## SUN DEVIL REWIND

It's been a tale of splits for the Sun Devils over the last month. After finishing November with a win and a tie against Vermont, followed by the same fate over then-No. 4 Denver, the Devils captured game one of their road series' at Michigan State and Omaha before losing game two.

After starting the season 0-2 on Saturday's, ASU has gone 5-0-2 since, which includes the past two series beginning on Saturday.

Junior forward JOHNNY WALKER has enjoyed the month of December thus far, scoring six of his 12 goals on the season and recording another three assists for nine points in six games. His 12 goals is just one shy of the national lead.

Tied with WALKER for the team lead in points is JAMES SANCHEZ, who is coming off a three-assist weekend at Omaha. SANCHEZ and WALKER are tied for 7th nationally in scoring with 22 points.

Along with WALKER and SANCHEZ, there were four other Sun Devils recording multi-point games, including PJ MARROCCO, JACOB WILSON, JORDAN SANDHU and DOMINIC GARCIA. MARROCCO had his first multi-goal game of his collegiate career

### CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

For the first time since 1999, NCAA Division I hockey returns to Orange County as the Sun Devils and Harvard meet in the So Cal Clash.

The two programs have met four times in the past, with the Crimson owning the overall record 3-1-0. The Sun Devils won the most recent meeting in Boston with a 3-2 overtime victory.

Both teams lost their starting netminders from a year ago, while Harvard also lost their top d-man in Adam Fox. The Crimson are one of the top scoring teams in the country, averaging four goals per game. They also rank among the top-10 on special teams, ranking 10th on the power play and 8th on the penalty kill.

Harvard got off to a hot start to their season, winning six straight before dropping their last four. Harvard is loaded with talent, featuring eight NHL draft picks. However, they'll be missing one of their key contributors this weekend as forward Jack Drury is currently with Team USA's WJC U-20 team.

#### BY THE NUMBERS



JOHNNY WALKER has six goals in his last six games, which includes 1g, 1a performances in the last two games. He leads the country in December goals scored.



WALKER and JAMES SANCHEZ co-lead the team in points with 22. At this point last year, with two more games played, WALKER led the team with 23 points and 17 goals.



The Sun Devils have scored 2 or more goals in all but three games this season with the most recent being two weekends ago at Michigan State.



This past Sunday was the first time in five games that sophomore goaltender EVAN DEBROUWER (#30) made fewer than 30 saves in a game.

#### SUN DEVIL TWEETABLES

- 1. This weekend is the first time since 1999's Frozen Four that Division I hockey will be played in Orange County.
- After his performance the last month, @jwalks96 is now one goal out of the national lead with 12.
- 3. Since December 1, @jwalks96 leads the country in total points (9) and goals (6).
- This coast-to-coast trip for Harvard is the first time they've had to go west of Troy, New York this season.
- At this point a season ago, the Sun Devils were 14-6-0 and ranked 15/13 in the national polls.

## LAST TIME THEY MET...

- Oct. 28, 2016: The two team's first-ever meeting did not favor the Sun Devils, as they ran into
  the buzzsaw that was Harvard's Frozen Four contending team in 2016-17. A team that won
  16-straight games until their loss in the Frozen Four semifinal and lost just five games during
  the regular season. The Crimson steamrolled the Devils, 7-0, in their first game of that season.
- Oct. 29, 2016: Game two wasn't much better, but the Sun Devils did manage to score two goals in a 6-2 loss.
- Nov. 16, 2018: ASU's first trip to Cambridge didn't start well, as the Crimson got off to a 2-0
  lead and held the Sun Devils to just two shots on goal in the first period. The Sun Devils
  found their legs, but were stymied by Harvard goaltender Michael Lackey. ASU finished the
  game outshooting Harvard, 31-30, but fell 4-1.
- Nov. 17, 2018: The Sun Devils finally ended the drought in the most recent match-up with JOHNNY WALKER scoring the game-winning goal in overtime. ASU tied the game in the final half of the 3rd period with a shorthanded goal, and JOEY DACCORD made 40 saves for a 3-2 victory.

## FAMILIAR FOES

- While brief, Sun Devil JOHNNY WALKER played together with Crimson defenseman Reilly Walsh and forwards Jack Badini and Baker Shore with the Chicago Steel (USHL) in 2016-17.
- ASU defenseman CONNOR STUART and Harvard goaltender Mitchell Gibson played together for the Lone Star Brahmas in 2017-18.
- AUSTIN LEMIEUX and Harvard's Nathan Krusko also crossed paths for a brief stint with the Omaha Lancers (USHL) in 2015-16.
- Three Edina High School alums will share the ice on opposing lineups, as DEMETRIOS KOUMONTZIS of ASU and Casey Dornbach and Henry Bowlby of Harvard were just two years a part.

## **POWERING UP**

Coach Powers enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2019-20, and his 12th overall at the helm at ASU. The 2018-19 was one for the record books, as the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year finalist led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 223-110-25 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
