### A Quick Peek at the Cards

- ◆In 2020, the Cardinals reached their sixth Sweet Sixteen and second in the last two years.
- ◆The 2020 ACC title is the third in the last six seasons for the Cardinals (15-3, 12-2), and their second outright. Louisville shared the championship with Pitt in 2017 after winning it outright in 2015. Louisville also earned the ACC's automatic qualification to the NCAA Championship with the win over North Carolina.
- ◆The Cardinals snapped Pitt's home match winning streak at 37 (dating back to 2017) as their final match in the fall of 2020. The win vaulted UofL into the No. 5 ranking spot.
- ◆ The Cardinals made their first appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight in 2019 after beating No. 2 ranked Texas, an upset was called the biggest in NCAA Volleyball Tournament history.
- ◆The Cardinals were ranked as high as No. 1 in blocking as a team in 2020.
- ◆The Cardinals were picked second in the ACC Preseason Coaches Poll. With Anna DeBeer, Aiko Jones, Tori Dilfer and Amaya Tillman being named Preseason All-ACC
- ◆The Cardinals advanced to the Sweet Sixteen when Claire Chaussee came off the bench to notch a career-high 21 kills to beat San Diego 3-1.
- ◆The Cards had ten 3-0 wins last season.

Card Nation, the City of Louisville, KIVA and the Louisville Fire Department mourn the untimely death of Lesley Drury Prather, who lettered at UofL from 1998-2001. She died in a car accident while travelling to a club volleyball tournament in Kansas City along with her daughter, Rhyan and Carrie Urton McCaw and her daughter Kacey Urton McCawwas standout athlete and student at Syracuse from 1994-97

Prather was a standout player for the Cardinals and led UofL to three conference championships, four NCAA appearances and a Sweet Sixteen appearance. She was named All-Conference USA twice and was named to the AVCA All-Region team. A true student-athlete, Drury Prather was also named to the Athletic Director's and C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll for her commitment to academics. After graduation, she was on the athletic staff as a Coordinator for CardsCare and worked in athletic marketing. Her love of volleyball was always evident as she served as head volleyball coach in IU Southeast from 2009-2012. She led the Grenadiers to four-straight KIAC Semifinal appearances and never had a losing record during her tenure. Her overall record at IU Southeast was 81-63 (.562). She was active in the club coaching scene, coaching for KIVA, a local Louisville volleyball club. After resigning from IU Southeast in 2012, Prather joined the Louisville Metro Fire Department.

A native of Louisville, Drury-Prather attended high school at Pleasure Ridge Park (PRP) where she lettered in three sports (volleyball, women's basketball, and track). She was married to fellow Cardinal Forever Justin Prather and they were the parents of four children. She was the older sister to the current UofL volleyball director of operations Sarah Drury Petkovic.

### This Week in Cardinal Volleyball

No. 13 University of Louisville volleyball opens regular season play this weekend, traveling to Tempe, Ariz. for a three-game slate in the Sun Devil Volleyball Classic on Aug. 27-28. The Cardinals will square off against Cal Poly in game one of a double-header on Friday, Aug. 27 at 1:00 p.m. ET before taking on Texas A&M- Corpus Christi at 8:00 p.m. ET. UofL will conclude action on Saturday, Aug. 28 with a match against Arizona State at 7:00 p.m. ET.

### Take a Peek at the Competition Cal Poly

This marks only the second meeting between Louis-ville and Cal Poly, the first of which came on Sep. 10, 2006, and resulted in 3-2 win for the Mustangs. Led by head coach Caroline Walters (2nd season), Cal Poly has won the Big West title in two of the last three seasons and has made an NCAA Tournament appearance three consecutive years. In Walters' first season at the helm, the Mustangs finished with a 21-9 record and second in the Big West at 13-3. The Mustangs return two 2019 First Team All-Big West selections in setter Avalon DeNecochea and middle blocker Meredith Phillips. After not competing in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Friday's match will mark Cal Poly's first in 629 days.

#### TAMU-CC

The Cardinals match against Texas A&M- Corpus Christi will be the first meeting between the two programs. Last season, the Islanders won the Southland conference tournament championship for the third time in program history and enter this season as the preseason favorite to win the conference. Head coach Steve Green enters his seventh season with Corpus Christi and led the team to its third NCAA appearance last season. The Islanders return Southland Setter of the Year Faith Panhans and Southland Libero of the Year Carissa Barnes, as well as three other Southland Preseason All-conference selections in Rachel Young, Kylie Filipiak and Montez Uigaese.

#### **Arizona State**

Louisville's last match of the weekend against Arizona State will be the fourth meeting between the Sun Devils and the Cards. Louisville is 2-1 against the ASU and won the last meeting on Sep. 7, 2019 3-1 at home. In the 2020-21 season, Arizona State, led by head coach Sanja Tomasevic finished ninth in the PAC-12 with a 6-14 record. ASU returns 13 players for the 2021 season including, All-PAC-12 honorable mentions Iman Isanovic and Marta Levinska.

### **Dilfer and Stevenson Named to USCNT**

Louisville seniors Anna Stevenson and Tori Dilfer were chosen as two of twenty-nine top volleyball players who will train in Anaheim, Calif., on June 13-18 as part of the 2021 USA Volleyball Women's Collegiate National Team. Players on the Collegiate National Team, selected by the U.S. Women's National Team staff and National Team Development Program (NTDP), will work with top volleyball coaches at USAV's Anaheim training center. Athletes will receive evaluation, feedback and individual development plans.

### Five Named to All-ACC Academic Team

The University of Louisville volleyball team landed five Cardinals on the All-ACC Academic Team. ACC Champion Louisville and Notre Dame lead the league with five players each on the academic team, followed by Florida State and Pitt with four each. NC State has three honorees on the team. Amaya Tillman, Anna Stevenson, Aiko Jones, Tori Dilfer and Anna DeBeer join the best of the ACC scholar-athletes.

# Busboom Kelly named the 2020 AVCA East Region Coach of the Year

Named ACC Coach of the Year, Busboom Kelly led Louisville to its third ACC Championship, winning 13 league matches. Under her guidance, the Cardinals lead the nation in blocks per set and lead the league in opponent hitting percentage. Louisville also ranks among the top five in the ACC in hitting percentage (second, 285), kills per set (second, 14.08) and assists per set (12.58).

# DeBeer Named 2020 East Region Freshman of the Year

Named ACC Freshman of the Year, DeBeer, a native of Louisville, Kentucky, ranked near the top of the ACC in kills per set with 3.17. The rookie outside hitter had a .283 hitting percentage and averaged 1.50 digs per set.

### Dilfer, Jones, Stevenson, DeBeer 2020 All-East Region First Team

Dilfer, the ACC Setter of the Year, leads the ACC, ranked among the top 20 in the NCAA in assists per set with 10.93. The senior from Los Gatos, California, keyed a Louisville offense that was among the nation's leaders in hitting percentage (13th, .285) and kills per set (21st, 14.08).

Jones was named First Team All-ACC and was an ACC Player of the Week. She played in all 52 sets and started in all 16 matches. She leads the team with 153 kills, hitting .267. She has three assists and leads the Cards in aces with 16. She has 56 digs and 56 blocks.

Stevenson established herself as one of Louisville's most potent weapons, both offensively and defensively. She played in all 52 sets and has 132 kills, hits .449, with 10 aces, 22 digs and 68 blocks. She was named to the All-ACC First Team. She was ranked No. 10 in the nation in hitting percentage and No. 34 in blocks.

Busboom Kelly led Louisville to its third ACC Championship, winning 13 league matches. #### Dilfer Named 2020 ACC Setter of the Year

Tori Dilfer led the ACC and ranked among the top 20 in the NCAA in assists per set with 10.93. The senior from Los Gatos, California, keyed a Louisville offense that was among the nation's leaders in hitting percentage (13th, .285) and kills per set (21st, 14.08).

### Tillman Named 2020 ACC Defensive Player of the Year

Amaya Tillman led the league and ranked third in the nation in blocks per set with 1.65. She spearheaded a stout Louisville defense that is the best nationally in blocks per set this season with 3.25 and ranks 17th in opponent hitting percentage (.132).

### DeBeer Named 2020 ACC Freshman of the Year

A native of Louisville, Kentucky, DeBeer ranks 10th in the league in kills per set with 3.17. The rookie outside hitter has a .283 hitting percentage and averages 1.50 digs per set.

### Stevenson, Jones, DeBeer, and Dilfer Named 2020 1st Team All -ACC/Tillman Named 2nd Team

Thirteen different schools are represented on the All-ACC Team, led by Louisville and Notre Dame with five honorees. Aiko Jones leads the Cardinals in kills with 153, hits .267 and has a team-high 16 aces. Stevenson hits .449 with 132 kills and 68 total blocks.

### Aiko Jones Named ACC Player of the Week

A native of Kingston, Jamaica, Jones shone in Louisville's sweep of No. 8 Syracuse. The Cardinal had double-digit kills in both contests, highlighted by a .500 hitting percentage on 11 kills in Friday's 3-0 win. Jones racked up 28 total kills on a .345 hitting percentage while adding nine blocks, six digs and two aces across the two matches.

### **RPI Run Down**

With less than 100 schools playing volleyball in 2020, the RPI was not been released for theyear. The Cardinals' final RPI in 2019 was 15, the best in the ACC. RPI stands for Ratings Percentage Index and the index comprises a team's winning percentage (25%), its opponents' winning percentage (50%), and the winning percentage of those opponents' opponents (25%). The opponents' winning percentage and the winning percentage of those opponents' opponents both comprise the strength of schedule (SOS). Thus, the SOS accounts for 75% of the RPI calculation and is 2/3 its opponents' winning percentage and 1/3 its opponents' opponents' winning percentages.

### **Cards Named New Volunteer Coach**

Linda Hampton-Keith brings a wealth of experience to the Cardinals' program after serving as the head coach at NC State for four seasons. In her first season with the Wolfpack, Hampton-Keith guided the team to 13 ACC wins and then the team followed up that season with a program record 15 ACC wins and its first NCAA tournament win in school history. In all, she led NC State to 16 new team season records, 11 individual career and season records, 11 All-ACC selections, five AVCA All-Region selections and two AVCA All-Americans.

### **Cards Have New Sports Medicine Director**

Kelsey Penebaker was named as the director of sports medicine/women's health for the University of Louisville's volleyball team. Penebaker was the athletic trainer for volleyball and dance at the University of Michigan since July of 2016. She served in the same position at the University of Michigan for field hock-

ey and cheerleading from July 2014 to July 2016. A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Penebaker graduated from Winona State University with a bachelor of science in athletic training. She obtained her master of arts in integrative studies with a concentration in public health administration from Northern Kentucky University in May of 2013.

### **Twenty Win Seasons**

The Cardinals reached their 30th 20-win season in 2019 with the win over Samford. UofL has had five 30-win seasons. The 1982 season mark of 39-14 is the school record.

**2020:** (pronounced See-See) Rush played in 26 sets for the Cardinals with an assist, five aces and nine digs. Had her best match against Boston College when she had a kill, an ace and two digs. **Prep:** Rush played for Providence High school for Coach Terri Purichia and for Coach Craig Bossmeyer at Union Volleyball Club. At Providence, she was named Academic All-State as a senior. She helped lead Providence to the state runner-up as a freshman, to semistate runner-up as a sophomore and junior and regional runner up as a senior. As a senior, she recorded 339 digs, averaging 3.4 digs per set and notched 32 aces, playing for Providence, which was nationally ranked at No. 19 going into this season.

### **#2 Ayden Bartlett**

2020: Ayden plays two rotations for the Cards at defensive specialist. She has played in 43 sets with five aces and 90 digs. He best match came against Florida State when she had a career-high 18 aces. Against San Diego, she played in three sets. Prep: Bartlett played for Coach Cassie Rockers at Leavenworth High School and Club Coach Beau Barnthson at MAVS Volleyball. As a freshman, she was HM All-Sunflower League before being named to the First Team All Sunflower League and qualified for the state volleyball tournament as a sophomore. As a junior, she was named to the First Team United Kansas Conference and was the United Kansas Conference Player of the Year. Voted to the third Team All-State squad, she also won the Janice Van Gorp Fearless Spirit Award. As a senior, she was 1st team United Kansas Conference made the Region 8 AVCA team and was a Kansas vs Missouri All-Star Large Class Participant. Against San Diego, she had one kill in three sets. **2019:** Nena played in 14 matches, providing both a defensive and offensive spark off the bench. She had a season high 11 kills against Clemson. She hit .316 (8-2-19) at Cincinnati, the team that knocked off No. 2 Pitt in the NCAAs in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. She had a season-high 3 digs at Kentucky and versus Clemson. She had a four blocks against Georgia Tech. She was named to the ACC Honor Roll.

#4 Alexa Hendricks: 2020: As a defensive specialist, Alexa has played in 29 sets with four assists, and 30 digs. Her best amatch came at Duke where she had nine

didgs. **2019:** Hendrix played in all but four matches for the Cards as a solid defensive specialist. She had a season-high 12 digs against North Carolina with nine versus NC State and seven versus Cincinnati, Notre Dame, Virginia Tech, recording 105 in all. She notched 11 aces over the season with two versus Xavier, two at Wake Forest and two versus Virginia. She also recorded 26 assists with a season high of four at Cincinnati and versus NC State. She is ranked No. 10 in the nation in hitting percentage and No. 34 in blocks. She had her best match against Pitt and Florida State where she had 13 kills apiece, adding nine blocks at FSU. Agains San Diego, she had seven kills, two digs and six blocks. 2019: Transferred from Auburn, where she played for former UofL assistant coaches Rick Nold and Alex Wilharm, because she wanted to play in the post season. Hitting .273, she had 14 matches of .300 hitting or better, highlighted by her 14-3-28 (.393) effort against No. 2 Texas that sent UofL to its first Elite Eight. She had nine at Notre Dame, and eight apiece at home against Virginia and Pitt. She had seven at Cincinnati and versus NC State. Anna is a Red and Black Scholar, on the All-ACC Academic Volleyball Team and is a member of the ACC Honor Roll.

**#12 Tori Dilfer: 2020:** Tori was named the ACC Setter of the Year and First Team All-ACC. She was named to the AVCA All-East Region First Team. She played in all but two matches, with 27 kills, a team-high 492 assists, nine

aces, 95 digs and 26 blocks. Her best match came against FSU when she had 49 assists. She had six blocks against Miami and two aces at Pitt. Against San Diego, she had a kill, 41 assists and ace, seven digs and four blocks. 2019: Transferred in from TCU ... Cards started season out in 6-2 offense, then switched to 5-1 with Tori and freshman setter Shannon Shields sharing responsibilities Tori Dilfer was named NCAA All-Texas Region for helming the team's Cinderella run to the Elite Eight. started the season at setter when UofL was running a 6-2 offense. The Cardinals moved to the 5-1 later in the season with Dilfer at the helm and she led them to their first Elite Eight Appearance. She had a total of 880 assists (8.38 per set) and was second on the team in aces with 28. She had a season-high three aces against Xavier, Syracuse, Notre Dame and Samford. She had a season-high 57 assists at Miami and had more than 40 on eight other occasions. She hit a perfect 100 percent at Duke with a 4-0-4 night. She racked up 39 total blocks with her season-high coming against NC State when she notched five against the Pack. An outstanding student, Tori made the ACC Honor Roll, the All-ACC Academic Team and is a Red and Black Scholar.

#### #14 Anna DeBeer

2020: Anna was voted ACC Freshman of the Year, First Team All-ACC, ACC All-Freshman and was a three-time ACC Player of the Week. She was named to the AVCA All-East Region First Team and was voted the East Region Freshman of the Year. She has played in 46 sets with 146 kills, hits .283 with two assists, 10 aces, 69 digs and 18 blocks. Her best match came against Pitt when she had 22 kills and hit .395 with three blocks She had three aces each against both GeorgiaTech and North Carolina. Against San Diego, she had 11 kills, eight digs and five blocks. Prep: A native Louisvillian, Anna played for Coach Ron Kordes at Assumption High School in Louisville and KIVA for Coach Alan Davis, was an AAU Junior National Volleyball Championship All-American in 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019 and a member of the Ultra-Ankle JVA All National Team in 2017, 2018, and 2019. She led her club team to the USA Today National Champions in 2017 and 2018, and National Championships in Prep Volleyball Max Preps in 2018. At Assumption, she led her team to the Kentucky State Championships in 2017, 2018, and 2019. Her individual honors include being named Durango Fall Classic MVP in 2017 and all-Durango Tournament in 2018 and 2019. An Asics Challenge All-Tournament Team in 2019, she was named to the All USA Preseason High School Volleyball Team in 2019 and the Max Preps Preseason High School Volleyball All-American Team in 2019. A Max Preps/AVCA Kentucky Player of the Week in 2019, she was ranked No. 19 in the Class of 2020 Prep Volleyball Top Senior Aces. She was Seventh Region All Tournament Volleyball in 2017, 2018, and 2019 and Seventh Region Player of the Year in 2019. She made KVCA First Team All-State in 2017 and 2018 and KHSAA Volleyball State All-Tournament Team in 2018, 2019. This year she was the KHSAA Volleyball State Tournament MVP in 2019 and an Under Armour All-America First Team selection in 2019. She led the Rockets to a 36-7 record and the state championship along with a No. 11 national ranking as rated by PrepVolleyball.com. DeBeer recorded 409 kills. 287 digs, 27 service aces and 27 blocks. Kentucky's Ms. Vol-

**#15 Aiko Jones:** 2020: Aiko (pronounced EYE-koh) was named First Team All-ACC and was an ACC Player of the Week. She was named to the AVCA All-East Region's first team. She played in all 52 sets and started in all 16 matches. She leads the team with 153 kills, hitting .267. She has three assists and leads the Cards in aces with 16. She has 56 digs and 56 blocks. Her best match came against Syracuse when she had 17 kills. She had three aces each against Miami, Pitt and NC State. She had seven blocks at Boston College. Against San Diego, she had five kills, six digs and three blocks. 2019: Aiko Jones had a breakout season in her first year, earning First Team All-ACC, AVCA All-East Region, AVCA HM All-American honors as well as being named to the NCAA Texas All-Regional Team. In the regular season, she was named to the All-LUV and All-Cardinal Classic teams. She started every set of every match and led the team in kills, and attacks while hitting .258 for the season from the right side. She was third on the team with 27 aces and third in digs with 151 and second in blocks with 97. She had a season-high 23 points when she was unstoppable against the No. 2 ranked Longhorns of Texas with 23 which tallied up to .375 hitting (23-5-48) to lead UofL to its first Elite Eight appearance. She had two double-doubles: a 18 kill, 10 dig performance at Syracuse and 10 kill, 10 dig output at Pitt. She had 21 matches with double-digit kills. She had 20 kills at Miami and at Western Kentucky to lead the Cardinals to the Sweet Sixteen. She had 19 kills at Virginia Tech, and 18 at Boston and Syracuse. In all, she was responsible for 460 of the Cardinals' points. As strong in the classroom as she is on the court, Aiko is a member of the ACC Honor Roll, was named to the ACC All-Academic Team and is a Red and Black Scholar.

#17 Mia Stander: 2020: Mia (pronounced MEE-ya) played in 19 sets with one assist and an ace and recorded 11 digs. Against San Diego, she had two digs. 2019: Mia Stander played in 30 matches last year at defensive specialist. She had 10 aces, 29 assists and 122 digs (fifth on the team). She had a season-high 12 digs at Western Kentucky after notching 10 against Samford in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament. A steady server, Stander had 10 aces with a season high two at Boston College. She tallied 29 assists with a season high four at Miami. She even notched a kill at Notre Dame on a broken play. Mia is a member of the ACC Honor Roll and is a Red and Black Scholar.

#20 Rachael DeMarcus: 2020: Acts as backup setter. Stepped in for Tori Dilfer at Boston College and led the Cards to two wins. She has seven kills, 86 assists, an ace, 10 digs and two blocks in the nine sets she played. Her 52 digs against BC was a season-high for the Cards. 2019: Transferred from South Alabama, where she appeared in 26 matches with 17 starts ... Ranked eighth in the Sun Belt Conference in assists per set (6.83) ... Also ranked eighth in the league in assists per set (8.10) in conference matches ... Named the Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Week on Nov. 5, after recording 78 assists for an average of 11.14

assists per set in a pair of matches against Troy ... Finished with 30 or more assists in eight matches ... Recorded five double-doubles on the season, which ranked second on the team ... Finished with a career-high 50 assists against Arkansas State (Nov. 15) in the opening round of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament, and tied her career-high in digs (13).

#22 Jamie Vasilou: 2020: Jamie played in one set and uncorked an ace and notched a dig against Miami. 2019: Feel good story of the squad ... walked on as a manager ... earned a spot on the team in the spring ... started her athletic career as an elite Level 8 gymnast ... Also ran track ... Moved to volleyball late in her high school career ... In her first year as a player, Jamie played in five matches, with a pair of assists against Tennessee Tech as her season high. Jamie excels in the classroom and is a member of the ACC Honor Roll and is a Red and Black Scholar.

**#25 Amaya Tillman:** 2020: Named ACC Defensive Player of the Year, Amaya was also 2nd Team All-ACC. She is currently ranked No. 3 in the nation in blocks per set. She has been ranked as high as No. 1 in that category. She has played in 49 sets with 68 kills, five digs, 81 blocks. Her best match came against BC when she had 10 blocks. Against San Diego, she had four kills and nine blocks. 2019: In her first year as a Cardinal, Amaya progressed quickly, earning a starting slot at middle blocker. Her progress did not go unnoticed as she was named to the ACC's All-Freshman Team. She had 95 total blocks with 13 at Pitt as a season high. She had nine at Western Kentucky in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to advance to the Sweet Sixteen. Against No. 2 Texas, she had six kills, three blocks as the Cardinals advanced to their first Elite Eight. She had a season-high four digs at Virginia Tech. She had six blocks against both Wake Forest and at Miami. She had an ace against Wake and at Boston College. She hit .667 (6-0-8) in the win over Syracuse and hit .500 at BC (7-1-12). Exceling in the classroom, Amaya made the ACC Honor Roll, was named to the All-ACC Academic Team and is a Red band Black Scholar.
