THE GAME - Sun Devil Football closes out the regular season this weekend with its rivalry contest against the Arizona Wildcats in the annual Territorial Cup on Saturday, Nov. 30. The contest is scheduled for an 8 p.m. AZT kickoff and will be nationally televised on ESPN. Fans hoping to tune in over the airwaves can listen on Arizona Sports 98.7 FM.

TERRITORIAL CUP - This will be the 93rd Duel in the Desert, with Arizona leading the all-time series 49-42-1. The vast majority of those Wildcat wins came prior to 1950, however. Since 1949, ASU holds a 40-29-1 record in the series. The winner of the game will receive (or retain) the Territorial Cup Trophy, and the game is recognized by the NCAA as the nation's oldest rivalry trophy game.

Last season, the Sun Devils mounted the largest fourth-quarter comeback in program history, rallying from 19 points down to shock the Wildcats, 41-40 - the second-straight victory in the series for ASU. Neither team has truly dominated the series since the Wildcats went 8-0-1 against ASU over the course of the 1980s. Since then, there have only been two occurrences where one team has posted a three-game winning streak - once for each team (ASU 2005-07, UA 1993-95).

The Sun Devils will be looking for their seventh victory in the past 10 contests against Arizona. The home team had won five straight meetings prior to ASU's dramatic victory last season, though the road teams won four in a row from 2009-12. The winning team has scored at least 41 points in the last 7 contests between the two teams. Nine of the previous 15 games have been decided by a touchdown or less.

KICKING OFF

-Kyle Williams has at least one pass reception in 39 consecutive games, tied for fourth in ASU history with Chris McGaha.
-Brandon Aiyuk and Frank Darby are the only receiving duo in the Pac-12 to each record at least 8 receiving touchdowns this season and one of just seven FBS duos to do so (LSU, Arkansas State, Minnesota, SMU, Alabama, Hawai'i).

-Oregon marked the 10th time in 11 games that ASU has held an opponent under 155 total rushing yards (217 vs. UCLA). The Devils had just five such games last season. It is the most since have 10 such games during the 2009 season.

- Jayden Daniels hasn't thrown an interception on 110 consecutive pass attempts, tied with Clemson's Trevor Lawrence for the eighth-longest active streak in the nation. That last interception, however, came on a half-ending Hail Mary attempt against Utah. With that removed, Daniels would have a streak of 178 consecutive passes without an interception over his last six games and change.

-Oregon quarterback Justin Herbert had just three interceptions thrown all year before the Sun Devils picked him off on back-to-back pass attempts in the fourth quarter. Of his 13 total interceptions in the last two years (24 games), four have come against ASII

-ASU's 535 total yards of offense are the most the Ducks have allowed since TCU recorded 545 yards in the 2016 Alamo Bowl.
-Oregon entered the game second nationally in turnover margin (+1.30). They were tied for 12th nationally with 20 turnovers forced compared to only seven lost. ASU forced two turnovers without giving the ball up and outscored the Ducks 11-0 (all in the fourth quarter) in points off turnovers.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- Give ASU seven wins over Arizona in the last 10 matchups
 - Gives ASU seven wins in a season for the sixth time in the last eight seasons.
- Be the first three-game winning streak in the series since ASU won three straight from 2005-07. It would be just the third such win-streak in the series since 1993 (UA won 3 straight from '93-95).
- Improve ASU to 15-9 in the series since the 1996 season.

MILESTONE COUNTDOWNS

- 381 passing yards for Jayden Daniels to move into 10th in ASU singleseason history (currently at 13th at 2,644 words behind Manny Wilkins' 3,025 in 2018)
- 2 100+ yard rushing game for Eno Benjamin to tie Wilford White for most games rushing over 100 yards in a career (currently tied for fourth with 14 with Art Malone).
- 13 rushing yards for Eno Benjamin to move into 7th in ASU career rushing yards (currently at 2,699 yards behind Darryl Clack's 2,711 total from 1982-85).
- 206 rushing yards for Eno Benjamin to move into 6th in ASU career rushing yards (currently at 2,699 yards behind Leon Burton's 2,994 from 1955-58).
- 2 games with catch needed for Kyle Williams to move into a tie for third
 in ASU history in consecutive games with a reception (currently tied for fourth
 with 39 behind Derek Hagan's 41 straight games.).

- 268 all-purpose yards needed for Brandon Aiyuk to set the ASU singleseason school record for all-purpose yards (currently at 1,797 behind Wilford White's 2,065 from back in the 1950 season).
- 41 receiving yards for Brandon Aiyuk to move into ASU's single-season Top-5 (currently at 1,125 behind Jaelen Strong's 1,165 in 2014).

#BYTHENUMBERS

Brandon Aiyuk has racked up 1,797 all-purpose yards this season on just 88 total plays (20.4 yards per touch, which is third nationally). At 163.36 yards per game, Aiyuk is the only wide receiver in the Top-20 nationally in the category. At 1,797 all-purpose yards this season, Aiyuk is fourth in ASU history and within 268 yards of Wilford White's long-standing school record of 2,065 set back in 1950. Aiyuk is the only player in the country to record at least 200 yards on both punt (226) and kick (446) returns. Aiyuk is currently 3rd nationally and first in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yards at 163.36 per game.

Eno Benjamin has played 313 snaps in passing routes this season, the second-highest total among FBS running backs as are his 52 targets. He has been targetted on 21.6 percent of ASU aimed passes (balls not thrown away, spiked or batted) - the 6th-highest percentage of running backs nationally. His 333 receiving yards this season are third among all FBS running backs. Benjamin has forced 60 missed tackles this season - a total tied for 11th nationally among running backs. He is 27th nationally with 634 yards after contact this season (69.3 percent of his 915 rushing vards).

Frank Darby's 21.32 yards per reception this season is fourth in the country and leads all Pac-12 receivers. He has seven touchdowns over the last four games. Prior to the UCLA game, he had five total receiving touchdowns

in his previous 30 career games to the current four-game stretch. Over his past four games, he has made 16 catches for 387 yards (24.2 yards per catch) and seven touchdowns. 24 of Darby's 58 career catches (41%) have gone for 20 or more yards. Darby is the 23rd-highest graded offensive player in the league (76.4) sixth among the league's wide receivers.

Jayden Daniels has completed 11 passes of 25+ yards in the fourth quarter of games (tied for 1st **nationally)** and his 19 pass completions over 15 yards in the frame is tied for 7th. Despite missing a game, Daniels has accounted for 774 passing yards in the fourth quarter of games, good for 7th nationally while his 33 passing first downs are 10th. He has recorded 9 fourth quarter passing touchdowns (fourth nationally) to one interception. His 183.84 QB efficiency rating in the fourth quarter is 15th in the country. Daniels has 719 passing yards on third downs good for 14th in the country (despite missing a game).

Kobe Williams has allowed just 140 yards in coverage thus far, the 11th-lowest total among the nation's corners.. His 0.49 yards allowed per coverage snap is tied for first in **the country.** Williams has only been thrown at just 30 times this season - the 7th-lowest total among corners that have played at least 50 percent of the coverage snaps this season. He has been targeted just once every 9.5 snaps in coverage this season, 5th-lowest among the nation's corners. He has allowed just 16 receptions this season, which is the fewest in the Pac-12 and 15th-fewest nationally.

Javden Daniels hasn't thrown an interception in 110 consecutive pass attempts, tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the nation. The last interception, however, came on a halfending Hail Mary attempt against Utah. With that removed, Daniels would have a streak of 178 consecutive passes without an interception over his last six games and change. The third-longest streak in ASU history without an interception was Mike Pagel (136) in 1980 and the school record is Rudy Carpenter's streak of 146 straight in 2005 (Manny Wilkins went 145 straight in 2017. Daniels is easily on pace to set the ASU school record for fewest interceptions with over 300 attempts (currently Wilkins' 6 in 393 in 2018)

2019 SUN DEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES



FOCUSING ON FOOTBALL

- The Sun Devil defense features three players ranked among the Top-21 in the Pac-12 in overall defensive grading from Pro Focus Football. Among Pac-12 players with at least 500 snaps, Kobe Williams is the 7th-highest graded defender in the league, regardless of position with a score of 82.6. He is the 24th highest graded corner overall in the country and the 21st-highest graded corner in coverage specifically (83.1)
- Aashari Crosswell is the 15th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his score of 76.0
- » Additionally, Jermayne Lole checks in as the 21st-highest graded player in the Pac-12 with a score of 73.3 - the third-highest score among edge defenders in the league. His 80.5 score on running plays this season is 36th among edge defenders nationally.
- Brandon Aiyuk has been ASU's highest graded offensive player this season, coming in as the 11th-highest graded offensive player in the Pac-12 and third-highest graded wide receiver (80.5).
- Frank Darby has continued to clumb the Pac-12's offensive grading chart, checking in as the 23rd-highest graded offensive player in the league (76.4) - sixth among the league's wide receivers. He has also done his part off the ball in recording the ninth-highest score in the FBS among receivers as a run blocker (84.5).
- » Despite being one of less than 20 true freshman offensive linemen to start in the country, Dohnovan West is 6th-highest graded guard in the Pac-12 this season (68.6).

ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS

- Eno Benjamin is sixth in the Pac-12 with eight rushing touchdowns this season. His nine 10 touchdowns are seventh in the league. He is 5th in the league with 113.45 all-purpose yards per game.
- Benjamin has recorded 14 career games with at least 100 rushing yards tied for 4th in program history with Art Malone. He also racked up 168 all-purpose yards against Oregon, giving him 17 career games in which he reached century mark in all-purpose yards.
- He has at least one touchdown (rushing or receiving) in 17 games in his career. He has 25 career rushing touchdowns, only three shy of cracking the Top-5 in program history. The junior has 30 total touchdowns (25 rushing, 4 receiving, and 1 blocked return) in his career.
- Benjamin has continued to do his part to make people miss this year, forcing 60 missed tackles this season - a total tied for 11th nationally among running backs. He is 27th nationally with 634 yards after contact this season (69.3 percent of his 915 rushing yards).
- The junior is within 13 rushing yards of 7th in ASU career rushing yard history. Benjamin enters the weekend with 2,699 career rushing yards while Darryl Clack (1982-85) posted 2,711 in his career to sit seventh in the ASU record books.
- » He has rushed for 14 first downs this season when the team is facing third down tied for 26th nationally among FBS running backs.
- When the helped rally the offense when attempting to come back, recording 18 rushing first downs when the team is trailing by 7 or fewer points the fourth-highest total nationally while his six rushing touchdowns while trailing by a touchdown or less are first in the FBS.
- » Benjamin has played 313 snaps in passing routes this season, the second-highest total among FBS running backs as are his 52 targets. He has been targetted on 21.6 percent of ASU aimed passes (balls not thrown away, spiked or batted) - the 6th-highest percentage of running backs nationally.
- » His 333 receiving yards this season are third among all FBS running backs.
- » Benjamin became the 20th Sun Devil in program history to reach 2,000 rushing yards with his effort against Colorado. The junior has 2,699 rushing yards in his career and is one of just five three-year players to find themselves in the 2,000-yard club (Mario Bates, Ben Malone, Art Malone and Woody Green). Benjamin also joined the all-purpose 3,000-yard club this year as he eclipsed the 3K all-purpose yards mark for his career against Utah.

DAAAAMMNNNN DANIELS

- Among FBS players, Jayden Daniels sits in the Top-30 in passing efficiency (17th, 156.4), passing yards (30th, 2,644), passing yards per game (24th, 264.4), and total offense (19th, 290.1)
- Daniels is 9th nationally and second in the Pac-12 in pass yards per completion (14.61) while his 9.09 yards per pass attempt are 12th in the FBS and third in the league.
- » He has a 108.0 NFL quarterback rating, tied for 21st nationally, while his 156.4 NCAA passing efficiency is 17th.
- » Among quarterbacks with at least 200 attempts, Daniels is tied for the second-fewest interceptions nationally behind Ohio State's Justin Fields with just two - one of which coming on a half-ending Hail Mary attempt against Utah.
- » Daniels hasn't thrown an interception in 110 consecutive pass attempts, tied for the eighthlongest active streak in the nation. The last interception, however, came on a half-ending

- Hail Mary attempt against Utah. With that removed, Daniels would have a streak of 178 consecutive passes without an interception over his last six games and change. The third-longest streak in ASU history without an interception was Mike Pagel (136) in 1980 and the school record is Rudy Carpenter's streak of 146 straight in 2005 (Manny Wilkins went 145 straight in 2017). Daniels is easily on pace to set the ASU school record for fewest interceptions with over 300 attempts (currently Wilkins' 6 in 393 in 2018)
- » Pro Football Focus has credited Daniels with just seven turnover-worthy throws this season, the 16th-lowest total nationally.
- » Daniels is 5th in the country with 15 pass completions over 40 yards this season and 8th in the FBS with 24 passes over 30 yards. His eight completions over 50 yards are 9th.
- » 11 of his 17 touchdowns passes this season have gone for at least 25 yards (64.7 percent).
- Daniels has three straight games with at least three touchdown passes, the first Sun Devil to do so since Taylor Kelly in 2013. With a tough Utah contest cast aside, Daniels' numbers in four of his last five games (vs. WSU, UCLA, USC and ORE) are incredible as he has completed 92-of-133 passes (.692) for 1,372 yards and four touchdowns.

ICE IN HIS VEINS

- » Jayden Daniels has shown poise beyond his years in high-pressure situations this season.
- Daniels has been exceptional on third downs this season, with his 719 passing yards on third downs good for 14th in the country (despite missing a game). His 165.14 passer rating on third down is 20th nationally.
- Despite missing a game, Daniels has accounted for 774 passing yards in the fourth quarter of games, good for 7th nationally while his 33 passing first downs are 10th. He has recorded 9 fourth quarter passing touchdowns (fourth nationally) to one interception. His 183.84 QB efficiency rating in the fourth quarter is 15th in the country.
- He has completed 11 passes of 25+ yards in the fourth quarter of games (tied for 1st nationally) and his 19 pass completions over 15 yards in the frame is tied for 7th.
- While under pressure this season, Daniels has posted the 5th-highest NFL passer rating of any quarterback in the FBS at 97.3. For reference, the national average is 67.6.
- » Daniel has a 69.4 accuracy rating under pressure, the 9th-best tally in the country. He has five touchdown passes under pressure, tied for 17th nationally while his 602 yards are 24th.
- » Daniels has done his part to escape pressure as shown by his 52 QB scrambles this season, a total that is second among FBS quarterbacks. His 417 yards on the ground excluding quarterback sacks are 36th among FBS quarterbacks.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE FRESHMEN

- » Jayden Daniels became the first true freshman quarterback in program history to start the first game of the season.
- » At 2,644 passing yards, Daniels has surpassed Rudy Carpenter's previous freshman school record of 2,273 yards. Daniels total is 13th in school history with two games remaining.
- » Daniels broke the Sun Devil record for passing yards in a first career game with 284 season opener, which was previously 160 by Jeff Krohn in 2000. This record was broken seven games later by teammate Joey Yellen, who through for 292 in his debut against USC.
- Daniels became the third freshman in ASU history to win his first career start, joining John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974) as the only other QB's to win their first career starts as freshmen.
- With his 72-yard touchdown pass to Eno Benjamin in the fourth quarter against Sacramento State, Daniels became the first ASU quarterback ever to throw a touchdown pass over 70 yards in consecutive games (had a 77-yard pass to Brandon Aiyuk in Week One).
- » Only 12 times in ASU history has a freshman quarterback recorded a 300+ yard passing performance, of which Daniels now has five. His five 300+ yard performances are tied with Andrew Walter (2004) and Rudy Carpenter (2005) for the most in a single season in ASU history.
- » Joey Yellen's four touchdown passes against USC were the most for a Sun Devil in their first-career start in program history.
- Yellen's 292 passing yards were the fourth-most for any Sun Devil in their first-career start in program history (Rudy Carpenter, 401; Sam Keller, 370; Steven Threet, 339; Dillon Sterling-Cole, 302).



HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS

- » Arizona State has played in 10 total games decided by four points or less in the Herm Edwards era which is tied with San Diego State for the most in the FBS over the last two seasons.
- ASU has seven wins in games decided by four points or less (7-3 record), tied with Nevada for the most wins by four points or fewer in the last two seasons.
- The Sun Devils have now played in 16 games decided by a touchdown or less in the last two years, going 8-8 in that time. The 16 games are tied with Texas for the most in the country during that time.
- » ASU's eight wins in one score games are tied for fourth in the FBS (Texas, San Diego State, and Nevada).
- » ASU has played seven games this season decided by a touchdown or less six of which decided by four points or less.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- » The Devils have turned the ball over just 12 times this season the 21th-lowest total in the FBS. ASU is 18th nationally in turnover margin this season (0.64).
- » ASU's four interceptions thrown on the year are tied for the 8th-lowest total nationally.
- ASU has collected 13 fumble recoveries this season, the third-most in the nation and the most since finishing the 2014 season with 13. ASU had 17 fumble recoveries during the 2011 season. It had one against Oregon State, the first fumble lost by the Beavers all season in Week 12.
- » ASU has outscored opponents 725-379 in points off takeaways since 2012. ASU has padded that stat this season, outscoring the opposition 51-24.
- Since 2012, ASU has scored 65.8 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (121 of 184) while finding the end zone 90 times in that span (48.9 percent).
- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 50.0 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (64 of 128) with 49 touchdowns (38.3 percent).

LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Sun Devils have given up just two plays over 50 yards this season, tied for the 6th-fewest nationally. ASU's seven plays allowed over 40 yards this season are 17th nationally. In 2018, ASU was tied for 11th nationally in allowing just 8 plays over 40 yards, an area the Devils had struggled in in previous seasons (allowing 20, 16, 30, 21 in the previous four seasons and finishing 103rd, 79th, 128th, 110th, respectively). ASU was also tied for 9th nationally in allowing just 3 plays of over 50 yards last year after sitting in the bottom 10 nationally in the previous four years.
- ASU has allowed just 13 plays over 30 yards this season, a total tied for 9th nationally. In 2018, The Devils gave up just 22 plays over 30 yards, tied for 34th-fewest nationally. In the previous four years, ASU had given up 38, 44, 40, 40 such plays, ranked 116th, 124th, 117th and 119th.
- ASU's run defense has been especially efficient, currently 7th in the country with only 32 rushing plays allowed over 10 yards this season. With just 6 rushing plays over 20 yards allowed this season, ASU is 7th in the country.
- ASU's defense has done it's part to limit opponents on short-field drives (drives beginning less than 60 yards for the end zone), holding teams to 3.09 points per drive in such situations (35th in the country).

KEEP 'EM OFF THE BOARD

- ASU is 44th in the country and fifth in the Pac-12 in allowing just 23.9 points per game. The Sun Devils allowed just 25.5 points per game last season, good for 53rd nationally. The totals are notable as ASU was 103rd nationally at 32.8 points per game allowed in 2017 and had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior to the marked improvement the past two seasons.
- ASU has been able to close games strong, allowing just 10.3 second half points per game against FBS opponents, good for 25th in the nation. At just 5.1 points allowed per fourth quarter, ASU sits tied for 21st nationally and third in the Pac-12.
- Finishing halves has been the forte with ASU allowing just 5.9 points per second quarter this season, good for 29th nationally and have held opponents scoreless in the quarter in six of those games this year.
- » ASU has held four opponents under 20 points this year, a feat it hadn't achieved since 2014.
- » ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 15 of 24 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of 43 previous games dating back in a span from 2013-17.

NO FLY ZONE

- » Kobe Williams is the 7th-highest graded defender in the league, regardless of position with a score of 82.6. He is the 24th highest graded corner overall in the country and the 21st-highest graded corner in coverage specifically (83.1)
- Williams has only been thrown at just 30 times this season the 7th-lowest total among corners that have played at least 50 percent of the coverage snaps this season. He has been targeted just once every 9.5 snaps in coverage this season, 5th-lowest among the nation's corners.
- » Williams has allowed just 140 yards in coverage thus far, the 11th-lowest total among the nation's corners. His 0.49 yards allowed per coverage snap is tied for first in the country.
- » He has allowed just 16 receptions this season, which is the fewest in the Pac-12 and 15th-fewest nationally. Wiliams' one reception allowed for every 17.8 snaps played in coverage is tops in the Pac-12 and 20th nationally.
- » Williams' 77.1 NFL passer rating when targeted this season is 6th in the Pac-12.
- » Chase Lucas and Williams have each allowed just one touchdown against them in coverage this season, tied for 26th among the nation's corners and first in the Pac-12.
- » Jack Jones is 15th nationally in averaging 1.3 passes defended per game this season and his 14 total passes defended are 10th nationally.
- Jones' five pass breakups against Washington State are the most by an FBS player this season. He was a part of 12 pass breakups by the Sun Devils the fifth highest total in the FBS this season and the first time ASU posted 10 or more since 2011.
- » ASU's 58 total passes defended this season are tied for 18th in the country.

MIDDLE OF THE LINE-UP

- » Khayan Kearse-Thomas has 4.5 sacks this season, a total that leads Pac-12 linebackers.
- » He has been credited with 33 defensive "Stops" this season, good for 9th among Pac-12 linebackers
- » Kearse-Thomas' 11 tackles for loss this season lead the team and are the most among true Pac-12 linebackers (excluding edge rushers).
- » Over the last three games, Kearse-Thomas is the 38th-highest graded linebacker in the country, according to PFF and the 16th-highest graded linebacker in coverage in that span.
- » Merlin Robertson has been credited with just eight missed tackles this season, a totla tied for second among the Pac-12 linebackers this season

SAFETY VALVE

- » Aashari Crosswell is the 15th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his score of 76.0 and fourth among the league's safeties.
- > Crosswell has not been credited with a missed tackle on a running play this season, marking him one of just 3 safeties in the country to lay such a claim.
- » His one missed tackle on the season, period, is the fewest among over 300 FBS safeties in the country.
- » Crosswell's three forced fumbles are the most among FBS safeties.
- » Evan Fields has 19 total defensive "stops" this season, a total that is second among safeties in the Pac-12.
- » On run defense this season, Fields has recorded 15 total defensive "stops" to lead all Pac-12 safeties and 27th nationally. His 5.5 run-stop percentage also leads the league and is 19th in the FBS among safeties with over 200 run snaps.
- When he plays within eight yards of the line of scrimmage at the snap, Fields has recorded an 6.8 run stop percentage highest among Pac-12 safeties and 20th in the FBS among safeties with at least 150 run plays beginning within 8 yards of the line of scrimmage.

LO-LEEEEEE, LOLE, LOLE, LOLEEEE

- Jermayne Lole checks in as the 21st-highest graded player in the Pac-12 with a score of 73.3 the third-highest score among edge defenders in the league. His 80.5 score on running plays this season is 36th among edge defenders nationally.
- The sophomore has the 14th highest positive run impact score in the country at 23.3 percent among players graded as interior linemen (percentage of run defense snaps where player earned a positive grade from Pro Football Focus).
- » Lole's 31 defensive stops this season are 4th among defensive interior linemen nationally and second in the Pac-12.
- » Lole has been credited with just a single missed tackle this season, tied for third among FBS defensive linemen.



BRANDON AI-YAC

- WR Brandon Aiyuk is third in the FBS in yards after the catch with 667 while his 11.1 yards after the catch per reception are the 15th-most nationally.
- » Aiyuk is 6th nationally and 2nd in the Pac-12 with 1,125 receiving yards on the year while his 102.3 receiving yards per game are also 9th in the FBS and lead in the league.
- Six of his eight touchdown receptions in 2019 have been for more than 30 yards (77 yards vs. Kent State, 53 yards vs. Colorado, 40 yards vs. WSU, 86 yards vs. WSU, 33 yards vs. WSU, 81 vs. ORE).
- Where is one of just three receivers with two 80+ yard receiving touchdowns this year (Arkansas State's Omar Baylesss and Louisville's Chatarius Atwell). His six catches over 50 yards are first in the nation while his nine 40+ yard and three 70+ grabs are both second. His 12 catches over 30 yards are good for third.
- » At 18.75 yards per reception, Aiyuk is second in the Pac-12 and 25th nationally in the category. His average LONG reception per game this season has been an incredible 46.0 vards.
- » Aiyuk has three games this season with 150+ receiving yards, tied for fourth in ASU CAREER history.
- » Aiyuk's 86-yard touchdown reception against Washington State was the longest passing play/ score by a Sun Devil since Demario Richard's 93-yard catch and run against New Mexico in 2015. It was the eighth-longest catch in ASU history.
- » His 196 total receiving yards in the Washington State contest with the 11th-most in Sun Devil history. His 28.0 yard per catch average in the game was easily the highest single-game per-catch average of a Sun Devil recording seven catches in a game, passing N'Keal Harry's previous record of 24.3 in 2017. It was the highest yards-per-catch average in a single game for any receiver in ASU history with 7 or more catches in a game.

ALL-PURPOSE AIYUK

- » Brandon Aiyuk is currently 3rd nationally and first in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yards at 163.36 per game - the most for any wide receiver in the country.
- Where the is over 2,000 all-purpose yards (2,652) in his career at ASU despite being in Tempe for less than two full seasons. Should he reach the 3,000 all-purpose yard milestone, he would join Marion Grice as the only two-year players in ASU history to accomplish the feat.
- Aiyuk has racked up 1,797 all-purpose yards this season on just 88 total plays (20.4 yards per touch, which is third nationally). At 163.36 yards per game, Aiyuk is the only wide receiver in the Top-20 nationally in the category. The only two players in front of Aiyuk are a pair of running backs with over 200 more touches on the season than the senior.
- » Among the Top-14 players nationally in total yards, no other player is within 8 yards per touch of Aiyuk's 20.4 tally (Maryland's Javon Leake at 12.0, all others below 10.0).
- » Aiyuk is the only player in the country to record at least 200 yards on both punt (226) and kick (446) returns. His 226 punt return yards are 8th in the country while his 446 kick return yards are 35th.
- » Aiyuk collected 293 (173 receiving, 76 punt return, 44 kick return) all-purpose yards against Oregon State, the fifth-most in single-game program history and eighth-most by player in the FBS this season.
- Aiyuk has eight performances with 100+ all-purpose yards this season and 12th of his career. He eclipsed 200 all-purpose yards for the fifth time in his career and for the third consecutive game against Oregon. He has 727 all-purpose yards in this three-game stretch (220, 293, 214).
- » At 1,797 all-purpose yards this season, Aiyuk is fourth in ASU history and within 268 yards of Wilford White's long-standing school record of 2,065 set back in 1950.

BIG PLAY FRANK

- Frank Darby has now hauled in a touchdown pass in each of his last four games and has accounted for two touchdowns in three of those outings. He has seven touchdowns over the last four games. Prior to the UCLA game, he had five total receiving touchdowns in his previous 30 career games to the current four-game stretch.
- » Over his past four games, he has made 16 catches for 387 yards (24.2 yards per catch) and seven truchdowns
- » His 125-yard performance against Oregon was the fifth 100+ yard game of his career.
- » 24 of Darby's 58 career catches (41%) have gone for 20 or more yards.
- » Darby's 21.32 yards per reception this season is fourth in the country and leads all Pac-12 receivers.
- » Frank Darby has continued to clumb the Pac-12's offensive grading chart, checking in as the 23rd-highest graded offensive player in the league (76.4) - sixth among the league's wide

receivers. He has also done his part off the ball in recording the ninth-highest score in the FBS among receivers as a run blocker (84.5).

NOBODY'S BUSINESS BUT THE TURKS

- » A semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, Michael Turk's 46.3 yards per punt average on 54 punts is 13th in the FBS and leads the Pac-12.
- Whe has pinned 29 of those 54 punts inside the opponent 20-yard line (53.7 percent), a total that is fourth in the nation. Turk has 18 punts out of 54 (33.3 percent) that have gone for 50+ yards this season.
- Turk holds the top mark in the FBS this season for max hang time on a punt with a mark of 5.51 seconds in generally unfavorable conditions in Week 8 against Utah. Pro Football Focus has given Turk the 16th-highest grade among FBS punters this season.
- The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Turk on Aug. 29 vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average vs. Alabama on punts of 56, 65, 62, 61 and 60 for 304 yards. Turks punted five times for 315 yards with boots of 64, 62, 65, 49 and 75 in his Sun Devil debut.
- Turk crushed Sun Devils school records for punting average, breaking the previous school record for average on five punts of 55.0 by Danny White in 1972. Turk's 63.0 yards per punt would have set records for every minumum number of punts in a game with the closest being Tony Lorick's 59.3 yards per punt on three punts in 1962.
- » Turk's 75-yarder to in the opener was tied for the seventh-longest punt in school history and the fifth-longest punt in the FBS this season.

KEEPING MOMENTUM

- » The Sun Devils have won as least seven games in five of the last seven seasons.
- Sun Devil Football has had one of the top home field advantages in the FBS in recent history, recording a 39-14 record at Sun Devil Stadium since 2012. The 39 wins are tied for 22nd nationally in that time while the 14 losses are the 28th-fewest in the FBS since 2012.
- » The Sun Devils had a streak of scoring double-digit points in 125 consecutive games ended against Utah, matching the longest streak in the modern era of FBS football with Lousiana Tech (125 straight games from 2008-2018).
- » ASU also had the FBS' longest active streak of consecutive games scoring more than 7 points ended at 140 straight games in that Utah contest. The Sun Devils had last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 77 of those games (55.0 percent).

THE KIDS WILL BE ALRIGHT

- » All told, 32 true or redshirt freshmen have played for the Sun Devils this year (21 true, 11 redshirt). That is tied for the third-highest total among FBS programs this season behind Clemson and Oklahoma.
- Eight true freshmen have started a game for ASU, tied for the second-highest total in the nation behind Alabama (9). ASU's 5 offensive true freshmen to start a game this season are the most of any team in the country.
- » Overall, ASU has 40 true freshmen on the roster (sixth in the FBS) and 13 redshirt freshmen. The 54 total freshmen equates to 52.5 percent of ASU's roster of 101 - the fourth-highest percentage of a roster in the FBS behind only Oklahoma State (57.1), UCLA (52.8) and Virginia Tech (52.5)
- » The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) the most ever in the modern era at ASU. That was the third-highest total in the country behind only Clemson (38 - 27/11) and Baylor (35 - 20/15).
- » Jayden Daniels became the first TRUE freshman quarterback to start for the Sun Devils on Opening Day in ASU's modern era (freshmen became eligible to play in 1972).
- » Daniels is just the sixth true freshman to start any game at quarterback in ASU history, joining Dillon Sterling-Cole (2016), Brock Osweiler (2009), Jake Plummer (1993), John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974).
- » For the first time in program history, a freshman was named a team captain after Herm Edwards dubbed true freshman quarterback/athlete Ethan Long as special teams captain before the season. Additionally, Darien Butler will be the first true sophomore captain in program history after the linebacker was named captain for the team's defense. Prior to this season, no player that had been with the program for less than three years had ever been named a team captain in ASU history.
- Arizona State is the only team in the country starting two true freshmen on its offensive line.
