## SUN DEVIL REWIND

It was a historical day for Sun Devil Hockey, as ASU defeated then-No. 18 Air Force, 5-2, on Sunday, Oct. 16 for the program's first victory over a top-25 ranked opponent.

The win also was the team's first over an NCAA Division I opponent at home since starting play last season. On the topic of firsts, four of the five Sun Devil goals were first-time goals while wearing the Maroon & Gold.

Redshirt sophomore captain DYLAN HOLLMAN got the Devils started with the team's first lead through four games of the season, tallying his first as a Sun Devil and first-ever collegiate goal. Freshman BRETT GRUBER extended the lead to two late in the 1st period after scoring his first goal of his college career. Teammates ROBBIE BAILLARGEON and WADE MURPHY, both transfers, tacked on their first goals as Devils. MURPHY's was also his first career college goal.

Freshman TYLER BUSCH continues to pace the team in scoring, netting a goal in each of his first four collegiate games.

Between the pipes, freshman JOEY DACCARD earned his first career win with a two-goal, 24-save performance.

## TODAY'S MATCH-UP

For the fifth-straight game, the Sun Devils will square off with a top-25 ranked opponent, as the Devils make their first trip to the east coast for a two-game series with No. 16/17 Northeastern in Boston, Mass.

The home of the Huskies, Matthews Arena, is the oldest indoor ice hockey arena in the world. As the former home of the NHL's Boston Bruins, it is the only NHL Original Six home arena that still exists.

Northeastern starts the 2016-17 season as the defending Hockey East Conference Tournament Champions, upsetting 3-seed Notre Dame, 1-seed Boston College and 4-seed UMass-Lowell en route to the NCAA Tournament. Unfortunately for them, they drew the eventual NCAA Champions, North Dakota, in the first round.

The Huskies return four of their five top scorers from 2015-16, including All-Hockey East forwards Zach Aston-Reese (14-29-43) and Nolan Stevens (20-22-42).

Goaltender Ryan Ruck also returns between the pipes after posting a 20-11-4 record with a .909 save percentage and 2.36 goals against average.

The most recent USCHO RPI has the Sun Devils ranked No. 31 after their victory over then-No. 18 Air Force. The ranking determines which teams get into the NCAA Tournament, which features the top 16 teams.

## PRIDE OF MASSACHUSETTS

- Freshman goaltender JOEY DACCORD is from North Andover, Mass., which is approximately 28 miles north of Boston.
- The rookie played for the Boston Jr. Bruins of the USPHL Premier League for a season, while also playing three seasons at Cushing Academy in Ashburnham, Mass. and two years at North Andover High School.

## NOTHING BUSCH LEAGUE ABOUT IT

- Freshman TYLER BUSCH (@BuschLeagueTen) is on a heater through the first four games of the season, netting a goal in each to start his rookie campaign.
- Nationally, he's tied for 4th in total goals scored and tied for 8th in goals per game.
- Out of all freshmen, he sits alone in 2nd in goals scored, tied for 8th in total points and tied for 3rd in goals scored per game.

## MASS COLONIZATION

- Massachusetts will be a familiar place for the Devils in 2016-17, as the team will make three trips back east in the next two months.
- Following the two-game series with Northeastern, ASU returns the second week of November for a game at the University of New Hampshire -- just over an hour from Boston -- and to Boston College the following day. The team will return exactly a month later for a one-night tilt against American International (Springfield) followed by a two-game series with the University of Massachusetts (Amherst).

## BACK IN BOSTON

- While DACCORD has a homecoming of his own, graduate transfer ROBBIE BAILLARGEON is back where he spent his first three NCAA seasons with Boston University.
- BAILLARGEON, who is from Enfield, Conn., tallied three goals and one assist in six games against Northeastern during his three seasons as a Terrier.

## DRAFTED DEVILS

- Three of the new Sun Devils were NHL draft picks within the past four years.
- While freshman JOEY DACCORD was drafted prior to wearing the Maroon & Gold, he is officially the first drafted player in Sun Devil Division I history as he was committed to ASU. DACCORD went 199th overall in the 7th round of the 2015 NHL Draft to the Ottawa Senators.
- Graduate transfer ROBBIE BAILLARGEON was also drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the 2012 NHL Draft in the 5th round and 136th overall.
- Redshirt junior WADE MURPHY was selected 185th overall by the Nashville Predators in the 2013 NHL Draft.
- 2017-18 signee PATRICK KUDLA was the most recent Sun Devil to be drafted, as he was selected 158th overall in the 6th round by the hometown Arizona Coyotes.
- Redshirt sophomore LOUIE ROWE and freshman BRINSON PASICHNUK were invited to NHL Development Camps, including the Winnipeg Jets and Minnesota Wild, respectively. ROWE tallied two goals and one assist in two games played.

## INTO THE HOT GATES

- The first nine games of the Sun Devils' 2016-17 season features match-ups with top-20 ranked opponents.
- Along with that streak, eight of the next nine games -- three at home -- will also be against top-25 ranked opponents, including No. 17 Northeastern, No. 13 Harvard, No. 11 Michigan, No. 10 Boston College and No. 25 Penn State.
- After Christmas break and the Desert Hockey Classic, the Devils encounter No. 6 Denver, No. 19 Ohio State, No. 4 Quinnipiac and No. 24 Western Michigan all on the road.

## REUNITED & IT FEELS SO GOOD

- Thirteen Sun Devils have played with at least one teammate prior to reuniting in Tempe.
- Freshmen TYLER BUSCH and RILEY SIMPSON, who came to ASU from Spruce Grove (AJHL), also played with redshirt sophomore DYLAN HOLLMAN in 2013-14.
- Sophomores JACK ROWE and LIAM MCGING shared ice time together with the Muskegon Lumberjacks (USHL) in 2014-15. The two also were paired up on another USHL squad...
- The biggest group of them all featured freshman GEORGY GORODETSKY and sophomores RYLAND PASHOVITZ, JACK ROWE, JOE LAPPIN and LIAM MCGING with the Des Moines Buccaneers (USHL) in 2014-15 as well.
- The longest tenured pair became teammates again years later, as senior DREW NEWMAYER and graduate senior ROBBIE BAILLARGEON played together from 2011-13 with the Indiana Ice (USHL).
- The obvious duo on the roster is brothers BRINSON and STEENN PASICHNUK, who played with the Bonnyville Pontiacs (AJHL) from 2013-16.

## LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

- The Sun Devils will have five games televised nationally, including three on the Pac-12 Network over the next month -- Oct. 16 vs. Air Force, Oct. 28 vs. #12 Harvard and Nov. 4 vs. #11 Michigan. The Oct. 29 game vs. Harvard will also be aired live on Twitter at Oceanside Ice Arena.
- ASU will also be featured on ESPNU and the WatchESPN app against Ohio State on Saturday, Jan. 14 at 12 p.m. (AZT).
- For all Sun Devil fans in Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, Nevada, South Dakota, Wyoming and Utah, they'll have the chance to watch our match-up with #3 Denver on Jan. 6 on Altitude Sports 2.

## WE'VE GOT THE POWERS

Coach Powers enters his ninth overall season on the Sun Devil Coaching Staff and his second as Head Coach of ASU's NCAA Division I Hockey program. In his first year as head coach, he led the team to a 10-23-5 in 2015. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 174-50-14 career record at ASU, and his team ended the 2014-2015 season ranked #3 in the ACHA with a 35-4-1 record qualifying for the team's third-straight ACHA Division I Final Four. Since taking the reigns as head coach, Greg has also coached eight ACHA Div. I All-Americans and 15 ACHA Academic All-Americans.

Coach Powers has helped lead Sun Devil Hockey to five consecutive ACHA National Tournament appearances, starting with his first year as head coach in 2010. In 2012-13, he led ASU to a new program best record and first ever 30-plus win season with a record of 35-8-1, its first ever Final Four Appearance, first ever National Ranking of #1, and a benchmark win over NCAA DI Penn State. During the 2013-2014 season, ASU Hockey won the ACHA DI National Championship, with Powers named ACHA DI National Coach of the Year. The Sun Devils were also named WCHL Conference Champions both for 2013-2014 and 2014-2015, and Powers was named WCHL Coach of the Year for 2013-2014. Powers was also named an ACHA Division I National Coach of the Year finalist in 2012-13 and 2014-15.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.

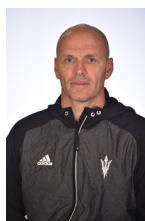
