




















Sun Devil Women's Golf

Arizona State women's has done something unmatched by any other NCAA Division I women's golf team - the Sun Devils have won seven National Championships, including three straight, five in six years, and six within nine years (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1998, 2009).

The Sun Devils return to the National Championships for the first time since 2014 as a team, their 33rd all-time NCAA Championship appearance.

ASU Regional Recap

- •The No. 7 Sun Devils won Regionals in 2017 for the first time since since 2009 (fifth all-time Regionals first-place finish)
- •ASU has won four or more tournaments in the same season for the first time since 2009 (won Pac-12 Preview, Clover Cup, PING/ASU Invitational, and NCAA Regionals in 2017)
- •Among all 4 Regionals winners, ASU had the lowest three-round score by 15 strokes. Alabama (Athens) shot 7-under, Stanford (Albuquerque) shot 2-over, Florida/South Carolina (Columbus) shot 22-over
- •Monica Vaughn, Olivia Mehaffey, and Linnea Strom went 1-2-3 for the Sun Devils at Regionals. This was Mehaffey's fourth top-10 finish in last five tournaments as well as Strom's sixth straight top-10 finish and eighth of the season in tournament play. Vaughn won her second collegiate tournament
- •ASU shot 16-under on day three, a new 18-hole program record, surpassing the old record of 15-under, which the Sun Devils tied at their own PING/ASU Invitational in early April
- •The Pac-12 advanced five teams to NCAA championships including USC, Cal, and Oregon as well as Regional winners ASU and Stanford
- •17 of the top 30 teams in Golfstat rankings advanced out of Regionals, but two teams in the top-10 (No. 2 UCLA, No. 8 Georgia) and two more in the top-15 (No. 13 Arkansas, No. 14 Arizona) failed to advance, showing the strength of the Regional fields



Sun Devil Women's Golf

Head coach Missy Farr-Kaye and assistant coach Michelle Estill, both former Sun Devils, played under legendary head coach Linda Vollstedt at Arizona State. The five-time National Coach of the Year retired from ASU in June 2001 after leading the Sun Devils to six NCAA championships in the 1990's.

Missy Farr-Kaye



- Missy Farr-Kaye was named the 10th head coach of the Arizona State women's golf team on June 26, 2015
- •Spent 13 seasons as an assistant coach then associate head coach of the ASU women's golf program under Melissa Luellen before the promotion
- •Under Luellen and Farr-Kaye's partnership, the Sun Devils won the school's seventh NCAA title in 2009 and Azahara Munoz took home an individual NCAA title in 2008
- •Farr-Kaye returns the Sun Devils to the NCAA championships, their 33rd all-time appearance, for the first time since 2014
- •A Phoenix-area native, she was a member of Arizona State's first NCAA title as a senior in 1990 under legendary head coach Linda Vollstedt
- •Farr-Kaye graduated from ASU in 1990 with a degree in Organizational Communications

Michelle Estill



- •Returned to her alma mater in November 2016, joining former teammate Farr-Kaye's staff as an assistant coach
- •Also played under legendary head coach Linda Vollstedt
- •Was the NCAA Championship runner-up in 1986
- •Graduated from ASU with a B.S. in Business Management in 1989
- •1991 LPGA Rolex Rookie of the Year and had four top-20 finishes the following year after ASU
- •LPGA playing member from 1991-2006, also serving on the LPGA Board of Directors and Executive Committee (1996-98) as as President (1998)
- Received Budget Service Award for the LPGA Urban Youth Pen Pal Program in 1994
 Since 2006, following her professional playing days, she worked in multiple areas of PING, Inc.

Linnea Strom

- •No. 10 in most recent Women's World Amateur Golf Rankings
- •Has a team-leading 8 top-10 finishes in 10 tournaments this season
- •2016 Pac-12 Individual Champion
- •Finished in top-25 at Women's World Amateur Championships in Mexico (Sept. 14-17, 2016)
- •Pac-12 First Team All-Conference
- •Has carded 18 of 30 rounds at or below par this season

Monica Vaughn

- •No. 16 in most recent Women's World Amateur Golf Rankings
- •Recently set a new program career low vs. par (64/-8) in round one of the PING/ASU Invitational (Apr. 7)
- •Won the NCAA Regionals tournament, her second career victory
- •Has six top-10 finishes in 10 tournaments this season
- •First Team All-Conference, Second Team Academic All-District
- •Recently graduated magna cum laude (Communications) in 2017

Olivia Mehaffey

- •No. 9 in most recent Women's World Amateur Golf Rankings
- •Has finished in the top-10 in four of the last five tournaments
- •Finished T15th at Women's World Amateur Championships in Mexico (Sept. 14-17) last fall, helping native Ireland to a medal (third-place)
- •Global Golf Post All-Amateur Team
- •Pac-12 First Team All-Conference
- •Helped lead 2016 Great Britain & Ireland team to Curtis Cup victory

Sophia Zeeb

- •Pac-12 All-Conference Honorable Mention
- •Set a new career low (67) in round two of the Clover Cup this season
- •Majoring in marketing and working on an international business certificate
- •An avid skiier and has traveled to South Africa
- •Has three top-10 finishes in tournament play this season, at Pac-12 Preview, Darius Rucker, and Clover Cup

Roberta Liti

- •Tallied not only her first career top-10 finish but first career victory at the Sun Devils' own PING/ASU Invitational in April (Apr. 7-9)
- •Pac-12 All-Academic First Team honoree in 2016
- •Set a new career low round (67) in a one-round dual competition with the University of Denver in January
- •Majoring in business (sports and media studies)
