Men's Tennis Heads to Texas Friday, Back Home on Sunday

STANFORD/BERKELEY – Sun Devil men's tennis hits the road again, this time kicking off Pac-12 play in the Bay Area against No. 7 Stanford and California. ASU played two extremely competitive games in Tempe last season versus the two conference foes, and Matt Hill expects nothing less of his squad this time around.

HEAD COACH MATT HILL:

We've been playing really good doubles so far this year, and part of it is adding three guys to our lineup this year who weren't in it last year in Justin Roberts, Nathan Ponwith and Dominik Kellovsky.

As for our returners, they have a year under their belt and have learned a lot more about doubles in that time period. With doubles, it's not something they typically learn a lot as young player, so there's a huge learning curve when they come to college. Their level can grow pretty quickly just by learning some basics like tactics and core positioning.

All three of our pairs are very, very good doubles teams. We're very even all the way through, and that's why they all have national rankings and be able to beat quality opponents. Us being the only Pac-12 school with three ranked teams in the top-55 says a lot about the depth of our doubles. It's a good stat for us too because the ability to win the doubles point is a huge factor when trying to beat the top teams.

We feel like that Stanford match kind of got stolen from us last season. Not in a bad way – Stanford didn't do anything wrong – but because we felt like we had a lot of the control in our match and we let it slip a little. You're always eager and hungry to get back on that same team to try to beat them the next time, so the guys are excited about Stanford.

It was the same thing with Cal where we had them on the ropes when the rain came last year. Then they nipped us in the finals of the Indian Wells Tournament last year which was frustrating for us. We're extremely hungry to go into this weekend and continue to make our presence known within the conference.

I would say we are more poised to beat them this time around than we were last year because we have more depth. We're dangerous at every spot, and we're starting to play some really good tennis is what we're seeing in training. There's no reason for that to not transfer to the court.

We beat a really tough San Diego team a week ago, and they're very good. We feel like we're in a really good place and we're excited for the weekend ahead.

Stanford has a younger group this year compared to last year, so they're less experienced. As it relates to college tennis, the group they recruited are a very good group of players, they're just a younger squad.

They've had some good wins, they're well-coached and they know what they're doing on the courts. It's going to be a tough test no matter whether they have freshmen in the lineup or an experienced group of seniors like they had last year.

On our side, we feel like every spot is starting to click well, which is exciting and key for us. We didn't have a lot of that in the beginning of the year: We've been clicking in some spots and the other spots haven't been sharp due to other things outside of our control. We're starting to see good tennis all through the courts which is a good sign. That's what we want to have happening and we want to see that continue to progress.

We've been really impressed with the way Andrea has been playing. He continues to impress us on a daily basis. It's no surprise, but we've been seeing some really great tennis from him. Justin has been really playing well this week. He's getting into his top form.

Nathan is putting a lot of work into his game, and it's showing. The areas that he needed to invest in, he's investing in. He's listening and getting better in those categories, and that equals more results. He's a special kid with a lot of tools and a lot of skill sets. We have a lot of guys on the court that we have a high level of trust in in tough situations, and he's definitely one of them. We're excited for not only this weekend for him, but the rest of the season. We think he's going to do some really big things.

Team Notes

Rankings Are Here, Rankings Are Here!

The latest rankings for doubles are out and No. 39 Andrea Bolla and Tim Ruehl supplied their name to the Oracle/ITA top 60 list. The tandem started the 2019 season ranked No. 22 and maintained their names on the list in every poll since.

The duo of Nathan Ponwith and Dominik Kellovsky also found themselves on the list this time around at No. 49, two spots up from their No. 51 ranking last time out. The tandem played a crucial role in securing the doubles point against No. 1 Wake Forest, as the first point came down to their match. They secured the victory, were left unfinished against No. 20 Oklahoma State but returned against Pepperdine to notch another win.

Makey Rakotomalala/Justin Roberts rounded out the Devils' ranked pairs, debuting at No. 55. They lead the team in wins with six, and made ASU the only Pac-12 school with all three doubles pairs ranked in the top-55, as well as just one of four schools within Division I tennis.

Ponwith was also recognized as No. 74 by the ITA as a singles player. Ponwith put up impressive wins in his last weekend in action, taking down two ranked opponents to secure a team-best 4-2 record against nationally-ranked opponents so far this season.

Double the Trouble

The Sun Devils have shown major improvement in doubles play in just one season's time, securing the first point in seven of the first nine matches so far. The squad did not notch seven doubles points until 15 games into last season.

Transfers **Justin Roberts** and **Dominik Kellovsky** have played large roles in upping the Sun Devils' game, as Roberts and his doubles partner, **Makey Rakotomalala** lead ASU in wins with six, while the relatively new pair of Kellovsky and **Nathan Ponwith** are 3-1 so far this season.

No. 26 **Tim Ruehl** and **Andrea Bolla** have also dominated the doubles game dating back to the fall season, going 4-2 overall while also battled to the quarterfinals of the ITA Fall National Championship in Surprise, Ariz.

Pac-12 Player of the Week

Tim Ruehl was recognized for his performance in the Sun Devils' matchups against Duke and No. 1 Wake Forest, a weekend in which he went a perfect 2-0 in singles play and 1-1 in doubles play.

Ruehl takes the first such accolade of the season, marking the first on the year for the Sun Devils and the seventh in program history. Combined with Michaël Geerts' two Player of the Week honors last year, ASU has three PotW awards since reinstatement in 2017, nearly doubling their four they totaled before being discontinued as a sport in 2008.

The German notched his first career win over a ranked opponent, defeated No. 80 Rrezart Cungu of Wake Forest 2-6, 6-2, 6-2 on Saturday. His win in tandem with Andrea Bolla – together they are ranked the No. 22 doubles pair in the nation – was against Duke to the tune of a 6-1 victory.

R&R

Makey Rakotomalala and **Justin Roberts** are clicking on all cylinders as a doubles pair. The tandem are 3-0 this season in doubles play, taking down pairs from Duke and Wake Forest with relative ease on court two.

Rakotomalala/Roberts easily slid past a tandem from No. 20 Oklahoma State this weekend to put the Sun Devils in prime position to clinch their third straight doubles point. They are currently on a three-match win streak and are 7-3 in their last 10 matches as a tandem.

ASU continues the new year with one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation in their second season, and that is something second-year mentor **Matt Hill** plans on making a tradition.

The Sun Devils open the year against some of the top competition in college tennis, as three ranked opponents came to compete in the Tempe Collegiate Classic with matchups including No. 14 TCU, No. 16 Illinois and No. 3 Mississippi State. As the season continues ASU faces four of the current top five opponents, including eight-time Big Ten champion No. 2 Ohio State for the second year in a row. Following matchups line up with powerhouses like No. 9 Texas A&M and No. 11 Baylor, as non-conference action wraps up when the Devils head to Fort Worth to face No. 14 TCU.

Mr. Worldwide(s)

With just one Devil from the United States, the men's tennis team is one of the most diverse teams within ASU Athletics. Every single Devil represents a different nation, as the nine men hail from nine different countries across the world: Italy, Czech Republic, Denmark, Bahamas, the Dominican Republic, France, Germany, the U.S. and Great Britain.

Up Hill Battle

Coach **Matt Hill** is no stranger to adversity. Upon taking the helm at South Florida in 2012, the Bulls hadn't been to the NCAA Division I Championship since 2009. Hill's team finished 8-14 in his first season, but the tide quickly changed under his mentorship, as they compiled a 12-10 record the following year and then found themselves in the Championship for the first time in five years the next season. The team made it to the second round and were eliminated by Florida, but Hill's team made the tournament the next two years as well, finishing as high as the Sweet 16 in 2015.

USF were back-to-back-to-back AAC Champions in Hill's final three years in Tampa, compiling a 82-47 record. He was a three-time American Conference Coach of the Year and mentored a three-time American Athletic Conference Player of the Year in Roberto Cid.

New Kids on the Block

Entering the 2019 season, Sun Devil men's tennis welcomes three highly sought after transfers to the new season, as they look to add veteran leadership and depth to the roster. Scottsdale native **Nathan Ponwith** returns back home after a two-year stint at the University of Georgia. During his time with the Dawgs, Ponwith earned 2017 SEC Freshman of the Year and First-Team All-SEC honors as Georgia's court one. In addition, Ponwith amassed an SEC record for most Freshman of the week honors in a single season with five to round out his sensational freshman campaign.

Another key newcomer that will compete in a major role for the Devils is **Dominik Kellovsky** from his home country of the Czech Republic. In his time overseas, he completed a large part of his time in the Pro Circuit accumulating a 70-97 record in singles and 110-80 record in doubles.

Graduate Student **Justin Roberts** returns back under head coach Matt Hill after completing two seasons with him at the University of South Florida. As a junior, Roberts was instrumental in clinching USF's fourth straight conference title when he defeated Danny Kerznerman of UCF. On top of that, Roberts added an American Athletic Conference Player of the Week honors to his resume after an upset win over No. 16 Mississippi State.

#StayTrueToASU

Scottsdale native **Nathan Ponwith** turned heads in his his weekend competing as a Sun Devil, taking down two ranked opponents en route to an undefeated weekend at the Tempe Collegiate Classic. He started the weekend with a win in straight sets over #69 Eduardo Roldan, and finished with a back-and-forth victory over #67 Niclas Braun.

Heading into the regular season, Ponwith, along with doubles partner Dominik Kellovsky, played a crucial role in securing the doubles point over No. 1 Wake Forest. Ponwith and Kellovsky teamed up to defeat a Demon Deacon tandem, 7-5, to clinch the point for ASU. This huge win was just two weeks after they took down #36 Nuno Borges/Strahinja Rakic of Mississippi State, 7-5. Ponwith notched his first regular-season win in come-from-behind fashion against Pepperdine, taking down Enrique Luque Rico 6-7 (7), 6-1, 7-5 after being down multiple times in the first and last sets.

HEAD COACH MATT HILL



Before arriving at ASU, Hill spent the previous four seasons as the head coach of the University of South Florida, leading the Bulls to three consecutive AAC team championships and a No. 17 final ranking among Division I programs this past season. USF advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season in 2016 after qualifying just twice in 10 previous campaigns prior to Hill's arrival.

Prior to his time at South Florida, Hill had two successful stops at a pair of nationally ranked SEC programs in Mississippi State and Alabama. Hill will be the Sun Devil program's first head coach since Lou Belken led the program from 1983 through 2008.

The 2016 Bulls reached a program-best ranking of No. 13 in the nation before finishing in the Top 20 at No. 17. Hill coached two-time All-American Roberto Cid to a ranking of No. 2 in the nation, the best ranking of any tennis player, men's or women's, in program history. USF also played one of the toughest schedules, notching 16 wins over ranked opponents and playing just four matches against unranked foes.

In 2015, Hill guided the Bulls to their best finish as USF advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA tournament after winning their second-straight conference championship while Oliver Pramming earned Most Outstanding Player honors.

The Bulls won the inaugural American Athletic Conference tournament in 2014 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Hill coached Cid to the first-ever All-America honor in USF history as he made an impressive run in the NCAA singles tournament.

An accomplished recruiter, Hill took over the USF program and immediately brought in five players in his first recruiting class that were either ranked among the top 100 juniors in the world or had already earned professional ATP points. His 2013 and 2016 recruiting classes were both ranked in the top 10 in the nation.



Additionally, Hill oversaw the start of a capital fundraising campaign geared toward a \$3 million renovation of the tennis facility and personally helped secure over half a million dollars toward that goal.

During Hill's five years as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, he helped the Bulldogs improve from a No. 58 ranking in 2008 and a No. 72 ranking in 2009 to top 20 finishes in his final two seasons, including a No. 11 final ranking in 2012 – the program's best finish since 1998. The Bulldogs posted the program's best record (20-7) since that same 1998 squad went 21-5.

MSU earned a No. 20 final ranking in 2011 after producing a 14-9 record, while winning the SEC Western Division title with an 8-3 mark. Hill was instrumental in helping five Bulldogs to All-SEC honors, while supporting Per Nilsson to SEC Coach of the Year honors. He was recognized for his efforts by being named ITA Southern Region Assistant Coach of the Year and SEC Assistant Coach of the Year.

Hill's recruiting prowess shined with the Bulldogs as he served as the team's recruiting coordinator, bringing in seven players that were either ranked in the top 100 among the world's juniors or became ranked in the top 125 players in the country upon arriving at Mississippi State. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked 13th in the nation.

While at MSU, Hill and the Bulldog staff had one of just three programs with five singles players ranked in the Top-75 nationally while his efforts in promoting the team helped grow the fan base by over 600 percent with the Bulldogs ranked in the top 5 nationally in average attendance during the 2009 and 2011 seasons.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Hill served as a volunteer assistant coach at Alabama for two seasons. He helped the Crimson Tide improve from a No. 56 final ranking the season before he joined the staff to a No. 14 ranking in 2007, his second year with the program. Hill helped coach five nationally ranked players and helped Alabama reach two NCAA Tournaments during his stint, including a trip to the round of 16 in 2007.

A native of Holt, Mich., Hill earned a degree in business marketing with a specialization in professional tennis management from Ferris State University in 2005 and a master's degree in human performance from Alabama in 2007. Also a member of the tennis team while at Ferris State, Hill helped lead the Bulldogs to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals for the first time in school history.

MICHAL KOKTA // ASSISTANT COACH

Kokta joined Matt Hill's staff after a two-year stint at Purdue where he was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers improve their record from 4-20 to 17-10 in the span of a year.

Prior to his appointment at Purdue Kokta was at Baylor where he served as volunteer coach at his alma mater for three seasons. During his three seasons, Baylor captured a pair of Big 12 Conference regular season titles and won the Big 12 Championship in 2014. The Bears advanced to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships in 2012 and 2013, followed by a quarterfinal appearance in 2014.

Prior to his collegiate career Kokta was ranked as high as No. 8 in singles and #3 in doubles in the ITF's juniors rankings. He reached the semifinals of the Australian Open juniors in singles, the semifinals of Wimbledon juniors in doubles, and was the European junior doubles champion. After juniors, Kokta was ranked as high as #356 ATP in singles and #480 in doubles.



DOM COTRONE // VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT

Cotrone is a volunteer assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and a former USF tennis standout.

The Bradenton, Fla. native played under Coach Hill during the 2016 season. Cotrone became the second All-American in USF history, advancing to the round of 16 at the NCAA singles tournament during his senior season while posting a 13-7 singles record.

Cotrone played in tandem with current Sun Devil Justin Roberts, with the two recording a 16-5 record in tandem during his final season at South Florida

Cotrone amassed a 10-19 singles record and 30-15 doubles record on the pro circuit, notching four professional doubles wins. Two wins came in 2015 at the USA F18 Futures and USA F22 Futures, while Cotrone recorded the other two in 2016 at the Italy F30 Futures and USA F37 Futures.
