UP NEXT

For the fourth time in five games and eighth time in its last 12 contests, the No. 19 Arizona State women's basketball team will face a Top 20 opponent (sixth Top 10 assignment) when it takes on third-ranked Oregon on Sunday (2 p.m. PT/3 p.m. MT) in Eugene, Ore.

The Sun Devils (16-7, 6-5 Pac-12) are currently in sixth place in the Pac-12 standings. They trail No. 9 Oregon State (19-4, 7-4) and No. 12 Arizona (18-4, 7-4), who are tied for fourth place, by one game; No. 6 Stanford (20-3, 9-2) and No. 10 UCLA (20-2, 9-2), who are tied for second place, by three games and first-place Oregon (21-2, 10-1) by four games.

The Sun Devils led Friday's game at Oregon State for more than 34 minutes and appeared to be on their way to their fifth-straight win over the Beavers after Ja'Tavia Tapley scored on a jumper to give ASU a 62-60 lead with 3.1 seconds left. The script flipped in a matter of moments as the Beavers used a four-point flurry in the final 3.1 seconds to come out on top 64-62 and end a four-game losing streak to the Sun Devils. ASU seniors Robbi Ryan (20 points, tied for game high), Reili Richardson (11 points), Tapley (10 points) and Jamie Ruden (eight points) combined to score 49 points against OSU. ASU played Friday's game without starting senior point guard Kiara Russell, who was injured in preparations leading up to the game and is being evaluated on a day-to-day basis.

Last month the Sun Devils made history in becoming the first unranked team to defeat consecutive Top 5 opponents when they knocked off then-No. 2 Oregon and then-No. 3 Oregon State. ASU outscored the Ducks 30-14 in the fourth quarter – which included a game-changing 14-0 run – to come out on top 72-66 on Jan. 10. Two days later, tied at 45-45 with the Beavers late in the game, ASU ended with a 10-2 run to defeat OSU 55-47. Tapley (15.0 ppg), Ryan (13.5 ppg), Richardson (11.0 ppg) and Ruden (10.5 ppg) all averaged double figures in the two wins. Tapley was named the Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's Player of the Week, the espnW National Player of the Week and Pac-12 Women's Basketball Player of the Week for her performance in the wins.

ASU would go on to win five straight games before falling at Arizona 59-53 on January 24. Ryan did everything she could to help the Sun Devils extend their winning streak as the senior guard scored a career-high 25 points, the most scored by a player against Arizona this season. Last week, the Sun Devils split their two contests, defeating USC 76-75 in the program's first ever triple overtime game and coming up short against No. 8 UCLA 70-61. Richardson (18.0 ppg) and Ryan (13.0 ppg) combined to average 31 points in the two games. Richardson scored a career-high 24 points – including the game-winning 3-pointer – in the victory over USC, the 500th win of head coach Charli Turner Thorne's career.

TV/RADIO

Sunday's game at Oregon will be televised by Pac-12 Network/Oregon (Krista Blunk, Ros Gold-Onwude). The game can also be heard on KDUS AM 1060 and on the Sun Devil Athletics TuneIn Channel. Pregame coverage will start at 2:30 p.m. MT. Veteran broadcaster and the state of Arizona's 2010 and 2019 Broadcaster of the Year Jeff Munn is in his 16th season as the voice of ASU women's basketball.

SERIES NOTES VERSUS OREGON

Although ASU has won 28 of the last 37 meetings, the Ducks have won four of the last five, sweeping the season series in 2018 (74-64 in Eugene/57-44 in Tempe) and 2019 (77-61 in Eugene/66-59 in Tempe). The Sun Devils came through with strong defensive efforts in each of the last three games played in Tempe. In last month's upset win, ASU held the Ducks and their top-ranked offense 23.5 points below their scoring average. Last season Oregon had its second-lowest point total (66 points) of the regular season in Tempe. In 2018, ASU held Oregon to its lowest point total of the season (57 points) in Tempe.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- For only the third time in the last two seasons, the Sun Devils will be entering a contest coming off back-to-back losses: 70-61 to then-No. 8 UCLA last Sunday and 64-62 at No. 9 Oregon State on Friday night. Over the last two seasons the Sun Devils are 13-3 when coming off a loss. In addition to its last two losses, ASU lost consecutive games last season on its trip to the Bay Area where it fell at Cal (69-60)/at Stanford (71-50). Last month ASU fell at UCLA (68-66 on Jan. 3) after dropping its Pac-12 opener to Arizona (58-53 on Dec. 29).
- ASU's five Pac-12 losses have been by an average of 4.8 points. Two of those losses were two-point setbacks on the road: 68-66 at then-unbeaten and No. 10 UCLA on Jan. 3 and 64-62 at No. 9 Oregon State on Friday.
- **Senior Reili Richardson** is currently in 2nd place on ASU's all-time list for career assists (527). She needs 12 assists to pass Briann January (538/2006-09) as ASU's all-time assists leader.
- In the last 10 games, senior **G Robbi Ryan** is averaging 15.1 ppg and is shooting 44 percent from beyond the arc (17-39). She has scored 17 or more points 5x, including a career-high 25 points at Arizona (Jan. 24). Nine of Ryan's 12 double-digit scoring efforts this season have come in the last 12 games. In Pac-12 games, Ryan is 14th in the conference in scoring (14.2 ppg) and tied for 10th in 3-pointers (1.6 per game).
- ASU is currently ranked among the top 40 in the nation in O-rebs per game (8th/16.3 rpg), reb margin (20th/+8.4) and scoring defense (38th/57.2 ppg). **Richardson** is No. 15 in the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.5).
- Graduate transfer **Tapley** has proven to be a difference maker for ASU. Named the Ann Meyers Drysdale/espnW/Pac-12 Player of the Week last month, Tapley has played in every game (21 starts) and currently leads the team in scoring (11.7 ppg), rebounds (6.6) and free throws made (55) and attempted (85), is 2nd in steals (1.3 spg), 3rd in FG pct. (47.1) and 5th in assists (1.5 apg).
- On average, ASU's bench has outscored the opponent's reserves 24.9-9.2. Top contributors include: Sr. **F Jamie Ruden**, who has averaged 7.0 ppg since returning from injury, Fr. **F Eboni Walker** (6.0 ppg, 4.8 rpg), Fr. **G Sara Bejedi** (4.4 ppg), So. **G Taya Hanson** (3.8 ppg), and So. **G Iris Mbulito** (4.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 2.4 apg).
- ASU has outrebounded all but four of its opponents (at USC, vs. Oregon, vs. Oregon St., at Arizona). It has scored 15 or more second chance points eight times, including a season-high 32 vs. Army. **Jayde Van Hyfte** (77 of 131) and **Walker** (68 of 111) both have more offensive than defensive rebounds.
- The Sun Devils have had 15 or fewer turnovers 9x in their last 11 games (averaged 11.2 TOs in those nine games. The exceptions were last week's contests vs. USC (26 turnovers) and vs. UCLA (16 turnovers).
- ASU has allowed 13 or fewer points in a quarter 43x (16x in single-digits).
- ASU has scored 20 or more points off turnovers nine times (9-0 in those games), including a season-high 36 vs. Army (Nov. 10).
- ASU is shooting 72.9 percent from the line in Pac-12 games, nearly eight percentage points higher than the 65.3 percent it shot in non-conference games.

POLLS

Both the coaches and media picked ASU to finish fifth in the Pac-12. ASU was ranked 20th in the preseason AP poll and 18th in the USA Today Sports Coaches Poll. It fell out of both polls after its 80-66 setback at Minnesota on Nov. 17. It returned to the polls on Jan. 13 (18th in AP/19th in coaches) following its upsets over No. 2 Oregon (Jan. 10) and No. 3 Oregon State (Jan. 12). ASU moved up to 16th (Jan. 20) in both polls after sweeping the Washington schools on the road. It fell to 19th in the AP and 20th in the coaches after falling at Arizona (Jan. 24). This week the Sun Devils are 19th and 21st after splitting with the LA schools.

TAPLEY EARNS NUMEROUS HONORS AFTER ASU'S HISTORICAL WEEKEND

Arizona State women's basketball senior forward Ja'Tavia Tapley was named the Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's Player of the Week after her performances in ASU's upset wins over No. 2 Oregon and No. 3 Oregon State last month. Tapley, who was also named the ESPNW National Player of the Week and Pac-12 Women's Basketball Player of the Week, led ASU in scoring (15.0 ppg), rebounds (6.0 rpg) and field goal percentage (48.0) in the two wins. She scored 16 points and grabbed six rebounds in the win over Oregon. Two days later, Tapley led all players with 14 points and six more rebounds in ASU's win over No. 3 Oregon State. In addition to her accomplishments on the offensive end, Tapley was part of an ASU defensive effort that held the Ducks and their top-ranked offense 23.5 points below their scoring average and kept the Beavers nearly 30 points below their scoring average of 76.5 points coming into the game.

SENIOR MOMENTS

ASU seniors Reili Richardson (16 points), Robbi Ryan (15 points), Ja'Tavia Tapley (eight points) and Jamie Ruden (seven points) were responsible for scoring all 46 of ASU's fourth-quarter points in its historic upsets of No. 2 Oregon (Jan. 10) and No. 3 Oregon State (Jan. 12). Ryan scored 11 of her team-high 17 points in the final period of the win over UO. Ruden added seven straight points late in the same quarter. Ruden also set the tone in the first quarter of the OSU win with seven straight to help ASU to a 13-4 lead. Tapley had six points in the final frame vs. OSU. In ASU's comeback win at Washington State (Jan. 19), Ryan and Tapley tied for the team lead with 20 points each. In the second half, Sun Devil seniors were responsible for 39 of the team's 41 second half points in helping ASU rally from a 10-point deficit. In ASU's contest at Arizona (Jan. 24), Ryan scored a career-high 25 points, the most scored by an individual against Arizona this season. In ASU's triple OT win over USC, Richardson scored 19 of her career-high 24 points in the second half and overtime, including the game-winning 3-pointer.

Ryan, who is averaging 15.1 ppg and shooting 44 percent from beyond the arc (17-39) in the last 10 games, has scored 17 or more points 5x, including career-high 25 points at Arizona (Jan. 24). Most recently, she led ASU with 20 points at Oregon State (Feb. 7).

REILI RICHARDSON NEARS CAREER ASSISTS RECORD

One of the biggest reasons for ASU's outstanding execution on the offensive end over the last three seasons is the play of senior guard Reili Richardson. In 2018, Richardson's exceptional play at the point helped the Sun Devils shatter the school record for fewest turnovers per game (11.3). Richardson concluded the 2017-18 season ranked No. 4 in the nation and first in the Pac-12 in assist-to-TO ratio (3.46). Last season Richardson finished No. 4 in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio and led the team and finished 6th in the Pac-12 in assists (5.0 apg). Richardson is currently in second place on ASU's all-time list for career assists (527). She needs 12 assists to pass Briann January (538/2006-09) and become ASU's all-time assists leader.

DOMINANT DEVIL DEFENSE

- Last season ASU led the Pac-12 in scoring defense (58.2 ppg) for the second straight season and the third time in five years.
- ASU has allowed an average of only 56.9 ppg since the start of the 2014-15 season (a span of 192 games). It has held the opposition to 50 or less points 60 times during that stretch (including six times this season). They are 59-1 in those contests. The only loss came at home to Cal (50-49) on Feb. 8, 2015. Over that same stretch (191 games), ASU has allowed the opposition to make only 28.8 percent of its attempts from long range.
- As of Feb. 8, ASU is 38th in the nation in scoring defense (57.2 ppg). It has allowed 13 or fewer points in quarter 43x this season (16x in single-digits).
- The 31 points scored by Maine on Nov. 29, 2019 represented the fewest given up by ASU since Harvard scored 29 on December 14, 2015.
- In historical back-to-back wins vs. No. 2 Oregon (Jan. 10) and No. 3 Oregon State (Jan. 12), ASU held the Ducks and their top-ranked offense 23.5 points below their scoring average and kept the Beavers nearly 30 points below their scoring average of 76.5 points coming into the game. The two teams combined to shoot 18 percent (7-38) from the beyond the arc.
- Outstanding team defense helped ASU make the greatest comeback in school history last season. Against Utah on Feb. 17, 2019, ASU held the Utes to only 3 points in the 4th quarter allowing the Sun Devils to rally from 18 down with a 20-0 run in the last 7:45 to win 60-58.

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP (10-2)

ASU started the 2019-20 campaign with pair of double-digit home wins, defeating Air Force 87-56 (Nov. 5) and Army 83-51 (Nov. 10). Leading the way were grad transfer senior post Ja'Tavia Tapley (14.5 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman post Jayde Van Hyfte (12.0 ppg, 6.0 rpg), who combined to average 26.5 ppg/13.0 rpg shot a collective 65.6 percent from the floor. ASU came up short in its first road contest of the season, falling at Minnesota 80-66 (Nov. 17), the first of nine games missed by starting senior center Jamie Ruden. ASU struggled from the floor, hitting only 34 percent of its shots against the Gophers. Tapley (16 points), sophomore guard Taya Hanson (career-high 14 points), Richardson (10 points) and senior guard Robbi Ryan (10 points) all scored in double figures for the Sun Devils, who outrebounded UM 43-34.

ASU rebounded with a 66-41 win over Cal Poly on Nov. 24. For the second time in three games, Tapley posted a career-high in scoring with 23 points while Van Hyfte pulled down a career-best 12 rebounds.

ASU spent Thanksgiving weekend in Estero, Fla., where it won two of three games – defeated Maine (57-31) and Middle Tennessee (61-60), lost to Purdue (59-52) – at the Gulf Coast Showcase. Hanson (9.3 ppg), Ryan (8.3 ppg), Tapley (7.3 ppg) and Walker (7.3 ppg) were ASU's top scorers for the weekend. Van Hyfte was ASU's leading rebounder (7.7 rpg). Van Hyfte (6-9/66.7 pct.) and Walker (10-20/50 pct.) combined to shoot 55 pct for the weekend.

A three-game homestand started with a pair of hard-fought wins over BYU (60-52 on Dec. 6) and Idaho State (74-69 in OT on Dec. 8). Tapley recorded double-doubles in both games (13.0 ppg/14.5 rpg) to lead ASU. Her 18 rebounds against BYU were the most by a Sun Devil in a single game in more than 20 years. Richardson had a (then) season-high 15 points against BYU and senior guard Kiara Russell had a career-high 14 points against ISU.

A sweep of the New Mexico schools followed as ASU defeated New Mexico at home 84-47 (Dec. 14) before going on the road to beat NMSU 70-47. Richardson (21 points) and freshman Sara Bejedi (16 points) both posted career highs against the Lobos while Tapley (12 points/12 rebs) recorded her third-straight double-double. Against NMSU, Walker scored a team/season-high 13 points while Tapley added 11 points.

ASU closed non-conference play with its sixth-straight win, a 70-55 triumph over Creighton, which came into the game No. 7 in the NCAA RPI. The highlight of the win was the return of Ruden, who showed little rust, scoring 11 points (5-9 FGs) after missing the previous nine games.

WHERE WE STARTED

The Sun Devils finished 15th in the nation in 2018-19, setting school records for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (six) and 20-win seasons (six). ASU won a pair of games in the 2019 NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the fifth time since 2005. ASU returned two starters this season in the form of guards Reili Richardson (started 89 of 101 games entering 2019-20) and Robbi Ryan (started 74 of 101 games entering 2019-20). ASU's three-year starter at point guard, Richardson concluded the 2018-19 season No. 4 in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio and led the team and finished 6th in the Pac-12 in assists (5.0 apg). Ryan, who earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention and Pac-12 All-Defensive honorable mention recognition from the league's coaches in 2018, started every game in 2018-19 and concluded the season second on the team in 3-pointers (29), third in scoring (7.2 ppg) and assists (1.8 apg) and fifth in rebounds (2.5 rpg). Sophomore guards Taya Hanson and Iris Mbulito both competed internationally over the summer for the second straight season. Representing Canada at the FIBA U19 World Cup in Thailand, Hanson averaged 10.7 points in the tournament's seven games and led Canada in its final contest with 15 points. Mbulito, who earned Pac-12 All-Freshman honorable mention honors last season, helped Spain claim a fifth-place finish at the FIBA U20 European Championship held in the Czech Republic. Mbulito averaged 10.4 points, 5.1 rebounds and 4.7 assists (second among all players) in the seven games. Also returning for ASU in the backcourt are senior Kiara Russell and sophomore Jamie Loera. Russell finished second on the team in assists (2.2 apg) and fifth in FG pct. (45.7) last season. Despite being limited to 11 games last season, Loera still had an impact as ASU's leader in 3-point FG percentage (50.0/9-18). The frontcourt is where the Sun Devils lost the most from last year's team as the squad had to replace its top three scorers and rebounders. Returning posts for the Sun Devils included senior Jamie Ruden (came into season averaging 6.1 ppg in 78 career games), junior Bre'yanna Sanders and sophomore Jayde Van Hyfte.

The Sun Devils started the new campaign with four newcomers. Senior post Ja'Tavia Tapley brought her talents to ASU after being a strong contributor for USC where she started 41 games the last three seasons (26 starts in 2018-19). Also debuting for the Sun Devils were freshman post Eboni Walker (state of Nevada's Gatorade Player of the Year in 2019) and freshman guards Sydnei Caldwell (2019 McDonald's All-American Game nominee from the state of New Jersey) and Sara Bejedi, who represented Finland at the World University Games in July 2019 and finished third among all players in scoring (16.2 ppg), second in steals (3.0 spg) and tied for third in 3-pointers per game (2.7).

BENCH PRODUCTION

Last season the Sun Devil bench more than doubled the production of the opposition's bench (23.2-11.4), an improvement over the prior season

when ASU had a 22.5-12.1 edge. Thus far in 2019-20, ASU has outscored the opposition's reserves 24.9-9.2. Providing the Sun Devils with productive minutes off the bench have been senior post Jamie Ruden, who has averaged 7.0 ppg since returning from injury, freshman post Eboni Walker (6.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg), freshman guard Sara Bejedi (4.4 ppg), sophomore guard Taya Hanson (3.8 ppg) and sophomore guard Iris Mbulito (4.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg, 2.4 apg).

2019-20 SUN DEVIL WBB GAME NOTES

NIKKI BLUE JOINS SUN DEVIL WBB COACHING STAFF

Former UCLA All-American and Washington Mystics guard Nikki Blue was named assistant coach last April. Blue joined Charli Turner Thorne's staff from nearby Grand Canyon University where she was the top assistant and recruiting coordinator the last two seasons. In that position she oversaw the program's domestic and international recruiting, scouting and planning. In her first season on staff, Blue's guidance was instrumental in guard Brie Mobley earning All-WAC first-team recognition. Blue arrived at GCU after spending three seasons as the top assistant at CSU Bakersfield, where she was part of a staff that helped the Roadrunners to a 2014 postseason appearance with 23 wins. Before Bakersfield, Blue spent six years as an assistant coach at UNLV, where she helped the Rebels land the Nevada Player of the Year out of high school and develop the Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year in 2008. As a player, Blue had a decorated career at UCLA where she earned Pac-10 first-team honors four times and was named a WBCA All-American in 2006. During her time at UCLA she played an integral role in leading the Bruins to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2006 Pac-10 Tournament title.

Blue was drafted by the WNBA's Washington Mystics in 2006. She played four seasons with the Mystics and one with the New York Liberty before playing two seasons internationally with FIBA (one in Turkey and one in Greece).

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Over the summer three Sun Devils – sophomores Taya Hanson and Iris Mbulito and freshman Sara Bejedi – participated in international competitions.

Taya Hanson was one of 12 athletes representing Canada at the FIBA U19 Women's Basketball World Cup 2019 in Bangkok, Thailand (July 20-28). Mbulito represented Spain at the FIBA U20 European Championship being held Aug. 3-11 in the Czech Republic. Bejedi just played for Finland at the World University Games in Italy, finishing third among all players in scoring (16.2 ppg), second in steals (3.0 spg) and tied for third in 3-pointers per game (2.7).

During the summer of 2018, Hanson, Mbulito and senior Kiara Russell all played in international competitions and were part of teams that won medals.

Mbulito earned Most Valuable Player honors as she helped Spain claim the gold medal at the 2018 FIBA U20 Women's European Championship in Sopron, Hungary. Mbulito posted a double-double (21 points, 12 rebounds) in the championship game in leading Spain to a convincing 69-50 win over Serbia. Mbulito, who had the game-winning basket with five seconds remaining in Spain's 51-50 quarterfinal win over France, averaged 9.7 points, 7.7 rebounds (team high), 2.4 assists and 1.6 steals in the tournament (seven games). She also recorded a double-double (12 points, 12 rebounds) in the win over France.

Russell was a member of the U.S. team that won the gold at the FISU America Games. Russell was part of a squad that defeated its four opponents – Mexico, Uruguay, Chile and Brazil – by an average of 43.8 points. The USA claimed the gold with a 59-42 win in the championship game. The FISU America Games are a multi-sport event sanctioned by the International University Sports Federation (FISU).

Hanson averaged 11.5 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.7 steals in helping lead Canada to a silver medal at the FIBA U18 Women's Americas Championship. Hanson came one rebound short of a double-double (14 points, nine rebounds) in Canada's opening game of the tournament against Colombia. She would surpass that performance with a 16-point, 11-rebound outing in Canada's quarterfinal victory over Chile. Canada won its first five contests by an average of 23.2 points before falling to the USA in the gold medal game.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Six Sun Devils were named to the 2019 Pac-12 Women's Basketball All-Academic teams. Headlining the list for ASU was Jamie Ruden, who earned first-team honors for the second consecutive year. Ruden (4.00 GPA in Psychology) was also named to the Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-District® VIII Second Team for the second straight year. ASU also had five players named Pac-12 honorable mention recognition: senior F Kianna Ibis, senior C Charnea Johnson-Chapman and guards Reili Richardson, Kiara Russell and Robbi Ryan.
- A league-high and school-record-tying eight Sun Devil WBB players were named to the Pac-12 Women's Basketball All-Academic teams in 2018. The eight awards tied the school record for most student-athletes on the Pac-12's All-Academic Team. The 2006-07 team also had eight (two on first team, one on second team and five honorable mention).
- In 2017 ASU finished among the nation's best in combined team GPA. With a final team GPA of 3.672 for the 2016-17 academic year the Sun Devils finished fifth in the nation (the highest ranking in program history) among Division I institutions in the WBCA's annual Academic Top 25.

HEAD COACH CHARLI TURNER THORNE



- The winningest coach in ASU women's basketball history and No. 2 in the Pac-12 in most career wins (460), Charli Turner Thorne is at the helm of an Arizona State program that has made it to the postseason 19 of the last 20 years, including a school record six consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (2014-19), two Elite Eight appearances and three Sweet 16 finishes. ASU's 14 NCAA Tournament appearances under Turner Thorne are 11 more than what ASU had in the 15 years prior to her arrival in Tempe. Has also earned a pair of gold medals with USA Basketball.
- The 2019-20 season is Turner Thorne's 23rd at ASU. She has 500 career wins in 26 seasons (includes 40 wins/three seasons at Northern Arizona).
- In 2018-19, Turner Thorne led ASU to a school record sixth consecutive NCAA appearance and 20-win season. The Sun Devils captured a pair of wins in the 2019 NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16.
- In 2017-18, ASU matched the school record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (five) and consecutive 20-win seasons (five). ASU won 22 games and made it to the second round of the NCAA Tournament while posting four Top 25 wins, including a 57-51 upset of No. 10 Oregon State in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament.
- In 2018 the Sun Devils also matched the school record with eight student-athletes named to the Pac-12's All-Academic Teams. ASU's No. 5 finish (3.672) on the WBCA's 2017 Academic Honor Roll represented the second time in three seasons the Sun Devils were among the top 10 programs in the country after placing seventh (3.558) for the 2014-15 academic year. Since the 1996-97 season, Turner Thorne's first season at ASU, the Sun Devils lead the Pac-12 in the number of first-team All-Academic conference awards (22) and the combined number of first- and second-team All-Academic conference awards (46).

• Despite injuries to key personnel and a young backcourt, Turner Thorne led ASU to its fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance (12th during ASU tenure) and fourth-consecutive 20-win season (12th during ASU tenure) in 2017. The Sun Devils made it to the second round of NAAs where they came up just short of upsetting eventual national champion South Carolina as the Sun Devils took a lead going into the final minute of the game.

• Was named the 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year (coaches and media), the second time she has been recognized with the honor (2001), after leading the Sun Devils to their second regular season Pac-12 championship. ASU would go on to earn its highest NCAA Tournament seed (No. 2) in program history. In 2016 ASU also tied the program records for most conference wins (16) and consecutive wins (15) and set the program record for most road wins (11).

• In 2014-15 Turner Thorne led ASU to 29 wins (second-highest total in school history), a second-place finish in the Pac-12 and a berth in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The 2014-15 Sun Devils posted the best overall start (18-1) and conference start (7-0) in school history and reached 20 wins faster than any other squad (22 games).

• In 2013-14, ASU recorded its 10th 20-win season (23) and its ninth NCAA Tournament berth since 2000-01. The Sun Devils advanced to the second round of the Tournament, the seventh time under Turner Thorne the Sun Devils have been among the final 32 teams or better.

• In 2011 led ASU to its sixth NCAA Tournament appearance in seven years and a third-place finish in the Pac-10, ASU's ninth top-3 conference finish in 11 seasons.

• In 2009 guided ASU to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons. ASU's final 26-9 record in 2008-09 included a school record 15-game winning streak (tied by 2016-17 team).

• In 2006-07 guided the Sun Devils to a school record 31 wins, including a school record 16 Pac-10 wins, and led them to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. ASU concluded the 2006-07 season ranked No. 8 in the final USA Today/ESPN coaches poll and No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll, their highest FINAL rankings in each of the respective polls in school history.

• In 2005-06 led ASU to a 25-7 record. During the season led ASU to its first Top 10 ranking in 22 years.



HEAD COACH CHARLI TURNER THORNE

- In 2004-05 directed ASU to a 24-10 record and its first NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 22 years.
- Led her 2001-02 team to a 25-9 record, which at the time had tied the single-season school record for most wins.
- Guided ASU to a share of the Pac-10 title in 2001 and the inaugural Pac-10 Tournament title in 2002, the first league championships in school history.
- Started her head coaching career at Northern Arizona where she spent three seasons (40-40 record from 1992/93 - 1995/96) and led NAU to consecutive winning seasons in 1994-95 and 1995-96, the first coach in school history to accomplish the feat.
- As a player, lettered four years at Stanford where she played three years under Tara VanDerveer.
- During the summer of 2009 Turner Thorne served as the head coach of the USA Women's World University Games Team which went undefeated (7-0) and captured the gold medal at the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia. It was Turner Thorne's second time working with USA Basketball. In the summer of 2007 Turner Thorne served as an assistant coach on USA Basketball's U21 World Championship Team which won the gold medal at the FIBA U21 World Championship in Moscow, Russia.
- Is a past president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) Executive Committee.
- Graduated from Stanford in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and later earned her master's degree in education from Washington in 1990.
- Turner Thorne and her husband, Will, have three sons – Conor (20), Liam (18) and Quinn (16).

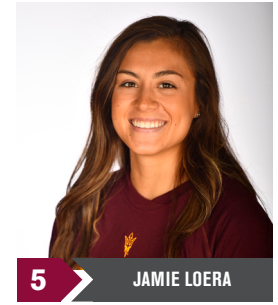
