SUN DEVIL REWIND

Coming off a program-best, 22-win season in 2019-20, and what was anticipated to be their second-straight NCAA Tournament apperance, the Sun Devils embark on a 22-day road trip through the Midwest and the Big Ten Conference.

While the Maroon & Gold lost two of their top scorers in defensemen BRINSON PASICHNUK (graduated) and JOSH MANISCALCO (signed with Pittsburgh), they return their 1-2 punch of JOHNNY WALKER and JAMES SANCHEZ who combined for 78 points on the top line. WALKER returns for his senior campaign leading all active NCAA players with 60 goals in his last three seasons.

Between the pipes, junior EVAN DeBROUWER carried a bulk of the workload in 2019-20, playing in 22 games with a 19-10-3 record. This season he has depth behind him with freshman and New Jersey Devils' 5th round draft pick COLE BRADY, who posted a 21-12-3 record for Fargo (USHL).

THE OTHER M&G

Michigan, who finished 2019-20 ranked No. 17 in the USCHO poll, comes into 2020-21 ranked No. 12 in the preseason poll and picked to finish second within the Big Ten Conference.

Despite losing their top three scorers, the Wolverines return one of the nation's top goaltenders in junior Strauss Mann, two NHL first-round draft picks in Johnny Beecher and Cam York, and welcome a top-end recruiting class featuring 2020 first-rounder Brendan Brisson and projected 2021 top-two overall draft pick Owen Power.

After starting the 2019-20 season with a 7-11-2 record, the Wolverines bounced back to finish with a 11-3-2 record in the 2020 calendar year.

BY THE NUMBERS



Senior forward JOHNNY WALKER has 17 more career goals than any other active player in college hockey with 60.



Senior forward & former Wolverine JAMES SANCHEZ was the first Sun Devil in program history to reach the 40-point milestone in a season last year.



When scoring 3 or more goals, the Sun Devils were 21-3-1 in 2019-20 while averaging 3.36 G/GP -- ranked 9th.



In 2020, the Sun Devil penalty kill led the country with a .929 kill rate, negating 52 of 56 power-play opportunities.

SUN DEVIL TWEETABLES

- These two teams last met in @SunDevilHockey's last series of the regular season of 2017-18, with @umichhockey taking each contest 5-3.
- The Sun Devils set a program record for most victories in a season with 22 during the 2019-20 season, outperforming the 2018-19 season of 21.
- 3. In 2019-20, @TheSunDevils had six players with 10+ goals versus just three in 2018-19 and one in 2017-18. They return four of those six in 2020-21.
- Three Sun Devils are Michigan natives, including Jacob Semik (Canton), Benji Eckerle (Northville) and Michael Mancinelli (Northville).
- The Sun Devil offense ranked 5th in the country during the 2020 part of the season scoring at a clip of 3.75 goals per game.

WALK THE WALK

- The former defenseman turned forward in junior hockey, who started his college career with just one goal and
 two healthy scratches in his first 11 games, has never looked back as JOHNNY WALKER finished that rookie
 campaign with the most goals per games played of all collegiate freshmen with 16 goals and 22 points in the
 final 23 games.
- That freshman year, WALKER completed his first NCAA season with seven goals in the state of Michigan including back-to-back, two-goal performances against Michigan at Yost Ice Arena. In that final stretch, JOHNNY WALKER was born.
- The Phoenix native went on to tie for the lead in goals scored during his sophomore year with 23 in 31 games played -- his G/GP led the nation -- which included seven goals in three games against a combination of Omaha and then-No. 6 Penn State. The last goal of that stretch being an overtime winner against the top-10 Nittany Lions in Happy Valley that set the tone for a historic season for the Sun Devils. WALKER was the catalyst in the program's run to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, and becoming the fastest start-up program to reach the postseason.
- Last season, just when it seemed WALKER couldn't take another step, he rounded out his game with another 20-goal season and 18 assists for a personal NCAA best 38 points. A majority of the season was spent on a line with Michigan transfer JAMES SANCHEZ, who fed off one another as SANCHEZ paced the team with 40 points and 30 assists -- the program's first 40-point, 30-assist player.
- Entering his senior season, **WALKER** returns with the most career goals of any active player in college hockey with 60. He also ranks 5th in total points with 96 in 100 games played.

"NEVER BEEN DEEPER"

- "We have five really good lines right now, and it's a tough decision to figure out which four of the five are going to go. We know three of them that are staples, but when you have the talent on four and five that we have, it's a good problem to have. When you're playing all road games, that depth is going to come in handy there's no doubt about it." -Head coach **Greg Powers**
- "We've never had a deeper forward group then what we have. It's by far the deepest forward group we've had. The biggest question mark is how do we replace the minutes lost on the back end from Brinson (Pasichnuk) and (Josh) Maniscalco, and especially (Jacob) Semik who sits out game one with a suspension from the final Wisconsin game last year. But we really like the way guys look back there. (Transfer) Tanner Hickey is a really, really good hockey player, and we're really happy with how he looks so far." -Head coach Greg Powers
- A big part of the added depth is the arrival of the six incoming freshmen and three transfers. The freshman class was at one point ranked as high as No. 2 in the country, according to Neutralzone.net.
- The three transfers include CHRIS GRANDO (Boston College), SEAN DHOOGHE (Wisconsin) and TANNER
 HICKEY (Alabama-Huntsville) -- all of which were key contributors to their respective programs before
 transferring. The Sun Devil roster features a total of FIVE transfers with the additions of JAMES SANCHEZ
 (Michigan) and WILLIE KNIERIM (Miami) last year.
- The incoming freshmen include two NHL draft picks in forward RYAN O'REILLY (Detroit) and goaltender COLE BRADY (New Jersey).

DEVILS IN THE PROS

- Former netminder Joey Daccord, who helped catapult the program to its first NCAA Tournament berth, recently signed a three-year, two-way extension with the Ottawa Senators. Daccord was not only the first Sun Devil to sign an NHL contract, but play in the NHL as he made his debut on April 4, 2019. He was also the first Sun Devil committed to the program when getting drafted.
- This past season, senior defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk became the program's second player to sign an NHL
 contract and first to sign a free agent deal. Pasichnuk signed with the San Jose Sharks for two years back in
 June.
- Most recently in August, rising junior Josh Maniscalco signed a three-year free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Penguins and is immediately considered a top-10 prospect within the organization. Maniscalco recorded 11 goals and 21 assists last year and was ranked 6th among national defensemen in scoring.

WE GOT THE POWER(S)

Coach Powers enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2020-21, and his 13th overall at the helm at ASU. The two-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19 and were on track for a repeat appearance in 2019-20 before COVID-19 ended the season. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 235-118-27 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
