SUN DEVIL REWIND

The Sun Devils didn't get the hot start they wanted in Ann Arbor, as the No. 6 Wolverines -- who received one vote as the No. 1 team in the country -- outscored ASU 11-1 in the weekend series. After a tough 8-1 loss in game one, the Sun Devils fought tooth-and-nail in a close game down to the end in game two, but couldn't find a chink the armor of Michigan goaltender Strauss Mann.

The Sun Devil freshmen shined in the opening weekend, as all five made their collegiate debuts with forward **RYAN O'REILLY** netting his first goal in his first NCAA game. Linemate MATTHEW KOPPERUD earned his first point with an assist on the goal. Meanwhile, goaltender COLE BRADY made 44 saves in game two on 47 shots for the most saves by a rookie in his debut in program history.

SCOUTING THE SPARTANS

After spending parts of the 2019-20 season ranked within the top-20 of the national polls, the Spartans took yet another step forward under fourth-year head coach Danton Cole. Last season, Michigan State was also in the hunt for the Big Ten regular season title before finishing 11-11-2 in the conference and sixth -- just three points out of second. They would end up finishing the season 15-19-2 overall with a loss and overtime victory against the Sun Devils mixed in.

The Spartans are without three of their top-5 point earners from a year ago, including 33-point man Patrick Khodorenko. They also lost their team MVP and All-Big Ten second-team goaltender John Lethemon, who will be replaced between the pipes by junior Drew DeRidder and incoming freshmen Pierce Charleson and Jon'Mor.

Senior forward Mitchell Lewandowski is an offensive leader, ranking 2nd behind Sun Devil **JOHNNY WALKER** in career goals scored among active players.

Seven Sun Devils found the scoresheet in game one against MSU last year, including goals by PJ Marrocco, James Sanchez, Jacob Wilson and Johnny Walker.

SUN DEVIL TWEETABLES

- 1. These two teams last met nearly a year ago to the date when
- @SunDevilHockey visited Munn, splitting the series with one-goal wins for each.
- 2. The Spartans are the only @bigtenhockey team that @SunDevilHockey has a winning record against, boasting three wins and an overtime loss.
- 3. Freshman @oreilly_ryan became the first freshman since @dkoumontzis in 2018-19 to score a goal in his NCAA debut.
- 4. After being one of the least experienced teams in college hockey in recent years, ASU is T7th for most upperclassmen and T4th for most seniors.
- 5. Before Sunday night against @umichhockey, the Spartans were the last team to shutout @SunDevilHockey.

SPARKY VS. SPARTY

- These two teams have met four times over the last two seasons, with the Sun Devils owning the series with three victories.
- In their most recent game, it was a goaltending duel between EVAN DeBROUWER and MSU grad JOHN LETHEMON as the game went to overtime, 0-0. While Michigan State's Mitchell Lewandowski scored the game winner, DeBROUWER made 35 saves in an impressive performance.
- In game one of 2019, ASU held a two-goal lead heading into the 3rd period before the Spartans would knot it
 up halfway through the final frame. JOHNNY WALKER would come through with the game winner with just over
 5 minutes left in regulation.
- In November of 2018, the two met in Tempe with the Sun Devils taking game one, 5-4, as alternate captain JORDAN SANDHU netted his first collegiate goal and first three-point game.
- The next night, former ASU netminder JOEY DACCORD posted a shutout 20-save shutout while SANDHU finished a four-point weekend.

POPULAR DESTINATION

- The Sun Devils have fallen fortunate to transfers since the program transitioned to Division I, including players like Dylan Hollman, Robbie Baillargeon, Wade Murphy and David Norris.
- In 2019-20, forwards JAMES SANCHEZ (Michigan) and WILLIE KNIERIM (Miami) made immediate impacts in their junior seasons. SANCHEZ led the entire team and became the first player in program history to reach 40 points in a season, while KNIERIM contributed 15 goals and was 5th in scoring for the Devils.
- While CHRIS GRANDO (Boston College) came in a season ago and had to sit out during the 2019-20 season due to transfer rules, he joins SEAN DHOOGHE (Wisconsin) and TANNER HICKEY (Alabama-Huntsville)
 -- all of which were key contributors to their respective programs before transferring -- as the 2020-21 transfers hoping to contribute to the Maroon & Gold transfer reputation.

"NEVER BEEN DEEPER"

- "We have five really good lines right now, and it's a tough decision to figure out which four of the five are going
 to go. We know three of them that are staples, but when you have the talent on four and five that we have, it's
 a good problem to have. When you're playing all road games, that depth is going to come in handy there's no
 doubt about it." -Head coach Greg Powers
- "We've never had a deeper forward group then what we have. It's by far the deepest forward group we've had. The biggest question mark is how do we replace the minutes lost on the back end from Brinson (Pasichnuk) and (Josh) Maniscalco, and especially (Jacob) Semik who sits out game one with a suspension from the final Wisconsin game last year. But we really like the way guys look back there. (Transfer) Tanner Hickey is a really, really good hockey player, and we're really happy with how he looks so far." -Head coach Greg Powers
- A big part of the added depth is the arrival of the six incoming freshmen and three transfers. The freshman class was at one point ranked as high as No. 2 in the country, according to Neutralzone.net.
- The incoming freshmen include two NHL draft picks in forward RYAN O'REILLY (Detroit) and goaltender COLE BRADY (New Jersey).

DEVILS IN THE PROS

- Former netminder Joey Daccord, who helped catapult the program to its first NCAA Tournament berth, recently signed a three-year, two-way extension with the Ottawa Senators. Daccord was not only the first Sun Devil to sign an NHL contract, but play in the NHL as he made his debut on April 4, 2019. He was also the first Sun Devil committed to the program when getting drafted.
- This past season, senior defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk became the program's second player to sign an NHL
 contract and first to sign a free agent deal. Pasichnuk signed with the San Jose Sharks for two years back in
 June.
- Most recently in August, rising junior Josh Maniscalco signed a three-year free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Penguins and is immediately considered a top-10 prospect within the organization. Maniscalco recorded 11 goals and 21 assists last year and was ranked 6th among national defensemen in scoring.

WE GOT THE POWER(S)

Coach Powers enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2020-21, and his 13th overall at the helm at ASU. The two-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19 and were on track for a repeat appearance in 2019-20 before COVID-19 ended the season. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 235-120-27 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
