## SUN DEVIL REWIND

The Sun Devils are coming off one of their worst weekends since the 2017-18 season, dropping both penalty-littered contests at then-No. 3 Minnesota State. ASU managed just a goal on the weekend, while playing shorthanded for 12.5 minutes on Saturday night. The weekend featured a total of 19 penalties against the Sun Devils and 32 penalties in total between the two teams.

JOHNNY WALKER was the lone goal scorer for the Sun Devils, netting his third in two games on Friday night in Mankato.

All-in-all, six of Minnesota State's nine goals were on special teams -- five on the power play and one shorthanded.

Head coach GREG POWERS will get an asset back in the lineup this week with the debut of freshman forward JAX MURRAY, who tallied 20 goals and 23 assists in 53 NAHL games with Fairbanks.

# **BEHIND ENEMY LINES**

Air Force is one of the Sun Devils most common opponents since ASU's arrival into the Division I ranks, as the two programs have met four times in the last three seasons. The Falcons hold the upper hand with a 3-1-0 record -- the only loss being the Sun Devils' first-ever victory over a ranked opponent in 2016-17 at Gila River Arena. Two seasons ago, ASU visited Cadet Ice Arena for the first time and dropped back-toback one-goal games.

Last weekend, Air Force traveled to then-No. 8 Notre Dame for the first series of its regular-season schedule. Air Force lost 3-4 on Friday and 1-6 on Sunday to start their season with a 0-2-0 overall record.

The Falcons are replacing their top four scorers from the 2018-19 season to graduation, and their three senior forwards -- Matt Pulver (2G), Brady Tomlak (1G, 1A), and Trevor Stone (2A) - have taken over that responsibility so far this season. Pulver, the leading goal scorer, boasts two of the team's four goals on the season.

Junior netminder Zack LaRocque notched a 4.56 goals against average and made 45 saves on 53 Notre Dame shots their opening weekend.

# FAMILIAR FOES

- Sun Devil junior JOHNNY WALKER and Falcon forward Marshall Bowery crossed paths during their NAHL careers in Topeka with the Roadrunners in 2015-16. That same year, fellow Air Force teammate Max Harper was also a part of that Roadrunner squad.
- ASU junior JACOB WILSON and Air Force sophomore d-man Keegan Mantaro likely shared time on the back end often while members of the USHL Champion Sioux City Musketeers in 2016-17. He also played with new Sun Devil forward WILLIE KNIERIM in Dubuque (USHL) the year prior in 2015-16.
- In 2016-17, freshman LOGAN JENUWINE and Air Force's Shawn Knowlton were teammates with the Aberdeen Wings (NAHL)
- Sophomore Sun Devil defenseman CONNOR STUART and junior Air Force defenseman Jacob Levin shared ice time with the Odessa Jackalopes (NAHL) for two seasons in 2015-16 and 2016-17. Falcon Pierce Pluemer also joined the two with the Jackalopes in 2015-16, while also splitting the season with JACOB WILSON of ASU with Sioux City that same year.
- Current Air Force junior Alex Mehnert and former Sun Devil defenseman were teammates as Fairbanks Ice Dogs back in 2015-16 for a season.
- Just 10 Sun Devils and 12 Falcons were in or a part of the last time these two programs met two years ago.

# **POWERING UP**

Coach Powers enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2019-20, and his 12th overall at the helm at ASU. The 2018-19 was one for the record books, as the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year finalist led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 213-107-24 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.
