SUN DEVIL REWIND

After encountering the Michigan State series without active NCAA career goal leader Johnny Walker, the Sun Devils will again have to find a way to navigate the weekend without the senior forward. Walker took a knee-to-knee in the final game at Michigan and has yet to take the ice since as his status remains week-to-week.

Despite the lack of goals scored through two weeks, the Sun Devil roster boasts what Coach Powers calls the "deepest roster we've had as a program" and double-digit goal scorers in previous seasons. One of those is former Badger and senior forward Sean Dhooghe, who returns to Madison this weekend for the first time since departing this past offseason. Dhooghe has been playing on the top line with James Sanchez -- the first Sun Devil 40-point earner in 2019-20 -- and freshman Matthew Kopperud, who is filling in the role of Walker.

Goaltending has proved to be a bright spot for the Sun Devils so far in 2020-21, with freshman Cole Brady and junior Evan DeBrouwer splitting games thus far. Brady has posted a .929 save percentage and 2.48 goals against average in two starts and three appearances for a 0-1-1 record. DeBrouwer posted 38 saves Thursday at Michigan State in the 2-0 loss, which matches game one against Wisconsin last year for the last time he posted that many saves.

HELLO, WISCONSIN

The Badgers have two sweeps sandwiched around being swept at the hands of Michigan as well. They return four of the top six scorers from a season ago, including 2019 15th overall draft pick Cole Caufield -- who is coming off a hat trick -- and Sabres' 7th round pick and current point leader Linus Weissbach. However, Wisconsin will be without 2020 14th overall pick Dylan Halloway, who is off to World Junior camp with Team Canada.

Despite the two losses, the Badgers have scored first in five of their six games and have scored a goal in the first period in all but one game.

A big, new addition for the Badgers in 2020-21 is graduate transfer goal-tender Robbie Beydoun from Michigan Tech. The Plymouth, Mich. native comes in after only playing five games for the Huskies in 2019-20, and is already putting up similar numbers with a 2.47 goals against average and .931 save percentage. The Badgers have not had a goaltender finish with above a .900 save percentage since 2015.

SUN DEVIL TWEETABLES

- @SunDevilHockey and @BadgerMHockey have met four times with Wisconsin sweeping the all-time series, 4-0.
- Wisconsin head coach Tony Granato's son, Mike, played for ASU head coach Greg Powers during the program's club days.
- At this time last year, @SunDevilHockey was 1-3-0 before going on to win a program record 22 games.

OUOTES OF THE WEEK

- "We were able to see each other at the rink the other day. Tony (Granato) was instrumental in getting this partnership with the Big Ten because him and I have such a good relationship. So having him in our corner to push was huge. We're here for eight days and to be able to get a drink with him that's a guy you can learn a lot from. He's just an unbelievable human being. What's really weird about it, is they're playing Penn State and they're at our hotel. Another coach I'm close with and know very well is Guy Gadowsky. We can't even have a beer together in the same hotel. We have to be so careful, and that's the biggest thing I'm noticing about us coaches is we're so terrified not necessarily of the virus itself but of the domino effect it can cause if we catch it. Sometimes you just can't avoid it. There's so many people out there that can't." -Head coach Greg Powers on interaction with coaches on road
- "We're going to look to everybody because no one has done it so far. We had a lot of really good chances against Michigan State, and they got really good goaltending ... Someone has to put one in the back of the net. We missed wide open nets in that game Saturday that guys have to execute. We're not going to change how we play just because we lost one player. We're going to see different line combinations to see if we can spark some energy on Saturday. We like what we've seen the last two days and the guys seem excited about the changes we've made, and we'll see if it works." -Head coach Greg Powers on missing Johnny Walker
- "He's so smooth and confident. He genuinely doesn't expect anyone to score on him, he's just incredibly
 confident that way. That's what you want out of a goalie. You want a goalie with moxie and that err of

- "He was really good against Michigan State. The amount of chances he created and the energy he brought, he is really upset at himself because he had some glorious chances that he didn't convert on that he will moving forward. POPULAR DESTINATION

- The Sun Devils have fallen fortunate to transfers since the program transitioned to Division I, including players like Dylan Hollman, Robbie Baillargeon, Wade Murphy and David Norris.
- In 2019-20, forwards JAMES SANCHEZ (Michigan) and WILLIE KNIERIM (Miami) made immediate impacts in their junior seasons. SANCHEZ led the entire team and became the first player in program history to reach 40 points in a season, while KNIERIM contributed 15 goals and was 5th in scoring for the Devils.
- While CHRIS GRANDO (Boston College) came in a season ago and had to sit out during the 2019-20 season due to transfer rules, he joins SEAN DHOOGHE (Wisconsin) and TANNER HICKEY (Alabama-Huntsville)
 -- all of which were key contributors to their respective programs before transferring -- as the 2020-21 transfers hoping to contribute to the Maroon & Gold transfer reputation.

DEVILS IN THE PROS

- Former netminder Joey Daccord, who helped catapult the program to its first NCAA Tournament berth, recently signed a three-year, two-way extension with the Ottawa Senators. Daccord was not only the first Sun Devil to sign an NHL contract, but play in the NHL as he made his debut on April 4, 2019. He was also the first Sun Devil committed to the program when getting drafted.
- This past season, senior defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk became the program's second player to sign an NHL
 contract and first to sign a free agent deal. Pasichnuk signed with the San Jose Sharks for two years back in
 June.
- Most recently in August, rising junior Josh Maniscalco signed a three-year free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Penguins and is immediately considered a top-10 prospect within the organization. Maniscalco recorded 11 goals and 21 assists last year and was ranked 6th among national defensemen in scoring.

WE GOT THE POWER(S)

Coach Powers enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2020-21, and his 13th overall at the helm at ASU. The two-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19 and were on track for a repeat appearance in 2019-20 before COVID-19 ended the season. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 235-121-28 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
