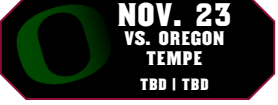

THE GAME - Sun Devil Football is back on the road looking for its third road victory over a ranked opponent as it takes on the #13/#14 Utah Utes on Saturday, Oct. 19 at 3 p.m. AZT (4 p.m SLC) in Salt Lake City, Utah. The game will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Network and can be heard over the airwaves locally at Arizona Sports 98.7 FM.

THE OPPONENT - ASU is 22-8 in the all-time series against the Utes, though posting just a 6-4 record in games played in Salt Lake City. The contest will have implications in the Pac-12 South battle, with the winner guaranteed to remain in at least a tie for the top record in the division's end.

It will be a tilt between two of the top scoring defenses in the Pac-12 with ASU third (16th nationally) at 17.7 points per game allowed and Utah leading the league and eighth nationally at 13.2 points per game allowed. It's also a battle of the top two rushing defenses in the league with Utah second nationally at 52.8 rushing yards per game allowed and ASU 12th nationally at 91.7 rushing yards per game given up.

The matchup is one of just three games in the FBS this weekend featuring two ranked opponents, and the second to appear in the Pac-12 (#12 Oregon at #25 Washington). #16 Michigan takes on #7 Penn State in Happy Valley this weekend in the lone other matchup.

KICKING OFF

-The Sun Devils have scored double-digit points in 125 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the FBS and tied for the longest streak in the modern era of FBS football with Louisiana Tech's run of 125 games from 2008-18.

-Arizona State is 2-0 against ranked opponents this season, with the two wins tied with five other teams for the most in the country. They they are one of just three of those teams that are 2-0 (Temple, LSU) and the only team that has two road victories against AP-ranked opponents.

-ASU is one of just 10 teams nationally to not give up a 50-yard play this season.

-Eno Benjamin has scored at least one touchdown in eight consecutive games.

-Kyle Williams has at least one pass receptions in 34 consecutive games, the sixth-longest streak in ASU history.

-The Sun Devils have been at their best in ending halves, posting a +27 point differential in the second quarter and +21 in the fourth quarter. The +48 combined difference is exceptional, but ASU will look to bolster their effort to start halves after sitting at a -2 point differential in the first (-14) and third (+12) quarters combined this season.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- Be ASU's third ROAD victory over a ranked team this season, marking the only time that has happened in program history.
- Move ASU to 3-0 against ranked opponents this year. It's current total of two wins is tied with five other teams for most nationally
- Improve ASU to 6-1 for the first time since 2014 and just the eighth time in the Pac-12 era (since 1978).
- Give ASU a 5-3 record under Herm Edwards against ranked opponents.
- Be the first time ASU started a season 3-0 on the road since the 1996 Rose Bowl season (4-0). It would mark only the fifth time in the Pac-12 era that the feat has occurred ('82, '86, '91, '96).

MILESTONE COUNTDOWNS

- **1 100+ yard rushing game** for Eno Benjamin to tie Demario Richard (13 from 2014-17) for fifth in ASU school history.
- **96 all-purpose yards** needed for Eno Benjamin to reach 3,000 career all-purpose yards (currently at 2,904).
- **43 rushing yards** for Eno Benjamin to pass D.J. Foster for 13th in ASU career history (currently at 2,313 yards behind Foster's 2,355 total from 2012-15).
- **162 rushing yards** for Eno Benjamin to pass Ben Malone for 13th in ASU career history (currently at 2,313 yards behind Malone's 2,474 total from 1971-73).
- **2 games with a catch** needed for Kyle Williams to move into fifth in ASU history in consecutive games with a receptions (currently at 34, needs 36).
- **1 game with 10+ points** needed for ASU to set the FBS modern record record for most consecutive games scoring in double digits (currently at 125 games, tied with Louisiana Tech's streak of 125 games from 2008-2018).

The Sun Devils have scored double-digit points in 125 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the FBS and matching the longest streak in the modern era with Louisiana Tech (125 straight games from 2008-2018). ASU also holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 140 straight games. The Sun Devils last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 77 of those games (55.0 percent).

The Sun Devils have been at their best in ending halves, posting a +27 point differential in the second quarter and +21 in the fourth quarter. **ASU's +48 combined scoring differential in the second and fourth quarters** is exceptional, but ASU will look to bolster their effort to start halves after sitting at a -2 point differential in the first (-14) and third (+12) quarters combined this season. The Sun Devils are 20th nationally in allowing just 9.6 points per first half this season against FBS opponents and just 3.6 points per second quarter (11th nationally). ASU hasn't allowed a first quarter score in 8 of 17 games in the Edwards era and is 7-1 in those games.

ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 13 of 19 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of 43 previous games dating back in a span from 2013-17. ASU is ranked 16th in the country in allowing just 17.7 points per game. **ASU has allowed just seven plays over 30 yards this season**, a total tied for 16th nationally. The Sun Devils are one of just 10 teams nationally to not give up a 50-yard play on the year. ASU's run defense has been especially efficient, leading the FBS with only 10 plays allowed over 10 yards this season.

Eno Benjamin leads the Pac-12 with seven rushing touchdowns this season (13th nationally). **His nine total touchdowns are also 9th nationally and lead the league**. He is third in the league (35th nationally) with 119.0 all-purpose yards per game. Benjamin has scored at least one touchdown in eight consecutive games, dating back to last season. Benjamin has continued to do his part to make people miss this year, forcing 36 missed tackles this season - a total tied for 11th nationally among running backs. In Pac-12 games, Benjamin has earned 224 yards after contact, the most in the Pac-12 and tied for 15th among FBS running backs since Week 4.

ASU has played eight total games decided by four points or less in the Herm Edwards era, the most in the FBS since the start of last year. ASU's six wins in games of four points or less (6-2) is tied with Nevada for the best in college football the past two seasons. The Sun Devils have now played 13 games under Herm Edwards decided by a touchdown or less, going 7-6 in those contests. Those 13 games are tied for the most in the country with Texas since the start of last season. ASU's seven wins in those games are second in the FBS in that time behind Texas.

Aashari Crosswell has not been credited with a missed tackle on a running play this season, **marking him one of just 10 safeties in the Power Five to lay such a claim. His one missed tackle on the season, period, is tied with six others for fewest among Power Five safeties**. Crosswell has allowed just 17 yards after the catch this season, the third-lowest total among Pac-12 safeties and 31st nationally - and his 64 total passing yards allowed are also third-lowest in the conference. Crosswell's five forced incompletions this season are most among Pac-12 safeties and third among Power Five safeties.

#10THINGS (Twitter-Friendly Notes)

- Brandon Aiyuk is second in the FBS with 424 yards after the catch and has forced 11 missed tackles this year - good for fourth in the nation.
- On run defense, Evan Fields has recorded a 9.8 run-stop percentage that leads the league and is second in the FBS. His 16 defensive stops this season are seventh among Power Five safeties.
- In Pac-12 games, @eno_benjamin5 has earned 224 yards after contact, the most in the Pac-12 and tied for 15th among FBS running backs since Week 4. His 106.7 yards per game in Pac-12 games only are currently tops in the league.
- Aashari Crosswell (@YkgAashari) has been credited with just one missed tackle this season, a total that ranks is tied for first among Power Five safeties.
- Arizona State holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 10 points, currently doing so in 125 straight games - a total that also matches the FBS modern era with Louisiana Tech (2008-2018).
- @JayD_5 has accounted for 474 total yards of offense and four touchdowns in the fourth quarter of games (401 passing, 73 rushing). His 401 passing yards in the fourth quarter are 7th nationally while his 19 passing first downs are 8th.
- Senior wide receiver @kylewilliamsVI has caught at least one pass in 34 consecutive games, dating back to his freshman season - a total good for sixth in ASU history and the fourth longest active streak in the FBS.
- ASU has allowed just seven plays over 30 yards this season, a total tied for 16th nationally. The Sun Devils are one of just 10 teams nationally to not give up a 50-yard play on the year.
- ASU is looking to win its third ROAD game against a ranked opponent in a single season, a feat it has never accomplished in program history.
- The Sun Devils are looking to maintain their national lead with a third win over a ranked team and become the only team in the nation to do that with all three wins coming on the road.



MANDRAKE OF THE WEEK

- » The Mandrake has quickly become a figure of Herm Edwards' lore at Arizona State. The Mandrake embodies strength, speed, athleticism, aggressive, high motor, and mental toughness.
- » This season, the Sun Devils have unveiled a special Mandrake practice uniform to be worn by a player that most embodies these characteristics in the previous weekend's game.
- » For the second consecutive week, an offensive player was rewarded with the honor after Brandon Aiyuk's 196-yard performance against Washington State last weekend.
- » The 196 receiving yards were the 11th-highest for a Sun Devil receiver in history. His 86-yard touchdown catch and run was the eighth longest completion in program history and the longest pass play for the Sun Devils since Mike Bercovici's 93-yard pass to Demario Richard in 2015.
- » His three receiving touchdowns are the most by a Sun Devil since N'keal Harry's caught three touchdowns against Utah in 2018.
- » It was the first time Washington State has given up three receiving touchdowns to one player since Eastern Washington's Cooper Kupp had three back in 2016.
- » Aiyuk's 28.0 yard per catch average was easily the highest single-game per-catch average of a Sun Devil recording seven catches in a game, passing N'Keal Harry's previous record of 24.3 in 2017. It is the highest yards-per-catch average in a single game for any receiver in ASU history with 7 or more catches in a game.
- » Aiyuk had 116 yards after the catch on Saturday, the most of any FBS receiver while his 196 receiving yards were the third-most among FBS receivers for the weekend.

FOCUSING ON FOOTBALL

- » The Sun Devil secondary features two players ranked among the Top-11 in the Pac-12 in overall grading from Pro Focus Football. Aashari Crosswell is the eighth-highest graded defensive player in the league, regardless of position, with a score of 79.3. Kobe Williams is the 11th-highest graded defender in the league at 78.6.
- » Crosswell is the 27th-highest graded safety in the country overall and the 38th-highest graded in coverage (77.4) while Williams is the 33rd-highest graded corner in covers in the FBS thus far.
- » Khaylan Kearsse-Thomas is the 31st-highest graded linebacker in the country in run defense with a score of 80.6.
- » Evan Fields is the 35th-highest graded safety in the FBS as a pass rushers (65.2).
- » Despite being one of less than 20 true freshman offensive linemen to start in the country, Dohnovan West is the 30th-highest graded offensive player in the Pac-12 this season (72.1) and the 36th highest-graded guard in the nation. However, that grade includes his first two weeks as a center as well. Since shifting to guard in Week 3, West has been the seventh-highest graded guard in the country.
- » Brandon Aiyuk has been ASU's highest graded offensive player this season, coming in as the 212th-highest graded offensive player in the Pac-12 and third-highest graded wide receiver (78.8), an overall score that ranks him 35th among receivers nationally.
- » Cohl Cabral has embraced his transition back to center, has the 24th-best overall grade among centers in the FBS (69.9). However, that includes his first two games at left tackle. Since shifting to center in Week 3, Cabral is the 17th-highest graded center nationally.

ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS

- » Eno Benjamin leads the Pac-12 with seven rushing touchdowns this season (13th nationally). His nine total touchdowns are also 9th nationally and lead the league. He is third in the league (35th nationally) with 119.0 all-purpose yards per game.
- » Benjamin has scored at least one touchdown in eight consecutive games, dating back to last season.
- » Benjamin has continued to do his part to make people miss this year, forcing 36 missed tackles this season - a total tied for 11th nationally among running backs.
- » In Pac-12 games, Benjamin has earned 224 yards after contact, the most in the Pac-12 and tied for 15th among FBS running backs since Week 4. His 106.7 yards per game in Pac-12 games only are currently tops in the league.
- » With six rushing touchdowns in Pac-12 games, Benjamin is tied for first nationally among all running backs in conference-only rushing TDs.

- » Benjamin has recorded 12 career games with at least 100 rushing yards - tied for 6th in program history with Leon Burton and J.R. Redmond.
- » He has rushed for 9 first downs this season when the team is facing third down - tied for 17th nationally.
- » Benjamin has played 164 snaps in passing routes this season, the third-highest total among FBS running backs and his 28 targets are tied for 4th. His 183 receiving yards this season are 8th among all FBS running backs.
- » Benjamin became the 20th Sun Devil in program history to reach 2,000 rushing yards with his effort against Colorado. The junior has 2,176 rushing yards in his career and is one of just five three-year players to find themselves in the 2,000-yard club (Mario Bates, Ben Malone, Art Malone and Woody Green).

DAAAAMNNNN DANIELS

- » Jayden Daniels is 11th nationally and first in the Pac-12 in pass yards per completion (14.50) while his 9.15 yards per pass attempt are 12th in the FBS. He is 13th in the FBS (second in the Pac-12) with 301.3 yards of total offense per game - tops among all FBS freshmen. His 1,610 passing yards and 268.3 passing yards per game are both 19th in the FBS.
- » The true freshmen is tied for 5th nationally in fewest interceptions with only one to date. He is 30th nationally with a passing efficiency of 153.8.
- » Daniels has been exceptional on third downs this season, with his 444 passing yards on third downs good for 12th in the country. His 175.49 passer rating on third down is 13th nationally while throwing for 19 first downs - the 21st-best total in the FBS.
- » In addition, Daniels has rushed for eight first downs on third downs this season - tied for 25th in the nation.
- » Daniels has accounted for 474 total yards of offense and four touchdowns in the fourth quarter of games (401 passing, 73 rushing). His 401 passing yards in the fourth quarter are 7th nationally while his 19 passing first downs are 8th.
- » While under pressure this season, Daniels has posted the third-highest NFL passer rating of any quarterback in the FBS (tops in the Pac-12) at 121.3. For reference, the national average is 69.1.
- » When pressured, he has been accurate on 76.5 percent of his throws - a total good for third in the FBS.
- » Daniels has done his part to escape pressure as shown by his 30 QB scrambles this season, a total that is tied for 2nd among FBS quarterbacks. His 271 yards on the ground - excluding quarterback sacks - are 27th among FBS quarterbacks.

NOT THE AVERAGE FRESHMAN

- » Daniels became the first true freshman quarterback in program history to start the first game of the season.
- » Daniels broke the Sun Devil record for passing yards in a first career game in the season opener, which was previously 160 by Jeff Krohn in 2000. It should be noted that this includes just a first career GAME appearance, not first career start.
- » Daniels became the third freshman in ASU history to win his first career start, joining John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974) as the only other QB's to win their first career starts as freshmen.
- » With his 72-yard touchdown pass to Eno Benjamin in the fourth quarter against Sacramento State, Daniels became the first ASU quarterback ever to throw a touchdown pass over 70 yards in consecutive games (had a 77-yard pass to Brandon Aiyuk in Week One).
- » Only 10 times in ASU history has a freshman quarterback recorded a 300+ yard passing performance, of which Daniels now has three.



KEEP IT CLOSE

- » ASU has played eight total games decided by four points or less in the Herm Edwards era, the most in the FBS since the start of last year.
- » ASU's six wins in games of four points or less (6-2) is tied with Nevada for the best in college football the past two seasons.
- » The Sun Devils have now played 13 games under Herm Edwards decided by a touchdown or less, going 7-6 in those contests. Those 13 games are tied for the most in the country with Texas since the start of last season.
- » ASU's seven wins in those games are second in the FBS in that time behind Texas.
- » ASU has played four consecutive games decided by a touchdown or less - four of which decided by four points or less.

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » The Devils have turned the ball over just four times this season - the 5th-lowest total in the FBS. ASU is 27th nationally in turnover margin this season (0.50).
- » ASU has outscored opponents 691-358 in points off takeaways since 2012. ASU has padded that stat this season, outscoring the opposition 24-3.
- » Since 2012, ASU has scored 66.8 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (115 of 172) while finding the end zone 86 times in that span (50.0 percent).
- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 50.8 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (61 of 120) with 46 touchdowns (38.3 percent).

LOCKING IT DOWN

- » ASU has allowed just seven plays over 30 yards this season, a total tied for 16th nationally. The Sun Devils are one of just 10 teams nationally to not give up a 50-yard play on the year.
- » ASU's run defense has been especially efficient, leading the country with only 10 rushing plays allowed over 10 yards this season. With just two rushing plays over 20 yards allowed this season, ASU is fifth in the country.
- » In 2018, ASU was tied for 11th nationally in allowing just 8 plays over 40 yards, an area the Devils had struggled in in previous seasons (allowing 20, 16, 30, 21 in the previous four seasons and finishing 103rd, 79th, 128th, 110th, respectively). ASU was also tied for 9th nationally in allowing just 3 plays of over 50 yards on the year after sitting in the bottom 10 nationally in the previous four years..
- » In 2018, The Devils gave up just 22 plays over 30 yards, tied for 34th-fewest nationally. In the previous four years, ASU had given up 38, 44, 40, 40 such plays, ranked 116th, 124th, 117th and 119th.
- » In 2018, ASU was tied for 13th nationally for fewest passing plays over 40 yards allowed last season, allowing just five. ASU was 90th in the category the previous year with 12 such plays allowed and 127th in 2016 with 22 passing plays over 40 yards allowed.

KEEP 'EM OFF THE BOARD

- » ASU is 16th in the country and third in the Pac-12 in allowing just 17.7 points per game. The Sun Devils allowed just 25.5 points per game last season, good for 53rd nationally. The totals are notable as ASU was 103rd nationally at 32.8 points per game allowed in 2017 and had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior to the marked improvement the past two seasons.
- » The Sun Devils are 20th nationally in allowing just 9.6 points per first half this season against FBS opponents and just 3.6 points per second quarter (11th nationally).
- » ASU has held four opponents under 20 points through six games, a feat it hadn't achieved since 2014. The next milestone would be six such games, which ASU accomplished in 2012.
- » ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 13 of 19 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of 43 previous games dating back in a span from 2013-17.
- » ASU hasn't allowed a first quarter score in 8 of 17 games in the Edwards era and is 7-1 in those games. ASU allowed just 5.3 points per first quarter last season, good for 44th nationally. In 2017, ASU allowed 6.7 first quarter points per game - the 82nd worst tally nationally.

NO FLY ZONE

- » Kobe Williams is the 11th-highest graded defender in the league at 77.3 and the 33rd-highest graded corner in the country.
- » Williams has only been thrown at just 18 times this season - tied for the 18th-lowest total among corners that have played at least 50 percent of the coverage snaps this season.
- » Williams has allowed just 109 yards in coverage thus far, the 35th-lowest total among the nations corners.
- » Jack Jones' five pass breakups against Washington State are the most by an FBS player this season. He was a part of 12 pass breakups by the Sun Devils - the fifth highest total in the FBS this season and the first time ASU posted 10 or more since 2011.
- » ASU's 35 total passes defended this season are tied for 19th in the country.

MIDDLE OF THE LINE-UP

- » Linebacker Khaylan Kearse-Thomas finds himself as the 23rd-highest graded linebacker in the country on run defense with a 82.3 score.
- » Darien Butler's 11 quarterback pressures this season are the fourth-most among Pac-12 linebackers and tied for 26th among all Power Five linebackers.
- » Kearse-Thomas is credited with 19 defensive "stops" this season, tied for sninth among Pac-12 linebackers while Butler is not far behind him in 11th with 18.
- » Butler - the first true sophomore captain in ASU school history - has been credited with just three missed tackles this season this season, tied for the 7th-lowest total in the Pac-12 and the 27th-lowest tally among Power Five linebackers.

SAFETY VALVE

- » Aashari Crosswell is the eighth-highest graded defensive player in the league, regardless of position, with a score of 79.3 Crosswell is the 27th-highest graded safety in the country overall and the 38th-highest graded in coverage (77.4).
- » Crosswell has not been credited with a missed tackle on a running play this season, marking him one of just 10 safeties in the Power Five to lay such a claim. His one missed tackle on the season, period, is tied with six others for fewest among Power Five safeties.
- » Crosswell has allowed just 17 yards after the catch this season, the third-lowest total among Pac-12 safeties and 31st nationally - and his 64 total passing yards allowed are also third-lowest in the conference.
- » Crosswell's five forced incompletions this season are most among Pac-12 safeties and third among Power Five safeties. Fellow Sun Devil safety Cam Phillips is second in the Pac-12 and fourth in the Power Five with four forced incompletions.
- » Evan Fields has 16 total defensive "stops" this season, a total that leads all safeties in the Pac-12 and tied for 7th among Power Five safeties in the FBS.
- » On run defense this season, Fields has recorded 13 total defensive "stops" to lead all Pac-12 safeties and sixth nationally. His 9.8 run-stop percentage also leads the league and is second in the FBS.
- » When he plays within eight yards of the line of scrimmage at the snap, Fields has recorded a 12.8 run-stop percentage - second in the FBS.

BRANDON AI-YAC

- » WR Brandon Aiyuk is second in the FBS in yards after the catch with 424 this season while his 13.7 yards after the catch per reception are the fourth-most nationally.
- » He has helped that cause by forcing 11 missed tackles after the catch this year - good for 4th among FBS receivers.
- » All five of his touchdown receptions in 2019 have been for more than 30 yards (77 yards vs. Kent State, 53 yards vs. Colorado, 40 yards vs. WSU, 86 yards vs. WSU, 33 yards vs. WSU). He is averaging 54.0 yards per catch on his average longest individual catch per game.
- » Aiyuk is 9th nationally and 2nd in the Pac-12 with 651 receiving yards on the year and his 108.5 receiving yards per game are also ninth in the FBS and second in the league.
- » At 21.00 yards per reception, Aiyuk is first in the Pac-12 and 18th nationally in the category. His 8 plays over 25 yards are 10th nationally.
- » In five of the first six games this season, Aiyuk has had at least one catch over 40 yards.
- » Aiyuk's 86-yard touchdown reception against Washington State is the longest passing play/



score by a Sun Devil since Demario Richard's 93-yard catch and run against New Mexico in 2015. It was the eighth-longest catch in ASU history.

- » His 196 total receiving yards in the Washington State contest with the 11th-most in Sun Devil history. His 28.0 yard per catch average in the game was easily the highest single-game per-catch average of a Sun Devil recording seven catches in a game, passing N'Keal Harry's previous record of 24.3 in 2017. It is the highest yards-per-catch average in a single game for any receiver in ASU history with 7 or more catches in a game.
- » The senior is currently 10th nationally and second in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yards at 141.33 per game.
- » After collecting just 10 catches for 178 yards and one touchdown in his first eight games as a Sun Devil, Aiyuk has emerged as a go-to target over the past 11 games, totaling 53 catches for 847 yards and seven touchdowns.

NOBODY'S BUSINESS BUT THE TURKS

- » Michael Turk's 46.5 yards per punt average on 27 punts this season is 11th in the FBS and leads the Pac-12.
- » Turk has pinned 16 punts inside the 20, tied for the 5th-highest total nationally.
- » The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Turk on Aug. 29 vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average vs. Alabama on punts of 56, 65, 62, 61 and 60 for 304 yards. Turks punted five times for 315 yards with boots of 64, 62, 65, 49 and 75 in his Sun Devil debut.
- » Turk crushed Sun Devils school records for punting average, breaking the previous school record for average on five punts of 55.0 by Danny White in 1972. Turk's 63.0 yards per punt would have set records for every minimum number of punts in a game with the closest being Tony Lorick's 59.3 yards per punt on three punts in 1962.
- » Turk's 75-yarder to in the opener was tied for the seventh-longest punt in school history and remains the second-longest punt in the FBS this season.

Z'S PEDIGREE

- » Cristian Zendejas has quickly added his name to the ASU family legacy in two games at placekicker, following his dad (Luis Zendejas 1981-84) and uncle (Alan Zendejas 1987-89). Luis Zendejas is the former all-time leading scorer in Sun Devil history before he was passed in 2016 by Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez.
- » Zendejas was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week for his effort against Sacramento State as he became the first Sun Devil kicker since 2016 to make four field goals in a game, when Zane Gonzalez kicked four against UTSA. The four field goals are tied for sixth in a single game in school history.
- » Zendejas is 11-for-14 on field goals this season and is 17-for-17 on extra points. His 11 field goals are tied for eighth nationally.
- » Zendejas has three field goals over 40 yards this season, tied for 17th in the country and his five field goals from 30-39 yards are tied for third in the country.

KEEPING MOMENTUM

- » The Sun Devils have scored double-digit points in 125 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the FBS and matching the longest streak in the modern era of football with Louisiana Tech (125 straight games from 2008-2018).
- » ASU also holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 140 straight games. The Sun Devils last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 77 of those games (55.0 percent).
- » The Sun Devils have won at least seven games in five of the last seven seasons.
- » Sun Devil Football has had one of the top home field advantages in the FBS in the last six seasons, recording a 38-12 record at Sun Devil Stadium since 2012. The 38 wins are tied for 18th nationally in that time while the 12 losses are the 12th-fewest in the FBS since 2012.

THE KIDS WILL BE ALRIGHT

- » All told, 29 true or redshirt freshmen have played for the Sun Devils this year.
- » Five true freshmen have started a game for ASU, tied the fourth-highest total in the nation behind Alabama and UMASS (7) and Stanford (6).
- » Freshmen are responsible for 1,473 of ASU 1,884 total yards of total offense this season, a 78.1 percentage that ranks behind only Ole Miss (2,189 of 2,628/83.3 percent).
- » Overall, ASU has 40 true freshmen on the roster (sixth in the FBS) and 14 redshirt freshmen. The 54 total freshmen equates to 52.4 percent of ASU's roster of 103 - the fourth-highest percentage of a roster in the FBS behind only Oklahoma State (57.1), UCLA (52.8) and Virginia Tech (52.5)
- » The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) - the most ever in the modern era at ASU. That was the third-highest total in the country behind only Clemson (38 - 27/11) and Baylor (35 - 20/15).
- » Jayden Daniels became the first TRUE freshman quarterback to start for the Sun Devils on Opening Day in ASU's modern era (freshmen became eligible to play in 1972).
- » Daniels is just the sixth true freshman to start any game at quarterback in ASU history, joining Dillon Sterling-Cole (2016), Brock Osweiler (2009), Jake Plummer (1993), John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974).
- » For the first time in program history, a freshman was named a team captain after Herm Edwards dubbed true freshman quarterback/athlete Ethan Long as special teams captain before the season. Additionally, Darien Butler will be the first true sophomore captain in program history after the linebacker was named captain for the team's defense. Prior to this season, no player that had been with the program for less than three years had ever been named a team captain in ASU history.
- » Arizona State is the only team in the country starting two true freshmen on its offensive line.
