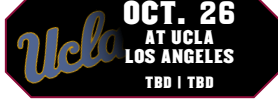

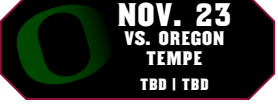

THE GAME - Sun Devil Football continues the 2019 season and the program's second season under head coach Herm Edwards this Friday, September 6 at Sun Devil Stadium in Tempe, Ariz., against Sacramento State. The tilt is scheduled for a 7 p.m. kickoff and will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Network and can be heard over the airwaves on Arizona Sports 98.7 FM.

THE OPPONENT - This will mark just the second meeting between the two programs. ASU knocked off the Hornets, 55-0, in 2013 in a game where the Sun Devils allowed just 167 total yards of offense. Sac State soundly defeated NAIA opponent Southern Oregon in its season opener, 77-19.

KICKING OFF

--With last weekend's win, the Sun Devils have come out victorious in 21 consecutive home openers - a total tied for the fifth longest active stream in the nation with Michigan State. Only Florida (30), Wisconsin (23), Oklahoma State (23) and Illinois (22) have longer streaks.

--The Sun Devils' 200 total yards of offense allowed against Kent State was the lowest since allowing 167 against Sacramento State in 2013. It was the 11th-lowest total yardage allowed since 1996.

--The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) - the most ever in the modern era at ASU. Additionally, eight other non-freshmen made their Sun Devil debuts for a total of 33 players that were either redshirt freshmen or appearing in their first games at ASU out of just 61 total players that entered the game on Thursday.

--Brandon Aiyuk's 77-yard touchdown reception was the fourth longest offensive touchdown in a season opener in school history. It is the longest by a Sun Devil since J.R. Redmond's 93-yard run against New Mexico State in 1997.

--Kent State's six fumbles were the most by an opponent since ASU also forced six fumbles on October 14, 2000 against Washington and marked the seventh consecutive game dating back to last season in which ASU has forced at least one turnover.

--Lasting only 2 hours and 58 minutes, the Kent State game was the shortest ASU game since the Sun Devils defeated Utah on October 8th, 2011 (2:57).

--The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Michael Turk on Aug. 29 vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average vs. Alabama on punts of 56, 65, 62, 61 and 60 for 304 yards. Turks punted five times for 315 yards with boots of 64, 62, 65, 49 and 75 in his Sun Devil debut.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- Give ASU consecutive 2-0 starts in Herm Edwards' tenure as head coach.
- Move ASU to 2-0 over Sacramento State in series history and 39-14-4 all-time against the Big Sky Conference. All 14 losses came against Northern Arizona and all happened prior to 1939. The Sun Devils have never lost a game to a Big Sky opponent in the modern era.
- Move ASU to 5-0 in non-conference regular season matchups under Herm Edwards.
- Move ASU to 37-10 in games played at Sun Devil Stadium since the 2012 season.

MILESTONE COUNTDOWNS

- **114 rushing yards** needed for Eno Benjamin to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards (currently at 1,886)
- **3 rushing touchdowns** needed for Benjamin to reach 20 rushing touchdowns in his career (currently at 17)
- **2 consecutive starts** needed for both Cohl Cabral and Kobe Williams to reach 30 consecutive starts for the Sun Devils (currently at 27)

#BYTHENUMBERS

135

ASU holds the longest active FBS streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 135 straight games. The Sun Devils last scored a touchdown or less when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 76 of those games (56.3 percent). ASU has done it's part on offense to keep the tally in tact with little drama, scoring under 10 points just one time (a nine-point effort against USC back in 2009).

Kobe Williams graded out with an 85.9 score from Pro Football Focus in the Opening week, the fifth-highest score among all cornerbacks nationally and second-highest score for any Pac-12 defender, regardless of position. Williams was targeted six times and **allowed two catches...for -10 yards and -5 yards after the catch** - the only corner in the country to allow negative YAC while the .10 total yards are the fewest of any corner nationally. He finished with two breakups, a forced fumble and a tackle for loss while allowing just a paltry 42.4 NFL QB rating when targeted.

The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Michael Turk vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average. Turk's 75-yarder to cap off the night was tied for the seventh-longest punt in school history and the longest punt in the FBS in the opening weekends. Turk's 63.0 yards per punt average in nine yards further than any player in the FBS over the first two week's of action (Kentucky's Max Duffy averaged 54.0 yards per punt on six punts).

ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 10 of 14 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of its 43 previous games dating back to 2013. That total is notable as ASU had allowed more than 30 points or more in 32 of its previous 43 games dating back to 2013 prior to the marked improvement in limiting opponent scoring in 2018. The Sun Devils allowed just 25.5 points per game last season, good for 53rd nationally. The total was notable as ASU was 103rd nationally at 32.8 points per game allowed in 2017 and had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior.

The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) - the most ever in the modern era at ASU. Additionally, eight other non-freshmen made their Sun Devil debuts for a total of 33 players that were either redshirt freshmen or appearing in their first games at ASU out of just 61 total players that entered the game on Thursday. Dohnovan West became the only true freshman center to start in the season opener when he earned the nod on Thursday night. Only seven true freshmen offensive linemen in the FBS were expected to start in their team's season openers, with West being the only center of the group.

Eno Benjamin forced 11 missed tackles in the opener, tied for the third-most among all running backs in the country (Utah's Zach Moss had 17 and Cal's Chris Brown had 13. Benjamin played 25 snaps in passing routes in the opener, the eighth-most of any running back in the country. Eno Benjamin recorded his 10th career 100-yard rushing game against Kent State, finishing with 102 yards on 22 carries. The 10 games with 100 yards are tied for ninth in program history with Ben Malone. At 1,886 career yards, Benjamin is within striking distance of 2,000 career rushing yards.

#10THINGS (Twitter-Friendly Notes)

1. @dtw61_ received a score just under 70.0 from Pro Football Focus this week, which ended up being good for 36th among all qualifying centers nationally despite being the only true freshman center in the FBS to start in the season opener.
2. Jayden Daniels became the first TRUE freshman quarterback to start for the Sun Devils on Opening Day in ASU's modern era (freshmen became eligible to play in 1972). His 284 passing yards set an ASU record for a Sun Devil quarterback in their first career appearance.
3. As has become the norm, @eno_benjamin5 forced 11 missed tackles on Thursday - tied for second-most among all running backs nationally.
4. @ThatMank7 was the 3rd-highest graded LB in the Pac-12 with a 72.8 overall score from PFF, while also 6th-highest graded pass rushing LB in the FBS (79.7) Thomas' 4 QB pressures were most among any LB in the league and his 5 defensive "stops" were tied for 3rd among Pac-12 LBS.
5. Arizona State holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 135 straight games.
6. @yaboiijucee was the second-highest graded defender in Pac-12 (regardless of position) by PFF (85.9 score) and fifth-highest graded corner in nation after Week 1. Targeted 6 times with two catches...for -10 yards. FF, 2 PBU, TFL, 42.4 NFL passer rating when targeted.
7. The Sun Devils have not allowed a non-conference opponent to score in the first quarter in four games under Herm Edwards. ASU is 5-1 under Edwards when holding opponents scoreless in the opening frame.
8. Since 2012, ASU has scored 67.7 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (113 of 167) while finding the end zone 84 times in that span (50.3 percent). Conversely, opponents have scored just 51.3 percent of the time (60 of 117) with 46 touchdowns (39.3 percent).
9. @ASUFootball's 200 yards allowed against Kent State were its fewest since allowing 167 against this week's opponent, Sac State, back in 2013.
10. For ASU, 25 freshmen (15 true, 10 redshirt) appeared in the team's season opener while eight non-freshmen appeared in their first games at ASU. 61 total players played in the game.



MANDRAKE OF THE WEEK

- » The Mandrake has quickly become a figure of Herm Edwards' lore at Arizona State. The Mandrake embodies strength, speed, athleticism, aggressive, high motor, and mental toughness.
- » This season, the Sun Devils have unveiled a special Mandrake practice uniform to be worn player that most embodies these characteristics in the previous weekend's game.
- » This week's recipient of that honor was Khaylan Kearsse-Thomas, who had his best game as a Sun Devil against Kent State with a career high 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks with a fumble forced and five total tackles.
- » Kearsse-Thomas was the third-highest graded linebacker in the Pac-12 this week with a 72.8 overall score from Pro Football Focus, while sitting as the sixth-highest graded pass rushing linebacker in the FBS with a 79.7 score on pass rush plays.
- » Thomas' four quarterback pressures were the most among any linebacker in the league (t-6th in the Power 5) while his five defensive "stops" were tied for third among Pac-12 LBs and tied for 20th in the Power 5.

FOCUSING ON FOOTBALL

- » Kobe Williams was the fourth-high graded cornerback among all Powever Five programs following the opening weekends on action, grading out with an 85.9 score that was fifth overall among all corners nationally, according to Pro Football Focus.
- » Williams was the second-highest graded defensive player in the Pac-12, regardless of position
- » Jack Jones was the 15th-highest graded corner among Power Five schools in the opening week, logging a 77.3 score from PFF.
- » Darien Butler was the highest-graded linebacker in the Pac-12 after the opening weekends, posting a 75.5 score that was 34th among all linebackers nationally (14th among Power Five schools), according to Pro Football Focus.
- » Khaylan Kearsse-Thomas was the third-highest graded linebacker in the Pac-12 this week with a 72.8 overall score from Pro Football Focus, while sitting as the sixth-highest graded pass rushing linebacker in the FBS with a 79.7 score on pass rush plays.
- » Dohnovan West received a score just under 70.0 from Pro Football Focus this week, which ended up being good for 36th among all qualifying centers nationally despite being the only true freshman center in the FBS to start in the season opener.

ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS

- » Eno Benjamin recorded his 10th career 100-yard rushing game against Kent State, finishing with 102 yards on 22 carries. The 10 games with 100 yards are tied for ninth in program history with Ben Malone.
- » Benjamin forced 11 missed tackles in the opener, tied for the third-most among all running backs in the country (Utah's Zach Moss had 17 and Cal's Chris Brown had 13)
- » Benjamin played 25 snaps in passing routes in the opener, the eighth-most of any running back in the country.
- » At 1,886 career yards, Benjamin is within striking distance of 2,000 career rushing yards and needs just three rushing touchdowns to reach 20 for his career.

NUMERO ENO

- » Benjamin was the highest-graded running back in the Pac-12 last season (90.1 rushing score), according the Pro Football Focus - a grade that was also good for 6th nationally among halfbacks with at least 400 snaps.
- » He posted the fifth-highest overall offensive grade (which accounts for all facets of the game) in the Pac-12, regardless of position (84.4) - a total that sat 12th among running backs nationally with at least 400 snaps.
- » Benjamin forced 94 missed tackles last season, third-highest among FBS players in the category.
- » In addition to the workhorse efforts at running back, Benjamin also ran 326 pass routes last season - a total that was third among the nation's running backs. He averaged a first down or touchdown on 40 percent of his 36 receptions - ninth among FBS running backs with at least 20 catches. The 36 receptions were also ninth among FBS running backs.

THE KIDS WILL BE ALRIGHT

- » Jayden Daniels became the first TRUE freshman quarterback to start for the Sun Devils on Opening Day in ASU's modern era (freshmen became eligible to play in 1972).
- » Daniels is just the sixth true freshman to start any game at quarterback in ASU history, joining Dillon Sterling-Cole (2016), Brock Osweiler (2009), Jake Plummer (1993), John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974).
- » For the first time in program history, a freshman has been named a team captain after Herm Edwards dubbed true freshman quarterback/athlete Ethan Long as special teams captain before

the season. Additionally, Darien Butler will be the first true sophomore captain in program history after the linebacker was named captain for the team's defense. Prior to this season, no player that had been with the program for less than three years had ever been named a team captain in ASU history.

- » The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) - the most ever in the modern era at ASU. Additionally, eight other non-freshmen made their Sun Devil debuts for a total of 33 players that were either redshirt freshmen or appearing in their first games at ASU out of just 61 total players that entered the game on Thursday.
- » Dohnovan West became the only true freshman center to start in the season opener when he earned the nod on Thursday night. Only seven true freshmen offensive linemen in the FBS were expected to start in their team's season openers, with West being the only center of the group.

DAAAAAMNNNN DANIELS

- » Jayden Daniels became the first true freshman quarterback in program history to start the first game of the season. He finished his ASU debut with a 15 for 24 effort with 284 total yards and 3 touchdowns on the night.
- » Daniels broke the Sun Devil record for passing yards in a first career game, which was previously 160 by Jeff Krohn in 2000. It should be noted that this includes just a first career GAME appearance, not first career start.
- » Daniels became the third freshman in ASU history to win his first career start, joining John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974) as the only other QB's to win their first career starts as freshmen.

NO FLY ZONE

- » Kobe Williams graded out with an 85.9 score from Pro Football Focus in the Opening week, the fifth-highest score among all cornerbacks nationally and second-highest score for any Pac-12 defender, regardless of position.
- » Williams was targeted six times and allowed two catches...for -10 yards and -5 yards after the catch - the only corner in the country to allow negative YAC while the .10 total yards are the fewest of any corner nationally.
- » Finished with two breakups, a forced fumble and a tackle for loss while allowing just a paltry 42.4 NFL QB rating when targeted.
- » Chase Lucas and Jack Jones, played on a combined 34 snaps in coverage and were not targeted a single time.
- » ASU's 80 passing yards allowed against Kent State were the fewest since San Diego State has 73 in 2017.

DO NOT ENTER

- » The Sun Devil defense has not allowed a single point in the first quarter of regular season games against non-conference opponents under Herm Edwards.
- » ASU hasn't allowed a first quarter score in 6 of 14 games in the Edwards era and is 5-1 in those games. ASU allowed just 5.3 points per first quarter last season, good for 44th nationally. In 2017, ASU allowed 6.7 first quarter points per game - the 82nd worst tally nationally.
- » ASU's seven points allowed in the opener was the 12th-lowest total in the country and led the Pac-12.
- » The Sun Devils allowed just 25.5 points per game last season, good for 53rd nationally. While not where the team wants to be, the total was notable as ASU was 103rd nationally at 32.8 points per game allowed in 2017 and had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior to the marked improvement this past season.
- » ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 10 of 14 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of its 43 previous games dating back to 2013.
- » While the Sun Devil defense started strong last year, it finished stronger. Opponents averaged just 3.8 points per fourth quarter last season - the 6th lowest total nationally and lowest in the Pac-12 and allowing ASU to outscore opponents 119-49 in the frame on the season.
- » Again this was a vast improvement over recent seasons, as allowed 8.9 points per fourth quarter (112th nationally) in 2017. The Sun Devils were outscored by opponents 116-102 in the fourth quarter of games on the year. ASU was 124th (10.7 points per fourth) in 2016, 121st (11.1 point per fourth) in 2015 and 101st (8.6 points per fourth) in 2014.



KEEP IT CLOSE

- » The tough scoring defense kept ASU in every game last season, with nine games being decided by one possession - second in the nation behind Texas and the second-highest total by a Pac-12 team since 1980 (Stanford with 10 in 2012).
- » ASU was 4-1 in games decided by three points or less, with the five such games second nationally behind Eastern Michigan. The four wins in games decided by a field goal or less were tied for most wins by any team in the nation in the category (Northern Illinois). ASU was 6-14 in tilts of 3 points or less in the previous 10 seasons.
- » It marked the most field goal or less wins by a Pac-12 team since Oregon State did the same in 2006, and just the second time a Pac-12 team won four field goal games in the past 18 seasons.
- » Unfortunately, ASU was also on the wrong end of five of those one-possession games - tied for the most losses by a touchdown or less of any team in the nation.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL

- » Eno Benjamin's lost fumble on his first carry of the second quarter against Kent State ended a streak of 911 running back carries without a lost fumble, dating back to 2016. That particular fumble occurred out of ASU's Sparky formation and you had to go back to 2015 and 1,250 carries prior since a Sun Devil running back had lost a fumble on a conventional running play.
- » ASU was tied for fourth nationally with only 11 turnovers last season. ASU outscored opponents 71-27 in points off turnovers on the year.
- » The Sun Devils turned the ball over just 15 times in 2017, a total that was good for 27th nationally. ASU and Stanford are the only Pac-12 teams to finish in the Top-30 nationally in each of the last two seasons. ASU finished 82nd in the country in 2016 with 21 turnovers.

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » The Sun Devils have forced a turnover in seven consecutive games dating back to last season.
- » ASU has outscored opponents 677-355 in points off takeaways since 2012.
- » Since 2012, ASU has scored 67.7 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (113 of 167) while finding the end zone 84 times in that span (50.3 percent).
- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 51.3 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (60 of 117) with 46 touchdowns (39.3 percent).

LOCKING IT DOWN

- » Limiting the big play has been a focus for defensive coordinator Danny Gonzales, and ASU doubled down against Kent State with just seven plays allowed over 10 yards in the contest - the 13th fewest in the nation and lowest total in the Pac-12.
- » ASU gave up just two plays over 20 yards in the contest, which was the 24th-lowest total in the nation.
- » Last year, ASU was tied for 11th nationally in allowing just 8 plays over 40 yards, an area the Devils had struggled in in recent seasons (allowing 20, 16, 30, 21 in the previous four seasons and finishing 103rd, 79th, 128th, 110th, respectively). ASU was also tied for 9th nationally in allowing just 3 plays of over 50 yards on the year.
- » The Devils gave up just 22 plays over 30 yards, tied for 34th-fewest nationally. In the previous four years, ASU had given up 38, 44, 40, 40 such plays, ranked 116th, 124th, 117th and 119th.
- » ASU was tied for 13th nationally for fewest passing plays over 40 yards allowed this season, allowing just five. ASU was 90th in the category the previous year with 12 such plays allowed and 127th in 2016 with 22 passing plays over 40 yards allowed.
- » ASU was ninth with just three 50+ yard plays allowed last season after finishing in the bottom 10 nationally in four previous seasons.

ON THE DEFENSE

- » Last season, the Sun Devil forced opponents into the 4th-worst starting field position nationally, with teams starting on average at their own 26.0 yard line.
- » On passing downs, opponents averaged a marginal explosive tally of -0.04 according to Bill Connelly's advanced metrics, the 21st-best score nationally.
- » A testament to ASU's ability to crack down on the big play, the Sun Devils were 28th nationally with a -0.02 defensive marginal explosiveness rating.
- » The defense was exceptional in limiting scoring, logging in a 1.09 IsoPPP (points per play) score based on Connelly's metrics, the 29th-best total among FBS defenses. A year prior, ASU was 111th (1.17).
- » ASU's .351 points allowed per play (minus fancy calculations) was 46th nationally after finishing 98th in the previous season (.445) and 125th in 2016 (.552)
- » The Sun Devil defense caused havoc (tackles for loss, fumbles forced or passed defended/

intercepted) 17.0 percent of the time - good for 46th nationally. ASU had just a 14.1% havoc rate in 2017 (94th nationally).

- » ASU's defense has held opponents to just 3.00 points per possession on "short" field drives (drives that start with 60 or fewer yards to go to the end zone). That was the 36th-lowest total nationally. ASU was 64th a year prior in the category (3.35).
- » ASU surrendered just 4.43 points per scoring opportunity (points per trip inside the 40), 55th nationally and a vast improvement over its 96th-place ranking last season.
- » The Sun Devil defense bent but didn't break last year, allowing an opponent touchdown on drives where a first down was allowed only 33.6 percent of the time this season (43rd nationally) after sitting 91st (42.4 percent) in the country in 2017.

TAKING OFFENSE

- » Last season, ASU was 39th nationally in Offensive Ball Control Rate (drives that last 4 plays or more) - doing so 69.0 percent of the time.
- » ASU capitalized on short field position, scoring 4.05 points per drive when the possession STARTED within 60 yards of the opponent end zone - 28th nationally.
- » Overall, ASU was 32nd nationally in total points per drive, sitting at 2.49.
- » ASU got itself into manageable third-and-short situations 14.4 percent of the time (16th nationally).
- » ASU only found itself in third-and-long situations 43.3 percent of the time last season, good for the 17th-lowest total national. It's average third-down distance was 6.8 yards - the 21st-best total in the country while posting a 45.9 percent success rate on third downs - also good for 21st.
- » ASU was 20th nationally in fourth quarter points per game (9.2) - second in the Pac-12 behind WSU - and have outscored opponents 119-49 in the fourth quarter of games this year.
- » The Sun Devil offense ran a successful play, according to Bill Connelly's metrics, 43.8 percent of the time - good for 44th nationally. In 2017 ASU was 65th with a successful play rate of just 41.8 percent.
- » ASU's offensive efficiency score (OFEI) of 2.76 was good for 23rd nationally. A team's OFEI is a value generated per drive by a team's offense adjusted by its starting field position based on the strength of defenses faced.

THE YOUTH MOVEMENT

- » Only three Pac-12 TRUE freshmen played at least 700 defensive snaps last season and all of them played for Arizona State (Merlin Robertson/749, Aashari Crosswell/786, Darien Butler/754).
- » Sun Devil freshmen (true or redshirt) combined for 3,549 play snaps on defense last season. Comparatively, freshmen combined for just 918 total defensive snaps played in 2017 and 1,035 in 2016.
- » Aashari Crosswell was one of just seven true freshmen among all Power Five teams to play at least 750 snaps on the season.
- » Sun Devil freshmen (true or redshirt) accounted for 34.7 percent of all of ASU's tackles last season (294 of 848) and 40.8 percent of the team's total tackles for loss (35.5 of 87).
- » Among all Power Five true freshmen, none had more defensive stops (as graded by Pro Football Focus) than Robertson (35) while Butler was right behind him with 34. The duo ranks 17th and 23rd overall in the Pac-12, regardless of year in school.
- » Both were among the Pac-12 top 10 linebackers in fewest missed tackles, with Robertson fifth with eight and Butler ninth in the league with 10 - just 18 total on their combined 1,503 defensive snaps this season (1.1 percent).

MAGNIFICENT MERLIN

- » Freshman Merlin Robertson was named the Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year.
- » Robertson became the fifth Sun Devil to earn a Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honor and the third to be named the Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year. He joins Vontaze Burfict (2009) and Junior Onyeali (2010) as the third person to be distinguished as the Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year.
- » Robertson led the team in tackles (77), tackles for loss (8.5) and sacks (5.0). Added an interception, two breakups, a fumble forced and a fumble recovered.
- » He was the first freshman to lead the team in tackles since Jason Shivers in 2001 and the first freshman to lead the team in tackles for loss and sacks since Junior Onyeali in 2010.
- » Led all FBS freshmen (true or redshirt) with 35 defensive "stops" in 2018 - tied for 17th among all Pac-12 defensive players.
- » Also led Pac-12 freshmen (true or redshirt) with 27 total QB pressures - second most among all freshmen in a Power Five conference. It was the 20th-most for any player in the Pac-12, regardless of year and second-most among all linebackers in the Pac-12
- » Played on 749 snaps as a truth freshman, despite missing the bowl game and half a game



Oregon - the eighth highest total among true freshmen in Power Five conference nationally.

- » Missed just eight tackles on the season, according to Pro Football Focus, tied for the fifth-fewest among linebackers in the Pac-12 and 33rd among all Power Five linebackers.

NO BUTLER'S ABOUT IT

- » Darien Butler was the highest-graded linebacker in the Pac-12 after the opening weekends, posting a 75.5 score that was 34th among all linebackers nationally, according to pro Football Focus.
- » Darien Butler's 70 tackles last year were the fourth most by a true freshman nationally regardless of conference.
- » He was tied for 23rd in the Pac-12 with 34 defensive "stops" last season, second among the league's true freshmen (behind teammate Merlin Robertson), and good for fourth among true freshman among the Power 5 conferences.
- » Tied for 9th among all linebackers in the Pac-12 with just 10 missed tackles this season

DON'T BE CROSS

- » Freshman Aashari Crosswell led the team in interceptions with four (t-4th among FBS freshmen) while recording 127 yards in interception returns - the latter good for the seventh-most nationally and the most for a freshman in the country
- » He had a team-high 9 pass breakups last season - more than any Sun Devil recorded in 2017 and tied for fourth among freshmen in the FBS this season
- » His 13 total passes defended were tied for third among FBS freshman and fifth among all Pac-12 players regardless of year.
- » He was one of just two Pac-12 true freshman to play at least 750 snaps (786), one of just 7 freshmen to do so nationally in a Power Five conference

NOT SO FRESH ANYMORE

- » Tyler Johnson established himself as a starter in the second half of last season after playing just 61 total snaps in the team's first 6 games of the year. Played on 394 snaps over the final seven games of the year.
- » His 20 QB pressures over the final seven weeks of the season were the ninth most among linebackers/edge rushers the Pac-12 Conference.
- » His four sacks over the final seven weeks were the most among Pac-12 outside linebackers and tied for 20th most among FBS outside linebackers.
- » Johnson finished tied for 17th among all Pac-12 linebackers and edge defenders with 25 quarterback pressures this season.
- » Johnson was tied for second on the team with 8.0 tackles for loss, six of which coming in the final six games of the season - the most on the team - and added a fumble forced, a blocked kick and a pass breakup on the season, alongside a pivotal fumble recovery against Arizona.
- » Last year, Jermaine Lole tackles for loss in three of the final four regular season games and started the final four games of the season.
- » He had four pass breakups on the season despite being a lineman - tied for third overall on the team and tied for the fourth among Pac-12 freshmen.
- » Lole was ASU's highest-graded true freshman according to PFF, and the 10th-highest graded true freshman in the conference and his 14 QB pressures were fifth among all freshmen in the Pac-12.
- » He had the highest positive run impact score among freshmen in the Pac-12 at 15.6 percent and was the fifth-highest graded freshman in the Pac-12 in run defense at 74.0.

GOLD RUSH

- » ASU has had a 100-yard rusher in 14 of its last 19 games dating back to 2017 (Demario Richard with 4 and Eno Benjamin with 10).
- » Benjamin's 9 100+ yard performances last season put him in rare company. He is now one of just five Sun Devils have had 7 or more in a season and passed the previous school record set by Freddie Williams and Art Malone (8). Woody Green (7, twice) and Demario Richard (7) are the only others to reach the 7-game milestone
- » ASU had 26 rushing TDs last year and reached 25 rushing touchdowns for the fifth time in the last seven seasons. Those five times are notable as the Devils had just three previous seasons with at least 25 rushing touchdowns from 1980-2011 (1985, 1986 and 1996).
- » The Sun Devils have rushed for over 2,000 yards seven times in the last eight seasons at ASU after doing so just one single time from 2000-2011 and only eight times total over 30 years from 1981-2011.
- » ASU finished with the 18th-highest graded rushing attack of 2018, according to Pro Football

Focus.

ON THE RECEIVING END

- » In his first eight games as a Sun Devil, junior wide receiver Brandon Aiyuk totaled 11 catches for 178 yards. Against Kent State alone, he accounted for 140 yards on four catches, giving him 26 catches for 436 yards over his last six games dating back to last season.
- » Aiyuk's 77-yard touchdown reception represented the longest passing play/score by a Sun Devil since Demario Richard's 93-yard catch and run against New Mexico in 2015.
- » Among returning wide receivers with at least 40 returning targets, Brandon Aiyuk ranks 11th in the Pac-12 (106.2) in wide receiver rating according to PFF, finishing third among Pac-12 players in their first season in Division I football.
- » He had the 15th-highest receiving score among returning wide receivers in the Pac-12 at 68.7. That score represents the fourth highest total for players in their first season of Division I football.
- » The Sun Devils may have lost standout receiver N'Keal Harry to the first round of the NFL Draft this summer, but the depth at wide receiver is still quite impressive this season.
- » Kyle Williams ranked third in the Pac-12 according to PFF with an 81.8% catch rate when playing out of the slot.
- » He also Excelled as a run blocker, ranking 36th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 among all wide receiver with a score of 76.0.
- » Last year, Williams boasted a 49.1% offensive success percentage when targeted, the eighth-highest among all Pac-12 receivers.
- » After his 42-yard catch against Kent State, Frank Darby now has 33 total receptions as a Sun Devil. Eight of those have gone for 40+ yards.
- » 50 percent of Frank Darby's targets last year came on deep passes, a total that led the Pac-12.
- » He averaged 20.0 yards/catch, which would have put him 14th nationally had he caught five more passes to reach the catches/game minimum.

NOBODY'S BUSINESS BUT THE TURKS

- » The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Michael Turk on Aug. 29 vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average vs. Alabama on punts of 56, 65, 62, 61 and 60 for 304 yards. Turks punted five times for 315 yards with boots of 64, 62, 65, 49 and 75 in his Sun Devil debut.
- » Turk crushed Sun Devils school records for punting average, breaking the previous school record for average on five punts of 55.0 by Danny White in 1972. Turk's 63.0 yards per punt would have set records for every minimum number of punts in a game with the closest being Tony Loric's 59.3 yards per punt on three punts in 1962.
- » Turk's 75-yarder to cap off the night was tied for the seventh-longest punt in school history and the longest punt in the FBS in the opening weekends.
- » Turk's 63.0 yards per punt average in nine yards further than any player in the FBS over the first two week's of action (Kentucky's Max Duffy averaged 54.0 yards per punt on six punts).
- » Turk pinned three punts inside the 20, tied for the sixth-highest total nationally.

KEEPING MOMENTUM

- » Arizona State holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 135 straight games. The Sun Devils last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 75 of those games (56.0 percent).
- » The Sun Devils have won as least seven games in five of the last seven seasons.
- » Sun Devil Football has had one of the top home field advantages in the FBS in the last six seasons, recording a 36-10 record at Sun Devil Stadium since 2012. The .778 win percentage in that time is 23rd nationally (14th among Power Five programs) while the 36 wins are 18th.
