# SUN DEVIL REWIND

Sophomore goaltender EVAN DEBROUWER held Denver to two goals (neither coming at full strength) in his career-high 44 save night Saturday. Much of the Sun Devil success is attributed to DEBROUWER as of late, riding a five-game unbeaten streak allowing just six goals (1.2/G) while posting a .960 save percentage (144 saves on 150 shots) in that stretch.

Junior forward JAMES SANCHEZ has grown comfortable quick in the maroon and gold. In his last 10 games, he's posted 13 points (4g,8a) and has a team-high and season total of 18 points. One point behind him is linemate JOHNNY WALKER (9g,8a), who netted his second career hat trick against the Pioneers in Friday's series opener.

Defensive pairing BRINSON PASICHNUK and JOSH MANISCALCO have become a dangerous duo for the Devils each totaling 14 points, respectively, ranking them in a tie for 7th in scoring among national defensemen.

In their series sweep over the Spartans last season, six different Sun Devils attributed with goals including now-sophomore forward JORDAN SANDHU who tallied a careerhigh three points in one game.

## SPARKY VS. SPARTY

The Spartans are also coming off a successful weekend at home as they swept Big Ten foe Wisconsin, putting them in a tie for second place in the Big Ten standings with Ohio State. So far this season, MSU is 4-5-1 against ranked opponents.

Senior forward Patrick Khodorenko has paced the Spartans offensively, ranking 5th in the Big Ten with 16 points (8g,8a) in 10 games.

Junior forward Mitchell Lewandowski is another Spartan to watch, as the former Chicago Steel linemate of ASU's Johnny Walker has 11 points (5g,6a). The two combined for 63 points in 96 games played in the 2015-16 season, and Lewandowski held off Walker for the NCAA national freshman goal scoring title in 2016-17.

On the back end, senior goaltender John Lethemon is having a career season as he sports the highest save percentage (.941) and second-highest goals against average (2.01) in the conference. Like DeBrouwer, his past month has been in his favor, boasting a 1.41 goals against average, .957 save percentage, and allowing more than two goals in a game just once since their home game against Michigan on Nov. 16.

## **FAMILIAR FOES**

- ASU sophomore forward JOHNNY WALKER and MSU goaltender John Lethemon spent time as teammates on the Chicago Steel (USHL) in 2015-16 along with Spartan forward Mitch Lewandowski.
   In 2016-17, WALKER and Lewandowski combined for 63 points in 96 games played. ASU goaltender JUSTIN ROBBINS also spent a short stint on the squad.
- Sun Devil defenseman JARROD GOURLEY and Spartan defenseman Dennis Cesana played together for a brief stint in 2016-17 for Brooks Bandits (AJHL) before Gourley went to the Spruce Grove Saints.
- ASU defenseman JACOB SEMIK and MSU forward Christian Krygier played together on the USA U17 squad (16-17) before fellow ASU defenseman JOSH MANISCALCO joined the pair for the U.S. National U17 Team the same year.
- Over the course of three seasons (2014-17), Sun Devils JOSH MANISCALCO and JAMES SANCHEZ
  played together with Spartans Tommy Miller, Patrick Khodorenko and Jagger Joshua for the USNTDP
  Juniors (USHL), U.S. National U17 Team and U.S. National U18 Team.
- Back in 2016-17, Sun Devil teammates PETER ZHONG and GVIDO JANSONS played with Spartan forward Gianluca Esteves on the Ashton Rebels (NAHL).
- In 2014-15, MSU defenseman Jerad Rosburg and forward Sam Sabila and ASU defenseman JACOB WILSON and forward FILIPS BUNCIS played together with the Sioux City Musketeers (USHL).
- Way back in 2013-14, Arizona State alumni Jack Rowe played with Michigan State defenseman Butrus Ghafari were teammates on the Fargo Force (USHL).

## **POWERING UP**

Coach Powers enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2019-20, and his 12th overall at the helm at ASU. The 2018-19 was one for the record books, as the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year finalist led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 221-109-25 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
