

# 2019 Sun Devil Baseball

## GAME NOTES/ROSTERS

**PHOENIX --** The No. 20 Sun Devil Baseball team begin a seven-game road trek beginning Tuesday, May 7 in a non-conference midweek tilt against rival Arizona down in Tucson. It will be the final midweek game of the season for the Sun Devils, who will wrap up non-conference play with a three-game series against Nebraska in Lincoln beginning on Friday.

Tuesday's game will get underway at 6 p.m. Arizona time and will be available live on the Pac-12 Network.

### Follow the Action

- The Sun Devils will be on the Pac-12 Network for the fourth consecutive game on Tuesday with Daron Sutton and Andy Lopez on the call.
- Each game will also be available over the airwaves this weekend on NBC Sports Radio 1060 AM KDUS on with the Voice of the Sun Devils, Tim Healey, alongside analyst Max Rossiter.
- Fans are encouraged to follow along in-game content throughout the weekend on the Sun Devil Baseball account (@ASU\_Baseball).

### Fear the Turk

- All-American and 2019 Midseason Golden Spikes Award candidate Spencer Torkelson has multiple hits in 41 of his 100 career starts (.410).
- The sophomore had a career-long 22-game hitting streak ended against Utah. It was the longest hitting streak by any Sun Devil since Riccio Torrez had a 26-game streak back in 2010 and is tied for the second longest streak by a player this year.
- In only five games this season has Torkelson not registered a hit and in only 19 of his 100 career games has that been the case. Torkelson has at least one hit in 81.0 percent of his appearances as a Sun Devil.
- Torkelson is 13th nationally and second in the Pac-12 with 16 home runs this season. Those 16 give him 10 for his career, good for seventh in school history. The school record is 56 home runs by Bob Horner from 1976-78.
- Torkelson is batting .347 on the season on 66-of-190 hitting with 16 home runs, 12 doubles and 51 RBIs.
- His 66 hits this season are third in the Pac-12 and are 55th in the country while he is also fourth in the league with 51 RBIs - the 42nd-best total in the country.
- Torkelson has multiple hits in a team-best 22 of ASU's games this season and at least one RBI in 28 of those (multiple RBIs in 14).
- In Pac-12 ONLY games, Torkelson is currently the league leader with 12 home runs. His .728 slugging percentage in league game is good for fourth in the conference. He has driven in 24 RBIs in league games, tied for sixth in the Pac-12, and record 33 hits - tied for fifth in league-only games
- Torkelson is tied for 7th in the Pac-12 with 12 doubles - matching his career high. He is 37th nationally and fifth in the Pac-12 in slugging percentage (.663) while proving to be a capable baserunner as his 52 runs are fourth in the Pac-12 and 43rd nationally.

### #TurksUp

- Torkelson leads the team with 23 hitting with runners in scoring position, recording 23 hits on 57 chances (.404)
- He has been an extremely tough out to end the inning, extending the inning 21-of-54 times with two outs (.389) with a team-best 28 two-out RBI - nine more than any other player on the roster.
- Hit or not, Torkelson consistently finds a way to successfully advance baserunners, doing so 59 times on 114 opportunities (.518).
- Defensively, Torkelson has also made impressive strides. He has posted just two errors this season (one coming while playing out of position in right field) on 381 chances (5th in the Pac-12). He leads the league in helping to turn 49 double plays this season - 14 more than any other player in the Pac-12 and a stat that shouldn't be overlooked given the amount of incredible picks and stretch-grabs he has made to help facilitate those double plays at first base.
- Torkelson led the country in 2018 with 25 home runs - two more than any other player and just one shy of the NCAA freshman record while becoming first freshman in NCAA history to lead the nation in home runs.
- Torkelson was a unanimous All-American, as every major baseball media outlet in the nation rewarded the freshman with at least one All-America accolade (Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, Baseball America, NCBWA, and Perfect Game)...Honored with Perfect Game's National Freshman of the Year award.
- Named a Golden Spikes Award Semifinalist, an award honoring the best player in college baseball.
- National Collegiate Baseball Writers of America named him as a third-team All-America selection; Earned third-team recognition from Perfect Game; Placed on the Perfect Game Freshman All-America First Team; Named by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as the National Co-Freshman of the Year and the NCBWA as the National Freshman Hitter of the Year.

### Hunting Party

- Hunter Bishop was named Perfect Game and D1Baseball's Midseason Player of the Year during the first week of April and was also tabbed as the NCBWA National Player of the Month for the Month of March.
- Bishop has also been named the 2019 Midseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List
- Bishop is fifth in the nation with 19 home runs this season - three more than any other player in the Pac-12. For perspective, Bishop had just 10 career home runs before entering his junior season.
- He is the sixth in the nation in slugging percentage (.792) while leading the Pac-12 and 11th nationally in runs scored (57).
- His 141 total bases are 15 more than any other player in the Pac-12 (teammate Spencer Torkelson has 116) and good for sixth in the nation.
- Bishop's 55 RBIs this season are second in the Pac-12 and 27th nationally, while his .354 average is seventh in the league. He has nine games this season with three or more RBIs, a team-best.

# 2018 Sun Devil Baseball

## GAME NOTES

- His 13 doubles are fifth in the Pac-12 while his four triples are tied for third.
- Bishop's .484 on-base percentage is fourth in the league and 43rd in the country. He has drawn a team-best 39 walks - fourth in the Pac-12.
- He had an active 44-game reached base streak dating back to last season ended during the Washington series, which was the fourth-longest active reached base streak in the NCAA this season.
- Bishop leads the team in advancing teammates 63 times on 112 chances (.563).
- He leads the team with 15 multi-RBI games and is second on the squad with 19 multi-hit games.
- His 55 RBIs already eclipse his previous career best of 26 while his 57 runs scored are 30 more than his previous career best of 27.
- The junior was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week three times in the month of March.

### Marshing to the Beat

- Alec Marsh was named a Midseason First Team All-American by Perfect Game on April 4 and was also named to USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List.
- Marsh was added to the Collegiate Baseball Hall of Fame's Watch List for the National Pitcher of the Year on April 17.
- Marsh has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 28 of his last 31 appearances dating back to his freshman season.
- Dating back to last season, Marsh has a posted a quality start in 14 of his 20 starts since assuming the mantle of Mr. Friday Night midway through the 2018 campaign.
- Marsh is tied for first in the Pac-12 and ninth in the nation with eight victories this season, currently posting an 8-2 record.
- His 3.09 ERA is currently 12th in the Pac-12 while his 68 strikeouts sit 6th in the league.
- Marsh leads Pac-12 pitchers and is 18th nationally with 78.2 innings pitched this season.
- The junior is not hesitant about pounding the strike zone, throwing a strike on 62.5 percent of his pitches while falling into 2-0 counts just 43 times on 322 batters faced on the year (.134).
- Marsh dominates when getting ahead of the count, holding batters to 2-26 hitting (.077) on 0-2 counts and 9-of-47 hitting (.191) on 1-2 counts with 34 combined strikeouts between the two. 2-2 counts have also been deadly when facing Marsh this season, with opponents going 4-for-39 (.103) with 22 punchouts.
- Marsh is responsible for one ASU's two complete game this season, a masterful three-hit effort as he shut down third-ranked Oregon State to the tune of a 4-1 victory.
- Marsh struck out 10 batters on Opening Night, the first time an ASU player had reached double digits in a game since Seth Martinez in March of 2016. Marsh also became the first Sun Devil in at least 20 years to throw 10 strikeouts on Opening Night. Since at least 1998 (as far back as readily accessible records go), no Sun Devil had struck out more than eight batters on Opening Night until Marsh's performance.

### #LINSANITY

- Lyle Lin has embraced his new role as the team's designated hitter this season, just outside the Top-1 in the Pac-12 with 41 RBIs this year despite not being an every-day starter
- Lin's 41 RBIs are an incredible tally considering the junior had just 18 RBIs total during the 2018 season, despite starting every game. He has multiple RBIs in 9 games.
- Lin is 13-for-18 this season in bringing runners from third home with less than two outs, a notable area of struggle for the junior was just 2-for-12 in the category last season despite starting every game in the middle of the lineup. The 13 RBIs in that spot this year are two more than any other Sun Devil.
- Lin has advanced baserunners 57 times on 97 chances (.588) - the second-highest total on the team by average.
- His knack for getting the ball into play has paid its due, as he's reached base a team-best eight times on opponent errors this season - three more than any other Sun Devil. He has advanced a runner with an out 21 times - also good for the team lead.
- Lin recorded the game-winning RBI (the RBI that put ASU ahead for the remainder of the game) in all three of ASU's games against UC Davis.
- Lin became the first Sun Devil since 2014 to hit a grand slam with his round-tripper in the second game of the UC Davis series.
- Lin leads the team with seven games this season with three or more hits.

### Put Me In, Coach

- The consummate team player, fans have seen Carter Aldrete all over the diamond this season. Aldrete has seen time in right field, second base, third base and on the mound.
- Aldrete is currently just outside the Top-10 in the Pac-12 with 38 RBIs this season. Of those 38 RBIs, 18 have come with two outs - second on the team
- Has five home runs on the season, good for a career-high.
- Has been much more efficient with runners on the basepath this season, batting .333 (32-of-96) with runners in front of him compared to just .216 (16-of-74) with the bases empty.
- He has 23 hits with runners in scoring position, tied for the highest total on the team - batting .338 in the scenario.
- In Pac-12-only games, Aldrete is tied for the league lead in doubles with eight. He has a career-best 12 on the season - tied for seventh in the league.
- In his first game not starting this season, Aldrete came off the bench to knock a game-winning RBI single in the series finale against #1 UCLA.

### Just Like He Drew It Up

- Despite missing three weeks to injury, Drew Swift returned to the lineup and continued to show he is one of ASU's most improved hitters.
- He has nine doubles this season - already a career-best - and a triple for 10 extra-base hits on the season despite missing several weeks to injury. He had just two extra-base hits on the season.
- Swift has been a part of 31 double plays this season, despite the time missed, good for fourth in the Pac-12 in the category and second among non-first basemen.
- His 105 defensive assists are good for sixth in the Pac-12.
- Became the first Sun Devil since Jake Peevyhouse in 2014 to have three doubles in a game, doing so against San Diego.

### Alika Like That

- Alika Williams has quietly continued to put up impressive numbers as a sophomore, embracing his role as a cleanup hitter with a .345 batting average with 45 RBIs - easily a career high in the category. He had just 20 total RBIs last season.
- The 45 RBIs are good for sixth in the Pac-12. When he does get RBIs, he tends to get a lot of them. He has 13 multi-RBI games this season and is second on the team with eight games with three or more RBIs.
- Williams has homered four times this year and recorded 10 doubles and three triples. He is slugging .512 on the season - over 150 points higher than his freshman total of .333. With 17 extra-base hits on the year, he has far surpassed his freshman total of nine.
- Williams is just outside the top-10 in the Pac-12 with a .443 on-base percentage.
- The sophomore been incredible when falling behind in counts this season, posting a .390 average (16-of-41) when facing 1-2 counts. Of his 58 hits on the year, 34 have come when falling behind in the count.
- He is 30-of-99 (.303) on two-strike hitting on the year - striking out a team-low 23 times while walking 25 times, making him the only player on the team with more walks than strikeouts.
- 17 of his 45 RBIs (.377) have come when falling behind in counts.
- The sophomore has been incredible at advancing baserunners this season, easily leading the team with a .629 average with 61 advancements on 97 opportunities - nearly 40 points higher than the next closest Sun Devil.
- Defensively Williams is currently tied for second in the Pac-12 with 119 defensive assists this season - one shy of the lead league.
- He has helped turn 32 double plays this season, which is good for third in the Pac-12 and first among non-first basemen.

### Putting in the Work

- Gage Workman has been one of the hottest players in the Sun Devil lineup of late, batting .333 with 33 runs scored, 33 RBIs and six home runs. He has hits in 11 of his last 14 games and multiple hits in seventh of those.
- After not having a home run in the first four weeks of the year, Workman erupted for three in the Washington State series.
- In Pac-12 only games, Workman has a .345 average - the best total on the squad and the 11th-best average among all Pac-12 players in league-only games.
- In Pac-12 only games, Workman is tied for ninth in the league with 17 walks.
- His .443 on-base percentage is 12 in Pac-12 games and the best among all Sun Devils in the category. His .609 slugging percentage in Pac-12 games is 8th in the league and second on the team.

- Workman is tied for the team lead in games with three or more hits with six.

#### **Trev Lightly and Carry a Big Stick**

- Perhaps no player on the Sun Devil roster has shown as much improvement this season as sophomore Trevor Hauver.
- The leadoff man is batting .351 with a .443 on-base percentage this season and a team-best 67 hits - good for second in the Pac-12.
- Hauver has drawn 32 walks on the season - currently 10th in the Pac-12.
- Hauver has also showed plenty of pop in the bat, third on the team with 11 home runs this season - good for 7th in the Pac-12.
- Hauver's .351 average is ninth in the Pac-12 and he is second on the team with six games with three or more hits while tied for second with 19 multi-hit games.
- He has been the top ASU player in games in several categories, posting a seven-RBI game, a five-hit game, a four-walk game and a two-home run game.
- He is the only player to record a five-hit game this season, doing so against Long Beach State.
- Hauver has scored 53 runs this season, third in the league and 38th nationally.
- As a leadoff batter in an inning, Hauver has reached base 31 times this season on 87 chances (.356).
- Hauver has been very productive for his teammates as well, successfully advancing runners 55 times on 96 chances (.573). Of ASU's day-to-day starters, Hauver's 22 runners left stranded this season are the fewest on the team.
- Hauver has been light's out with runners in scoring position, leading the team with a .440 average on 22-of-50 hitting while also making it tough for pitchers to get out of innings with a team-best .450 average on 18-of-40 hitting with two outs.
- Hauver has a case for being ASU's most clutch batter late in games this season. In innings 7-9, Hauver is batting .441 on 19-of-43 hitting with 14 RBIs and 14 runs, easily leading ASU in each of those categories in the late stages of games. Five of his 11 home runs have come in these latter stages of games.

#### **Pay the Tolman**

- Erik Tolman has been thrust into several crucial spots as a true freshman this season and responded best when the lights were on.
- Tolman is 3-0 with two saves this season and a team-best 2.40 ERA.
- Tolman has struck out 37 batters and in 41.1 innings pitched.
- Opponent's .179 batting average against Tolman this season is easily the lowest on the team.
- Tolman has allowed just seven extra-base hits this season - all doubles. With a handful more innings pitched, Tolman would qualify as the only pitcher in the Pac-12 this season to not allow a home run.
- Tolman is dominant when he has two strikes to his credit, holding opponents to 3-30 (.100) in 1-2 counts and 3-of-26 (.115) in 2-2 counts with 28 of his 37 strikeouts.
- With runners on the basepath, opponents are batting just 11-of-67 (.164) against Tolman on the season and he has been shutdown with two outs, limiting the opposition to 3-of-42 (.071) while stranding 41 baserunners.
- With runners in scoring position, opponents are just 6-of-41 (.146) with just 10 RBIs.

#### **All That Chaz**

- Chaz Montoya has quickly developed a role as the team's stopper in several crucial scenarios this season.
- Montoya leads the squad with 23 appearances in 45 games, posting a 2.25 ERA in 20.0 innings pitched with 18 strikeouts.
- Montoya has inherited 27 runners this season, allowing just five of them to score.
- In his 23 appearances, Montoya has retired the first batter he has seen on 17 occasions.
- Montoya had a streak of 11 straight games not allowing a run ended in the series finale against Arizona.
- Montoya is 2-0 on the season with a team-high two saves as well.

#### **The Brady Bunch**

- Brady Corrigan has quickly asserted himself as one of ASU's go-to players out of the pen, appearing in 22 of ASU's 45 games this season.
- Corrigan has inherited a team-high 33 runners this season, allowing just five of them to score (.151).
- Corrigan has 50 strikeouts in 41.2 innings pitched - easily the best strikeout-to-inning ratio on the team.

#### **Chicks Dig The Long Ball**

- ASU's power numbers this season have been at another level with ASU posting 73 home runs - a total that is currently fifth nationally.

- The Devils have three players with over 10 home runs in Hunter Bishop (19), Spencer Torkelson (16) and Trevor Hauver (11). It is the first time a Sun Devil roster has laid that claim since 2009 (Carlos Ramirez/19, Jason Kipnis/16, Kole Calhoun/12).
- That 2009 team knocked 75 home runs for the season, making this year's tally the most since then with at least three weeks left to play.
- ASU's 73 home runs have already set the Pac-12 record during the BBCOR era of bats (since 2011), surpassing Oregon State's 2018 mark of 67.
- ASU is hitting 1.62 home runs per game this season, a mark that would be the fourth-best of any team in the past nine years since the BBCOR batting standards were introduced.
- Ten different Sun Devils have gone yard this season, with eight of those doing so 3 or more times.
- ASU's 73 home runs are 8 more than any other team in the Pac-12 (Cal is second with 65).
- The Devils' .523 slugging percentage is 20 points higher than any other program in the conference.
- ASU had 50 home runs last season in 55 games last season, a mark that the current roster surpassed by the midway point of 2019.

#### **Pitching For Contact**

- The Sun Devil pitching staff has done its part to put trust in the defense behind it, a trait of pitching to contact that has led to 53 double plays being turned on the season - a total that leads the Pac-12 and is second nationally and five of the national lead.
- ASU's defense as done its part with a solid .974 fielding percentage that is fifth in the league and 63rd nationally after consecutive seasons ranked 184th or worst in the category.
- That trusting relationship has played a huge role in ASU escaping numerous jams this season. In total, ASU has stranded 402 opponents on the basepath this year - just a tick under nine stranded runners per game at 8.9 per game.

- Most players taken in the MLB Draft since 2010 (57)
- ASU's 110 Major Leaguers since 1959 are the most in the nation
- The first-ever player drafted by the MLB was Sun Devil alum Rick Monday
- ASU is the only school at any level to have multiple No. 1 overall picks in June MLB Draft history
- Most unique first round players taken in the June MLB Draft with 20 - (excludes compensation picks and re-draftees)
- Most players drafted in a single year (15 in 2008)
- 437 MLB Draft Picks, more than any other school in the country.

## Movin' On Up

- As has become commonplace at Arizona State, five Sun Devils heard their names called in the MLB Draft following the 2018 season. The Sun Devils have had five or more players drafted in 47 of MLB Drafts held since 1956 and five or more players have gotten the call in 14 of the last 16 seasons.

## Keeping the Tradition Alive

- Two Sun Devils made their debuts in the MLB during the 2018 season, bringing ASU's total to 110 all-time - the most among all NCAA schools since 1959. Ryan Burr (White Sox) and Adam McCreery (Braves) each saw their first Big League action when the rosters expanded this past season.
- The Sun Devils have now had at least one major league player on their varsity roster each year from 1961 through 2015, which is the longest current streak in the nation.
- Thirty-five ASU baseball players have made their MLB debuts since 2002.

## Making an Impact

- Since 1999, Sun Devils in the major league have the second-highest WAR among all colleges in the country with a Sun Devil WAR of 152 coming in behind only Long Beach State (214), according to Baseball America.
- The 2008 Sun Devils boasted a trio of eventual first-round picks in 1B Ike Davis (2008, 1st round), 3B Brett Wallace (2008, 1st round) and RHP Mike Leake (2009, 8th overall), plus also OF Jason Kipnis (2009, 2nd round). Davis, Leake and Kipnis all had moments in the sun in the big leagues.
- The program's brightest light is 2B Dustin Pedroia (2004, 2nd round). He and OF Andre Ethier (2003, 2nd round) teamed up in 2002 and 2003.
- Pirates RHP Trevor Williams (2013, 2nd round) is the most prominent ASU alum in his peak years.

# 2019 Sun Devil Baseball

HEAD COACH



## TRACY SMITH - HEAD COACH - FIFTH SEASON (23rd OVERALL)

Tracy Smith, the 2013 National Coach of the Year, was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014, and enters his fifth season at the helm of the Sun Devil baseball program.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 50 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school.

In 22 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 80 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 73 draftees since 2000 and 33 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 48 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past eight seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In 2018, Smith eclipsed 700 career wins as an NCAA head coach while also overseeing one of the most prolific freshman campaigns in collegiate baseball history as Spencer Torkelson became the first freshman to ever lead the nation in home runs, finishing with 25 on the season.

Torkelson knocked two more home runs than any other player and just one shy of the NCAA freshman record. Torkelson was just the sixth player to reach 25 home runs since the BBCOR batting technology changes took effect in 2011 and the only freshman in the NCAA to reach the milestone in that time.

Against Washington State, he surpassed the previous Sun Devil freshman record of 11 home runs set by Barry Bonds in 1983. Torkelson finished tied with Bob Horner (1978) for second in ASU single-season history, just two shy of Mitch Jones' school record 27 in 2000.

Torkelson slugged .743 on the season (25 homers, 12 doubles), the third-highest total for any freshman in the NCAA in the past two decades and the highest for a freshman in the BBCOR era (since 2011). Only Rickie Weeks (.849 in 2001) and Jeremy Baltz (.771, 2010) have posted higher freshman slugging percentages in the past 20 years.

Smith saw five of his student-athletes taken in the 2018 MLB Draft, including fifth-round selection Gage Canning to the Washington Nationals. Canning wrapped the season as one of the elite five-tool players in the country, finishing with a .369 average and a Pac-12 leading 87 hits on the season. Canning was the national leader in triples with 11, and now has 25 in his career at ASU – good for third in school history and the most since Ed Irvine tied the school record of 26 between 1977-79.

Canning reached base in 54 of 55 games for the Sun Devils this season and logged a hit in 47 of those. He led the team with multiple hits in 26 games and had 11 games with three or more hits, becoming the first Sun Devil player to have at least 10 games with 3+ hits since Brett Wallace did so from 2007-08.

With one more home run, Canning would have become the first player in the BBCOR batting era (since 2011) to record double digit numbers in doubles, triples AND home runs. He finished the season with nine homers, 17 doubles and 11 triples, slugging .648 for the season – good for third in the Pac-12 and 38th nationally.

Defensively, Canning was flawless after shifting to center field and logged just one error on the season on 144 chances for a .993 fielding percentage.

The 2017 campaign saw Canning emerge as one of the elite players in the Pac-12. The California-native led the team in virtually every hitting category, including batting average (.332), runs (37), doubles (12), triples (8), home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.538). He was the only player in the Pac-12 to finish with a double-digit number of doubles while also posting at least six home runs and six triples.

On top of dominating the leader boards at ASU, Canning's eight triples were the most by a player in the conference and second-most in the NCAA. Canning also recorded 120 total bases on the season, good for third in the conference. The outfielder really hit his stride in the middle of the season, as he went on a 12-game tear in which he hit at a .538 clip, including five three-hit nights and a four-hit performance.

Smith also helped oversee the emergence of Hunter Bishop as one of the exciting young freshmen in the country on the year. The freshman finished his 2017 campaign with an impressive .301 batting average, five doubles, four triples and five home runs. He ranked second on the team – behind only Canning – in batting average, runs scored (27), triples, home runs and slugging percentage (.484). Bishop started 31 games in the outfield season to become just the sixth ASU freshman in the past 15 years to start over 50 percent of the season in the outfield, most recently done by Canning last season. His 10 multi-RBI games were also a team-best.

In 2016, Smith piloted the Sun Devils to a regional final for the first time since 2013. The Sun Devils' 36 wins were the most in the previous three years and they finished tied for third in the Pac-12. Five players were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft, marking 14 total players who have been taken in the draft during Smith's tenure.

Eight Devils earned All-Pac-12 honors on the season, including first team selections David Greer, Seth Martinez, Brian Serven and Colby Woodmansee. All four players would go on to be selected in the MLB draft with Greer (third team), Martinez (second team) and Woodmansee (third team) earning Louisville Slugger All-America accolades.

In his first season at ASU, Smith led the Sun Devils to a postseason berth, a third-place finish in the Pac-12 and 30-plus wins.

He became one of five active coaches, and one of eight all-time, to bring three different Div. I schools to NCAA Regional play as he guided the Sun Devils to a No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional in 2015.

A exceptional recruiter, Smith was instrumental in Sun Devil Baseball's signing of the nation's top recruiting class in 2016, which included eight players who had been drafted by the Major League out of high school. His 2017 class was also rated in the Top-5 nationally and was the No. 1 class in the West.

He has amassed a 698-535-1 career record in 21 seasons as a head coach at three different schools, including nine seasons at both Miami (Ohio) and Indiana, and one year at Arizona State. His 698 victories rank in the top 50 among active coaches in the NCAA, and his 21 seasons represent the sixth-fewest number of years on that list.

Smith instituted a change in culture at Arizona State and his demand for excellence both on and off the field was represented as the Devils led the Pac-12 in both all-conference and all-academic honorees in 2014.

Nineteen players have earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors in Smith's first two seasons, tied for the most in Sun Devil history for a two-year span. ASU's 10 selections in Smith's first season led the Pac-12.

His emphasis on defense became evident right away as ASU vastly improved its fielding percentage and lowered its number of errors committed in Smith's first season. The Devils finished fourth in the Pac-12 in both categories in 2015 after ranking near the bottom of the conference from 2010-14.

An accomplished fundraiser, Smith played a huge role in helping transition the Sun Devil Baseball program into Phoenix Municipal Stadium. His vision saw a renovated clubhouse, complete with an alumni locker room and an academics center, as well as an increased prominence on the program's historical accomplishments. Capital improvements included a state-of-the art video board, batting tunnel, a weight room and training room, creation of a grass berm and patio installations, and premium seating options. Smith also played a huge role in facility upgrades at both Indiana University and Miami (Ohio) and was instrumental in the approval and design of both Miami's Stanley G. McKie Field at Joseph P. Hayden Jr. Park and Indiana's Bart Kaufman Field.

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

Smith came to Tempe with 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach, including nine at Miami University (Ohio) and nine at IU, where he was two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year. He led both programs to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances and more than 600 combined career victories.

He tallied more than 40 wins in his final two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.

Smith took an IU program that had finished 10th in the Big Ten six times in an eight-year stretch between 2000 and 2007, and led the Hoosiers to an NCAA Regional in 2009 and to the College World Series in 2013. IU notched a program-best 21 conference wins in 2014 and secured eight first team All-Big Ten selections to tie a conference mark for most first team honorees from one school.

Smith's Academic Progress Rate as a head coach increased each season until it reached a perfect 1000 in two-year stretch between 2008-10.

IU saw eight players on 12 occasions be named All-Americans under Smith, including four in 2014, which was the highest total in program history and the second straight season that IU produced three or more All-Americans.

Smith mentored two Big Ten Players of the Year, three Big Ten Pitchers of the Year and a pair of Big Ten Freshman of the Year in nine seasons at IU, and at least one Hoosier earned Freshman All-America honors in six of the past seven seasons in Bloomington.

He has landed three players on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team and mentored numerous players at all positions, including outfielder Alex Dickerson, who was named Big Ten Player of the Year and won the Big Ten Triple Crown in 2010, right-handed pitcher Aaron Slegers, who was named 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, and catcher Kyle Schwarber, who was named an All-American by five major college baseball groups in 2014.

In nine years at the helm of the RedHawks baseball program, Smith compiled eight straight 30-win seasons, two NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals six times.


He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization. He also participated in 1992 Major League Scouting Bureau's Professional Scout School as a representative of the Cubs.

Born Feb. 14, 1966, Smith graduated with a bachelor's degree in Education from Miami (Ohio) in 1989 and completed a master's degree in Sport Organization from Miami (Ohio) in 1992.
