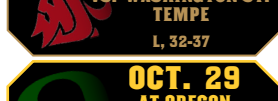

THE GAME - Sun Devil Football will return to action Saturday with a trip to Eugene, Ore., to face the Oregon Ducks at Autzen Stadium. The game is scheduled for a 2 p.m. AZT kickoff and will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Networks. Roxy Bernstein, Anthony Herron and Lewis Johnson will provide the call.

THE DUCKS - ASU trails Oregon, 18-16, in the all-time series, including an 8-9 record against the Ducks in Eugene. Oregon has won eight straight against ASU, currently the second-longest active winning streak by one conference opponent over another. The Ducks hold a 17-16 overall record in the series and have not seen defeat to the Devils since 2004. The series is all squared up at eight games a piece in contests played at Sun Devil Stadium. The Sun Devils will be looking for it's first win against the Ducks since the 2004 season, and first Pac-12 road victory in the 2016 campaign.

ASU has not traveled to Eugene since the 2011 season.

The Ducks will enter Saturday's game against the Sun Devils coming off a 52-49, double overtime loss at UCLA last Friday night. The Ducks managed to overcome a 31-14 halftime deficit in their game against the Bruins, but were unable to hold on in overtime as a costly interception by freshman quarterback Justin Herbert in the second overtime period ended the game.

Despite his game-ending turnover, Herbert still managed to put together quite a game for the Ducks, completing 22-of-40 passes for 258 yards and six touchdowns, while also adding nine rushes for 56 yards. Wide out Charles Nelson caught seven passes for 84 yards and two touchdowns, including the one that forced overtime, in what was a season high for touchdowns in a game for the Daytona Beach, Fla., native.

Oregon, a team known for their prolific offense, has continued their success in finding the end zone in 2016. The Ducks enter Saturday's tilt ranked in the top-20 nationally in scoring offense and total offense checking in at 21 and 20, respectively.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- » Improve ASU to 9-3 in regular season games since 2013 following a loss.
- » End the Ducks' nine-game winning streak against ASU, currently the second-longest active streak by one Pac-12 team over another.
- » Mark the 40th victory for Todd Graham as head coach of the Devils.
- » Make the Sun Devils bowl eligible for the sixth-straight season and each of the five seasons under Todd Graham.
- » Make it seven-straight seasons the Sun Devils have won at least six games, the longest streak since seven straight years from 1977-83.
- » Help ASU avoid going 0-3 through its first three Pac-12 road games for the first time since 2008.
- » Move the Devils to 11-10 in Pac-12 road games under Todd Graham after going 5-13 in previous four seasons.
- » Give ASU 14 wins in its last 26 true road contests. ASU had 15 total road wins from 2004-2011 (8 seasons)

General

The Sun Devil Athletics media relations staff understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. We pride ourselves in being able to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Sun Devil Football media relations staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the media relations department.

Practice Policies

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Media members will be able to view the team stretch periods as well as Periods A, B and C. Media wishing to document practice via photograph or video will be able to do so during this time, so long as said documentation does not record play-calling signals. Following that open viewing period, the members of the media will be escorted out of the facility and reconvene near the end of the practice period for post-practice interviews.

Interview Policies

Interviews are conducted at the end of each practice. Due to high demand, several players and members of the coaching staff might only be available on a limited basis each week. A full availability schedule will be provided to the media each week.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutson Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

Any members who wish to contact a student-athlete or coach outside of the aforementioned interview periods should contact Jeremy Hawkes (520-403-0121 or jdhawkes@asu.edu) to arrange a time outside of practice or post-game for interviews.

Weekly Press Conferences

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Coach Graham will not be available following practice.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutson Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

All press conference will be streamed live via the Pac-12 website at <http://pac-12.com/live/arizona-state-university>. Additionally, ASAP Transcription Services will provide a transcript following each press conference throughout the year that will be made available via TheSunDevils.com and will also be sent to members of the media following each press conference.

Credentials

Media credentials for Sun Devil home games for the 2016 football season will be handled online through Sports Systems. For access to the online portal request system, please contact Doug Tammara (tammara@asu.edu). For road games, please contact Mark Brand (mark.brand@asu.edu) for more information.

Photography/Videography

Media members will be able to view the team stretch periods as well as Periods A, B and C. Media wishing to document practice via photograph or video will be able to do so during this time, so long as said documentation does not record play-calling signals. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice. For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

Weekly Media Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season. Coach Graham is scheduled to speak at 12:05 PT/1:05 MT each Tuesday. The teleconferences will be recorded and available at Pac-12.com that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the

Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

Live Broadcasts

It is not permissible for any non-rightsholder to broadcast over the air, stream over the internet (audio or video), or transmit in any other way, any live event without the consent of the Sun Devil Athletics Department. Live events include varsity contests, press conferences (including but not limited to weekly scheduled and postgame press conferences) and any other group media availability. Exceptions may be made for any major news-breaking event and will be communicated in the media advisory for the event.

Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at <http://video.pac-12.com>).

News Outlet Highlight Policy

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage - on their television newscasts only - for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.



ON THE AIR

Hear the hometown call with broadcaster Tim Healey and color analyst Jeff Van Raaphorst as well as sideline reporter Derek Hagan providing all the action for Sun Devil Football this season. The hometown broadcasts are boosted by Bonneville's powerful sports/talk lineup of Arizona Sports 98.7 FM, ESPN Phoenix 620 AM and 92.3 KTAR News FM. LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

The Sun Devils will look to improve upon their impressive 15-3 all-time record when playing a game broadcasted by the Pac-12 Networks. The contest will feature Roxy Bernstein on the call alongside analyst Anthony Herron while Lewis Johnson will provide insight from the sidelines.

The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2016 for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

LAST TIME - OREGON - 2015

TEMPE (AP) - Addison scored on a 20-yard pass in the third overtime on a play upheld by review and Springs intercepted Mike Bercovici's pass in the end zone, lifting Oregon to a wild 61-55 win over Arizona State last year.

Two teams clinging to hopes in their respective divisions, the Sun Devils and Ducks traded explosive plays in a game that featured 1,243 total yards and 177 combined plays.

It came down to a pair of plays in the third overtime.

Addison appeared to touch the back line on his TD catch, but one view of the play was blocked by a camera and the officials upheld the original call upon review.

After Oregon (5-3, 3-2 Pac-12) failed on the mandatory 2-point conversion, Springs sealed it with an interception, sending the Ducks racing onto the field.

The Sun Devils (4-4, 2-3) had 742 total yards -- one short of the school record -- and scored touchdowns in the first two overtimes, yet still couldn't stop the Ducks when they needed to.

Bercovici threw for 398 yards and five touchdowns, and added an 18-yard scoring run in the second overtime. Demario Richard ran for 136 yards and scored two touchdowns.

#BYTHENUMBERS

42

The Sun Devils have forced **42 three-and-outs this season** on 104 opponent drives (36.2 percent of the time). The 42 three-and-outs are good for the third-highest total in the country while the 5.25 three-and-outs forced per game are good for seventh in the country. On the season, the Sun Devils have forced 217 negative or no yardage plays of 604 run by the opposition (35.9 percent). Under Graham, the Sun Devils have forced 1,574 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 4,364 (36.1 percent).

True freshman N'Keal Harry has **32 receptions this season**, putting him in a tie with Derek Hagan for the third-most catches by a freshman in school history. Zach Miller holds the school record with his 56 receptions as a freshman in 2004. Harry also has 342 receiving yards this season as he slowly creeps up on ASU's top four in the category. Hagan currently sits fourth at 405 yards while Miller owns the school record in that category as well, having posting 552 yards during the 2004 season.

Oregon has won nine straight games over the Sun Devils, dating back to the 2005 season. 2004 was the last time ASU defeated Oregon and was also the last time ASU defeated Oregon in Eugene. The nine-game winning streak is the second-longest active streak by one Pac-12 team over another, trailing only ASU's own 10-game active winning streak over the Washington Huskies. This is the first time the Sun Devils have traveled to Oregon since the 2011 season and ASU will be looking to avoid its first 0-3 straight in Pac-12 road games since the 2008 season.

Zane Gonzalez has **broken or tied four FBS records this season** and owns the nation's longest active streak of field goals made at 14. Gonzalez is the new FBS career record holder for most field goals with 93 (breaking the previous record of 88 by Florida State's Dustin Hopkins). Additionally, Gonzalez now has 474 points in his career as he also surpassed Hopkins' FBS record for points by a kicker of 466. He's also set the Pac-12 scoring mark by any player (previously 413). He has also tied the FBS records for most career games with 4 or more field goals (6) and for most field goals over 50 yards in a single game (3).

#10THINGS (Twitter-Friendly Notes)

- Oregon's nine-game winning streak over ASU is the second-longest active winning streak by one Pac-12 team over another. (ASU w/ 10 over UW).
- The Sun Devils have scored on 71.3 percent of the time following an opponent turnover since 2012 (87 of 122) w/ 67 TDs (54.9 percent).
- Conversely, opponents have scored just 48.8 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (42 of 86) w/ 32 TDs (37.2 percent).
- ASU has rushed for 21 touchdowns in 2016 (eighth in FBS) and has already surpassed its 2015 total.
- N'Keal Harry has 32 receptions as a true freshman, tied with Derek Hagan for third-most in school history (Zach Miller has record at 56).
- The @FootballASU defense has forced 42 three-and-outs this season, the third-highest total in the nation
- Tim White is fourth among all active FBS players with 2,976 all-purpose yards in the last two seasons.
- .@ZaneG_5 currently has the nation's longest active streak of field goals made, entering the contest with 14 in a row.
- .@ZaneG_5 has broke or tied 4 FBS records in '16, breaking FGs made and points by kicker, tying games with 4+ FGs and most 50+ in one game.
- Zane Gonzalez now holds the Sun Devil record for single season (4) and career (6) @Pac12 Player of the Week honors.

**FOOD FOR THOUGHT**

- » ASU has 21 rushing touchdowns already in 2016 after having 19 in the entirety of the 2015 season.
- » The Sun Devils have now scored on 29-of-30 trips to the red zone in 2016 and have scored a touchdown on 21 of those trips (70.00). That was an area ASU struggled in last year, only finding the end zone on 51.5 percent of its red zone trips.
- » The Sun Devils have forced 42 three-and-outs this season on 116 defensive drives this season (36.2 percent), with an average of 5.25 three-and-outs per game that ranks seventh nationally this season while the 42 total are the third-most in the country.
- » N'Heal Harry has 32 receptions as a true freshman, tying Derek Hagan for third most in Sun Devil history. Zach Miller's 56 snags in 2004 are the school record.
- » Zane Gonzalez enters the weekend with the nation's longest active streak of field goals made at 14, three shy of his own school record.
- » Zane Gonzalez has broken or tied four FBS records this season, breaking the records for career field goals made (92, previously 88), career points by a kicker (468, previously 466), tying the record for career games with 4 or more field goals (6) and also tying the record for most 50+ yard field goals in a single game (3).
- » Zane Gonzalez has been named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week four times this season, breaking the ASU record for most honors in a single season.
- » ASU now has six Pac-12 Players of the Week honors this season, two off the '96 record of 8.

STRIKE FIRST

- » Arizona State has scored first in 42 of the 58 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is 32-10 in the Graham era when getting on the scoreboard first.
- » The Sun Devils were 5-2 when scoring first last season and are 4-2 this year after picking up

victories against NAU, Texas Tech, UTSA and UCLA.

STRIKE FAST

- » 249 of the Devils' 350 offensive scoring drives under Todd Graham have come in three minutes or less (71.1 percent).
- » Of ASU's 48 scoring drives this season, 31 have come in under three minutes (64.6 percent), including 4-of-4 against Colorado.

GETTING STARTED ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- » The Sun Devils have outscored their opposition 518-305 in the first quarter under Todd Graham despite being outscored 49-45 this year.
- » The Sun Devils are 24-3 under Graham when holding their opposition scoreless in the first quarter and 2-1 this season when doing so.
- » A strong second half start is also important and ASU scored 115 points in the third quarter of games against FBS opposition last year, a 9.6 points per third quarter average that was ranked 14th nationally.
- » ASU has posted an impressive 31-3 overall record under Graham when leading at halftime.

DON'T CROSS THAT LINE

- » Against WSU, the ASU defense forced 25 negative or no yardage plays (11 TFLs, 11 incomplete passes, 3 rushes of no gain) of 72 plays run by Washington State (34.7 percent).
- » On the season, the Sun Devils have forced 217 negative or no yardage plays of 604 run by the opposition (35.9 percent).
- » Under Graham ASU has forced 1,574 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 4,364 (36.1 percent).

SERIOUSLY, DON'T CROSS IT

- » ASU is first in the Pac-12 and second in the nation (Clemson) with an average of 8.02 TFL per game under Graham and one of two teams in the nation with more than 485 total tackles for loss (Clemson). They rank second in that time with 3.26 sacks per game.

**LAST TIME OUT
WASHINGTON STATE****THE WHITE PLACE AT THE RIGHT TIME...**

- White's 70-yard punt return for a touchdown at the 11:15 mark in the fourth quarter marks the first by a Sun Devil since Jamal Miles recorded a 78-yard touchdown return versus Oregon State on Oct. 11, 2011.
- Recording 184 all-purpose yards (78 PR, 62 KOR, 48 REC) on the outing, White now has 14 games in his career with over 100 all-purpose yards and nine in his last 10 starts dating back to last season.

BALLAGE BARRAGE...

- Ballage now has two rushing touchdowns of 50+ yards on the season, after having none in his first two seasons.

SUPER DEMARIO...

- Tallying 37 yards rushing on 12 attempts while adding his third rushing touchdown on the 2016 campaign, Demario Richard moved to 14th on the all-time ASU career rushing list (2,114)

NO RUSH...

- imiting Washington State to -52 yards rushing, Arizona State has now held 23 opponents under 100 yards rushing in the Todd Graham era (61 games/37.7 percent) including five of eight games this season.

GOLD ZONE...

- Going 3-for-3 on the outing in red zone attempts, the Sun Devils have now scored on 29-of-30 trips to the red zone in 2016 (96.7 percent).

DON'T CROSS THAT LINE...

- Against the Cougars, the ASU defense forced 25 negative or no yardage plays (11 TFLs, 11 incomplete passes, 3 rushes of no gain) of 72 plays run by Washington State (34.7 percent).



LIGHT' EM UP

- » ASU has scored 50 or more points 16 times since Todd Graham arrived in Tempe for the 2012 season.
- » To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11).
- » Against Pac-12 opponents, the Sun Devils have scored 50 or more points 10 times under Coach Graham, after only tallying nine in the conference era prior (since 1978).
- » ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 or more four times ('12-63 NAU, '12-62 Navy, '13-62 USC, '16-68 TTU).
- » The Sun Devils have dropped 50 on Arizona twice in the last three years after doing so just three times in 85 previous contests.
- » The Sun Devil offense is currently ranked 32nd in the nation in scoring at 35.8 points per game.

GOLD RUSH

- » The Sun Devils have rushed for 21 touchdowns this season after having 19 in the entirety of 2015. The 21 touchdowns are good for eighth among all FBS teams.
- » After having just two five-rushing touchdown games in nine previous seasons, the Sun Devils did it in back-to-back games too open the season, marking the fifth and sixth times in the Graham era that ASU has gone over five rushing touchdowns in a game. The Devils had three such games TOTAL from 1997-2011.
- » The ASU trio of running backs (Demario Richard, Kalen Ballage and Nick Ralston) have been tough to bring down all year, logging 462 total yards after first contact out of their 1013 combined rushing yards 45.6 percent).

GOLD ZONE

- » The Sun Devils have scored on 29-of-30 trips to the red zone in 2016 (96.7 percent), a total that is currently good for second in the nation.
- » The Devils have scored a touchdown on 21 of

those trips (70.00 percent). That percentage is ranked 31st nationally and is notable as ASU found the end zone on just 51.5 percent of its red zone trips last season - a total that ranked 108th in the country.

- » ASU is tied for ninth nationally with 17 rushing touchdowns in the red zone this year.

SUPER DEMARIO

- » Demario Richard is currently 15th in Sun Devil history with 2,114 career rushing yards and one of just 19 Devils to reach the 2,000-yard milestone.
- » Richard now has nine 100-yard rushing games in his career, three shy of cracking the ASU top-five in the category.
- » Of Richard's 1,636 rushing yards as a sophomore and junior, 747 have come after first contact (46.2 percent/2.2 yards per touch).
- » Last season, Richard became the fourth Sun Devil in history to have at least seven 100-yard rushing games in a single season, joining Freddy Williams and Art Malone (8) and Woody Green (7, 2 times).

CAME IN LIKE A WRECKING BALLAGE

- » Kalen Ballage introduced himself to the world in a big way against Texas Tech, tying an FBS record with eight total touchdowns (7 rushing, 1 receiving). He also tied the FBS record for touchdowns in a quarter with four in the second quarter of the contest.
- » His seven touchdowns against Tech were equal to or more than five teams had in the entirety of the 2015 season.
- » Ballage had eight total touchdowns in his two previous seasons prior to his barrage against Texas Tech.
- » He is currently ranked ninth in the nation in rushing touchdowns (10) and 21st in total points scored (66).
- » His 10 rushing touchdowns make him just the fourth Sun Devil since 2000 to reach double digits in the category.

**NO RUSH**

- » The Sun Devils have held 23 opponents under 100 rushing yards in the Todd Graham era (61 games/37.7 percent), including four of eight games this year.
- » ASU held three straight opponents under 100 rushing yards for the third time under Graham (2013, 2015, 2016). The Devils had limited opponents to under 100 rushing yards in three straight games in just five previous seasons dating back to 1986.
- » The Sun Devil rush defense is currently ranked seventh nationally and first in the Pac-12 in allowing just 99.9 yards per game this year.
- » The Sun Devils finished 20th in rushing defense in 2015, 49th in 2014 and 26th in 2013 and are one of just 20 schools to be ranked in the Top 50 in each of the last three seasons.

THE WHITE PLACE AT THE RIGHT TIME

- » Tim White now has 14 games in his career with over 100 all-purpose yards and nine in his last 10 starts dating back to last season.
- » White is currently fourth among all active FBS players with 2,976 all-purpose yards over the last two seasons.
- » He currently sits 12th in the nation with 158.38 all-purpose yards per game and seventh with 1083 total all-purpose yards.
- » He is second nationally with 692 combined kick return yards (448 on kickoffs and 244 on punt returns and eighth in punt return average at 14.4 yards per return.

TAKING OFFENSE

- » ASU ranks second in the Pac-12 and twelfth in the nation at 37.23 points per game (Baylor, Oregon, Ohio State, Marshall, FSU, TTU, OU, Oklahoma State, Alabama, TAMU, Clemson) in the Graham era.
- » ASU ranks second in the Pac-12 and eighth in the nation with 2,271 total points (Baylor, Oregon, Ohio State, Alabama, Florida State, Marshall, Clemson) in that time.

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 519-249 in points off takeaways and leads 36-24 this season.
- » The Sun Devils outscored the opposition 142-62 in points off turnovers in 2014, ranked fourth nationally behind only Louisiana Tech's 172, Nevada's 170 and Oregon's 164. ASU scored 22 times following 27 total takeaways (81.5 percent) that year and scored touchdowns on 19 of those occasions (70.4).
- » In 2013, ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number, putting points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored.

A HAND IN THE COOKIE JAR

- » The Sun Devils have forced 122 turnovers under Todd Graham in the past five seasons, which is the tied for the seventh-highest total in the country in that span.
- » ASU has 14 interception returns for touchdowns under Graham, compared to posting just four total in the three previous seasons prior to 2012. The total currently leads the nation in for the most interception returns for touchdowns in that span. ASU has added three fumble returns as well for 17 defensive touchdowns since the 2012 season, fourth in the country in that time span.
- » ASU finished with 27 takeaways in 2014 (2.1 per game) after having a streak of 29 consecutive games forcing a turnover come to an end in the season opener. The total was good for 24th nationally and third among Pac-12 schools.
- » ASU led the Pac-12 with 33 takeaways in 2013, finishing fifth nationally. The team was seventh nationally with a 1.1 turnover margin that season.

TURNOVER FACTORY

- » ASU ranked third in the Pac-12 and fifth in the nation with a .59 average turnover margin per game (Oregon, Houston, Michigan State, Washington) since Graham took over the helm and was third in the Pac-12 and fifth in the nation with a plus-36 total turnover margin (Oregon, Houston, Michigan State, Washington).
- » ASU is first in the Pac-12 and tied for fifth in the nation with an average of 1.28 interceptions per game (Houston, TCU, Louisville, Boise State, tied with Ohio State) since 2012 and is first in the Pac-12 and tied for fourth in the nation with 78 total interceptions (Houston, Boise State, Louisville, tied with TCU, Ohio State, and Northern Illinois).

IN-ZANE IN THE MEMBRANE

- » Zane Gonzalez currently leads all active FBS players in averaging 10.1 points per game in his career. Additionally, he is first among all active kickers with an average of 1.98 field goals per made per game in his career.
- » Gonzalez is the new FBS career record holder for most field goals with 93 (breaking the previous record of 88 held by Florida State's Dustin Hopkins).
- » Additionally, Gonzalez now has 474 points in his career as he also surpassed Hopkins' FBS record for points by a kicker of 466. He already set the Pac-12 scoring mark by any player (previously 413).
- » He is 20-of-21 on field goals this season - two more than any player in the FBS - and he sits sixth nationally in scoring at 11.0 points per game. His lone miss this season came on a 53-yard attempt against UTSA and his 95.2 percentage is currently good for fifth nationally and first among all players with over 15 attempts (next closest at 90.0 percent).



- » If his career ended now, Gonzalez would also own the FBS record for scoring per game among kickers and the ASU record for overall points per game with his 10.2 points per game topping Houston's Roman Anderson's FBS record of 9.6 and Wilford White's school record of 8.6.
- » Gonzalez has kicked 14 field goals in a row, currently the longest active streak in the FBS and three off his own school record.

ZANE-IAC

- » Gonzalez has scored at least one point in each of the 47 games he has played at ASU, breaking the previous school record of 45 such games held by Luis Zendejas for most games scoring a point.
- » He leads the nation in 50+ yard field goals with six this season. He had three against Colorado, tying the FBS record for most in a game. The FBS record for a season is eight. No other player this season has more than two.
- » His 59-yard against Colorado was a school record and the longest kick in the FBS this season.
- » Gonzalez has four or more field goals in six games in his career, tying three other players for the most games in FBS history. At 12 games with three or more field goals, he needs two to break the FBS record there as well.
- » Gonzalez holds ASU's first, second and fourth highest single-season points totals in history (138, 130, 118).
- » Gonzalez was good on 26 field goals last season and became the first ASU kicker ever to have 20 or more field goals in three different seasons. In fact, only Luis Zendejas had two such seasons before. No other player outside Zendejas and Gonzalez have had more than one.

KICKING THE HABIT

- » Zane Gonzalez is again out to prove he is the best kickoff specialist in the nation, having kicked 45 of his 58 kickoffs for touchbacks this season (77.6 percent, fifth nationally) - six more than any other FBS player - while just 11 of his kicks have been returned (17th in the FBS).
- » A total of 79 of Zane Gonzalez's 88 kickoffs last season went into the endzone and 66 were touchbacks (75.0 percent), the highest touchback percentage in the country and notable as just 27 of 83 opponent kicks were touched back (32.5 percent). ASU had just 33 touchbacks for the entire season in 2014 on 91 kicks (36.3).
- » His 64.56 yards per kickoff in 2015 were second nationally.
- » The 18 kickoff returns allowed by Gonzalez last season were the fourth-lowest total nationally and the lowest among all 67 teams with 71 or more kickoffs.

WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has had an average starting yard line of its own 34.6 in 39 victories compared to a starting yard line of the 25.4 for their opponents in such contests.

- » Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 31.1 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 28.7 in ASU's 22 losses under Graham.
- » in 2012, ASU posted an average starting spot of its own 33-yard line that ranked 10th in the nation, according to the folks at Football Outsiders (www.footballoutsiders.com) and in 2013, the team ranked 13th nationally (average starting yard line: 33.3). With a 32.6 average starting spot in 2014, ASU was 13th nationally.
- » The Sun Devils also held their opponents to an average starting line of their own 28-yard-line, a total that ranked 24th nationally in 2012 and was 32nd in 2013 (average opp. starting yardline: 28.2). ASU jumped to 11th nationally in 2014, forcing their opponents to an average field position of their own 26.9 yard line.
- » ASU dropped to 46th in opponents starting position in 2015 while also falling to 62nd as far as their own starting field position went, notable given the team's 6-7 record on the year.

SEAL THE DEAL

- » ASU has outscored other teams 657-474 in the fourth quarter and overtime under Todd Graham (10.8 points per game) and are averaging 15.6 points per fourth quarter this season (outscored opponents 109-49).
- » Excluding FCS NAU, the Sun Devils are currently fourth nationally in averaging 21.4 points per second half against FBS opposition and third in the country with 13.7 points per fourth quarter against FBS teams as well.
- » The 21.4 second-half points per game are more than 24 teams are averaging PER GAME against FBS opposition this season.
- » ASU's offense has scored on 19 of the 28 times it has possessed the ball in the fourth quarter this year, excluding game-ending kneel downs.
- » The Sun Devils finished sixth nationally against FBS teams with 10.6 points per fourth quarter in 2014, 10th (9.9) in 2013 and eighth (9.3) in 2012.
- » The Sun Devils averaged 18.5 second half points per game last season against FBS opponents, good for 13th nationally.
- » ASU struggled defensively in the second half, however, giving up 18.8 second half points per game to opponents, the 14th-worst total nationally.

ROAD WARRIORS

- » The Sun Devils are winners of nine of the last 16 true road contests. ASU has 13 wins in the past 25 road games, including 10 Pac-12 Conference road wins in the past 20.
- » Todd Graham has 10 Pac-12 road victories under his belt already, the second-most among all ASU coaches since 1980 behind only Bruce Snyder's 18 from 1992-2000. Graham is 10-10 in Pac-12 road games at ASU, notable as the Devils were 5-13 in four seasons prior.
- » The Sun Devils are 4-4 in Pac-12 games in the State of California since 2012 after going just 3-23 from 1998-2011.

**T.N.T., WE'RE DYNAMITE**

- » The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU has 61 thus far this season, though they have struggled in recent weeks with just eight total in the last two games.
- » ASU is 45th in the country with 37 plays over 20 yards and 48th with 18 plays over 30 yards.
- » ASU finished 30th nationally in plays over 10 yards last season with 216 and 27th in 30+ yard plays at 35.
- » ASU finished 24th nationally with 20 plays over 40 yards in 2014 after having just 16 total in 2013 and eight the year before. ASU was 26th nationally in plays of 20 or more yards with 71.
- » The Sun Devils finished 2013 tied for seventh in the nation in plays longer than 20 yards with 86 after having 72 in 2012, which was good for 19th in the country in the category.

BETTER SUITED FOR HANDKERCHIEFS

- » The Sun Devils are currently ranked 21st in fewest penalties (35), 12th in fewest penalties per game (4.38), 51st in fewest penalty yards (373) and 26th in fewest penalty yards per game (46.63).
- » The Sun Devils averaged just 4.5 penalties for 32.4 yards per game in 2014, ranked 16th in fewest penalties per game and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game in D-I. In 2013, the Sun Devils finished eighth in fewest penalties per game (4.00) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (31.4).

KEEP IT CLEAN

- » ASU ranks first in the Pac-12 and third in the nation with an average of 36.23 penalty yards per game (Navy, Air Force) under Graham and ranks first in the Pac-12 and sixth in the nation with an average of 4.34 penalties per game (Navy, Air Force, Ball State, Army, Georgia Tech).
- » Twenty-eight of ASU's 32 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham.
- » Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 264 penalties in 61 games (4.33 penalties per game).

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- » ASU is 25-7 at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham.
- » In 32 regular season home games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 40.8 points per game. Against non-conference Power Five teams, ASU is averaging 50.0 points per game at home under Graham.
- » The Sun Devils join Baylor as the only other school in the country to be ranked in the Top-35 in home points per game in EACH of the past five seasons with only Arkansas State added to the list if 2016 were not included.
- » ASU has posted under 20 points in a regular home game just twice in Todd Graham's tenure - a 19-16 overtime victory over Utah in 2014 and a 42-14 loss to #19 USC in 2015.
- » The Sun Devils are 282-102-3 (.734) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium since 1958, the 25th-highest active winning percentage in a stadium among all FBS schools.

ON THE RISE

- » ASU is 25-16 in Pac-12 games since 2012, ahead of UCLA (24-17) for the best tally in the Pac-12 South in the past four seasons.
- » ASU is 20-12 (.625) in Pac-12 games in the past three-plus seasons, just a half of a game behind USC in that time (21-12/.636) for tops in the Pac-12 South.
- » ASU has finished first or second in three of the past four seasons in the final Pac-12 South standings.

USE THEM WISELY

- » Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 66 timeouts on defense in third down situations, and have not allowed a first down on the ensuing play or forced a turnover on 46 of those occasions (70.0 percent).

HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS

- » ASU has now gone 9-6 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2012 Arizona comeback in Tucson. ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season up until that moment. The Devils are 2-1 in games decided by less than a touchdown this year.
- » In 2016, ASU is 4-3 in games it has been tied or trailed in the second half after going 8-19 in four previous seasons.
- » ASU went 3-1 in 2013 in games decided by less than a touchdown, after going 4-13 in the previous four seasons in such games.. ASU was 3-1 in 2014 in games decided by less than a touchdown.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- » In 2014, the Sun Devils had six games where they did not turn the ball over and went 6-0 in those contests. That number was notable because in the previous two seasons, ASU had just five combined games where it did



not turn the ball over.

- » ASU is now 12-3 under Todd Graham in games where it does not have a turnover.
- » The Sun Devils have two games without turning the ball over in the four games that Chip Lindsey has been offensive coordinator. To put that in perspective, ASU had two games total in the 2015 regular season that it did not turn over the ball.
- » ASU earned its first victory in a game in turned the ball over three times against UTSA after going 0-6 in the Todd Graham era prior.

TAKING DOWN THE TOP

- » ASU finished 1-2 against teams ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll last season after a gauntlet that pitted the Sun Devils against three Top 25 teams in four weeks (a loss to USC, a win at UCLA, and a loss at No. 4 Utah).
- » ASU was 3-2 in 2013 against team's ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll and the three victories were the most since 1997 when the team went 3-1 against teams ranked in the AP poll.
- » ASU's 2014 schedule put the team on a collision course with three consecutive AP Top-25 teams (UCLA, USC, Stanford), a streak that ASU had faced only twice in program history. The last that happened was 2001, where ASU went 0-3 against No. 13 Washington, No. 8 Oregon and No. 11 Washington State. In 1994, ASU defeated No. 20 BYU in between losses to No. 23 Washington State and No. 21 Oregon.
- » ASU came out of the stretch with a 2-1 record with back-to-back victories over No. 16 USC and No. 23 Stanford. It was the first time ASU has won back-to-back games over ranked opponents since 1997, when it took down No. 25 Stanford on Oct. 18 before defeating No. 10 Washington State on Nov. 1 following a bye week.

SLAYING DRAGONS

- » The Sun Devils have gone 8-6 in the last 14 games against ranked teams.
- » In four seasons at the helm, Todd Graham is 8-9 against AP-ranked opponents and the team was 4-2 in such teams in 2014.
- » Graham has more than doubled the Top-25 win total of Dennis Erickson (3) and Dirk Koetter (2) during their tenures.

- » In the previous 14 seasons, ASU was 5-40 in games against teams ranked in the AP poll. Other notable victories include the come-from-behind victory over Arizona in 2012, winning a game in the Coliseum last season for the first time since 1999 and defeating USC in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-97. ASU also ended a four-game losing streak to Stanford.

HAACK THIS WAY

- » Matt Haack has led a punting attack that has seen opponents combined for just 33 total return yards this season, good for 26th nationally and eighth among teams with 10+ punt returns against.
- » Haack is eighth in the FBS in averaging 46.1 yards per punt this season while his 44.0 net yards per punt average is good for fourth in the FBS.
- » Haack averaged 43.1 yards per punt last season, good for fourth in the Pac-12 and 35th nationally. Yardage didn't do the whole story justice, however. Nineteen of his 74 punts were for 50 or more yards (25.7 percent) while 32 punts were downed inside the 20 yard line (43.2 percent). The 32 punts inside the 20 were the second most in the nation and four more than any other player in the Pac-12. His two touchbacks were tied for the lowest total in the nation as well.
- » Haack has a 42.8 yard per punt average in his career that current ranks tied for fourth all-time in ASU history.

GRAND SALAMO

- » Redshirt senior Salamo Fiso finds himself in a position this year to move into numerous Sun Devil records while also finding a spot on several preseason award lists, including the Bednarik, Nagurski, Butkus, Lombardi and Polynesian CFB Player of the Year.
- » Fiso is sixth in ASU history with 204 solo tackles in his career and is just 3.0 tackles for loss behind Carl Bradford (43) to crack ASU's all-time top 10 for tackles for loss.
- » Fiso finished eighth nationally and second in the Pac-12 behind teammate Antonio Longino last season in average 1.5 tackles for loss per game. His 6.0 solo tackles per game were also second in the Pac-12 (behind teammate Jordan Simone) and 12th nationally.

WHO'S THE NEW GUY?

- » There are plenty of new faces on the Sun Devil coaching staff this season, an especially high amount given the fact that Todd Graham remains at the helm. ASU's five new assistant coaches this season are tied for the fifth most in the nation among all FBS programs that retained their coaching staff (USC leads with 7; Fresno State, Utah State and Western Kentucky all had 6 changes).
- » There are plenty of relatively new faces along the offensive front as well as the Sun Devils entered the season with the fifth fewest returning offensive



line starts (15) of any team in the country.

- » N'Keal Harry became just the ninth true freshman in Arizona State history to start in a season opener this year. He joins Cohl Cabral, Robbie Robinson and Kyle Williams as the only true freshman to play on Opening Day.
- » Harry is just the fourth Sun Devil ever to start on offense as a true frosh in the opener and he joined D.J. Foster as the only other Sun Devil in history to score in each of their first three games of the season as a true freshman.

SCHEDULE ANOMALIES

- » The 2016 will mark the a strange year from a schedule standpoints For instance, ASU has had only a single home game after Oct. 22 just twice (1996 and 1998) in the Pac-12 era. ASU's only home game after Oct. 22 this year is Nov. 10 vs. Utah.
- » The Devils had just one home game in November just once in the past 10 years (2012). Utah is only home game in November this year.
- » 2016 will mark the first time since 2002 ASU finishes with back-to-back games on the road.
- » The Sun Devils have finished with three of final four games on the road just five times (2012, 2002, 1998, 1996 and 1994) since joining the Pac-12.

THE FIRST OF MANNY

- » Manny Wilkins became just the fourth quarterback since 1970 to go 4-0 in his first career starts, joining Danny White (10-0) and Todd Hons (8-0).
- » The Sun Devils entered the season as one of just two teams in the nation without a quarterback on the roster that had officially completed a pass at a four-year college until Wilkins first attempt.

The Sun Devils picked off Davis Webb twice in that span and D.J. Calhoun returned a Cal onside kick attempt 42 yards with 48 seconds to play in a 51-41 victory over the Bear in the Pac-12 opener for both teams on Saturday night.

Laiu Moekiola returned the second interception 28 yards for a touchdown to put the Sun Devils (4-0, 1-0 Pac-12) ahead 44-34 with 2:52 remaining.

Webb's fifth touchdown pass of the night, 26 yards to Demetris Robertson, cut the lead to 44-41 with 54 seconds to play. But Calhoun grabbed the onside kick try and ran untouched to the end zone.

Manny Wilkins completed 21 of 30 passes for 290 yards and a touchdown for Arizona State and ran 23 times for 72 yards and three scores.

Salamo Fiso's interception set up the last of Zane Gonzalez's three field goals, a 23-yarder that careened off the right upright, to put the Sun Devils ahead for good 37-34 with 2:55 remaining.

On the first play after the subsequent kickoff, Moekiola picked off Webb's short pass and returned it for the score.

LOS ANGELES (AP) Southern California shrugged off its dismal September with a stellar freshman quarterback and a revived defense.

Sam Darnold passed for 352 yards and three touchdowns in his first home start, and USC emerged from its rough start to the season with a 41-20 victory over Arizona State on Saturday night.

JuJu Smith-Schuster caught seven passes for 123 yards and a career-high tying three TDs for the Trojans (2-3, 1-2 Pac-12), who emphatically avoided their first 0-3 start to conference play since 2001 with a blowout of the previously unbeaten Sun Devils (4-1, 1-1).

Arizona State lost starting quarterback Manny Wilkins shortly before half-time when he was hurt while getting sacked by Rasheem Green. Wilkins watched the second half on crutches with a walking boot on his left foot, but coach Todd Graham provided no postgame information on the injury.

After averaging 48.8 points in their first four games, the Sun Devils didn't reach the end zone against USC's inspired defense until Brady White threw a 13-yard TD pass to Raymond Epps with 8:37 to play.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) Sefo Liufau has thrown for 1,101 yards against Arizona State, so the Sun Devils naturally expected to see plenty of passes Saturday night when the Buffaloes senior quarterback returned to the starting lineup for the first time in a month.

Instead, they got steamrolled.

Phillip Lindsay rushed for 219 yards and three touchdowns in the Buffaloes' 40-16 romp that marked Colorado's first win over the Sun Devils in eight tries.

Lindsay averaged 8.4 yards on 26 carries and his big day included a 75-yard TD rumble on the first snap of the second half. He also scored from 13 yards out and capped it off with a 4-yard run in the final minute.

The Buffs ran for 315 yards overall compared to just 50 for Arizona State. Liufau threw for 265 yards on 23 of 31 passing against the nation's worst pass defense in his return to the Buffs starting lineup for the first time since spraining his left ankle at Michigan on Sept. 17.

Senior Zane Gonzalez's field goals of 50, 51 and 59 yards tied an FBS record for most 50-plus field goals in a game and his 59-yarder established a Sun Devils record. It was the second-longest at Folsom Field behind Mason Crosby's 60-yarder against Iowa State on Oct. 16, 2004.

TEMPE (AP) Luke Falk threw for 398 yards and three touchdowns, helping Washington State hold off Arizona State 37-32 Saturday night.

Washington State (5-2, 4-0 Pac-12) had more trouble with Arizona State's defensive scheme in the first quarter, unable to get anything going as the Sun Devils dropped deep into coverage and forced Falk to throw underneath.

Once Falk adjusted, he picked the Sun Devils (5-3, 2-3) apart, leading the Cougars to 28 straight points, a run triggered by Robert Taylor's 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

Falk hit Tavares Martin on a 9-yard TD late in the second quarter and Jamal Morrow on a 3-yard score in the third. The junior also laid the ball in perfectly for Gabe Marks, who became Washington State's all-time receptions leader, on a 52-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that put the Cougars up 37-21.

Arizona State was down to its fourth-string quarterback after Manny Wilkins was injured on the opening drive and had four other starters out. The Sun Devils still managed to lead by 11 early and clawed most of their way back from a 16-point deficit in the fourth quarter.

Tim White had a 70-yard touchdown on a punt return and Zane Gonzalez hit a 29-yard field goal to pull Arizona State within 37-32. But Falk and the Cougars ground down the game's final 4:36.

Wilkins ran for a 3-yard touchdown by hurdling a defender - his third hurdle of the season - before going out and freshman Sterling Dillon-Cole completed 7 of 16 passes for 86 yards in his place.

TODD GRAHAM

HEAD COACH

**ASU: 39-22 (5TH SEASON) | CAREER: 88-52 (11TH SEASON)
2013 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR**

From the moment he was introduced as Arizona State University's head football coach on December 14, 2011, Todd Graham made it clear he was a visionary. A throwback. A teacher who truly believes in the virtues of hard work, dedication and giving back. He had a plan to infuse the program with a culture

that was about winning in all facets of a student-athlete's life. Graham referred to it simply as, 'The Sun Devil Way.'

"Our goal as a program is that we are going to first and foremost bring out the best in every single person's character that's involved in our program," Graham said. "I'm not only interested in winning on Saturday... I want to win every day in every way. We will compete in the classroom as we compete on the field. On the field we're going to be passionate and disciplined. Discipline is the key to winning football games. We're going to be involved in the community. The greatest joy that I've had in my life is to learn to be a giver. . . I want our players to understand that family and character and bringing out the best and being a giver, that's what I call unique character, is giving every day."

Graham, the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, enters his fifth season at the helm of the Arizona State University football program. Under his leadership, Sun Devil football has reached levels of success not seen in more than 30 years. Graham's most impressive achievements include:

- With 34 wins in his first four seasons, Graham joined Frank Kush and Darryl Rogers as the only Sun Devil coaches to reach the 30-win mark within four seasons.
- Last season Graham, whose average of 8.5 wins per season are tops in program history, established a new precedent in becoming the only ASU football coach to have each of his first four teams earn bowl-eligible status.
- The 2014 squad became the first to post back-to-back 10-win seasons since 1973.
- Graham, who is 3-1 vs. Arizona, has already climbed to No. 2 among Sun Devil head coaches in Pac-12 road wins. His 10 victories trail only Bruce Snyder, who won 18 from 1992-2000. Another feat ensconced within that achievement is the Sun Devils have brought home conference wins from Los Angeles each of the last three seasons – UCLA in 2013, USC in 2014 and UCLA in 2015. Only one other time (1991-93) had ASU accumulated as many successive Pac-12 wins in the City of Angels.
- Under Graham's direction ASU ranks first in the Pac-12 and third in the nation with an average of 34.6 penalty yards per game and ranks first in the Pac-12 and sixth in the nation with an average of 4.32 penalties per game.

Graham's influence on ASU football has been just as significant off the field where his student-athletes have been trailblazers in the classroom. In the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) – a real-time look at a team's academic success each semester by tracking the academic progress of each student-athlete – the Sun Devil football program reached an all-time high 960, including a single-year APR of 990 for the 2014-15 roster, which is third in the Pac-12 for that year.

Last season ASU became the first school to have consecutive winners – quarterback Taylor Kelly in 2014 and quarterback Mike Bercovici in 2015 – of the Pac-12's Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year, awarded to senior student-athletes that are standouts both academically and in their sports discipline.

Graham's resolute commitment to help Sun Devil football be the best can also be seen in the recent reinvention of Sun Devil Stadium, a project which Graham has invested in both figuratively and literally. In September 2014, Graham and his wife Penni, and Vice President for University Athletics Ray Anderson and his wife Buffie, each gave \$500,000 in personal funds to the Sun Devil Athletics Momentum fundraising campaign.

The second of three phases of the \$256 million project will be completed in time for the 2016 season with the third and final phase set to be finished in 2017.

Throughout his time at ASU Graham has been steadfast when stating his ultimate goal: to bring championships to Tempe. When the 2015 season commenced, the Sun Devils were among the teams that pundits picked to be contending for a national championship at season's end. Although the Sun Devils would ultimately end up with a 6-7 record, Graham made it clear he had no regrets about being in harmony with the preseason excitement.

Despite not reaching the heights they had hoped, the 2015 Sun Devils proved their mettle with gut-check wins at No. 7 UCLA (the undefeated Bruins were coming off a 56-30 win at Arizona while the Sun Devils were reeling from a 42-14 home loss to USC), a 27-17 home win vs. Washington (ASU overcame back from 17-point deficit to win) and a 52-37 win in the annual Territorial Cup game vs. Arizona.

In 2014, Graham's Sun Devil squad posted a 10-3 record, including a 6-3 mark in Pac-12 play, a second-place finish in the Pac-12 South Division and a 36-31 victory over Duke in the Sun Bowl. Tasked with replacing nine starters on defense, Graham led a unit that ranked near the top in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss, forced 27 turnovers and scored five touchdowns during the season.

On the other side of the ball, ASU finished the season ranked 16th in the nation in scoring offense and averaged more than 440 yards per game behind record-breaking quarterback and Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year Taylor Kelly, 1,000-yard



rusher D.J. Foster and 1,000-yard receiver Jaelen Strong.

In 2013 Graham's Sun Devils brushed aside the prognostications from skeptics who felt that an early-season string of games against Wisconsin, Stanford, USC and Notre Dame would be a little bit too much to overcome. Then, sitting with a 5-2 record after seven games and still very much in the race for the Pac-12 South crown, the Sun Devils would have their endurance and desire questioned again as they had to navigate their way through a stretch of three of their next four games on the road. In a hard-fought, 20-19 win at Utah, the Sun Devils dug deep and proved they had the toughness and resilience to fight through any challenge that lay before them.

That belief would serve them well two weeks later in a winner-take-all showdown at No. 14 UCLA. At stake: a trip to the Pac-12 Championship game. There would be no hesitation to seize the moment as the Sun Devils ambushed the Bruins, jumping out to a 35-13 halftime lead. A furious rally by the Bruins got them to within one score. Down 38-33 and with 3:21 remaining, the Bruins took over possession of the ball at their own 35. In a similar situation one year earlier, UCLA responded by taking the ball down the field for the game winning field goal. Despite Hollywood being a short distance away, the Sun Devil defense ensured there would be no sequel on this day as a pair of critical sacks forced the UCLA offense into submission. And just like that, the Sun Devils were champions of the Pac-12 South.

One week later ASU would keep possession of the Territorial Cup after blitzing Arizona 58-21. With the win the Sun Devils clinched a berth in the 2013 Pac-12 Championship Game.

ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number in 2013. ASU put points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

The duo of defensive tackle Will Sutton and linebacker Carl Bradford combined to give ASU the most dynamic defensive tandem in the country as the two combined for 24.5 sacks and 44.0 tackles for loss in 2012. Their collective average of 1.92 sacks per game was the highest in the country by two players on the same team since the 2006 season. Bradford racked up 40.5 tackles for loss in two years under Graham, tied for the fourth most by any player in the nation in that time.

Sutton became ASU's sixth winner of the Morris Trophy and the 18th consensus All-American and first since 2007. Sutton also became the fifth ASU player to win the Pac-10/12 conference Defensive Player of the Year award. After accomplishing all of that as a junior, Sutton returned for his senior season and repeated as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year and Morris Trophy Winner while adding numerous All-American accolades.

Although the 2013 Sun Devils would come up short of their ultimate goal of getting to and winning the annual Rose Bowl Game, they proved they had the right people on board. And leading that ship a captain in Graham, who was named the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

In his first season at Arizona State, Graham guided the team to an 8-5 record as

the program recorded its first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007. ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.

That season, ASU used a dramatic fourth-quarter comeback to defeat Arizona in Tucson and reclaim the Territorial Cup. The Sun Devils would go on to win a bowl game for the first time since 2005 and the 13th time in school history. Additionally, ASU was one of just four Pac-12 teams to win at least three conference road games (3-2) in 2012, doing so for just the fifth time in the program's Pac-10/12 history.

While known for leading programs that have annually been among the nation's leaders in offensive production, Graham gained national acclaim for his coaching prowess on the other side of the ball after leading defenses that helped West Virginia (2002) and Tulsa (2003) engineer two of the top single-season turnarounds in recent memory. With head-turning accomplishments like those it is easy to see why Graham believes that defense wins championships.

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils' extraordinary improvement on defense played a paramount role in the team's rise improvement in 2012. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal in 2012 as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

Graham was named the 23rd head football coach in program history on December 14, 2011, arriving in Tempe from the University of Pittsburgh.

Born Dec. 5 1964, Graham earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education from East Central University. He and his wife, Penni, have six children: Bo, Natalie, Hank, Haylee, Dakota and Michael Todd Jr.

TODD'S WINNING WAYS

- » Graham won 34 games in his first four seasons at Arizona State, becoming just the third Sun Devil coach outside Frank Kush and Darryl Rogers to accomplish the 30-win feat by his fourth season.
- » He has become the only ASU head coach to be bowl eligible in each of his first four seasons with the program.
- » He led ASU to three consecutive eight win seasons for the first time since 1971-73 in his first three seasons at the helm.
- » Of all the coaching hires made prior to the 2012 season that remain at those institutions, Graham has posted the fourth-best record at 39-20, ranking behind only Urban Meyer (56-5), Kevin Sumlin (42-17) and Jim Mora (40-21) and in the last five seasons.

TODD-BITS OF INFO

- » Over his four seasons prior to coming to ASU -- one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa -- Todd Graham's teams rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. The 2012 Sun Devils rushed the ball on 59.1 percent of their total plays followed by a 55.2 percent tally in 2013, 52.1 percent in 2014 and 50.2 percent last season. In 2011, ASU rushed just 44.5 percent of the time.
- » Over the past 10 seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then finished with 2.9 per game in 2013 and 3.0 per game in 2014 to finish 17th and 13th, respectively, in the country. ASU would earn the NCAA statistical trophy in the category in 2015, leading the nation with 3.54 sacks per game.
- » In 10 seasons, Graham is 30-28 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in such games in 2012, 3-2 in 2013 and 4-2 in 2014 before dropping to an uncharacteristic 1-4 last season (11-11 overall). In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16 in true road contests.
- » In nine of the last 10 years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012 (eighth nationally), 31.36 per game in 2013 (seventh nationally) and 32.38 per game in 2014 (fourth nationally) and 39.85 per game last season (15th nationally).

NOT WASTING TIME

- » In his first four seasons, Todd Graham has an average of 8.5 wins per year at ASU, which ranks him number one all-time in Sun Devil lore.
- » ASU's 31 regular-season wins under Coach Graham (2012-15) were the most regular-season wins in a four-year span since 1980-83, and the team's 34 total wins were the most since 1975-78.
- » Graham became the third-quickest coach to reach 30 wins, doing so in 43 games (Frank Kush and Darryl Rogers each did so in 40).
- » As far as Bowl Games go, Graham has wasted no time establishing himself in the record books as his three appearances with the Sun Devils are already tied for third among all ASU coaches and his two wins are tied for second.

ELITE COMPANY

- » Head Coach Todd Graham had a school-record 28 wins in his first three seasons as head coach at ASU, one more than College Football Hall of Fame Coach Dan Devine (1955-57).
- » Coach Graham has recorded 10 wins in five of his 10 seasons as a head coach (Tulsa 2007, 2008, 2010; ASU 2013, 2014.) Since 2007, Coach Graham currently sits tied for No. 7 nationally in most 10-win seasons with five at FBS institutions, ranking behind only Nick Saban, Bob Stoops, Chris Peterson, Urban Meyer, Mark Richt and Gary Patterson.
