### **UP NEXT**

After a pair of convincing home wins, the No. 18/16 Arizona State women's basketball team goes on the road for the first time this season when it travels to Milwaukee, Wisc., to take on Marquette (Saturday at 2 p.m. CT/1 p.m. MT).

Success on the road has been one of the most important factors in ASU's 57-13 record since the start of the 2014-15 season. During that stretch the Sun Devils have won 21 of 24 road games. Last season the Sun Devils set a program record with 11 road wins.

ASU (2-0) opened the new campaign with home wins over Illinois State (76-40) and San Jose State (82-37) last weekend. Seven players averaged 7.0 or more points in the two wins led by senior forward Sophie Brunner, sophomore guard Armani Hawkins and freshman guard Reili Richardson, who averaged 9.0 points each. ASU shot 45 percent in the two wins, including 41 percent from long distance (13-32).

The Sun Devils were equally impressive on the defensive end where they held last week's opponents to a combined shooting percentage of 29.3 while giving up only one triple (1-20).

This year's Sun Devil squad returns three senior starters – posts Sophie Brunner, Quinn Dornstauder and Kelsey Moos – from the 2015-16 team that captured a share of the Pac-12 regular season title, won 26 games (tied for third-highest win total in program history) and went on to earn a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the highest placement in program history. In addition, 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year Charli Turner Thorne also welcomes a five-member freshman class – Sydney Goodson, Reili Richardson, Jamie Ruden, Kiara Russell and Robbi Ryan – that was ranked among the nation's top 10 signing classes when it was announced last fall, and Sara Hattis, a graduate post who will be eligible to play this season after transferring to ASU from the University of Texas in May.

Saturday's game at Marquette will be streamed at http://www.gomarquette.com/collegesportslive/?media=541362. The game can also be heard on the Sun Devil Athletics Tune-In Channel. For those with HD Radio, the game can be heard on KSLX 100.7 FM HD2. Pre-game coverage begins at 12:30 p.m in the Valley. Veteran broadcaster and the state of Arizona's 2010 Broadcaster of the Year Jeff Munn is in his 13th season as the voice of ASU women's basketball.

### **SERIES NOTES VS. MARQUETTE (ASU LEADS 2-1)**

This will be the fourth all-time meeting between ASU and Marquette and the first one in Milwaukee with each of the first three meetings taking place in Tempe. The two teams split the first two meetings with ASU winning the first encounter 119-72 in 1992 and Marquette coming away with the win in 1997 (69-50). In the most recent meeting last season the Sun Devils came out on top 90-80. Three of the four Sun Devil players who scored in double figures in last year's win – Arnecia Hawkins (17 points), Katie Hempen (14 points), Elisha Davis (11 points) – were members of the 2016 senior class. In her first game back after missing the previous six games due to injury, Sophie Brunner scored 14 points and grabbed four rebounds.

### REILI RICHARDSON NAMED PAC-12 WBB FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Sun Devil women's basketball freshman guard Reili Richardson was named the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Freshman of the Week, according to an announcement by the league office on Monday.

Richardson, a 5-11 guard from Brea, California, averaged 9.0 points and 5.5 assists while connecting on 58 percent of her shots in helping the Sun Devils come away with wins over Illinois State and San Jose State.

In her Sun Devil debut on Friday, Richardson scored seven points (3-5 FGs), dished out a game-high seven assists and grabbed three rebounds to help the Sun Devils to a 76-40 win over Illinois State.

On Sunday, Richardson tied fellow freshman Robbi Ryan with a game-high 11 points (4-7 FGs) to go along with four assists in ASU's 82-37 win over San Jose State. Richardson (seven points) and freshman teammate Kiara Russell (seven points) both knocked down all three of their shots and combined for 14 points in the first quarter to help the Sun Devils outscore the Spartans 29-7 over the first 10 minutes.

#### SUN DEVIL WBB BENEFITS FROM OFFSEASON TRIP TO COSTA RICA

Over the summer the Sun Devil women's basketball did a six-day foreign tour of Costa Rica. Every four years the program is allowed to take a foreign tour to a destination where it plays games and partakes in a variety of team bonding activities in addition to volunteering time in the community.

The Sun Devils, who graduated five players from last year's team that won a share of the regular season Pac-12 title, won all four games during their stay in Costa Rica. From a basketball standpoint the trip was an invaluable experience for a relatively young team. While ASU returns its entire starting frontcourt this season in the form of seniors Sophie Brunner, Quinn Dornstauder and Kelsey Moos, they are also adding seven new members.

Following its first official practice of the season last month, Charli Turner Thorne said that having the practices prior to the trip and the games in Costa Rica helped to smooth the transition with such a new team.

"Obviously the fact we got some summer practices in I think made it a lot less frantic," Turner Thorne said. "We had great energy and effort out there, but we are by no means peaking right now."

Turner Thorne said preseason practices are important for setting the tone for the upcoming season.

"This such an impactful time because once you get into the season your rest and recovery is so important," Turner Thorne said. "This is when you really lay your foundation and establish how you are going to play. You figure out who you are and try and get as good as you can because once you get into games you are never going to have this amount of quality reps and practice time."

### **NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE NOTES**

ASU will play five teams that qualified for the 2016 postseason during the nonconference portion of its 2016-17 schedule.

Included in this year's non-conference slate are contests against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams Maryland (back-to-back Big Ten Champions), St. Johns, Kentucky and Middle Tennessee. The Sun Devils could potentially play a fifth 2016 NCAA qualifier in the ASU Classic. ASU will open its annual home tournament against Boston and then the following day will face either Florida (2016 NCAA Tournament participant) or Long Beach State (2016 WNIT participant).

ASU will face Maryland and St. John's in back-to-back contests Thanksgiving weekend when it travels to Las Vegas for the South Point Shootout .

The Sun Devils will also face a challenging road trip in December when they take on Kentucky and Middle Tennessee in consecutive games.

#### **QUICK PLAYER NOTES**

Sophie Brunner: A starter in 86 of 97 career games, in 2016 Brunner earned honorable mention recognition on the 2016 WBCA NCAA Division I Coaches' All-America Team, the first Sun Devil to earn all-America notice since Briann January in 2009...Brunner is ASU's active leader in points (975), rebounds (691 - 3rd on ASU's all-time list), assists (128) and steals (141). Is also 2nd on ASU's all-time list for most rebounds (56) in the NCAA Tournament.

Quinn Dornstauder: Has played in 97 career games (28 starts) and is ASU's active leader in career blocks (93/5th on ASU's all-time list)...Moved into starting role in 2015-16 after coming off the bench her first two seasons and continued to be a strong offensive presence, accounting for 3 of ASU's 4 highest single-game point totals.

<u>Kelsey Moos:</u> Has started 91 of 93 career games and has been first (2014 - 6.6 rpg) or second (2015 - 5.4/2016 - 6.0) on the team in rebounds each of her first three seasons...Was also second on the team in field goal percentage in 2014 and 2015...Earned Pac-12 Defensive honorable mention recognition and was also named to the Pac-12's All-Academic first team for the second straight season last year... Earned her Communication degree in only 3 years (May 2016) and is currently pursuing Master's Degree in Liberal Studies.

<u>Sara Hattis:</u> Came to ASU this past May as a four-year transfer from the University of Texas in and will be eligible to play in 2016-17...An exceptionally talented athlete, Hattis was a member of both the Longhorn volleyball and women's basketball squads in 2012-13 and 2014-15 before committing to basketball on a year-round basis prior to the 2015-16 academic year...Hattis played in 51 games in her three seasons as a member of the Longhorn women's basketball team (joined the squad after the conclusion of volleyball season in 2012-13 and 2014-15).

<u>Courtney Ekmark:</u> Valley native who transferred to ASU in June 2016 after playing two seasons for UConn where she was part of two national championship teams...Per NCAA transfer rules, will have to sit out the 2016-17 season, but will have two years of eligibility remaining beginning with the 2017-18 season...In her three years playing for Phoenix St. Mary's, helped lead the Knights to an 87-3 record that included a 49-game winning streak, three straight Division I State Titles, a No. 1 ranking in the USA Today Super 25 in 2012 and a No. 2 ranking in 2013.

Sabrina Haines: Earned Pac-12 All-Freshman honorable mention honors in 2016 after she played in every game and led the team in FT percentage (86.7/39-45), was 2nd in 3-point FG pct. (31.9/15-47) and 4th in 3-pointers (15)...Posted season highs in scoring (19 points/5-7 FGs) and rebounds (6) in win at Washington State (Jan. 10, 2016). Scored 14 of her 19 points in the second half... Has started both games this season Charnea Johnson-Chapman: Expected to seeing more playing time this season after playing in 25 games as a freshman...Scored a season-high 8 points (4-4 FGs) in win at Hawaii (Nov. 28) and grabbed season-high 5 rebounds in win over CSUN (Dec. 28).

<u>Kianna Ibis:</u> Outstanding offensive talent who was slowed freshman year by knee injury suffered senior year of high school... Robbi Ryan: A 2016 graduate of Sheridan High School (Sheridan, Wyo.), Ryan was a four-time First Team All-State selection and two-time Gatorade Player of the Year for the State of Wyoming, who would go on to be named Ms. Wyoming Basketball 2016... Averaged 9.0 opening weekend and tied with fellow frehman Reili Richardson with a game-high 11 points in win vs. San Jose State (Nov. 13).

<u>Sydney Goodson:</u> A 2016 graduate of Liberty Christian School (Argyle, Texas), who was as one of key players in helping lead her Liberty High School team to back-to-back state titles in 2015-16...Was named the Denton Chronicle's Co-Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 after averaging 17.6 points, 3.7 assists and 2.9 steals per game.

<u>Jamie Ruden:</u> A 2016 graduate of John Marshall High School (Rochester, Minn.), Ruden was a two-time AP First-Team All-State honoree, member of the James Naismith All-American team and a finalist for Minnesota's Miss Basketball award who concluded her five-year varsity career (was member of varsity since eighth grade) as Rochester's all-time leading scorer, boy or girl, with 2,671 points while also pulling down for than 1,000 career rebounds.

#### **NOTES**

- ASU was picked to finish in fourth place in the Pac-12 by both the league's coaches and media who cover the conference. The Sun Devils received one first-place vote in the media poll.
- Over the last three seasons ASU is 33-5 in non-conference games and 45-6 at home.
- ASU is 31-5 in regular season Pac-12 games the last two season. Prior to its loss at Oregon State on Feb. 1, 2016, ASU's 9-0 record in Pac-12 play was its best conference start in program history (surpassed last 7-0 start in 2015).
- ASU has allowed an average of only 54.9 points per game since the start of the 2014-15 season (70 games). On average, opposing teams scored more than 15.0 points under their scoring average when facing ASU last season. In fact, only two opponents (Marquette and Tennessee), scored more points than what they averaged coming into their respective games vs. ASU.
- Since the 1996-97 season, Turner Thorne's first season at ASU, the Sun Devils lead the Pac-12 in the number of first-team All-Academic conference awards (19) and the combined number of first- and second-team All-Academic conference awards (40). In 2014-15 ASU's team GPA (3.558) was No. 7 on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) 2015 Academic Honor Roll.
- In the last three seasons the Sun Devils are 25-6 in games decided by five points or less and/or overtime.



#### CHARLI TURNER THORNE HAS SUN DEVIL WBB AMONG NATION'S ELITE

The all-time winningest coach in program history and No. 2 in the Pac-12 in career wins (382), Charli Turner Thorne has turned Sun Devil women's basketball into one of the nation's premiere programs since taking over in 1996-97. Included in ASU's earlier run of 13 consecutive postseason appearances (2000-12) were a school record five-consecutive NCAA Tournament bids from 2005-09. During that time the Sun Devils qualified for the Elite Eight on a pair of occasions, making ASU one of only 15 programs in the country to have qualified for the Elite Eight at least two times between 2007-12.

In 2013-14 Turner Thorne, who recorded both the 400th win of her coaching career and her 200th Pac-12 win last season, raised the curtain on the team's current era of success as she helped the Sun Devils post one of the best turnarounds in the country as they went from a 13-18 record and a ninth-place Pac-12 finish (5-13) in 2012-13 to a 23-10 record and fourth-place Pac-12 finish (11-7). Included among ASU's 23 wins in 2013-14 were three triumphs over Top 25 teams.

In 2015-16 Turner Thorne was named one of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith Women's College Coach of the Year for a season in which she led the Sun Devils to their best start in school history (18-1), their best conference start in school history (7-0), a second-place finish in the Pac-12 and 29 wins, the second-highest number of wins in school history.

Under Turner Thorne's leadership the program ascended to even greater heights last season. In the month of January alone the Sun Devils posted the best conference start in school history (9-0), equalled the highest AP ranking in school history (No. 8) and matched the school record for consecutive wins (15). They would go on to clinch their first Pac-12 regular season championship since 2001 and earned the highest NCAA Tournament seed (No. 2) in program history.

The outstanding success Sun Devil women's basketball has enjoyed under Turner Thorne is a 180-degree difference from the program that had an aggregate record of 20-60 in the three years prior to her arrival and only two NCAA Tournament wins in its history.

### **CELEBRATING ELITE ACCOMPLISHMENT**

This season will be the 10th anniversary of ASU's first ever appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight. Led by senior forwards Aubree Johnson and Emily Westerberg who were both named to the All-Pac-10 Team, ASU set school records for overall wins (31), most Pac-10 wins (16 - tied in 2016) and most road wins (10 - broken in 2016) With the honor, Westerberg became the first Sun Devil to be named to the All-Pac-10 Team three times. In addition to Johnson and Westerberg's accolades, sophomore guard Briann January was named All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention and guard Dymond Simon was named to the Pac-10 All-Freshman Team.

### SUN DEVIL WBB ANNOUNCES THE SIGNING OF EVA RUBIN AND BRE'YANNA SANDERS

On Nov. 9, 2016, Arizona State University head women's basketball coach Charli Turner Thorne today announced that student-athletes Eva Rubin and Bre'yanna Sanders signed national letters of intent to join the Sun Devil women's basketball program.

"We are excited to announce that Eva and Bre will be joining our Sun Devil women's basketball family," Turner Thorne said. "Both of these young women come from great families and will not only excel on the court but in the classroom and our community."

A 6-5 post, Rubin will be coming to ASU from Homewood-Flossmoor High School in Flossmoor, Illinois, where she averaged 15 points, eight rebounds and four blocks as a junior in 2016. Ranked No. 14 at her position by ESPN.com, Rubin earned Class 3A/4A All-State recognition from the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association last season in addition to also being named to the All-Area and All-Conference teams. As a sophomore in 2015, Rubin helped lead her squad to a fourth-place finish in the IHSA 4A state tournament. During Homewood-Flossmoor's run in the tournament, Rubin tied a Class 4A single-game record with five blocked shots.

A 6-0 forward, Sanders will be joining the Sun Devils from Clovis West High School in Fresno, California, where she has earned first-team All-Valley recognition in addition to being named the team's defensive player of the year each of the last two seasons. In 2016 Sanders averaged 11.0 points, 6.4 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.2 blocks in helping lead her team to 30-4 record and the semifinals of the Southern California Regional Open Division. She would go on to be named the league co-player of the year. In 2015 Sanders had a big role on a team that posted a 26-5 record, its third straight Central Section Division I title and reached the second round of the Southern California Open Division regional.

ASU's 11 NCAA Tournament appearances under Turner Thorne are eight more than what ASU had in the 15 years prior to her arrival in Tempe. Has also earned a pair of gold medals with USA Basketball.
- Was named the 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year (coaches and media), the second time she has been recognized with the honor (2001), after leading the Sun Devils to their second regular season Pac-12 championship. ASU would go on to earn its highest NCAA Tournament seed (No. 2) in program history. In 2016 ASU has also tied the program records for most conference wins (16) and consecutive wins (15) and set the program record for most road wins (11).
- Turner Thorne, who is in her 20th season at ASU, recorded the 400th victory of her career (includes 40 wins at Northern Arizona) on Dec. 14, 2015 (at Hartford).
- In 2014-15 Turner Thorne led ASU to 29 wins (second-highest total in school history), a second-place finish in the Pac-12 and a berth in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The 2014-15 Sun Devils posted the best overall start (18-1) and conference start (7-0) in school history and reached 20 wins faster than any other squad (22 games).
- Since the 1996-97 season, Turner Thorne's first season at ASU, the Sun Devils lead the Pac-12 in the number of first-team All-Academic conference awards (19) and the combined number of first- and second-team All-Academic conference awards (40). In 2014-15 ASU's team GPA (3.558) was No. 7 on the

Women's Basketball Coaches Association's 2015 Academic Honor Roll.

- In 2013-14, ASU recorded its 10th 20-win season (23) and its ninth NCAA Tournament berth since 2000-01. The Sun Devils advanced to the second round of the Tournament, the seventh time under Turner Thorne the Sun Devils have been among the final 32 teams or better.
- Earned her 300th win as ASU's head coach on Jan. 25, 2013. Turner Thorne joined current Stanford coach Tara Vanderveer and former Washington/USC head coach Chris Gobrecht as the only other coaches to earn at least 300 wins while coaching in the Pac-10/12. ASU's 63-60 triumph over No. 20 Syracuse on Dec. 30, 2013 was the 313th win at ASU for Turner Thorne, moving her
- In 2011 led ASU to its sixth NCAA Tournament appearance in seven years and a third-place finish in the Pac-10, ASU's ninth

into the No. 2 spot on the Pac-12's all-time wins list.

- top-3 conference finish in 11 seasons.
- In 2009 guided the Sun Devils to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons. ASU's final 26-9 record in 2008-09 included a school record 15-game winning streak.
- Is one of three coaches (former Washington head coach Chris Gobrecht and current Stanford head coach Tara VanDerveer) in Pac-10/12 history (since the 1986-87 season) to have led their respective schools to five (or more) consecutive 20-win seasons.
- In 2006-07 guided the Sun Devils to a school record 31 wins, including a school record 16 Pac-10 wins, and led them to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. ASU concluded the 2006-07 season ranked No. 8 in the final USA Today/ESPN coaches poll and No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll, their highest FINAL rankings in each of the respective polls in school history.

It was Turner Thorne's second time working with USA Basketball. In the summer of 2007 Turner Thorne served as an assistant coach on USA Basketball's U21 World Championship Team which won the gold medal at the FIBA U21 World Championship in Moscow, Russia.
- Is a past president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) Executive Committee.
- Graduated from Stanford in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and later earned her master's degree in education from Washington in 1990.
- Turner Thorne and her husband, Will, have three sons Conor (17), Liam (15) and Quinn (12).
