Last Weekend

At the Sun Devil Classic two weekends ago, the Sand Devils went 2-1, picking up wins over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Coastal Carolina before falling to No. 6 Cal Poly. Anya Pemberton and Olivia McElroy, competing at the No. 2 and No. 3 courts, were the only pair to win their court against Cal Poly. The duo now has wins over four pairs from ranked teams this season.

Arizona State remains undefeated against unranked opponents under head coach Kristen Glattfelder, dating back to last season.

Big 12 Pair of the Week

The No. 1 duo of Daniella Kensinger and Ava Williamson were the Big 12 Pair of the Week on 3/4, the first Big 12 award for the program. They went undefeated that weekend, picking up two wins over pairs from ranked teams and not losing a single set in the process.

2025 Schedule Outlook

The schedule features two home tournaments and two additional duals in home sand. Arizona State will face 11 of the 15 teams in the 2024 NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship (not including ASU, which was in the bracket), including all of the final four (USC, Cal Poly, LSU and UCLA) and reigning champion USC. On the schedule are also 15 teams that were in the final top 20 AVCA Coaches Poll ranking. The first Big 12 Beach Volleyball Championships will be held at TCU from April 24-25.

2024 Milestone Season

Led by first-year ASU head coach Kristen Glattfelder (formerly Rohr), Arizona State had a stellar season in 2024. In the final season as a member of the Pac-12, the team went 21-10 (5-5 Pac-12) and made it to the NCAA Tournament for the first time, earning a No. 12 seed. The 21 wins tied the ASU record for wins in a season. ASU had raked in 11 ranked wins this season, the previous record was held at three during the 2019 season.

After an incredible season, the awards rolled in for the Sun Devils, making this the most decorated season the program has seen. Arizona State saw its first All-Americans as Daniella Kensinger and Ava Williamson were both AVCA Second Team All-Americans. Additionally, Williamson and Arden Besecker were named an AVCA Top Flight pair for Flight 2 after they went 15-3 at the twos for

the first half of the year. In her first season at Arizona State, head coach Glattfelder was the Pac-12 Coach of the Year for leading the squad to this historic season. She was the first Sand Devil coach to earn this award.

Coach of the Year

In her first season at Arizona State in 2024, head coach Kristen Glattfelder (formerly Rohr) was the first Pac-12 Coach of the Year in Sun Devil Beach Volleyball history after leading the team to a historic season. She led the Sand Devils to an incredible season in her first season in Tempe. She guided the team to their first NCAA Championships appearance in team history. In her ninth season overall as a head coach, she helped the squad compile a 21-10 record.

In the Rankings

The Sand Devils are ranked No. 11 in the AVCA Coaches Poll. ASU was ranked every week last season, which was the longest the Sand Devils have been ranked in a single season. The highest ranking last season was No. 10 in week 2, which was tied for the highest rank ASU has received in program history. It tied a No. 10 ranking in 2017.

Returners

Of the 10 starters at the NCAA Championships, the Sand Devils lost just four, bringing back a core group of strong student-athletes. There are eight on the 2025 roster who played significant time in 2024.

New Faces

The Sand Devils have seven new faces this year: four freshmen and three transfers. The transfers bring a lot of experience. Junior Tori Clement comes from Stetson where she played on the top court all of last season. Sophomore Kaydon Meyers played her freshman year at Pepperdine where she earned the WCC Freshman of the Year honor. Lastly, sophomore Olivia McElroy played on the top two courts all year in 2024 at Arizona.

The freshmen are Lucci Alexander, Kastyn Hoffman, Zoe Taylor and Layla Williams. Each bring strong experience from their club days prior to college. Taylor, though a freshman and has not played in a game yet, is a mid-year transfer from LSU, which is where she spent her fall.

2024 Pac-12 Coach of the Year 2022 AVCA Coach of the Year

- Kristen Glattfelder (then Rohr) was hired as the third head coach in program history on June 2, 2023.
- Glattfelder has coached eight AVCA All-Americans and five AVCA Top Flight pairs.
- In her first season with the Sand Devils in 2024, she led ASU to its most successful in program history. The team went 21-10 and made it to the NCAA Tournament for the first time, earning a No. 12 seed. The 21 wins tied the ASU record for wins in a season. ASU had raked in 11 ranked wins this season, the previous record was held at three during the 2019 season. Arizona State was No. 12 in the final AVCA Coaches Poll. The Sun Devils were ranked for the entire season, the first time the program has been ranked for more than four weeks.
- Glattfelder spent eight seasons at Grand Canyon University, leading the team to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2022 and 2023.
- The GCU beach volleyball program went from being unranked in 2015 to a top-15 team in her second season as head coach in 2017. She led the Lopes to three-straight top-10 rankings to finish the seasons from 2021-23. In her eight seasons, she led the team to three top-10 finishes, two top 15 and one top 20.
- From 2007-2015, she competed professionally in beach volleyball, ranking as high as fifth in the country.
- Additionally, she was head coach of Cardinal Mooney High School in Sarasota, Fla., for five seasons. She co-founded the Coastline Volleyball Club team for high school athletes and served as its director and coach.
- Glattfelder graduated from Kentucky in 2005 with a degree in family consumer science. During her collegiate career, she was a four-year starter for the Wildcats and was named All-SEC and team MVP. She received her master's degree in counselor education from Capella University in 2011.
- Prior to college, she competed at Venice (Fla.) High School, leading the team to a state championship and being selected as MVP during her junior and senior years.
- Glattfelder and her husband Daniel reside in the Valley.


