SCOUTING THE SERIES

After an exciting home opener weekend, No. 18/19 Sun Devil Hockey (2-0-0) returns to the ice to battle the Northern Michigan Wildcats (0-1-1) on Oct 20-21. Puck drop is slated for 7 p.m. MST on Friday and Saturday. Fans can watch the free ASU Live Stream or listen on Fox Sports 910, the home of Sun Devil Hockey.

The only time the two teams met was during the 2017-18 season when the Sun Devils won, 7-3, in the first round of the Ice Vegas Invitational. ASU went on to win the holiday tournament after defeating Michigan Tech for the program's first holiday tournament win in program history. The all-time series record is 1-0-0 with ASU looking to add another tally in the win column this weekend.

Northern Michigan is one of two CCHA teams ASU will compete against this season. In January, the Sun Devils will host first-year program Augustana.

The Sun Devils took down the No. 15 Merrimack Warriors in a series sweep last weekend, including a 1-0 overtime victory thriller on Friday night and a 4-2 heated win on Saturday night. As a result of the sharp skating and puck handling, ASU entered the national polls for the first time since 2020. Junior goaltender TJ Semptimphelter recorded his sixth career shutout and had a 30-plus save game, while freshman Anthony Dowd made his long-awaited debut. Matthew Kopperud recorded the game-winning goals on both nights and tallied his 25th career power play goal.

QUOTES OF THE WEEK

Tim Lovell on staying locked in going into this weekend:

"I think we just got to keep our eyes on the prize. With last weekend, obviously, the first couple of games kinda just getting our feet wet. I think the guys are getting used to the pace and getting to play. So I think that if we stick to it, the game plan, work hard and practice everyday, I think we'll be all set."

Anthony Dowd on challenges that Northern Michigan brings:

"They definitely bring a lot of offense, I think. We're gonna definitely have to tighten up our D-zone and be disciplined all around the ice. Not really give up a lot of odd-man rushes or take penalties because they're, they do have good special teams. So I think just stay disciplined and play our game."

SUN DEVIL NOTES

PENALTY KILL SUCCESS

After finishing the 2022-23 season as the third-best kill squad (87.1 percent success rate) in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey, the team is right back where they left off. In the two games this weekend, the Sun devils stopped 11 power play chances (33 minutes) for the Warriors.

LUCKY NUMBER 39

Alternate captain and senior forward Ryan O'Reilly opened up the scoring for the Sun Devils on Saturday night with his first goal of the season. Donning the number 39 on his jersey, the Texas native collected his 39th career point.

THE UNDISPUTED CAPTAIN

Unknown to many Sun Devil fans could be the ninth captain in Sun Devil Hockey history: Tyler Gratton. The graduate transfer joins the ASU roster for his fifth and final year of college eligibility and was unanimously named captain, as voted on by players and staff in September. In previous seasons, the captains group was appointed by head coach Greg Powers and his assistant coaches. This time around, Powers put the power in the players hands. giving the team a vote on the leadership group. Gratton was unanimously voted as captain for the 2023-24 season. He is accompanied by alternate captains (also voted on by the players and staff): Matthew Kopperud, Lukas Sillinger, Ryan O'Reilly, and Ethan Szmagaj.

OFF SEASON MOVES

"We got bigger. We got harder. We got a lot tougher."

Head coach Greg Powers added five transfers to the roster this offseason. The group includes three forwards and two defensemen culminating from Boston College, Yale, UMass Lowell, Colgate, and Penn State. The forwards: Brian Chambers, Tyler Gratton, and Alex Young combined for 73 total points from 36 goals and 37 assists in 2022-23. The duo of defensemen, Cade Alami and Brandon Tabakin, combined for 42 blocks, two goals, and seven assists last season.

FRESH FACES

With nine new freshmen on the roster for the 2023-2024 season, ASU bolstered several open spots with young talent. Joining the Sun Devils is Hank Levy (G), Anthony Dowd (D), Matthew Romer (F), David Hymovitch (F), Josh Niedermayer (D), Kyle Smolen (F), Cole Gordon (F), Cole Helm (F), and Tony Achille (F).

BETWEEN THE PIPES

TJ Semptimphelter resumes his reign between this pipes in 2023-24. The junior from New Jersey recorded his sixth career shutout on Friday night against No. 15 Merrimack with 31 saves. Semptimphelter was the only NCAA goaltender to earn a shutout against a ranked team so far this season (12 shutouts across NCAA). Last season, Semptimphelter recorded five shutouts to tie for fifth in the NCAA. Joey Daccord holds the ASU career record for shutouts with eight.

KRAZY FOR KOPPERUD

The long-awaited return of Matthew Kopperud is finally upon Sun Devil Hockey. The senior scored both game-winning goals in ASU's opening weekend to steal the lead for most GWG in the country. On Saturday night. Kopperud tallied a goal and an assist for his 20th career mulitpoint game. ASU is 10-10-0 when Kopperud records multiple points in a night. Kopperud also leads all current NCAA skaters in power play goals with 25. He is inow tied with ASU alum. Johnny Walker's record of 25 career power play goals. The fourth-year Sun Devil dons the 'A' this season - it is the first time in his entire hockey career that Kopperud has been a member of a captains group.

MEET YOUNGER

Head coach Greg Powers filled the gap left by Robert Mastrosimone and Josh Doan with elite firepower in San Jose draft pick Alex Young. The Colgate transfer ranks eighth among all active career leaders entering 2023-24 in points with 83. His 37 goals land him at No. 8 in goals among NCAA active career leaders. Last year, Young tallied 39 points (21G, 18A) in 40 games, including three game-winning goals and nine power play goals. He scored his first goal as a Sun Devil on Saturday night with assists from Tyler Gratton (C) and Ty Murchison.

ASSIST KING

Powers has replaced the first line center role carried last year by Josh Doan and Robert Mastrosimone with graduate transfer Brian Chambers on opening weekend. The Massachusetts native secured his 11th multi-point night on Saturday with two assists after earning an apple on Kopperud's game-winning overtime goal on Friday night. Chambers is coming off of his best statistical season in college hockey at UMass-Lowell with eight goals and 11 assists.

HEAD COACH GREG POWERS

Coach Powers enters his ninth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2023-24, and his 16th overall at the helm at ASU. He was a finalist for the 2019 and 2020 Spencer Penrose Award, which is awarded to the Division I Coach of the Year. Coach Powers was also named the 2018-19 Frank Kush Sun Devil Coach of the Year, as voted on by the 26 head coaches at Arizona State. On July 7, 2022, Arizona State University and Greg Powers agreed to a five-year contract extension through the 2026-27 season. In 2021-22, Powers led ASU to five-straight wins versus USCHO.com Top-20 opponents in 2021-22 for the first time in program history (the previous record for consecutive wins against ranked opponents was three-straight games). In 2021-22, the team boasted three of the top-10 scorers in the nation in Colin Theisen, Matthew Kopperud and Josh Doan. ASU scored 116 goals in 35 games for a 3.31 goals per game average, ranked No. 10 in the country. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their firstever ACHA Division I National Championship. Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.

BREAKING GROUND

- On Wednesday, Dec. 16, 2020, Arizona State University and Sun Devil Athletics announced all required approvals have been received for the
 commencement of construction on a new Multi-Purpose Arena, which will host university and community events and serve as the future home for Sun
 Devil men's ice hockey and wrestling. This project continues the development of the Novus Innovation Corridor, and will be sited south of Rio Salado
 Parkway on the east side of Packard Drive, immediately north of the existing Packard Drive Parking Structure.
- Construction began in January 2021 and recieved its certificate of occupancy on Friday, September 30, 2022.
- Over 8,000 square feet is set aside for a ASU state-of-the-art ASU locker room, weight room, lounge and coaches' offices on the north side of the arena.
 Eight additional locker rooms are accounted for on the west side of the arena between the main arena and community ice sheet that can be utilized for visiting teams, youth programs, ASU club programs, and live events.
- On February 14, 2022, ASU and the NHL's Arizona Coyotes formed the first agreement of its kind between a college and NHL team in 100 years. The last time an NCAA college team and an NHL team shared an arena was the Boston Bruins and Boston University from 1924-28 at Boston Arena, now known as Matthews Arena. Other improvements will now be made, at the Coyotes' expense, to prepare the arena to temporarily house Coyotes home games. These improvements include constructing coaches' rooms, equipment rooms, technology and other aspects of the new ASU arena according to NHL standards. The added cost is up to \$30 million, which will be paid in advance by the Coyotes.
- The 5,000-seat venue is managed and operated by Oak View Group, SCI Architects have designed the arena, while Mortenson Construction will serve as the design builder.
- The second full-size ice sheet will also be accessible to students, the community and youth ice hockey programs at every level, providing an additional public sheet to one of the fastest-growing states for youth hockey participation in the country.
- The seating configuration for Mullett Arena includes 20 luxury suites, two group suites, a large club lounge and event-level premium club seats. The club lounge will consist of a Center Ice Club on the main concourse that runs along center ice and can host up to 500 fans. On the 300-level, a social deck will run the length of the east side of the venue, providing an open-air, aerial view of the arena where fans can interact while still experiencing exceptional sightlines to the competition. The arena would also be able to serve as a backup for sports played on hardwood, such as volleyball.
- · A 942-seat student section occupies the entire west side of the venue to provide an enhanced gameday experience for ASU students.
