#### DEVILS HEAD TO TUCSON SEEKING T-CUP POINT

TEMPE - The Sun Devil women's tennis team heads to Tucson this Saturday for its final regular season matchup against in-state rival Arizona for a coveted Territorial Cup Series point.

"This is a big weekend for the T-Cup," coach Sheila McInerney said. "I think we're down right now but we've got a chance to get a point and men's tennis and softball both have a chance too. It's a big deal. I've been here a long time, so I'm smart enough to know you want to beat U of A."

In addition to the T-Cup point, the Sun Devils are looking to improve to 15-6 on the season, which would give them their fifth 15-win season in six years. For Arizona, the match is the squad's final opportunity to claim a conference win before the Pac-12 tournament next weekend.

"It's always big playing the rival," McInerney said. "It's certainly more difficult to play them on the road versus home, so we're expecting a tough match. They've struggled a bit in the league as far as wins, but individually they've competed well against some of the girls we've played this year. They've had a couple of kids in and out of the lineup, but they're healthy now."

There's more than just a T-Cup point up for grabs for the Devils as well. A win Saturday would cement them as the three-seed heading into the conference tournament and would keep them in the hunt for another NCAA Tournament berth.

"It's a big match for us because you always want to start out in the quarterfinals," McInerney said. "That coupled with it being the last match and of course the rivalry with U of A, it makes this one a little more intense for both teams."

To get it done in Tucson, the Devils will go with a roster of student-athletes who will be making their first trip to the school down South and only two active Devils who have participated in the rivalry in Nicole Fossa Huergo and Savannah Slayman.

"I think our kids are looking forward to it and it'll be interesting because it's the first time any of them have been down there," McInerney said. "It might be the first time since I've been here we've had anything like that. You tell them about [Tucson], but until they get down there and experience it, it's hard for them to understand it."

ASU has been the more successful of the two programs head-to-head, winning the last four meetings and going 22-6 (44-19 overall) against the Wildcats since the new millennium.

In the last dual, the Devils swept Arizona 4-0 in Tempe to close out the 2017 season, and last time in Tucson, ASU won 7-0 in 2016.

The Sun Devils and Wildcats hit the courts at the LaNelle Robson Tennis Center Saturday at 1 p.m. Live results and a live stream will be available on arizonawildcats.com.

#### **RANKINGS UPDATE**

After splitting last weekend's matchups in Los Angeles, the Sun Devils moved up one spot in the latest Oracle/ITA Rankings to No. 32.

The Devils also moved up to the third spot out of eight in the Pac-12 Conference, behind No. 20 Stanford and No. 13 UCLA, where they also stand in the conference heading into the final matches of the regular season before the seeding for the Pac-12 Tournament in Ojai, California.

The duo of Lauryn John-Baptiste and Ilze Hattingh moved up to No. 17 from last week's No. 21 with a 15-1 record on the season. It is ASU's highest doubles ranking since the tandem of Alex Osborne and Ebony Panoho finished the 2016 season ranked 14th.

Court two's duo of Savannah Slaysman and Tereza Kolarova checked in at No. 51, and John-Baptiste also found herself on the singles ranking at 53.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

The Sun Devils split last weekend in Los Angeles, falling to No. 15 UCLA, 4-0 on Friday, April 14 before besting No. 41 USC, 4-3 on Saturday.

In the win against the Trojans, Senior Nicole Fossa Huergo scored the matchclinching point for the Sun Devils, defeating Becca Weissman.

The No. 21 duo of Ilze Hattingh and Lauryn John-Baptiste and doubles team Fossa Huergo and Savannah Slaysman each won their respective matches, 6-4 and 6-2, to secure the doubles point for the Sun Devils.

Also bringing in points for the Devils were Sasa Klancek and Tereza Kolarova. Friday's match-up at UCLA saw Hattingh/John-Baptiste with their first defeat of the season, dropping the match to No. 11 Jada Hart and Terri Fleming of the Bruins.

#### **T-CUP UPDATE**

The Sun Devils stand a point behind the Wildcats, 5.5 to 6.5, in the 2017-18 Territorial Cup Series following Arizona's victory in Beach Volleyball last night in Tempe.

This weekend is a big one for the T-Cup and could turn the tide for the Devils with home events against U of A in softball and men's tennis and the women's tennis team heading to Tucson.

With three points on the line and just a few areas of competition left, this weekend is vital for both schools' Territorial Cup dreams.

#### **GET TO KNOW THE WILDCATS**

The season hasn't been what the Arizona Wildcats expected under 16thyear coach Vicky Maes as the Cats haven't earned a win in conference play this year and sit at 9-14 overall.

Although Arizona will be seeking its first conference win against bitter rival Arizona State, Maes' squad has been competitive and has unfortunately come up just short on several occasions.

After winning their first seven of nine, including a win against Wisconsin in Las Vegas, the Cats found themselves in a 2-12 spell with close defeats to Colorado and Utah on the road.

Zona has played the exact same Pac-12 schedule as the Devils, going 0-9 while ASU sits in third in the conference with a record of 6-3.

Last weekend in Los Angeles, they fell to UCLA, 4-0 and to USC, 4-0. Arizona's last win over ASU in Tucson came in 2014.

In the past 33 years, Sheila McInerney has seen a vast amount of change at Arizona State, from new athletic directors, new head coaches, schools added to the conference, and numerous renovations to athletic facilities. Through the countless changes across Arizona State, McInerney has continued to lead the women's tennis program in a successful direction heading into her 33rd season

In Arizona State's history, no coach has the number of accolades that Sheila McInerney has accumulated during her 33-year tenure as a Sun Devil. Since her first season as head coach in 1985, Sun Devil women's tennis has won 495 matches, advanced to 31 of 32 NCAA Tournaments, including 29 straight, and has finished each season in the top 38 nationally. That's the second most wins by any Arizona State coach in school history. In the 2016 season, McInerney was named the Southwest Region Coach of the Year by the ITA, as well as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year. She also was awarded the 2016 ITA Meritorious Service Award, which is given to an ITA coach who has gone "above and beyond" in their commitment and contributions to the ITA and college tennis in general.

In recent years, Arizona State's tennis program has continued to thrive on and off the court. On the court, the Sun Devils have 86 wins against ranked opponents since 2008. Leading the way for the tennis program have been 45 All-Americans and 41 All-Pac-12 student-athletes. Of these integral players in Arizona State's history, there have been 40 players ranked in the Top 50 of the singles season-end ranking and 21 in the Top 25 of the doubles season-end ranking.

In the classroom, McInerney has recruited bright student-athletes. She has had four Academic All-Americans, 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes (since 2002), and 80 Academic All-Pac 12 student-athletes (since 1991). Of those 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes, four were named in 2015 – Alexandra Osborne, Aubria Solares, Gussie O'Sullivan and Kassidy Jump. Her players have had majors such

as Bioscience, Business
Management, Criminal
Justice and Criminology,
English, Journalism,
Kinesiology, Marketing,
Political Science, and
Sociology.

McInerney has also been fundamental in helping development to players' reach high achievements in the NČAA. Among the achievements include Jacqueline Cako named Arizona State Female Athlete of the Year (2013), Michelle Brycki awarded Cissie Leary ITA National Sportsmanship Award  $(20\dot{1}2),$ Kelcy McKenna selected as the



Pac-12 Post-Graduate Scholar (2011), four singles and four doubles All-Americans since 2009, 14 players ranked in the singles season-end ranking and seven doubles teams ranked in the doubles season-end ranking since 2009.

Prior to coming to Arizona State, McInerney served as assistant women's tennis coach at the University of Southern California during the 1983-84 season, in which the Trojans were NCAA finalists. In addition to her success as a collegiate coach, McInerney has traveled with various USTA junior and national teams. At the 1986 Goodwill Games, McInerney coached the team to gold and silver medals. In 1987, she led the U.S. Pan American Games doubles squad to a gold medal.

McInerney attended USC, where she captained the Trojans during her senior season. The four-time All-American also was a four-time Trojan Spirit Award winner, as voted by her teammates. The Trojans won three national championships during McInerney's collegiate career, and she was the national collegiate doubles runner-up three times and a singles semifinalist in 1977. McInerney collected a half-dozen USTA national titles and was a member of the 1977-80 USTA Junior Federation Cup team. As a professional, she played on the major international tour, earning a world ranking in the top 75. McInerney competed at three grand slam venues -- Wimbledon, French Open and the U.S. Open where she reached the round of 32. She also served a short term as assistant pro at the highly acclaimed L.A. Tennis Club.

McInerney earned a bachelor's degree in public relations from the University of Southern California in 1980. A member of the Dean's List at USC, she won the USC Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the USC Junior Student-Athlete and Senior Student-Athlete awards.

Head coach Sheila McInerney announced in 2015 that Matt Langley would join the program as an assistant coach and in 2017, Langley was named associate head coach.

Langley joined the Sun Devils from Middle Tennessee State University, his alma mater, where he most recently served as assistant coach for its women's tennis program. At MTSU, Langley helped coach the Blue Raiders to one of their best seasons in program history, recording a 19-5 overall record, 7-1 in Conference USA competition.

A member of the MTSU men's tennis team from 2009-12, Langley was a two-year co-captain and three-time Sun Belt Conference Champion, earning two Most Outstanding Player honors at the Sun Belt Conference Championships. Langley also recorded three career appearances at the NCAA Championships.

Langley graduated from MTSU with a degree in exercise science, and was a two-time Academic All-American and ITA Scholar-Athlete.



Ebony Panoho is a graduate student assistant for the Sun Devil women's tennis program and former Sun Devil tennis standout. The Brisbane. Australia native won the Pac-12 doubles championship in her senior season with teammate Alexandra Osborne to give ASU its first conference doubles title. She once partnered with 2003 U.S. Open champion Andy Roddick for a mixed doubles exhibition match.
