1. The Sun Devils logged 94 home runs last sea-

The Sun Devils led the nation in home runs during the 2019 regular season with 92 (finishing with 94 including the postseason), the most since the 1993 Sun Devils recorded 97 homers. The Sun Devils were the NCAA statistical champion in home runs per game at 1.65. The 94 homers were easily a Pac-12 record for the BBCOR era of batting standards, surpassing Oregon State's total of 67 in 2018, ASU was the first Power Five

school in that BBCOR era to have multiple players reach the 20-home run milestone thanks to Torkelson (23) and

ASU's 18 strikeouts against #24 Oklahoma State were the most for against a Power Five program since March 21, 1998, against Cal. It was the most, period, since a 21-strikeout effort in 2001 against a now defunct Southern Utah program, Erik Tolman struck out 12 - the most for an ASU pitcher since Ryan Kellogg had 12 strikeouts against Oregon on May 12, 2014. It took Kellogg eight innings to get to that mark, while Tolman was able to reach the number in just six innings of work. It was the most strikeouts in six or fewer innings since Mitchell Lambson had 12 on March 14, 2009 in 5.2.

The Sun Devil pitching rotation has had as effective of a five-game stretch to open the season as it has in recent memory. The Sun Devils have not allowed more than five runs in each of the first five games, the first time accomplishing that feat to start a season since 2012. Each of ASU's five separate starting pitchers has recorded a quality start in their first outing of the season (3 or fewer earned runs in 6.0+ innings of work). ASU's five consecutive quality starts are the most since a seven-game stretch in 2011.

Opponents have wanted no part of Spencer Torkelson this season, intentionally walking him five times through the first five games. Torkelson was electric in the first two games of the season, sending each of his first two hits of the 2020 season out of the ball park. The junior now has 50 homers in his career and is within six of tying Bob Horner's longstanding school record of 56. He needs two home runs to move into sole possession of second in ASU history (Jeff Larish, 51)

All three games will be available to be streamed live through the Pac-12 Network Live Stream.

On The Eagles

- ASU is 5-0 all-time against Boston College and but have not seen each other since a dominant fourgame series for the Sun Devils back in 1999 that included one game where ASU set a school record with 10 doubles. ASU scored 20 or more runs in three of the four games.
- BC went 3-1 on opening weekend against Northern Illinois in Winter Haven, Fla. Three senior Eagles went 6-for-13 in the series, including shortstop Brian Dempsey, who hit an opening day home run and totaled a team-high seven RBI.
- First baseman Jack Cunningham hit two doubles and outfielder Joe Suozzi added a triple. Sophomore outfielder Sal Frelick returned to the lineup and went 5-for-14 with six runs and three stolen bases.
- Sophomore right-hander Mason Pelio gets the ball on Friday night. He went five innings with two runs against him and four strikeouts in the opening day win vs. NIU.
- The BC game hat features a "Strike Out ALS" patch on the side and this year the Eagles honor former captain Pete Frates with a "PF3" patch on each jersey. Frates, diagnosed with ALS in 2012, was an avid fundraiser and advocate for a cure by spreading awareness, including the Ice Bucket Challenge. He passed on Dec. 9, 2019. The Sun Devils will honor Pete prior to Sunday's contest.

Fear the Tork

- Projected as No. 1 Overall Pick in several early MLB mock drafts and a unanimous Top-3 Pick in any mock draft he's not listed No. 1, junior first baseman Spencer Torkelson figures to pace a potent offense
- The junior opened the season with a bang with each of his first two hits of the campaign leaving the ball park in the series against Villanova. The Wildcats didn't need a third reminder, and Torkelson was intentional walked four times over the rest of the series.
- Torkelson leads the nation with nine walks through five games, five of which of the intentional variety.
- Torkelson has 50 homers in his career, needing just seven to surpass Bob Horner's long-standing school record of 56 and two to move into sole possession of second in ASU history (Jeff Larish, 51).
- Torkelson needs 23 home runs to break into the NCAA all-time Top-10 in career homers and in doing so would become the first player in the BBCOR era to even sniff the feat. He would be just the second player since 2000 to have a career home run tally that left him in the Top-10 in NCAA homers (Matt LaPorta, Florida).

#TorksUp

- Last season, Torkelson was the Pac-12 home run leader for the second season in a row, finishing the season with 23 - good for fifth in the nation. He became the first Pac-12 player to lead the conference in homers in back-to-back seasons since Oregon State's Michael Conforto 2012 and 2013, though it should be noted Conforto only hit 13 and 11 in those seasons.
- Torkelson is only the third player in Pac-12 history to have back-to-back 20+ home run seasons.
- Torkelson ranked in the Top-10 in the Pac-12 in a slew of categories including homers (1st), walks (41/8th), average (.351/8th), hits (85/3rd/33rd nationally), runs (69/3rd/18th nationally), RBIs (66/2nd/27th nationally), slugging (.707/3rd/17th nationally) and total bases (171/1st/5th nationally).
- Torkelson led the team with 27 hits with runners in scoring position, recording 27 hits on 67 chances
- He was an extremely tough out to end the inning, extending the inning 26-of-67 times with two outs (.388) with a team-best 35 two-out RBI - 15 more than any other player on the roster.
- Hit or not, Torkelson consistently found a way to successfully advance baserunners, doing so 71 times on 142 opportunities (.500).
- With his first home run in the series against Cal, Torkelson has homered in every single Pac-12 ballpark in the league despite being just a sophomore.
- Torkelson has played 29 weekend series at ASU and homered at least once in 23 of those. He has played 20 Pac-12 series and homered in 18 - the season finales against Cal (2018) and Stanford (2019) being the only exceptions
- Defensively, Torkelson made huge strides and helped turn 10 more double plays than any other player in the Pac-12 (57), which was a testament to some of the impressive stretches and picks he has made to make those possible.
- He had just four errors on the year despite being sixth in Pac-12 in defensive chances (476) and one of those came while he was playing out of position in right field for one inning in a game earlier this season.
- Joined Brett Wallace as the only other player in Sun Devil history to be a two-time semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.

GAME NOTES

Alika Like That

- Alike Williams quietly continued to put up impressive numbers as a sophomore in 2019, embracing his role as a cleanup hitter with All-Pac-12 honorable mention accolades with a .333 batting average with 53 RBIs - easily a career high in the category. He had just 20 total RBIs as a freshman.
- When he did get RBIs, he tended to get a lot of them. He had 16 multi-RBI games was second on the team with nine games with three or more RBIs.
- Williams homered four times and recorded 12 doubles and three triples. He slugged .474 on the season - nearly 150 points higher than his freshman total of .333. With 19 extra-base hits on the year, he far surpassed his freshman total
- The sophomore was incredible when falling behind in counts, posting a .409 average (18-of-44) when facing 1-2 counts. Of his 71 hits on the year, 41 came from behind in the count.
- He was 37-of-105 (.352) on two-strike hitting on the year striking out a teamlow 28 times while walking 33 times, making him the only player on the roster with more walks than strikeouts.
- 20 of his 53 RBIs (.377) came when falling behind in counts.
- The sophomore was incredible at advancing baserunners this season, leading the team with a .593 average with 73 advancements on 123 opportunities.
- Williams was ASU's most productive hitter with the bases loaded, going 7-for-14 (.500) with a team-best 16 RBIs.
- Defensively, Williams was second in the Pac-12 with 149 defensive assists.
- He has helped turn 36 double plays, which was good for fourth overall in the Pac-12 and first among non-first basemen.
- His defensive efforts allowed him to be named a member of the Pac-12 All-Defensive team as a result.

Putting in the Work

- Gage Workman was one of the hottest players in the Sun Devil lineup of at the end of last season and finished the year batting .330 with 40 runs scored, 42 RBIs and eight home runs. He had hits in 20 of the final 26 games and multiple hits in 12 of those.
- He was second on the team with 20 two-out RBIs and successfully advanced runners 63 times on 125 chances (.504)
- In Pac-12 only games, Workman had a .330 average the best total on the squad while his 25 Pac-12 RBIs were second on the team.
- In Pac-12 only games, Workman was tied for 10 in the league with 19 walks.
- His .430 on-base percentage was 12th in Pac-12 games and the second-best among all Sun Devils in the category. His .623 slugging percentage in Pac-12 games was 9th in the league and second on the team.
- Workman had eight home runs on the season, a new career high. His 23 extrabase hits surpassed his freshman total of 20.
- The sophomore earned Honorable Mention honors on the All-Pac-12 team.
- Workman had just three errors in Pac-12 games at third base on 80 chances (.964) and helped turn 17 double plays on the season en route to Pac-12 Defensive Honorable Mention honors.

Trev Lightly and Carry a Big Stick

- Trevor Hauver breakout sophomore campaign in which he was named to the Pac-12 Honorable Mention team as well as earning a second-team nod on the ABCA All-West Region team
- Spent the majority of the season as the leadoff batter, recording a .339 average that was good for third on the team behind All-Americans Hunter Bishop and Spencer Torkelson
- Slugged .574 on the year behind 13 home runs (10th in the Pac-12) and 16 doubles (7th in the conference) and reached base at a .433 clip
- Hauver had a 15-game hitting streak at one point in the season, the thirdlongest streak for a Sun Devil on the year
- He was the top ASU player in games in several categories, posting a seven-RBI game, a five-hit game, a four-walk game and a two-home run game.
- Scored 60 runs, sixth in the Pac-12 and 60th in the country
- As a leadoff batter in an inning, Hauver reached base 37 times this season on 98 chances (.378)
- Hauver was very productive for his teammates as well, successfully advancing runners 68 times on 126 chances (.540). Of ASU's day-to-day starters, Hauver's 32 runners left stranded were the fewest on the team.
- He was light's out with runners in scoring position, leading the team with a .450 average on 27-of-60 hitting while also making it tough for pitchers to get

- out of innings with a second-best .370 average on 20-of-54 hitting with two outs.
- Hauver had a case for being ASU's most clutch batter late in games. In innings 7-9, Hauver bat .403 on 25-of-62 hitting with 18 RBIs and 17 runs, easily leading ASU in each of those categories in the late stages of games. Six of his 13 home runs came in those latter stages of games.

Filling the Boyd

- Boyd Vander Kooi is the veteran presence in the starting rotation for the Sun Devils this season and responded in turn with an incredibly efficient 7.2 innings of work against Villanova, allowing just one earned run and striking out five.
- Last season, Vander Kooi Went 4-4 and was second on the team with 85 strikeouts to 39 walks over 95.0 innings pitched
- Posted one of just two of ASU's complete game efforts on the season in his victory over Utah
- Gave ASU at least seven innings in three of his last four outings and posted five quality starts on the season
- Over the final three regular season weekends 2019, Vander Kooi had a team low 2.25 ERA, striking out 22 and walking just 4.
- His 20.0 innings pitched in that time were the most among all players while he allowed just one single extra base hit - also a team low, regardless of starting or relief pitchers.
- Vander Kooi struck out a career high 11 batters in 7.0 scoreless innings against #3 Stanford in the final game of the regular season. He became the first Sun Devil since 2016 to record 11 strikeouts in a game.

Justin Time

- Justin Fall has been named the Friday night starter for the 2020 season and the southpaw junior college transfer will look to fill the void left by Alec Marsh, who was drafted in the second round of the 2019 MLB Draft.
- The first impression was a good one as Fall went 6.0 innings against Villanova with no runs allowed and six strikeouts.
- Fall was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 122 overall prospect in the country for the 2019 MLB Draft but chose to come to Arizona State instead
- Drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the 34th round with the 1009th overall pick of the 2019 MLB Draft
- Fall pent two years at Brookdale Community College after graduating from Toms River South High School
- Pitched 64.1 innings while leading the team with a 1.82 ERA as a sophomore, striking out 68 with just 13 walks on the season and only 13 earned runs
- As a freshman, led Brookdale with 64.1 innings pitched, 72 strikeouts, and five complete games and finished with a 7-2 record in his first season at the Community College level
- Ranked as the #1 prospect in the Atlantic Collegiate League last summer after compiling a 0.90 ERA, and 35 strikeouts in 20 innings...posted an impressive 35-to-12 strikeout to walk ratio.

Every Rose Has Its Thorn

- Saint Mary's transfer Tyler Thornton also figures to play heavily into the Sun Devil pitching rotation.
- Thronton was nigh unhittable in his debut as a Sun Devil, allowing just one hit in 6.2 innings of work
- Thornton was tabbed the National Freshman of the Year (Collegiate Baseball) and National Freshman Pitcher of the Year (NCWBA) and Freshman of the Year of the West Coast Conference.
- Finished the year with a 10-2 record and a 2.71 earned run average in 13
- His 5.54 hits allowed per nine innings were ranked 11th in the country and first in the West Coast Conference and his 10 wins were also ranked 11th in the
- Along with teammate Carlos Lomeli (also 10 wins), he collected the most wins in a single season by any Gael pitcher since 1991.
- Thornton's 11.08 strikeouts per nine were ranked third in the WCC and his WHIP of 0.97 was also third in the conference (27th in the nation).

Just Like He Drew It Up

Despite missing three weeks to injury, Drew Swift showed he was one of ASU's most improved hitters throughout the season, in addition to his deft

- glove at second base
- Was named to the Pac-12 honorable mention All-Defensive team
- He has nine doubles this season a career-best and a triple for 10 extra-base hits on the season despite missing several weeks to injury. He had just two extrabase hits as a freshman
- Swift was a part of 36 double plays, despite the time missed, good for fourth in the Pac-12 in the category and second among non-first basemen. He helped ASU turn 61 double plays on the season - sixth in the nation and first in the Pac-12
- His 135 defensive assists were good for 7th in the Pac-12.
- Managed to to reach base at a .375 clip on the season over .100 points higher than his batting average as he provided a valuable tool at the bottom of the ASU order
- Became the first Sun Devil since Jake Peevyhouse in 2014 to have three doubles in a game, doing so against San Diego.

Pay the Tolman

- Erik Tolman was thrust into several crucial spots as a true freshman this season and responded best when the lights were on, showing off his skills in a number of two-way roles
- Tolman's 2020 debut was absolutely electric as he posted a career-best 12 strikeouts against #24 Oklahoma State the most for an ASU pitcher since Ryan Kellogg had 12 strikeouts against Oregon on May 12, 2014. It took Kellogg eight innings to get to that mark, while Tolman was able to reach the number in just six innings of work.
- It was the most strikeouts in six or fewer innings since Mitchell Lambson had 12 on March 14, 2009 against Kansas in 5.2 innings.
- In 2019, Tolman went 3-1 with two saves this season and a team-best 3.38 ERA
 among pitchers averaging at least two innings per game and didn't allowed an
 earned run in 15 of his 24 appearances
- Tolman struck out 49 batters and in 48.0 innings pitched.
- Opponent's .206 batting average against Tolman last year, easily the lowest on the team.
- Tolman was dominant when he has two strikes to his credit in 2020, holding opponents to 4-35 (.114) in 1-2 counts and 5-of-30 (.167) in 2-2 counts with 33 of his 49 strikeouts.
- With runners on the basepath, opponents bat just 17-of-86 (.198) against Tolman in 2020 and he has been shutdown with two outs, limiting the opposition to 8-of-54 (.148) while stranding 53 baserunners.

Pounding The Zone

- ASU's new pitching coach Jason Kelly has made immediate impressions on the Sun Devil pitching staff based on early returns
- The Sun Devil pitching rotation has had as effective of a five-game stretch to open the season as it has in recent memory. The Sun Devils have not allowed more than five runs in each of the first five games, the first time accomplishing that feat to start a season since 2012.
- Each of ASU's five separate starting pitchers has recorded a quality start in their
 first outing of the season (3 or fewer earned runs in 6.0+ innings of work).
- ASU's five consecutive quality starts are the most since a seven-game stretch in 2011 (one game against Fullerton and series against Arizona and Oregon).
- ASU finished the first week of action second in the Pac-12 and Top-50 nationally with a team 2.20 ERA.
- ASU's 18 strikeouts against #24 Oklahoma State were the most for against
 a Power Five program since March 21, 1998, against Cal. It was the most,
 period, since a 21-strikeout effort in 2001 against a now defunct Southern Utah
 program.

Dab On 'Em

- RJ Dabovich kicked off the 2020 season as the team's closer and responded with two saves in his opening week of work. The junior has posted a 0.0 ERA in 4.1 innings of work in three appearances with six strikeouts.
- A pivotal addition to the Sun Devil rotation last season, RJ Dabovich recorded a 7-1 record while recording three saves
- Started nine games in 2020 the first eight games of the year and his final appearance in the postseason against Stony Brook - while appearing in relief in seven games
- Struck out 47 batters to 26 walks in 53.0 innings pitched
- · Escaped a no-out, bases loaded jam in extra innings at Cal to set up an eventual

ASU victory

- Recorded saves in his first three relief appearances on the season, picking them up against Washington, top-ranked UCLA and Arizona
- Struck out a season-high six in wins against Xavier and Stony Brook the latter in an elimination game in the 2019 postseason

Chicks Dig The Long Ball

- ASU's power numbers this last season were at another level as the Sun Devils
 led the nation in home runs during the 2019 regular season with 92 (finishing
 with 94 including the postseason), the most since the 1993 Sun Devils recorded
 97 homers. The Sun Devils were the NCAA statistical champion in home runs per
 game at 1.65.
- The 94 homers were easily a Pac-12 record for the BBCOR era of batting standards, surpassing Oregon State's total of 67 in 2018.
- ASU was the first Power Five school in that BBCOR era to have multiple players reach the 20-home run milestone thanks to Torkelson (23) and Bishop (22). ASU was just the 5th team in Pac-12 history to have two different players reach 20 homers in one season.
- The Devils had three players with over 10 home runs in Spencer Torkelson (23), Hunter Bishop (22), and Trevor Hauver (13). It was the first time a Sun Devil roster has laid that claim since 2009 (Carlos Ramirez/19, Jason Kipnis/16, Kole Calhoun/12).
- With Hunter Bishop and Spencer Torkelson eclipsing 20 home runs last season after Spencer Torkelson hit 25 as a freshman, it was the first time ASU had a player hit 20 or more home runs in consecutive seasons since 1987 (Tony Mattia/21) and 1988 (Tim Spehr/20).
- Bishop and Torkelson make ASU just the 5th team in Pac-12 history to have players reach 20+ home runs in multiple consecutive seasons, joining ASU '84-85 (Bonds/McDowell), WSU '87-88 (Hooper/Olerud), STAN '90-91 (Griffin/McCarty) and UCLA '97-01 (5 players combined)
- They are first ASU duo to have 20+ HRs in same year. Since the BBCOR batting standards were introduced in '11, ASU is the first Power 5 team to achieve this and just 2nd team overall.
- ASU was just the 5th Pac-12 team in history to have at least two players reach 20+ homers in same season, joining Arizona '93 (Arias/Thompson), UCLA '97 (Glaus/Heinrichs/Valent), UCLA '00 (Johnson/Utley/Scott) and Stanford '08 (Ratliff/Muth)
- Ten different Sun Devils went yard last season, with eight of those doing so 3 or more times.

Pitching For Contact

- The Sun Devil pitching staff did its part to put trust in the defense behind it, a trait
 of pithching to contact that led to 61 double plays being turned on the season a
 total that led the Pac-12 and was fourth nationally.
- ASU's defense did its part in matching the school season record with a solid .976 fielding percentage that that was fourth in the league and 50th nationally after consecutive seasons ranked 184th or worse in the cateogry.
- That trusting relationship has played a huge role in ASU escaping numerous jams this season. In total, ASU has stranded 474 opponents on the basepath during the regular season - just a tick under nine stranded runners per game at 8.8 per game.
