### UP NEXT

For the second consecutive Sunday (10 a.m. MST on Sept. 12) the Sun Devil soccer team (6-1) will be facing an unbeaten team when it takes on No. 21 Texas Tech (6-0-1) in Tucson in a game that can be seen on Pac-12 Arizona. Last Sunday, ASU was defeated by then-No. 17/current No. 7 LSU, 5-2, in a battle of 5-0 teams. ASU bounced back with a 1-0 win on Thursday against Nebraska.

### IN THE RANKINGS

The Sun Devils went from receiving votes up to No. 21 (Aug. 31) in the United Soccer Coaches Top 25 after their road wins at Mississippi State(1-0) and at UAB (5-1). ASU was downgraded to receiving votes after last week's loss to No. 17 LSU. ASU also fell one spot to No. 4 in the Pacific Regional behind fellow Pac-12 schools UCLA (No. 1) and Stanford (No. 2) and Oregon State (No. 3).

### SERIES NOTES

The Sun Devils have dropped all four of their prior meetings with Texas Tech. Like Sunday's game, all four of the meetings have taken place in Tucson.

### WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- This was the second straight season ASU started 5-0. On Sept. 5, ASU was looking for its first 6-0 start since 2000 before being defeated by No. 17 LSU, 5-2. Last season ASU would go on to start the season 6-0-2 before its first loss in the season's ninth game. ASU's best winning streak to start a season came in 2000 when it started 9-0. That season ASU won a school record 14 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.
- Nicole Douglas scored the 34th goal of her career in Thursday's win over Nebraska. Douglas is currently in third place on ASU's all-time list in both career goals (34) and career points (82) and is tied for fourth place with Elizabeth Bogus in career GW goals (12).
- Douglas (seven goals) & fellow senior forward Olivia Nguyen (five goals) have combined for 12 of ASU's 21 goals. Although Douglas and Nguyen have accounted for the majority of the goals, the Sun Devils have had nine different players find the back of the net.
- In the national rankings (through games played Sept. 9), the Sun Devils are among the top 25 teams in the nation in shots on goal per game (11th/10.3), assists per game (17th/3.1), points per game (23rd/9.1) and scoring offense (24th/3.0 goals per game).
- Individually speaking, Nicole Douglas is 3rd in the nation in GW goals (3), 6th in points per game (2.6), 7th in goals per game (1.0) and shots on goal per game (2.7) and 8th in shots per game (5.0). Nguyen is 2nd in the nation in GW goals (2). Both of them came in the first week of the season in ASU's wins over Central Arkansas (6-1) and Southeastern Louisiana (2-1). Nguyen helped ASU stave off Southeastern Louisiana's upset bid after she scored two goals in just under 11 minutes, including the game winner in the 90th minute.
- The Sun Devils started the season with a pair of true freshman goalkeepers – Julia Ortega and Birta Gudlaugs each played a half in ASU's first two games – as the team was forced to start the season without returning two-year starter Giulia Cascaperan due to injury. Gudlaugs has

### ASU HEAD COACH GRAHAM WINKWORTH

- ASU Vice President for University Athletics and Athletics Director Ray Anderson announced Graham Winkworth as the new head coach of Sun Devil Women's Soccer in November of 2016.
- The Sun Devils had their best season under head coach Graham Winkworth in 2021 (2020 season), finishing the regular season with an 8-5-2 record and making a postseason run for the first time since 2014 and eighth in school history. ASU made it to the second round of the tournament to become the fifth ASU soccer team to advance to that stage in the NCAA Tournament.
- Winkworth and company boasted an undefeated non-conference slate last season, including an overtime comeback thriller at Grand Canyon to protect the streak. ASU continued its unbeaten streak through eight games and notched wins against UCLA, Stanford, and USC to become only the fourth team in history to beat all three programs in a single season. With a 4-4-2 record in Pac-12 Conference play, the Sun Devils finished in the middle of the table after being picked to finish last in the preseason poll.
- The Sun Devils scored 28 goals in 17 games, second-most in the Pac-12 Conference. ASU boasted one of the strongest defensive lines in the Pac-12, conceding only 16 goals and forcing ASU's keepers to make only 57 saves - fifth-fewest amongst Conference competitors.
- In 2019, Winkworth led his team to a dominant start to the season, securing five-straight wins for just the second time in program history, and carded their best start to a season since winning nine straight to start the 2000 season. The five-game win streak was the longest for the Sun Devils since 2014. ASU's strong non-conference performance helped the Pac-12 record the best-ever win percentage in conference play. Together, the league's 77-14-9 record for a .815 win percentage, the highest of any conference in the nation, and the highest non-conference win percentage by the league in Pac-12 history.
- Winkworth's 2019 squad combined to score 33 goals on the year, marking the best offensive output for the Sun Devils since scoring 34 goals in 2015. Sun Devil Women's Soccer capped the season with a 6-11-3 record to push Winkworth's overall ASU record to 21-29-7.
- In his second season at the helm, Winkworth achieved his best record at ASU, finishing with a 10-7-1 record. During the conference schedule, ASU swept all of the Pacific Northwest Pac-12 schools (Washington, Washington State, Oregon, Oregon State) in four consecutive games (two home and two away).
- Prior to his time with the Sun Devils, Winkworth spent four seasons transforming South Alabama women's soccer program into one of the top mid-major programs in the country and an emerging national power. Under Winkworth's direction, South Alabama set school records and program bests including qualifying for four-straight NCAA appearances, winning four straight Sun Belt Conference Championships, and earning the program's first top-25 national year-end ranking. A two-time Sun Belt Coach of the Year ('14, '15), Winkworth's student-athletes had a monopoly on the conference's top honors including four straight Sun Belt Freshmen of the Year, three Sun Belt Players of the Year, and three Sun Belt Defensive Players of the Year.
- In his first season as head coach of the Jaguars, Winkworth guided South Alabama to its most wins (14) since 1997 and the second-most wins in school history only to set the new program record for most wins (19) in 2014. The 2014 team also set school records for best winning percentage (.848), longest unbeaten streak (18), consecutive games scored (22) and shutouts (12). As evidence of South Alabama's transformation, in the five years prior to Winkworth's arrival, South Alabama had only one season with a finish above .500.
- Winkworth spent 10 seasons with North Alabama University, leading the Lions to a total of 111 wins, the most for a coach in school history. He also coached the program's first two All-Americans and led the program to its first NCAA post-season appearance.
- Winkworth began his coaching career in England with the Preston North End Football Club as an assistant with the Center of Excellence. He also served as an assistant coach at Cumberland (Tenn.) and Central Arkansas before North Alabama.
- Winkworth and his wife Jonna are parents to children Lucas, Caden, and Darbi.

played every minute of in four of ASU's last five games, including a pair of shutout wins at Mississippi State (Aug. 26) and vs. Nebraska in Tucson (Sept. 9).

- Freshman defender Olivia Coleman made her first career start in ASU's win vs. Nebraska (Sept. 9).
- The Sun Devils' defense has allowed an average of only 4.9 shots on goal per game while averaging 10.3 of their own. In their 5-2 loss to LSU on Sept. 5, the Sun Devils had more shots (22-17), more shots on goal (11-8) and a slight 4-3 advantage in corner kicks in the matchup of then-5-0 teams.
- ASU has overcome 1-0 deficits in three of their wins: vs. Central Arkansas, vs. Southeastern Louisiana and vs. CSUN. The Sun Devils would go on to wins those games by a combined score of 12-4.

### HEAD COACH GRAHAM WINKWORTH SAID...

The following is what ASU head coach Graham Winkworth had to say following Thursday's win over Nebraska.

"Superb effort from the team today. First half, I thought we were very good. I thought we created a lot of high-percentage chances, and I was really pleased with the football we were playing, combined with the heart and desire that the girls showed. (In the second half) we did not play as much of the football that we played in the first half, but the heart and desire was there for 90 minutes. And that's the number one thing we want as a Sun Devil, so really proud of the girls, really proud of their efforts, and I couldn't be happier. It is a great result against a really talented Nebraska team."

### DEVILS HAVE ACCUMULATED THREE PAC-12 POW AWARDS THIS SEASON

Nicole Douglas (Offensive POW/Week One), Lieske Carleer (Defensive POW/Week Two) and Birta Gudlaugs (goalkeeper of the week) have combined for three Pac-12 Player of the Week honors this season. Douglas opened the season with a pair of goals and assisted on three others to tie the second-highest, single-game point total in program history (seven) in helping lead the Sun Devils to a 6-1 win over Central Arkansas on Aug. 19.

Both Carleer and Gudlaugs played big roles in helping the Sun Devils capture road wins Mississippi State (1-0 on Aug. 26) and at UAB (5-1 on Aug. 29). Carleer played all but seven minutes of the two games and contributed to a defensive effort that allowed a single goal including a shutout at MSU and conceded only 13 shots in two games. Carleer helped ASU get off to a good start in the 5-1 win at UAB after the junior defender scored her first goal of the season in the 13th minute to give ASU an early 1-0 advantage. Gudlaugs earned the first shutout of her career in the win at Mississippi State. The true freshman keeper made eight saves in ASU's two wins and gave up a single goal in 180 minutes of play.
