### NORTHERN MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

#### NATIONAL RANKS

- Redshirt freshman Tanner Latsch leads the nation in goals (5) and PPGs (4) heading into the weekend. His six points also rank T5
- Andre Gbantous started the season right where he left off, recording six points in two games. His six points are also T5, and his four assists are T3 across the college landscape
- Among defensemen, Josh Zinger's four points (0g, 4a) are T9 across the collegiate landscape and T2 among defensemen who have only played two games
- Michael Van Unen continues to show he isn't afraid to get in front of pucks, as his nine blocks through two games are the most among players who have only played two games, and five back of the leader (14 blocks in four games)
- Northern has scored 10 goals through two contests, and its five goals/game ranks T5
- The Wildcats were effective in the faceoff circle, owning a 54.9% faceoff percentage, good for 11th nationally
- The 'Cats have scored six PPGs and own a PP% of 33.3%. The six goals rank third, and the PP% ranks T6

#### CATNIPS

- Tanner Latsch became only the second Wildcat in program history to score a hat-trick in his collegiate debut, joining Jeff Pyle who accomplished the feat against Manitoba on October 27, 1978. Latsch received CCHA Forward and Rookie of the Week honors
- Josh Zinger paced all CCHA skaters with four assists last week and led all conference defensemen with four assists, highlighted by a three-helper game against Minnesota Duluth on Friday, matching a single-game point high. Zinger received CCHA Defenseman of the Week honors
- Andre Gbantous posted a six-point weekend at UMD (2g, 4a). Gbantous has played 25 games in the month of October over his collegiate career, posting six goals and 20 assists for 26 points in those games, second most points and assists in the month of October among active skaters. Gbantous currently leads all active skaters in career points (130), assists (84), and is second in goals (46)

#### NOTES ON ARIZONA STATE

ASU comes into the weekend earning a home sweep against the No. 15/13 Merrimack Warriors, by scores of 1-0 in overtime and 4-2. The Sun Devils' production over the weekend largely came from its senior group, including graduate student Brian Chambers (0g, 3a), and seniors Matthew Kopperud (2g, 1a), Lukas Sillinger (1g, 1a), and Tim Lovell (0g, 2a). Sophomore goaltender TJ Semptimphelter played both games over the weekend, posting a solid 0.98 GAA and a 0.968 SV% with one shutout and 61 saves.

The trend for the Sun Devils through two games is scoring late, as through the opening weekend they have scored one goal in both the first and second periods combined, with four goals coming in the third period or overtime. It's no surprise that the Wildcats penalty kill was suspect through its first two games, but the 'Cats seem to have a good chance to get back on track, as the Sun Devils were just 2-14 (14.3%) on the power-play this past weekend.

The Wildcats have played Arizona State once in its history, and it came during the 2017-18 season when the 'Cats took a trip to the "Ice Vegas Invitational" on 1/5/2018, dropping the contest 7-3.

## WELCOMING THE NEW 'CATS

### THREE TRANSFERS JOIN THE 'CATS

#### Jeppe Urup

A 6'2" right-shot defenseman from Odense, Denmark, Urup joins the Wildcats from Sacred Heart University, where he registered 15 points in 54 games played over four years.

#### Jack Perbix

A 6'1" right-shot forward from Elk River, Minnesota, Perbix joins the Wildcats after playing all 29 games for the Western Michigan University Broncos in the 2022/23 season, where he tallied 19 points on six goals and 13 assists. Prior to Western Michigan, Perbix played three seasons at Minnesota, where he suited up for 103 games for the Golden Gophers. Perbix is a 2018 4th-round draft pick of the Anaheim Ducks.

#### Mitch Deelstra

A 6'0" left-shot forward from Wallace, Ontario, Deelstra joins the Wildcats as a transfer from Ferris State University. Deelstra comes into his fourth year of collegiate hockey off the back of career highs in goals (7) and points (13) in the 2022/23 season for the Bulldogs. Entering 2023-24, Deelstra has 36 points in 87 games.

### NORTHERN WELCOMES EIGHT NEW FRESHMEN

#### Viking Gustafsson Nyberg

A 6'6" left-shot defenseman from Sweden, Gustafsson joins the Wildcats from Leksands IF of the J20 Nationell, the highest-level junior ice hockey league in Sweden. In 42 games as an alternate captain last season, Gustafsson recorded six goals and 17 assists with a +24 rating. In two total seasons with Leksands, Gustafsson has recorded seven goals and 30 assists in 82 games.

#### Travis Hensrud

A 5'11" right-shot forward from Thunder Bay, Ontario, Hensrud joins the Wildcats after a successful season with the Steinbach Pistons of the Manitoba Junior Hockey League (MJHL). Hensrud is coming off a career year, tallying 72 points (35 goals, 37 assists) in 55 games, finishing third across the MJHL in total points and goals. Over three seasons with the Pistons, Hensrud recorded 111 points in 109 games.

#### Matvei Kabanov

A 5'11" right-shot forward from Togliatti, Russia, Kabanov joins the Wildcats from Amurskie Tigry of the MHL, a major junior ice hockey league in Eurasia. In the 2022/23 season, Kabanov amassed 57 points on 27 goals and 30 assists in 53 games, finishing first on his team in points, goals, and assists. Across the MHL, Kabanov finished fourth in assists and eighth in total points.

#### Kevin Marx Norén

A 6'1" right-shot winger from Knivsta, Sweden, Norén has played his entire career in the North American Hockey League (NAHL), most recently with the Minnesota Wilderness. In his first game with the Wilderness, Marx Norén scored four goals in a 7-3 victory, setting a single game team record for the Wilderness. He then went on to set new Wilderness marks in single-season goals with 33, and power play tallies with 14. Marx Norén was named to the All-NAHL 2nd Team, and to the All Midwest Division Team. He also represented the Midwest Division in the 2023 Top Prospects Tournament last February. In the 2022/23 season, Norén led the Nahl in goals (34), ppg (14), was second in game winning goals (7), and ninth in total points (60).

#### Michael Mesic

A 5'11" left-shot center from Plymouth, Michigan, Mesic played one season in the NAHL with the North Iowa Bulls in the 2021/22 season. During the regular season, Mesic led all rookies in goals (18), assists (31), points (49), ppg (3), shg (2), and gwg (2). Mesic also led the Bulls in points, was second in assists and third in goals. Mesic then shifted to the USHL for the 2022/23 season, the top junior ice hockey league sanctioned by USA Hockey, where he put up five goals and 14 assists.

#### Brendan Poshak

A 5'8" right-shot forward from Green Bay, Wisconsin, Poshak joins the Wildcats after two seasons with the Brooks Bandits in the AJHL, Canada's best Junior A league when it comes to development. In 58 games during the 2022/23 regular season, Poshak put up 24 goals and 26 assists for 50 points. Poshak continued his success in the post season, putting up 14 points and leading his team in assists (11) in 15 games.

#### Grant Slukynsky

A 6'0" right-shot forward from Warroad, Minnesota, Slukynsky has played his entire junior career in the USHL, his last two seasons with the Sioux City Muskateers and team captain last year. In the 2022/23 season, Slukynsky was second on the Muskateers in goals with 21 and third with 48 points. Slukynsky recorded one goal and two assists for three points in two playoff games, leading his team in points. Before joining the Fargo Force, Slukynsky had 39 goals and 62 assists for 101 points in 31 games for Warroad high school.

#### Carsen Stokes

A 5'10" netminder from Prior Lake, Minnesota, Stokes joins the Wildcats from the New Mexico Ice Wolves of the NAHL. In the 2022/23 season, Stokes posted a 17-13-3 record with a 2.90 GAA and a .908 SV%. Stokes made his junior hockey debut in 2020-21 with the North Iowa Bulls in the NA3HL. Stokes shined in the Fraser Cup Playoffs that season, as he led the Bulls to the Fraser Cup Championship with a 8-1-1 record in the playoffs. Stokes was named the Fraser Cup Championship Most Valuable Player and named to the All-Tournament Team. Stokes was named the NA3HL Rookie of the Year and also named to the 2020-21 All-NA3HL 2nd team that season.

# GRANT POTULNY | NMU WILDCATS HEAD COACH



Grant Potulny took over at the helm of NMU hockey prior to the 2017-18 season.

In the 2022-23 season, the Wildcats reached the 20-win plateau for the second consecutive season, finishing 21-17. The Wildcats defeated the Bemidji State Beavers on home ice to advance to the CCHA Semifinals and then shut out the Michigan Tech Huskies in Houghton to advance to the CCHA Finals for the second time in three years. Across the nation, the Wildcats had the second most short-handed goals with eight, had the fourth-best faceoff percentage at 54.5%, the fifth-best shooting percentage at 11.7%, the sixth-best penalty kill percentage at 86.0%, and the 11th best power play percentage at 23.5%. Potulny coached Andre Gbantous, who was tabbed to the All-CCHA Second Team, as well as Beni Halasz, Josh Zinger, and Joey Larson, who were all named to the CCHA All-Rookie Team. The Wildcats excelled in the classroom, with 15 student-athletes landing spots on the CCHA All-Academic Team.

In 2021-22, The Wildcats reached the 20-win plateau, finishing 20-16-1. Northern defeated Lake Superior State in the CCHA quarterfinals to advance to the semifinals. NMU had the 5th best scoring offense in the country, netting 3.54 goals/game. The Wildcats also had the 9th most power play goals with 34. Potulny coached Hank Crone, who was 2nd in the nation in points per game (1.38) and assists per game (0.97), and AJ Vanderbeck, who was 2nd in the nation in goals per game (0.67). Vanderbeck landed on the All-CCHA Second Team while rookie goaltender Charlie Glockner earned All-CCHA Rookie Team honors.

The Wildcats finished 2020-21 with a 11-17-1 overall record. NMU advanced to the WCHA championship game, defeating #13 nationally ranked Bowling Green and #3 ranked Minnesota State on the road in the playoffs. Joseph Nardi (Second Team), Andre Gbantous (Third Team), and Rico DiMatteo (Rookie Team) earned All-WCHA accolades for NMU.

The 2019-20 season saw the Potulny's Wildcat squad post an 18-16-4 record, as well as reaching as high as 15th in the national polls, a team-best during his tenure. NMU hosted the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Quarterfinals with a third-place regular season finish. Three Wildcats were honored with All-WCHA Team honors following his third season behind the bench, as well as four league Player of the Month honorees during the 2019-20 campaign.

In 2018-19, he guided the Wildcat to a second-straight 20-win season, the first time NMU Hockey saw back-to-back 20-win seasons since the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons accomplished the feat. NMU also hosted the Western Collegiate Athletic Conference Playoff Semifinals for a second year in a row. Under his guidance, the squad nearly swept postseason position of the year accolades, as they received Forward of the Year, Defenseman of the Year and Goaltender of the Year. Troy Loggins went on to earn WCHA Player of the Year and was named an All-American after leading the nation in power-play goals and finishing second in goals.

In his first season, Potulny orchestrated one of the best single-season turnarounds in the country with NMU recording a 25-15-3 record. Despite being picked to finish seventh in the preseason WCHA polls, the Wildcats finished second in the conference standings and advanced to the WCHA Championship Game which they hosted in the Berry Event Center. Potulny's efforts earned him WCHA Coach of the Year honors.

Potulny spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Minnesota, where he helped the Golden Gophers capture six regular-season conference titles and qualify for five NCAA tournaments.

A two-time NCAA and WCHA tournament champion during his playing career at Minnesota, Potulny has also experienced success on the international stage. In 2013 and 2017, he helped the United States win the IIHF World Junior Championships as an assistant coach.

At Minnesota, Potulny worked primarily with the forwards and power-play units and was heavily involved in recruiting. Under his guidance, the Gophers were one of the nation's top offensive teams.

In 2012-13, Minnesota led the Division I ranks with an average of 3.48 goals per game. Each of the past five seasons, the Gophers averaged more than three goals per game and never finished lower than 11th in the nation in this statistical category. They also excelled on the man advantage during that stretch, finishing first in the NCAA in power-play percentage in both 2012-13 (.246) and 2014-15 (.280).

Minnesota reached the NCAA Frozen Four in 2012 and 2014. The Gophers ultimately fell in the 2012 semifinals to eventual champion Boston College and in the 2014 finals to Union College.

Potulny recruited and coached 11 skaters who went on to play in the National Hockey League: Mark Alt, Nick Bjuggstad, Hudson Fasching, Erik Hauula, Seth Helgeson, Nick Leddy, Kyle Rau, Mike Reilly, Nate Schmidt, Jordan Schroeder and Brady Skjei. Under his watch, seven players also garnered All-American accolades.

From 2000 to 2004, Potulny played at Minnesota, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Sport Management and was the team's only three-year captain since 1947. As an assistant captain in 2002, he netted the game-winning goal in Minnesota's 4-3 overtime victory over Maine in the national championship game. He then captained the Gophers to a second national title the following campaign.

Potulny, who finished his collegiate career with 116 points (68g-48a) in 146 career games, went on to play five seasons at the professional level. From 2004 to 2007, he skated for the Ottawa Senators's American Hockey League affiliate in Binghamton, New York. He also spent time with the AHL's Hershey Bears (2007-08), Springfield Falcons (2007-08), San Antonio Rampage (2008-09) and Norfolk Admirals (2008-09).

A native of Grand Forks, North Dakota, Potulny was selected by the Ottawa Senators 157th overall in the 2000 NHL Entry Draft. During his time at Red River High School, he was a three-time North Dakota state champion. He spent two seasons with the United States Hockey League's Lincoln Stars and was named the 1999-00 Anderson Cup champion team's most valuable player.

Potulny and his wife, Melissa, have three children: Jack, Owen and Charlotte.

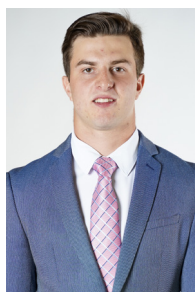

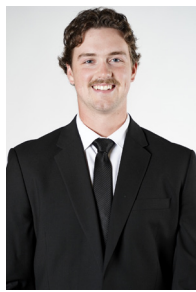
