SUN DEVIL REWIND

Still, without the NCAA leading scorer Johnny Walker, the Sun Devils have encountered some hard lessons over the past three games. In all three, the Sun Devils either lost in the final seconds of regulation or in sudden-death overtime. In two of those three games, they saw leads of two-to-three goal leads dissipate.

In the most recent Penn State series, the Sun Devils came back from a two-goal deficit to force overtime before losing, followed by a three-goal lead squandered to force overtime before again losing a heartbreaker.

Senior forward Willie Knierim had a great weekend in Happy Valley, netting a goal in each game and adding an assist in game two for a three-point weekend. Wisconsin transfer Sean Dhooghe also got the monkey off his back with his first goal as a Sun Devil this past weekend, scoring the game-tying goal to force overtime in the 3rd period.

In the crease, junior Evan DeBrouwer started both games against the Nittany Lions, compiling 40 or more saves in both starts with a 3.83 goals against average and .916 save percentage. He also recorded his second assist of the season.

DO THE SPLITS

After being swept on the road by the only remaining undefeated team in the country -- Minnesota -- Ohio State has since split each series they've played over the last three weeks. Their three wins all came when allowing just two goals, while their three losses came by allowing three.

Despite having a fairly young team, the Buckeyes were ranked No. 9 in the USCHO preseason poll and remain at No. 18.

Ohio State graduated their two top scorers from a year ago, while junior forward Quinn Preston -- who recorded 15 goals and 26 points in 2019-20 -- returns as a pivotal offensive leader and threat for the Buckeyes. He has four goals this season after netting two in their Sunday upset of Notre Dame. Fellow junior forward Gustaf Westlund is another double-digit goal scorer from a year ago who has three goals thus far. Freshman forward Travis Treloar is pacing the team in points with eight in the last six games.

Between the pipes, senior netminder Tommy Nappier returns as one of the veteran goaltenders in the Big Ten conference with 66 games played, a 36-19-7 career record, 2.00 goals against average and .933 save percentage.

Despite the 3-3 record, the Sun Devil offense continues to put up goals, averaging 4.5 goals per game over the last



Since Nov. 27, the Sun Devil offense leads the country in goals scored per game (4.50) for teams who have played at least three or more game during that stretch.



ASU has six players with over 100 games played, including James Sanchez, Jacob Wilson, Dom Garcia, Sean Dhooghe, Johnny Walker and Gvido Jansons.



Despite a pointless weekend, freshman forward Matthew Kopperud still sits second in the country in points with 11 and is tied for first in goals scored with six.

BREAKIN' MY HEART

- The last three games have been hard to swollow for the Sun Devils, who were one bounce away in each game from being on a six-game winning streak.
- In game two against Notre Dame, the Sun Devils had a two-goal lead heading into the 3rd period. The Fighting Irish fought to three goals in the final 9 minutes of regulation, including the game-winner with five seconds remaining.
- In game one against Penn State, Penn State came out fast with a 2-0 lead through the first 20 minutes. ASU
 proceeded to tie the game in the final 40 minutes, including the game-tying goal early in the 3rd period. The
 Nittany Lions would score the game-winner four minutes into overtime, despite several grade 'A' scoring
 chances by the Sun Devils that were stymied by the PSU netminder.
- In game two against the Nittany Lions, it was nearly the opposite of game one as the Sun Devils came out hot
 with three goals in a span of 1:09 of the first four minutes of the game. Penn State answered a minute later
 before exchanging goals again before the end of the 1st period, entering intermission with a 4-1 lead. PSU then
 scored two goals to tie the game in the 2nd period, ultimately forcing overtime and scoring the game-winner
 1:28 into the extra period.

POPULAR DESTINATION

- The Sun Devils have fallen fortunate to transfers since the program transitioned to Division I, including players like Dylan Hollman, Robbie Baillargeon, Wade Murphy and David Norris.
- In 2019-20, forwards JAMES SANCHEZ (Michigan) and WILLIE KNIERIM (Miami) made immediate impacts in their junior seasons. SANCHEZ led the entire team and became the first player in program history to reach 40 points in a season, while KNIERIM contributed 15 goals and was 5th in scoring for the Devils.
- While CHRIS GRANDO (Boston College) came in a season ago and had to sit out during the 2019-20 season due to transfer rules, he joins SEAN DHOOGHE (Wisconsin) and TANNER HICKEY (Alabama-Huntsville)
 all of which were key contributors to their respective programs before transferring -- as the 2020-21 transfers hoping to contribute to the Maroon & Gold transfer reputation.

DEVILS IN THE PROS

- Former netminder Joey Daccord, who helped catapult the program to its first NCAA Tournament berth, recently signed a three-year, two-way extension with the Ottawa Senators. Daccord was not only the first Sun Devil to sign an NHL contract, but play in the NHL as he made his debut on April 4, 2019. He was also the first Sun Devil committed to the program when getting drafted.
- This past season, senior defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk became the program's second player to sign an NHL
 contract and first to sign a free agent deal. Pasichnuk signed with the San Jose Sharks for two years back in
 June.
- Most recently in August, rising junior Josh Maniscalco signed a three-year free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Penguins and is immediately considered a top-10 prospect within the organization. Maniscalco recorded 11 goals and 21 assists last year and was ranked 6th among national defensemen in scoring.

WE GOT THE POWER(S)

Coach Powers enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2020-21, and his 13th overall at the helm at ASU. The two-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19 and were on track for a repeat appearance in 2019-20 before COVID-19 ended the season. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 238-124-28 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.



BREAKING GROUND

- On Wednesday, Dec. 16, Arizona State University and Sun Devil Athletics announced all required approvals have been received
 for the commencement of construction on a new Multi-Purpose Arena, which will host university and community events and serve
 as the future home for Sun Devil men's ice hockey, wrestling and women's gymnastics. This project continues the development of
 the Novus Innovation Corridor, and will be sited south of Rio Salado Parkway on the east side of Packard Drive, immediately north
 of the existing Packard Drive Parking Structure.
- Construction is scheduled to begin in January 2021, with full completion projected for December 2022.
- The 5,000-seat venue will be managed and operated by Oak View Group, SCI Architects have designed the arena, while Mortenson Construction will serve as the design builder.
- The second full-size ice sheet will also be accessible to students, the community and youth ice hockey programs at every level, providing an additional public sheet to one of the fastest-growing states for youth hockey participation in the country.
- The seating configuration for the Multi-Purpose Arena includes 20 luxury suites, two group suites, a large club lounge and event-level premium club seats. The club lounge will consist of a Center Ice Club on the main concourse that runs along center ice and can host up to 500 fans. On the 300-level, a social deck will run the length of the east side of the venue, providing an open-air, aerial view of the arena where fans can interact while still experiencing exceptional sightlines to the competition. The arena would also be able to serve as a backup for sports played on hardwood, such as volleyball.
- A 942-seat student section will occupy the entire west side of the venue to provide an enhanced gameday experience for ASU students.
- Over 8,000 square feet is set aside for a ASU state-of-the-art ASU locker room, weight room, lounge and coaches' offices on the
 north side of the arena. Eight additional locker rooms are accounted for on the west side of the arena between the main arena and
 community ice sheet that can be utilized for visiting teams, youth programs, ASU club programs, and live events.
