# ASU Individual Rankings (Top 25)

<u>Vault</u> Anaya Smith - No. 18, 9.915

#### **NCAA Championships**

Seniors Jada Mangahas and Anaya Smith are set for their first time at the NCAA Championships, competing as individuals on bars and vault, respectively, to represent Sun Devil Gymnastics. They will be in the first semifinal on Thursday, April 18, at 1:30 p.m. MST/3:30 p.m. CDT in Fort Worth, Texas.

The two Sun Devils will be rotating with Arkansas, with Smith competing in rotation three and Mangahas wrapping up the competition in rotation four. This is the first time both Mangahas and Smith have qualified for nationals. It's the second-straight year that ASU has had an individual at nationals after Hannah Scharf went in 2023 in the all-around.

#### **Last Meet**

The impressive postseason run came to an end for Sun Devil Gymnastics as the team placed fourth at the NCAA California Regional Final with a 196.750. Arizona State's season ended with their second-straight regional finals appearance, third in the last four years. ASU was also one of four unseeded teams in the country to make the final 16 teams advancing to regional finals.

#### Vault Star

Anaya Smith has been a star on vault all season, earning a spot on the All-Pac-12 Vault First Team for the second time in her career. She is currently ranked No. 18 in the nation on that event. She has seven scores of 9.9 or better this season, including a 9.950 that matches her personal best. She scored a 9.900 in the second round of regionals to tie for first for the vault regional title. Her big scores has helped the team

score well on this event, making it ASU's highest scoring event, ranked in the top 20 all season.

#### **High Bar**

In her senior season, Jada
Mangahas has been a force on
bars. She has four scores of 9.900
or better, including a career-high
tying 9.925 against Southern
Connecticut. She has not scored
below a 9.800 on bars this season.
Her scores helped her win three
event titles in the all-around this
year. Fortunately for the Sun Devils,
she will be returning for a fifth year.

#### **One More Year**

Three seniors recently announced their return for a fifth year in 2025: Sarah Clark, Jada Mangahas and White will all be coming back next season. Between the three of them, they have 23 scores of 9.9 or better this year, led by 11 from White. They also have 16 total event titles in 2024.

#### **Santos Supremacy**

This is the eighth season for two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year Jay Santos, who got win number 50 in Tempe in the win over Arizona this season. He has brought the program to new heights in time in Tempe. Aside from his first season, he has led the team to a 196-plus NQS and a top-25 ranking at the end of every season since. There had never been a streak longer than two-consecutive seasons with the NQS over that mark prior to his tenure.

#### COACHING HONORS

2023 Pac-12 Coach of the Year 2021 WCGA Regional Coach of the Year 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year 2016 NCAA Central Regional Coach of the Year Jay Santos was named the head women's gymnastics coach on May 27, 2016.

Jay Santos' impact has been immediate for the Gym Devils. He has led the team to postseason each season since 2018 with two regional finals appearances (2023, 2021) and has coached two All-Americans (Hannah Scharf and Cairo Leonard-Baker). Both of those All-Americans also qualified for nationals an individuals, Scharf in 2021 and Leonard-Baker in 2018, 2019 and 2021. He was the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2018 and the WCGA Regional Coach of the Year in 2021. In the Road to Nationals rankings. he has helped the team finish in the top 25 for sixth-straight seasons.

The Gym Devils had another strong season for Jay's' seventh season, earning a final rank of No. 15 and a team NQS of 197.105. This is the third time ever that ASU ends the regular season with an NQS over 197, two of which have been while Santos has been in Tempe. ASU went to NCAA Regionals and advanced to the regional finals. The team had an eight-meet streak of scoring 196.000 or better throughout the regular season. That run included a three-meet winning streak where the Gym Devils upset then-No. 4 Utah, set a program record road score in a win over Washington, and dealt then-No. 11 Oregon State its first loss of the season. He helped the team finish the season ranked in the top 20 on all four events and helped Hannah Scharf qualify as an individual in the all-around to nationals.

For Jay's sixth season, he helped the 2022 squad finish ranked No. 22. The team scored a 196-plus in all but one meet, including three 197s. Arizona State had five conference wins to tie for the 2022 Pac-12 Regular Season Title, the first one in program history. It was also the most conference wins in a single season in 2001. The biggest win came against UCLA as ASU scored a 197.800 to beat the Bruins for the first time since 2001. For the second year in a row, he helped coach Hannah Scharf to another WCGA Second Team All-America honor in the all-around.

Jay's' fifth season was historic as he led Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time. The success came off of an abbreviated 2020 season where Santos helped a young team, with seven making their collegiate debuts, reach new heights. The team went out on a high note before the caancelations began, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

Santos led the Gym Devils to a another successful season in 2019, the first since 2014 to have a winning record (11-10) in the regular season. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. They scored a 196.000 or better six times.

Santos has led ASU to arguably one of the most substantial turnarounds in recent collegiate gymnastics history after his first season as head coach in 2017. Santos' 2018 squad improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, capping the season ranked at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). Ranking in the top-20 of the national standings for 12 consecutive weeks, Arizona State made its first team NCAA regional appearance since 2014. Santos was named the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

Santos coached Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation - the highest national ranking in the history of the program. He earned NCAA Central Regional Head Coach of the Year honors. He had a 28-8-1 record whiile at EMU.

Santos has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Ohio State. Santos also spent eight years coaching at Somersault Gymnastics Center in Stoughton, Mass., serving as the women's team director and head coach for his last four years. Santos served as a nationally-rated men's gymnastics judge from 1997-2001, working numerous college dual meets as well as Junior Olympic state and regional championships.

Santos earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration in Operations Management from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1995, and was a member of the Minutemen's gymnastics team from 1990-95. At Amherst, he was a three-time co-captain and founding member of the department's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

He and his wife Jess have two sons, Mason and Cooper.

- Lacy Dagen was announced as an assistant coach on June 16, 2023.
- Dagen was the volunteer assistant for OSU in 2023. The team advanced to the NCAA Regional
  Finals in Denver and had a final ranking of No. 12. Dagen helped coach All-American Jade Carey, who
  was the 2023 Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year. She also coached her younger sister Madi Dagen, who
  was All-Pac-12 honorable mention on floor. OSU also earned a share of the Pac-12 Regular Season
  Title for the second year in a row.
- In her role as a volunteer assistant with UC Davis in 2022, Dagen helped the Aggies earn the highest score in school history at an MPSF Championship, scoring a 196.050. The UC Davis squad finished the season with the highest NQS score in school history, tallying a 195.915.
