NCAA Regionals

The Gym Devils earned a 16 seed and are part of the second session in the second round that also features No. 1 seed Oklahoma, Arkansas and the winner of the first-round dual meet between West Virginia and Arizona. The first session includes No. 8 Minnesota, No. 9 California, Boise State and Utah State. The top two teams from each session in the second round will compete on April 2.

This will be the fourth-straight trip to NCAA Regionals for Arizona State after trips to Salt Lake in 2021, Baton Rouge in 2019 and Penn State in 2018. The team also was a lock to qualify in 2020 before the postseason was canceled due to COVID-19.

In the regular season, Arizona State has seen four competing in this regional. ASU beat Arizona on the road in Tucson and beat Cal and Boise State at home. Arizona State came up short to Oklahoma in the home finale.

Canadian All-American

For the second season in a row, junior Hannah Scharf was named a WCGA Regular Season All-American, making the second team in the all-around. She has done the all-around in every meet and has 13 scores of 9.900+ and 11 event titles. She has two weekly awards this season: Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week (3/1) and Pac-12 Coaches Choice of the Week (2/22).

Last season, she went to the NCAA Championships as an individual and earned Second Team All-America honors, adding to her WCGA regular season nod in the all-around. She led the team with 14 total event titles, with seven coming from the all-around. On Road to Nationals, she finished the season ranked No. 16 in the all-around. She was named to the All-Pac-12 All-Around First Team along with being an honorable mention for floor and vault.

All-Pac-12

Two Gym Devils earned All-Pac-12 honors. Hannah Scharf made the first team in the all-around while freshman Alex Theodorou made the first team on vault. Theodorou has been a great addition to the vault lineup, going in the anchor spot in all but one meet. She has won three event titles there and has five scores of 9.9 or better.

Pac-12 Regular Season Champs

For the first time ever, Sun Devil Gymnastics has won a share of the Pac-12 Regular Season Championship after earning five conference wins, the most in a season since 2001. The Gym Devils are regular season co-champions alongside Cal, Oregon State and Utah.

The Gym Devils have had a stellar conference season. It began with a home opening-win over Washington before another road win at Arizona. That close win over the Wildcats gave the Sun Devils their sixth-straight dual meet win over their rivals. In back-to-back home meets, ASU earned its first win over UCLA since 2001, as well as upsetting Cal to give the Bears their first loss of the season. The fifth and final win of the conference season came on Sunday at Stanford.

Record-Breaking Meets

On Feb. 20, ASU beat UCLA for the first time since 2001 with the seventh-highest score in program history (197.800). The 49.525 floor score was the highest since 2004.

In the season opener at No. 1 Michigan, the Gym Devils took second with a score of 196.275, the highest season-opening team score in program history.

Weekly Awards

Junior Hannah Scharf has two conference weekly awards this season. She was the Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week on 3/1 after earning career highs in the all-around (39.575) and on beam (9.950) to take down previously undefeated Cal. She was the Pac-12 Coaches Choice of the Week on 2/22 for her efforts in the win over the Bruins on her birthday.

Sophomore Emily White was the Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week on 2/22 after winning the all-around with a 39.600 to help ASU upset UCLA at home. She got a career high on vault (9.925) and in the all-around, as well as season highs on bars and beam (9.900s). Her all-around total is tied for 21st in program history.

National Qualifying Score

NQS is based on a team's six best regular season scores, three of which must be away. The overall high score is eliminated, and the five remaining scores are averaged. NQS scores are used to determine seeding for NCAA regional competition in April.

Senior Class

There are just two seniors on the 2022 roster: Jasmine Gutierrez and Megan Thompson. Gutierrez has brought in some big scores on beam and floor, including a career-high 9.900, which she has hit three times. She has not scored below a 9.800 on beam this year. Thompson has led off on beam in every meet of her career, scoring a 9.800 or better 19 times with a career-best 9.900 scored this season.

Strength of Schedule

Arizona State faced the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in back-to-back meets for the first time in program history. The Sun Devils also hosted No. 1 Oklahoma in the regular season finale. This is the first time in program hisitory that ASU has faced the No. 1 and 2 teams three times in a season. On the schedule, there are seven teams who finished the 2021 season in the top 25, with four of those teams finishing in the top 10.

Cancellations

Arizona State's first two meets of the season were canceled due to COVID-19 protocols. The meet at Michigan was the season opener for the Gym Devils.

Co-Head Coaches

After five seasons of working to build Sun Devil Gymnastics to a top-10 program alongside Jay Santos, Jessica Santos was promoted to co-head coach back in June, elevating her position from associate head coach.

Since coming to Tempe in May 2016, Jess Santos has helped bring Arizona State to new heights. She and Jay have built the team from a No. 41 final ranking in 2017 to the No. 9 finish in 2021. They have coached two All-Americans in Cairo Leonard-Baker (3x) and Hannah Scharf (2x), helping both to qualify for the NCAA Championships as individuals (Leonard-Baker in 2018, 2019 and 2021, Scharf in 2021).

G-PAC

Junior Izzy Redmond is Arizona State's representative in Gymnasts for Peace, Action and Change (G-PAC), a student-athlete driven organization. G-PAC facilitates an environment where diversity and inclusion is both welcomed and encouraged. It strives to ignite lasting change by sharing experiences, providing others with education and outside resources, and creating an authentic safe space for fellow student-athletes. It inspires others to thrive at the edge of their comfort zone furthering the journey to true equality.

Vice President for University Athletics and Athletics Director Ray Anderson named Jay Santos the head women's gymnastics coach on May 27, 2016. In June 2021, his wife Jess was promoted to co-head coach, he and Jess becoming co-head coaches for the Gym Devils.

Jay Santos' impact has been immediate for the Gym Devils. He has led the team to postseason each season since 2018 and has coached two All-Americans (Hannah Scharf and Cairo Leonard-Baker). Both of those All-Americans also qualified for nationals an individuals, Scharf in 2021 and Leonard-Baker in 2018, 2019 and 2021. He was the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2018 and the WCGA Regional Coach of the Year in 2021.

Jay's' fifth season was historic as he led Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time. The success came off of an abbreviated 2020 season where Santos helped a young team, with seven making their collegiate debuts, reach new heights. The team went out on a high note before the caancelations began, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

Santos led the Gym Devils to a another successful season in 2019, the first since 2014 to have a winning record (11-10) in the regular season. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. They scored a 196.000 or better six times.

Santos has led ASU to arguably one of the most substantial turnarounds in recent collegiate gymnastics history after his first season as head coach in 2017. Santos' 2018 squad improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, capping the season ranked at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). Ranking in the top-20 of the national standings for 12 consecutive weeks, Arizona State made its first team NCAA regional appearance since 2014. Santos was named the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

Santos coached Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation – the highest national ranking in the history of the program. He earned NCAA Central Regional Head Coach of the Year honors.

Santos has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Ohio State. Santos also spent eight years coaching at Somersault Gymnastics Center in Stoughton, Mass., serving as the women's team director and head coach for his last four years. Santos served as a nationally-rated men's gymnastics judge from 1997-2001, working numerous college dual meets as well as Junior Olympic state and regional championships.

Santos earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration in Operations Management from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1995, and was a member of the Minutemen's gymnastics team from 1990-95. At Amherst, he was a three-time co-captain and founding member of the department's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

Jessica Santos started at ASU as the associate head coach for Sun Devil Gymnastics, being named so on May 27, 2016, joining her husband Jay Santos, who was named head coach of the Sun Devil Gymnastics program on the same day. In June 2021, Jess was promoted to co-head coach, she and Jay becoming co-head coaches for the Gym Devils.

Since joining the team, Jess has helped bring Arizona State to new heights. Her fifth season was historic as she helped Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. She was named the WCGA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time. The best team score was 197.600, which Arizona State scored in the NCAA Regional Finals for the ninth best score in program history and the best postseason score the Sun Devils have ever earned. She helped Hannah Scharf and Cairo Leonard-Baker advance to the NCAA Championships. Scharf earned Second Team All-America honors on bars at nationals, in addition to her WCGA Second Team Regular Season All-America nod in the all-around.

In her fourth season with the program, Santos helped a young team finish with a winning record (7-6-1) for the second-straight season, including a win over No. 10 Cal. Due to COVID-19 concerns, the season was cut short the week before the Pac-12 Championship, meaning NCAA regionals did not happen as well. However, the team went out on a high note, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

In 2019, the team earned the first winning record (11-10) in the regular season since 2014. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. In 2018, the team improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, finishing the season at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). All-American Cairo Leonard-Baker has qualified for nationals in each of her two seasons. In 2017, they had the best season since 2014, capping it off by scoring the best Pac-12 team total since 2004.

Santos helped coach Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation – the highest national ranking in the history of the program. She has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Pittsburgh.

Jessica earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees in Athletic Coaching Education at West Virginia University in 2005 and 2007, respectively. She competed for the Mountaineers from 2001-05 and was the last gymnast at WVU to score a perfect 10.0 in competition. Jessica then served as the Mountaineers' volunteer assistant coach during the 2006 season. A member of the National Association of Women's Gymnastics Judges, Jessica has been a Certified Level 10 judge since 2007.

Jess and Jay Santos have two sons, Mason and Cooper.



Kristin White was named the new assistant coach for the Gym Devils on May 26, 2020.

White's first season was historic as she helped Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. She was named the WCGA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time.

After two seasons as an assistant coach at lowa State, White is moving to the desert. Her primary responsibilities with the Cyclones were balance beam and floor, including choreographing floor routines. During her three years at lowa State, she helped the team finish ranked in the top 25 each season.

After graduating from Oklahoma in May 2010 with her Bachelor's Degree in Human Relations, White stayed in Norman, and joined the OU coaching staff as a graduate assistant. She graduated with her Master's Degree in Adult and Higher Education in 2012.

As a student-athlete at Oklahoma, White helped lead Oklahoma to a trio of Big 12 team championships from 2008-10, and a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2010. That season, White closed out her OU gymnastics career with a pair of All-America honors on balance beam and in floor exercise.

White is from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Her husband is Trent White and they have a son named Brayden.

Former Florida All-American gymnast Rachel Slocum joined the coaching staff in July 2020 as the new volunteer assistant coach.

Slocum's first season was historic as she helped Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time.






