MINNEAPOLIS - For the first time in program history, Minnesota will travel to the state of Arizona for a men's hockey game as it faces Arizona State, a team receiving votes in the national polls, for a nonconference series Nov. 25-26 inside the brand new Mullett Arena.

Tune in for the call of both games beginning at 8 p.m. (CT) live on the Gopher Radio Network 103.5 FM / AM 1130, while video streaming coverage will be available for free via Pac-12 Insider.

STEADY AT TWO

Following a road sweep at No. 3 Michigan last week, Minnesota remained No. 2, the place where it started the season, in both the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine and DCU/USCHO.com national polls. The Maroon and Gold has spent three weeks at No. 1 and are the only team in the country to be ranked no lower than No. 3 at any point this season, while Denver maintained the top spot during its bye week.

HISTORICALLY DIFFICULT

When the Maroon and Gold faced off against No. 3 Michigan last week, it marked the sixth-consecutive series where Minnesota battled a team ranked in the top 12 of the national polls and it handled that challenge to the tune of an 8-4 record. The series against the Wolverines also was the fourth time the Gophers took on an opponent ranked No. 10 or better. Since the USCHO polls were introduced 22 years ago, this has been the most difficult Gophers' schedule to date, having played 12 of their first 14 games against teams that highly ranked.

HISTORY WITH THE SUN DEVILS

The Gophers are a perfect 6-0-0 against Arizona State dating back to the first meeting in 2019 will all the matchups coming at home. The 'U has outscored the Sun Devils 40-10 in the all-time series and are set to play in the state of Arizona for the first time in program history. The two teams played four games at 3M Arena at Mariucci during a three-week stretch back in January 2021 with the Gophers coming away victorious in each outing by a combined score of 30-7. Jackson LaCombe has the most points of any active Minnesota player versus ASU putting up five assists in two career outings.

KEEP IT ROLLING

Minnesota has won six of its last seven games to take over first place in the Big Ten Conference standings following its road sweep of No. 3 Michigan last week. The Gophers have averaged nearly four goals per game offensively and outscored their opposition by a 27-13 margin in that stretch. Eleven different players have provided the goal scoring, while 15 guys have tallied at least one point. The surge has led to the nation's fifth-best scoring margin (+1.43) and pushed the scoring offense to sixth in the NCAA (3.86 goals per game).

STAR FROM THE BLUE LINE

Thanks to his four-point series and first NCAA goal at Michigan, Luke Mittelstadt earned B1G First Star of the Week honors Nov. 22. The freshman had a career day Nov. 17 when he recorded assists on the opening two goals before adding the first goal of his collegiate career in the third period. He followed that up with another assist Nov. 18, again on the first goal of the night.

STEPPING IN TO SWEEP

With Justen Close unable to play due to illness, goaltender Owen Bartoszkiewicz stepped up and played a major role in the Gophers' sweep of the Wolverines. Now 3-0-0 this season, the Northville, Mich., native earned the first B1G starts of his career and backstopped the two wins. The netminder made 64 saves over the sweep with a .928 save percentage, including a career-high 35 saves in the series finale Nov. 18.

VETERANS TAKING CHARGE

The combined offense from the senior class helped Minnesota to its road sweep at Michigan as they combined for 11 points in the two games. Jackson LaCombe had a goal and three assists for four points, while Bryce Brodzinski and Jaxon Nelson each had three points. The trio all rank in the top four of the B1G leading scorers in conference play as they've found the offensive touch over the last month. Ryan Johnson chipped in an empty net goal rounding out the senior scoring in Ann Arbor.

WELCOME THE NEWEST GOPHERS

The Gophers are set to welcome four newcomers to the 2023-24 roster as Beckett Hendrickson (USNTDP), Oliver Moore (USNTDP), Sam Rinzel (Waterloo Black Hawks) and Max Rud (Sioux Falls Stampede) recently signed National Letters of Intent. All four of the incoming freshmen originally hail from the State of Hockey and played prep hockey in the state as the Maroon and Gold continue to bring in local talent.

SPECIAL TEAMS = SUCCESS

During its recent stretch of quality play winning six of seven games, Minnesota has used its special teams to create that success. The Gophers have scored seven power-play goals in their last seven outings and converted at a 23 percent rate. Five different players have scored on the man advantage in that time, while the penalty kill has erased 20 of the previous 22 opponent chances when down a

FIGHTING TO THE END

Fans watching Gopher hockey this season want to stay in their seats until the end of the period before hitting the concession stands. The Maroon and Gold have scored 15 goals in the final five minutes of periods or overtime this season, including three in the final minute. Matthew Knies and Mason Nevers have both put away three of those tallies, while Connor Kurth and Jimmy Snuggerud have two apiece. On the flip side, Minnesota has only allowed eight goals in that same span.

DOUBLE-DIGIT SCORING

Minnesota boasts six players that have reached double-digit scoring this season led by Jimmy Snuggerud's 16 points in 14 games. Jackson LaCombe (15) and Matthew Knies (14) are close behind the freshman, while Logan Cooley, Jaxon Nelson and Bryce Brodzinski recently joined the double-figure crew. Four other players are one point shy of reaching the 10-point mark.

STEADY SOPHOMORE SCORING

Sophomore Matthew Knies is making a return to his home state playing at ASU in front of family and friends for the first time in his college career this weekend. The Phoenix, Ariz., native has delivered offense at opportune times this season as he has generated all but one of his points (seven goals and six assists) in Maroon and Gold wins. He is tied for second in the NCAA with three game-winning goals and has hit the back of the net in eight of 14 games played. He continues to average a point per game in his Gophers' career totaling 47 points (23 goals, 24 assists) during 47 contests thanks to a pair of three-point efforts during the 2022-23 campaign.

SENIOR STARS

In back-to-back weeks, seniors Justen Close (Nov. 8) and Bryce Brodzinski (Nov. 15) were selected

as B1G Second and Third Star of the Week, respectively. Close recorded his second shutout of the season Nov. 5 against No. 12 Notre Dame, which moved him into a tie for 12th in Minnesota history for career shutouts with the fifth of his tenure. His goals against average remains an impressive 1.88, which leads the league and ranks 10th in the nation. Brodzinski put together a threegoal performance against No. 7/8 Penn State to earn the second weekly honor of his career. He broke a 1-1 tie with the Nittany Lions Nov. 11 by scoring twice in a span of 66 seconds during the third period to give Minnesota a victory.

HATS OFF TO THEE

Thanks to his first four collegiate goals against No. 5 Minnesota State, three of which came on the same night, freshman Jimmy Snuggerud was named B1G First Star of the Week Oct. 10. He burst onto the scene Oct. 7 tallying the NCAA's first hat trick of the year, including the game winner against the Mavericks. The Chaska, Minn., native posted his second three-point effort of the season against the Buckeyes Oct. 28 and has 14 points in Minnesota's 10 wins. After recording multiple points in both games at Michigan, he pushed his team-leading total to 16 points, which is tied for 13th nationally.

FIRST STAR AND RISING

Behind a four-point opening weekend, Minnesota freshman Logan Cooley earned B1G First Star of the Week honors Oct. 4. The Pittsburgh, Pa., native shined in his collegiate debut versus Lindenwood scoring twice with an assist on the game-winning goal during a three-point effort. He ranks fifth on the team behind 12 points in 13 games, as 11 of his points have been in Minnesota victories. Cooley has registered at least one point in nine of 13 games played, including a season-best, four straight from Oct. 29 to Nov. 10.

FRESHMEN A FORCE

Minnesota's 11 freshmen have contributed on both ends of the ice, but especially offensively where the class has combined for 20 goals and 28 assists, accounting for 37 percent of the team's goal scoring. Jimmy Snuggerud's nine goals paces the squad, while Logan Cooley, Connor Kurth and Brody Lamb all have multiple goals. From the blue line. Luke Mittelstadt is the second-highest scoring freshman defenseman in the B1G this year totaling nine points.

NHL HONORS

A trio of former Gophers recently reached impressive milestones in the National Hockey League as Blake Wheeler posted his 300th career goal Nov. 13 in the final seconds of a road win at Seattle. He is only the third former Minnesota player to reach the mark. Meanwhile, Phil Kessel played in the 990th-consecutive game of his career Oct. 25 setting the Iron Man record for most games played without missing a contest, while also scoring the 400th goal of his NHL career the same night. The week before, Alex Goligoski stepped on the ice Oct. 20 at the Xcel Energy Center for his 1,000th career NHL game joining five former Gophers to hit the milestone.

RETURN THE PRIDE

Minnesota made its 22nd all-time trip to the NCAA Frozen Four in 2021-22, and first since 2014, after winning twice at the NCAA Northeast Regional over 2020-21 national champion Massachusetts and

top-seed Western Michigan. The victory against the Broncos was the 58th NCAA tournament win in program history, which is the most in college hockey history. Thanks to an eight-game winning streak to finish the regular season a year ago, the Gophers claimed their fifth Big Ten regular-season crown in the league's nine-year history and the 28th overall regular-season conference championship in Minnesota's 101-year history of college hockey.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Thanks to 11 freshmen on the roster, the average age of the Minnesota lineup, as of opening night, was 20 years and 321 days old (20.88 years) making it one of the youngest rosters in the nation. Only Justen Close and Carl Fish were born before 2000, while Ryan Chesley, Jimmy Snuggerud and Logan Cooley were all born in 2004.

SOMETHING NEVER BEEN DONE

For the first time in the program's more than 100-year history, more than one player will wear a jersey numbered higher than 80 as the 2022-23 roster has three players that fit the bill. Matthew Knies will don his familiar No. 89 sweater following an impressive rookie campaign, while newcomers Jimmy Snuggerud and Logan Cooley are set to wear No. 81 and No. 92, respectively. Cooley's number is officially the highest ever worn by a Gopher taking the short-lived title away from Knies.

LOCALLY SOURCED

Holding the moniker of the State of Hockey, Minnesota is known for its strong history of players that start skating on local ice sheets and backyard ponds. That has fed a deep pipeline of talent to colleges around the country, most importantly to the University of Minnesota. The Gophers' roster features a collection of 26 student-athletes, 20 of which were born and raised within the state lines. Even more impressive is the fact that 16 of the Minnesotans on the team are from within 40 miles of campus.

WHEN YOU CALL MY NAME

Fourteen of Minnesota's 26 rostered players have heard their name called in the NHL Entry Draft, six of which are part of this year's freshmen class. The Gophers have had the most all-time draft selections (227) by any NCAA men's hockey program after

adding four in July 2022. At least one Gopher has been drafted in 48 of the last 49 NHL Entry Drafts dating back to 1974, with 2001 being the only exception. Only Harvard has more draft picks (15) on its NCAA roster for the 2022-23 season.

LEADERS EMERGE WITH NEW LETTERS

Four players are sporting a new letter on the front of their sweaters in 2022-23 as Brock Faber (C), Ryan Johnson (A), Jackson LaCombe (A) and Jaxon Nelson (A) were named team captains in the offseason. In the history of Minnesota hockey, 166 different players have served as a team captain with the addition of this year's group.

MAROON AND GOLD RUNS DEEP

The family connections representing the Maroon and Gold run deep throughout the Minnesota lineup. Jimmy Snuggerud is a third-generation Gopher joining his father, Dave, an All-American in 1989, and maternal grandfather, James Westby, as those in the family that have worn the 'M' on their sweater. Brothers John and Luke Mittelstadt followed in the footsteps of their older brother Casey in attending Minnesota after the eldest was on campus for one season in 2017-18. Two returners have family ties with the Gophers, including senior captain Ryan Johnson, who is the son of former Gopher, Craig. Rhett Pitlick's father, Lance, played at the 'U' and served as a team captain in his final season, while his older brother, Rem, also spent his college career with the Maroon and Gold and was an All-American in 2019.

MOTZKO ENTERS YEAR FIVE

Back for his fifth season behind the Minnesota bench, head coach Bob Motzko owns a record of 86-50-11 for the Maroon and Gold, while his all-time record stands at 362-242-60 in 17 completed seasons. For his efforts guiding the Gophers to the Big Ten title and NCAA Frozen Four a year ago, he was named B1G Coach of the Year, his second such honor by the league in four seasons. He previously picked up the honor in 2020 and is now a six-time conference coach of the year honoree during his illustrious career as a college hockey coach. Motzko also was selected as a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the CCM/AHCA Men's Hockey Division I Coach of the Year.




