.m. MST, and will play Sunday in either the championship match at 12 p.m. MST or the consolidation match at 8 a.m. MST.

The matches will be streamed on Goheels.com/watch and live stats for the matches can be found here. The winner of the Chapel Hill regional will move on and play in the ITA Women's Team Indoor National Championships set for Feb. 7-11 hosted by Northwestern and Illinois.

LAST TIME OUT:

In the season opener last Saturday against LMU, the team swept the Lions 7-0 and won every singles match in straight sets. Going 10-1 in the last 11 season openers for the Sun Devils. Later the team defeated UC San Diego 6-1, moving to 2-0 on the season.

SUN DEVIL OUTLOOK

- -The Sun Devils open the season 2-0 for the fourth straight season, and will aim to move to 3-0 under head coach Jamea Jackson with a win over Wisconsin.
- With two wins, the Sun Devils will attempt to qualify for the ITA Indoor nationals for the first since the 2021 season.
- Wisconsin will be opening their season against the Sun Devils and it marks the first meeting with the Badgers since 1995.
- ASU holds a 4-1 advantage over Wisconsin, with the last meeting coming in 1998.teams and an 34-0 record against Big West schools.
 Patricija Spaka earned her 50th and 51st singles win as a Sun Devil, making her the 45th different player in program history to win 50+ singles matches.

The Sun Devils have a 25-10 record

over Big 10 opponents, and are looking for their third straight win over a Big 10 school, defeating No. 7 Ohio State last year and Northwestern in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament in 2024.

- Three Sun Devils earned their first wins donning the maroon & gold, Karin Altori, Karsyn Evans and Lily Taylor.

IN THE RANKINGS:

The Sun Devils boast three players in the top-100 in the latest ITA Rankings which came out in the fall, all are sophomores. Emilija Tverijonaite is ranked 24th in the country after being ranked No. 52 at the start of the fall season. Sara Svetac entered the top-50 and is ranked No. 47 entering the Spring. Lastly, sophomore Ada Piestrzynska is No. 97 in the country after going 6-4 in the Fall and going 7-5 in doubles. The Sun Devils are one of two teams (Oklahoma State) in the Big 12 to have at least three players ranked in the top-100 of the ITA rankings,

SUN DEVIL DEBUTS:

Karin Altori, Karsyn Evans and Lily Taylor all made their Sun Devil debuts last week in both victories against LMU and UC San Diego and all three went a perfect 2-0 in doubles and singles play. Evans, a transfer from Denver, went 14-2 in singles and 10-7 in doubles as a freshman.

THREE SET STARS:

During the fall season the team showed its clutch gene by going 12-3 in three-set matches. Sara Svetac and Tverijonaite led the team in three-set victories with three wins apiece. Piestrzynska and Evans each had two wins during the fall season.

NEW CONFERNCE, WHO THIS?

The Sun Devils received votes in the ITA preseason poll announced on January 6, and were picked to finish fourth in the Big 12 Conference in the preseason poll announced on Jan. 7. The maroon and gold also picked up a first-place vote. In the first season competing in the Big 12, the Sun Devils boast a 98-23 record against current Big 12 competition.

JAMEA JACKSON

- Announced has the third head coach in program history since 1954, head coach Jamea Jackson was hired on June 4, 2024 announced by Athletic Director Graham Rossini and taking over for legendary head coach Sheila McInerney who announced her retirement last May after leading the Sun Devils to the round of 32 in 2024. Coach Jackson comes to Tempe after being at the helm of the Princeton Tigers for two seasons, leading them to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and was awarded the 2024 lvy League Coach of the year and led the Tigers to as high as No. 30 in the ITA team rankings last season. In two seasons she has a 33-14 record in addition to a 13-1 conference record.
- During her time at Princeton, she has coached five All-Ivy selections which includes Daria Freeman who reached No. 2 in the ITA singles rankings and earned Ivy League player of the year, All-American honors and was named ITA Northwest Region player of the year.
- This fall, Jackson assisted sophomore Emilija Tverijonaite to the NCAA Singles
 Tournament, who became the first Sun Devil since 2021 to take part in the
 championships.
- Jackson is a former professional tennis player and has sought out talent at the
 national and collegiate level. Prior to coaching at Princeton, Jackson served as
 a national coach for nince years from 2013-2022 with the United States Tennis
 Association (USTA) to recruit top American talent and developing the nation's best
 junior and pro tennis players.
- Before becoming a coach wtih the USTA, Jackson served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma State from 2009 to 2013 at Oklahoma State University. In her four years she helped the Cowgirls go from unranked to a top-25 program and managed to recruit the No. 4 recruiting class in 2011, whereas led to the Cowgirls playing in their first Big 12 Championship in more than a decade in 2013.
- Jackson played professionally on the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) Tour from March 2003 to August 2009 and achieved a career-high ranking of No. 43 in 2006. She competed in all four grand slams and represented the red, white and blue in the Fed cup competition in 2006. During her professional career she notched top-20 wins over grand slam winner Maria Sharapova, Marion Bertoli, Amy Frazier, Maria Kirilenko and Jelena Jankovic.



Education.....LMU

- Erik Kortland begins his first season with the Sun Devils after being hired by Jamea Jackson on Aug. 5, 2024 as the associate head coach. Kortland founded the RKT3 group to help promote a new innovated approach to the tennis industry and joined the player services and sports marketing team on Yonex USA to help recruit and take care of US. Juniors
- In 2017 in Carson, California at Training Center West. Kortland was promoted to lead national coach for men's and women's tennis and was in charge of all women's and junior boys' programming. He played a key part in recapturing the Junior Fed Cup title in back-to-back years in 2017 and 2018 in Budapest, Hungary. The 2017 team consisted of current world No. 3 Coco Gauff, Alexa Noel and Connie Ma. In 2016, Kortland coached Amanda Anisimove to her first junior French Open final and first WTA Grand Slam win at the U.S. Open. Kortand was hired as a player development coach in 2013 by the USTA in junior development with the primary responsibility to develop the best prospects and creating programming for all juniors at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, the site of the US Open. While working as a coach at Riviera Country Club, he served as a volunteer assistant coach at Pepperdine in 2012. Kortland began his coaching career as an assistant coach at LMU in 2001, after graduating from his

alma mater with a bachelor's of Communication.
