## QUICK HITTERS

• California heads to Arizona State for the 2016 Pac-12 opener, marking the Golden Bears' first trip to Tempe since 2011. When these teams met last season on Nov. 28, the Bears enjoyed a 21-point comeback victory that was their largest since also coming back from a 21-point deficit in the 2007 Armed Forces Bowl against Air Force.

• Cal is now receiving votes in both the AP Top 25 (44) and the Amway Coaches Poll (6). The Bears are the 31st team listed in the AP Top 25 and tied for 41st in the Amway Coaches Poll.

• Cal ranks second in the nation in passing offense (453.0 ypg), third in total offense (580.3 ypg) and 10th in scoring offense (47.0 ppg).

• The Bears look to carry the momentum from last week's upset-victory over then-No. 11/16 Texas, 50-43. It was Cal's first win over a team ranked as high as No. 11 since a 2007 victory at No. 11 Oregon) and first win over a ranked team since a home victory over No. 25 UCLA in 2012.

• Davis Webb leads the nation in passing attempts (166), second in in passing TDs (13), passing yards (1,359), passing yards per game (453.0 ypg), completions (106) and completions per game (35.33 cp/g), and third in total offense (433.0 ypg), points responsible for (90) and points responsible for per game (30.7 ppg).

• Wide receiver Chad Hansen was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List on Tuesday. He currently leads the nation in receptions (40), per-game receptions (13.3 rpg), receiving yards (546) and per-game receiving yards (178.7 rpg). He is also tied for first in touchdown receptions (5). Hansen has 103 more receiving yards than his closest competitor. In each of the first three games of the season, Hansen hauled in double-digit receptions and 100 yards receiving. He was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week after his career-best 196 receiving yards last Saturday against Texas that rank seventh in school single-game history. While his current career-best of 14 receptions, which he has accumulated twice this season, rank tied for third. He also ranks sixth in the nation in all-purpose yardage (178.67).

• Sonny Dykes has led Cal to wins in 10 of its last 16 contests, and he has gone 15-13 since the Golden Bears' 1-11 season in 2013.

• Matt Anderson has made all 21 of his kick attempts this season, going 5-for-5 in field goals and 16-for-16 on extra points. Anderson equaled his career best with three successful field goal tries in the season0opener against Hawai'i while also adding a 6-of-6 performance on extra points for a career-best 15 total points scored. He has now made 17 straight field goals and 22 of his last 23 dating back to 2015. Anderson ranks tied second in the Pac-12 and tied for 18th nationally in field goals made (1.67 fgpg) as well as tied for first in both for field goal percentage (100.0).

## Webb Powers Highly-Ranked Offense

- Quarterback Davis Webb has accounted for 15 touchdowns in the first three games this season, 13 passing and two rushing. The 13 touchdown passes are rank second after his former Texas Tech teammate Patrick Mahomes. Through three games as Cal's starter, Webb is a combined 106-of-164 for 1359 yards with the 13 passing touchdowns and three interceptions for a 157.96 passer efficiency rating. Webb also ranks second in nation in completions per game (35.33).
- Webb's 72 attempts at San Diego State were a school record, breaking the mark of 64 by Goff vs. Northwestern on Aug. 31, 2013. Webb's 41 completions against the Aztecs were two shy of the school record. Also at SDSU, Webb's 522 passing yards ranked third on Cal's all-time single game list. Goff had a school-record 542 yards vs. Arizona State in 2015 and 527 yards at Washington State in 2014.
- Webb ranks first in the Pac-12 in passing yards per game (453.0 ypg) and total offense (433.0), while also ranking second nationally in passing yards per game and third in total offense.
- Webb has played in 26 career games with 17 starts dating back to his time at Texas Tech from 2013-15. His fourth passing touchdown against the Rainbow Warriors was also the 50th of his career, and he now boasts 59. He also surpassed 6,000 career passing yards at San Diego State, and has completed 565-of-913 passes (61.9%) with 6916 passing yards.
- After leading Cal to its upset victory over Texas last week, Webb was tabbed the Rose Bowl Game's Pac-12 Player of the Week as well as one of eight national Manning Award Stars of the Week, and has an opportunity to earn Manning Award Quarterback of the Week through fan voting that ends Thursday at 9 am PT.
- Webb has been named to watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award.

## Moving The Ball

- Cal produced 630 yards of total offense in the season debut against Hawai'i. The Bears have averaged 608.8 yards of total offense in their last seven games dating back to last season - 760 (Oregon State), 495 (Stanford), 680 (Arizona State), 586 (Air Force), 630 (Hawai'i), 604 (San Diego State) and 507 (Texas).
- Cal ranks first in the Pac-12 and third in the nation in total offense (580.3 ypg), first in the Pac-12 and second in the nation in passing offense (453.0) and second in the Pac-12 and tied for fourth in the nation in first downs (85). Cal also ranks 10th in the nation and third in the Pac-12 in scoring offense (47.0 ypg).
- Fifteen different Bears have caught at least one pass in three games this season, and six of them have caught at least seven passes. Chad Hansen leads the way with 40 catches through three games, which leads the nation. Jordan Veasy is averaging 19.4 yards per catch after hauling in a career-best three catches for 77 yards and a touchdown vs. Texas. Cal's longest play from scrimmage this season was a 59-yard touchdown reception from Davis Webb to Demetris Robertson at SDSU.
- Cal has run 261 plays, which ranks sixth nationally and first in the Pac-12.

## Hansen Continues Strong Season, Racks Up The Honors

- Chad currently leads the nation in per-game receptions (13.3 rpg) and receiving yards (178.7 rpg). He is also tied for first in touchdown receptions (5). Hansen has 103 more receiving yards than his closest competitor. In each of the first three games of the season, Hansen hauled in double-digit receptions and 100 yards receiving. He was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week on Sept. 19 after his career-best 196 receiving yards on 12 catches last Saturday against Texas that rank seventh in school single-game history. His current career-best of 14 receptions, which he has accumulated twice this season, ranks tied for third. (Chris Harper also had 14 catches for 231 yards vs. Washington State on Oct. 5, 2013). The all-time record is 16 for 245 yards by Geoff McArthur at Stanford in 2003, followed by 15 for 140 yards by Dameane Douglas at Oregon State in 1998. He also ranks sixth in the nation in all-purpose yardage (178.67).
- Hansen was named the MVP of the Sydney College Cup after he amassed 160 yards and two touchdowns against Hawai'i. He topped that with 190 receiving yards at San Diego State prior to his 196 receiving yards vs. Texas.
- Hansen was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List this week, as well.

## Muhammad With High All-Purpose Yardage Total

- Khalfani Muhammad leads the nation in kickoff return yards (357), ranks second in combined return yards and second in the Pac-12, 20th nationally in kick return average (27.5) after returning six kicks for a career-high 167 yards vs. Texas. Muhammad was Cal's leading rusher against Hawai'i, ending the day with 96 yards on 10 carries. Muhammad also totaled 212 yards of all-purpose yardage, coming up 12 yards shy of his personal best.
- Muhammad has totaled 3,525 career all-purpose yards and is 201 yards shy of making Cal's career all-purpose yardage top-10 list. Paul Jones (1975, 77-79) is 10th (3,726).
- Muhammad's efforts have helped Cal rank 23rd nationally and third in the Pac-12 in kick return average (25.67).

## Enwere Has Four Career TDs Against Texas

- Vic Enwere now has four career touchdowns against Texas, after scoring twice last Saturday and in the 2015 meeting. His only multi-rushing touchdown performances have come against Texas. Last Saturday's performance gave him his first two rushing touchdowns of the 2016 season and the 11th and 12th of his career. He ended the night with 18 carries for a career-high 110 yards and the two touchdowns. He added a career-long 54-yard run on the game's final drive.
- Enwere ranks third in the Pac-12 and 21st nationally with his average of 6.7 yards per rush.

## Stovall, Veasy Have Big Nights Vs. Longhorns

- Chad Hansen hasn't been the only Bear finding the end zone through three games, as Jordan Veasy and Melquise Stovall each scored their second touchdowns of the season against Texas, and they each set personal bests in receptions and receiving yards.
- Stovall caught six passes for 75 yards, while Veasy hauled in three catches for 77 yards.

## Anderson Ranks At The Top Of National Rankings

- Matt Anderson is 5-for-5 in field goals this season, including tying his career best with three successful tries in the season opener against Hawai'i, part of his career-best 15 points scored. He has now made 17 straight field goals and 20 of his last 21 dating back to 2015. He ranks second in the Pac-12 in field goals (1.67 fgpg) and tied for first in field goal percentage (100.0), while nationally he is tied for first in field goal percentage. He is also one of two Pac-12 kickers who have not missed a field goal yet in 2016.
- Anderson is also on the watch list for the 2016 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List. He is the first Cal player on the list since Vincenzo D'Amato was a national semifinalist in 2013. The Lou Groza Place-Kicker Award will announce 20 semifinalists Thursday, Nov. 3.

## Experienced O-Linemen Have Nearly 100 Career Starts

- Cal has four returning starters from 2015 on the offensive line that have started 91 games. Steven Moore (team-high 39 career starts), Chris Borrayo (32) and senior Dominic Granado (13) each started all 13 games in 2015, while junior Aaron Cochran made all six of his career starts a year ago and started vs. Texas last Saturday.
- Borrayo is also on the watch list for the 2016 Outland Trophy. The award annually honors the nation's top interior lineman for the second consecutive season.

## Explosive Plays

- The Cal offense has produced 25 plays of 20 or more yards in three games this season. The longest play from scrimmage was Davis Webb connecting with Demetris Robertson for a 59-yard touchdown at San Diego State. Vic Enwere garnered a 54-yard rush vs. Texas. Nine of the 20 pass plays over 20 yards have resulted in touchdowns. Individually, Chad Hansen has caught nine passes good for at least 20 yards.

## Defense Continues Turnovers Trend

- Cal's defense has continued its trend of turnovers through three games. Cal recovered two fumbles and Cameron Walker caught his third career interception against Hawai'i, while Evan Rambo recorded his first career interception against San Diego State and Luke Rubenzer, a native of Scottsdale, Ariz., recovered a fumble for the second straight game. Rubenzer, who also caught his third career INT vs. Texas, ranks tied for second in the nation and tied for first in the Pac-12 in fumble recoveries (2). Also against Texas, Chibuzo Nwokocha caught his first career interception.
- The Bears are tied for 13th in turnovers gained (7) and tied for 15th in fumbles recovered (3). Cal has gained 27 points off of turnovers this season, including a 24-0 advantage in the two wins this season. Cal currently enjoys a +3 turnover margin (7 gained, 4 lost), which ranks tied for 21st in the nation and tied for fourth in the Pac-12.

## Defense Tightens Up In the Clutch

- The Cal defense held Texas to 10 second-half points last Saturday, and neither team scored in the third quarter. The last time neither team scored in a quarter was the fourth quarter against Washington State last year. It was also the second time this season that the Bears held an opponent scoreless in a quarter (Hawai'i, 2nd).
- Texas' second-half point total was the lowest since the Bears held Washington State to seven second-half points last season. Cal also shut out San Diego State in the final three quarters of their 2015 meeting.

## Onside Kicks Go Bears' Way

- Cal is the only Pac-12 team to successfully recover its own onside kick and successfully recover an opponent's onside kick attempt. Hawai'i attempted an onside kick on the opening kickoff of the season, and Patrick Laird recovered it. At San Diego State, Derron Brown came up with the ball on Cal's onside kick attempt during the Bears' fourth-quarter comeback.

## Cal In The NFL

- Cal has a total of 27 former players on active 53-player NFL rosters as well as two coaches on NFL staffs as of Sept. 20, 2016. The group including five rookies in drafted players Jared Goff (Los Angeles), Trevor Davis (Green Bay) and Daniel Lasco (New Orleans), as well as undrafted free agents Stephen Anderson (Houston) and Bryce Treggs (Philadelphia).
- Goff's No. 1 overall selection led the way for four former Cal players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft last April along with Davis (Green Bay, fifth round, No. 163 overall), Lasco (New Orleans, seventh round, No. 237 overall) and Kenny Lawler (Seattle, seventh round, No. 243 overall). The four Cal players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft were the most since four Golden Bears were also chosen in 2013.
- Goff became the second player in school history to be selected No. 1 overall when he was chosen by the Los Angeles Rams on the opening of the draft (Steve Bartkowski, 1975). He also became Cal's sixth quarterback drafted in the first round and the 27th overall first-round draft pick in the history of the program.
- Former Cal players currently on NFL practice squads include Kyle Kragen (Denver) and Lawler (Seattle). Keenan Allen (San Diego) and Jordan Rigsbee (Carolina) are on injured reserve.

## Kabam Field at California Memorial Stadium

- The partnership formed between the University of California and Kabam, Inc., creates the largest field naming rights deal in college athletics with a 15-year contract valued at \$18 million. Beginning with the 2015 season, Cal's field became known as Kabam Field at California Memorial Stadium. Additional elements include a scholarship program, an internship program, speaking engagements and other partnerships on campus around innovation and technology. Kabam, the western world's leader in free-to-play mobile games for traditional players, was founded by Cal alumni, led by CEO Kevin Chou, and the genesis for the business plan that became Kabam arose in a Cal engineering class.

- Cal has four players with fathers or grandfathers that were student-athletes at Cal in Joe Castignani, Justin Dunn, David Garner and David Ortega Jr.
- Castignani's father, Jim, was a two-sport athlete at Cal and a member of the 1980 national championship rugby team. Dunn's father, Steve, played football at Cal and was on the field for "The Play." Garner's father was a four-year letterwinner at Cal from 1982-85 who made one of the five laterals during "The Play" as a freshman. Ortega's father, David, is in the Cal Athletic Hall of Fame and is the school's all-time tackles leader and currently works in the Cal public affairs office.

- Austin is heavily involved in community service with the long list of the groups he has worked with and activities he has participated in including College Sports Day, Oakland Tech High School Christmas Charity Event, Washington Elementary School Mentor, Boys & Girls Clubs of Oakland, St. Mark's Episcopal Church and San Quentin State Prison.
- Former Bear Stefan McClure was nominated for both awards in 2015.

- Running back Bug Rivera's uncle is Ron Rivera, currently head coach of the 2015 NFC Champion Carolina Panthers in the NFL and former Cal (1980-83) and Chicago Bears (1984-92) linebacker. Rivera was named the 2013 AP NFL Coach of the Year.
- Davis Webb's favorite sport is hockey. He grew up a Dallas Stars fan.
- Patrick Worstell is involved in the Wounded Warrior Project, selling bracelets to support wounded soldiers and their families.

After missing two seasons at USC due to injuries, Wilson transferred to Riverside Community College for the 2013 and 2014 campaign where he regained his form as a 2014 sophomore to earn all-conference honors and a spot in Cal's 2015 recruiting class. On July 25, 2016, Wilson and Brittany Tull, married in a ceremony held at San Francisco City Hall. The wedding was filmed by Pac-12 Networks as part of its Cal training camp show. DeVante and Brittany are the proud parents of a one year-old daughter, Avery.
- Defensive tackle James Looney, a transfer from Wake Forest, is the brother of Joe Looney, currently an offensive guard for the Dallas Cowboys.
- Offensive lineman Vincent Johnson's father is the chief operating officer at UC Davis Medical Center in Sacramento.
- Defensive tackle Marcus Manley enjoys graphic design as a hobby.

## HEAD COACH SONNY DYKES



Sonny Dykes has returned Cal football to national prominence and the postseason in his first three-plus seasons as the head coach in Berkeley. The team's seven-win turnaround from a 1-11 record in 2013 to an 8-5 mark in 2015 is tied for the second best in school history behind only the eight-win improvement from a 2-10 mark in 1946 to a 10-1 record in 1948.

That turnaround on the field is a huge reason Dykes earned a contact extension through the 2019 season with major improvements off the field as evidenced by a single-season Academic Progress Rate (APR) score that jumped

to 997 (out of a possible 1,000) in the spring of 2016 to take the Bears from worst to first in the Pac-12 in single-season APR since Dykes' arrival.

Dykes success has continued in his 22nd campaign as a collegiate football coach and his fourth at Cal in 2016 with the Golden Bears posting a 2-1 record heading into Saturday night's Pac-12 opener at Arizona State in Tempe. Dykes most recently led the Golden Bears to a 50-43 upset victory last Saturday over then-ranked No. 11/16 Texas in the 2016 home opener in Berkeley. The victory was Cal's first over a ranked team since a win over No. 25 UCLA in 2012 and the first over as highly of a ranked team since a victory at No. 11 Oregon in 2007. After the victory over Texas the Bears are receiving votes in both the AP Top 25 and Amway Coaches poll in latest rankings released the day after the Texas win.

Cal's 2016 offense is once again among the nation's best, ranking second nationally in passing offense (453.0), third in total offense (580.3 ypg) and 10th in scoring offense (47.0 ppg). Chad Hansen was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List on September 20 and currently leads the nation in receptions (40), per-game receptions (13.3 rpg), receiving yards (546) and per-game receiving yards (178.7 rpg). He is also tied for first in touchdown receptions (5). Davis Webb leads the country in passing attempts (166), while ranking second in passing TDs (13), passing yards (1,359), passing yards per game (453.0 ypg), completions (106) and completions per game (35.33 cpg), and third in total offense (433.0 ypg), points responsible for (90) and points responsible for per game (30.7 ppg).

Cal's eight wins in 2015 marked the school's most victories since 2009, capping the season with a win over Air Force at the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.

Cal began the 2015 season with five straight victories to mark the program's best start since the Bears were also 5-0 in 2007 before dropping four of their next six games to teams that were all ranked in the top 10 at some point in 2015 including top-five foes Oregon and Utah, with four of those five contests on the road. At one point, the Bears were in the national rankings for four consecutive weeks (Weeks 4-7) and moved as high as No. 19 in the Amway Coaches Poll and No. 20 in the AP Top 25 in Week 7. Cal's national rankings were its first since 2010 (coaches poll) and 2009 (AP Top 25).

But Cal finished strong with three wins in their final four contests over Oregon State, Arizona State and Air Force. The Bears secured their first winning season since 2011 with a dramatic 48-46 comeback victory that was won on the final play of the game in the regular-season finale against Arizona State after reaching bowl eligibility also for the first time since 2011 with their sixth victory of the season over Oregon State two weeks earlier.

Cal's offense flourished again in 2015, setting numerous records including single-season school marks in passing yardage (4,892), passing yards per game (376.3 ypg), passing touchdowns (44), total offense (6,879), total yards per game (529.2 ypg), total touchdowns (63), scoring offense (37.9 ppg, modern-era record), first downs (341) and first downs passing (201).

Cal also set single-game team records in 2015 with 760 yards of total offense and 36 first downs vs. Oregon State, while tying a modern-era school record with 10 extra-point attempts vs. Grambling State.

Quarterback Jared Goff, who was selected No. 1 overall in the 2016 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams, set 26 school records during his three seasons and started all 37 of Cal's games at quarterback from 2013-15 including career marks for passing yardage (12,220), touchdown passes (96), total offense (12,086) and completions (977). He also finished his career second on the school's all-time list for passing efficiency (143.95) behind only Aaron Rodgers. He ranks third all-time in Pac-12 history in passing yardage and fourth in passing touchdowns, while he is 26th nationally in passing yards and 27th in passing touchdowns.

Cal was the only team in the nation to have six receivers with 40 or more catches in 2015 – Kenny Lawler (52-658, 13 TD), Darius Powe (47-560, 8 TD), Bryce Treggs (45-956, 7 TD), Stephen Anderson (41-474, 2 TD), Trevor Davis (40-672, 2 TD) and Maurice Harris (40-558, 6 TD). The Bears also had three 500-yard rushers – Khalifani Muhammad (87-586, 1 TD), Vic Enwere (106-505, 8 TD) and Tre Watson (89-504, 3 TD) – to become the first college football team in recorded history to have six players with 40 or more receptions and three 500-yard rushers in the same season.

Cal also made tremendous improvements on defense in 2015 especially in the turnover numbers, tying for 11th in the nation in fumbles recovered (12), tying for 13th in turnovers gained (27) and tying for 23rd in interceptions (15). Cal was also tied for 25th nationally in defensive touchdowns with three. In the Pac-12, tied for the lead league in fumbles recovered while ranking tied for second in turnovers gained and interceptions.

Cal finished the 2014 season with a 5-7 overall record and a 3-6 mark in conference action to place fourth in the Pac-12 North for its highest showing since the 2011 team was also fourth. Cal won four of its first five games beginning with back-to-back victories over Northwestern and Sacramento

State. After a heartbreaking loss on a Hail Mary on the final play of the game in its Pac-12 opener at Arizona, the Bears recovered by scoring a combined 119 points in back-to-back thrilling and record-setting victories over Colorado (in double overtime) and at Washington State. Cal's 4-1 start and a 2-1 Pac-12 record put the Bears in first place (Pac-12 North) three games into the league schedule for the first time since 2006. Cal picked up its fifth and final win of the campaign at Oregon State.

Dykes came to Cal after spending three seasons at Louisiana Tech where he directed an offense that led the nation in both scoring offense (51.50 ppg) and total offense (577.92 ypg) during his final campaign at the helm in 2012. He spent three seasons as head coach for the Bulldogs, compiling a 22-15 record and winning 16 of 17 regular-season games during one stretch over the 2011 and 2012 schedules.

During his tenure at Louisiana Tech, Dykes engineered a turnaround for a program that improved all three seasons under his leadership. The Bulldogs were 4-8 the year before he arrived in 2009, then proceeded to finish 5-7, 8-5 and 9-3 in successive campaigns. In 2011, Louisiana Tech started just 1-4 before winning seven consecutive games to capture the Western Athletic Conference title – the team's first league championship in a decade – and a berth in the Poinsettia Bowl. Dykes was named the WAC Coach of the Year.

Dykes, the son of former longtime Texas Tech coach Spike Dykes, boasts a resume that includes additional stops in the Pac-12, Big 12 and SEC, where he served under such head coaches as Mike Stoops (Arizona), Mike Leach (Texas Tech) and Hal Mumme (Kentucky).

Born in Big Springs, Texas, Dykes received his bachelor's degree in history from Texas Tech in 1993 and was a member of the Red Raider baseball team for two seasons. He is married to the former Kate Golding and they have two daughters, Alta (Ally) and Charlotte (Charlie).

### MEMORIAL STADIUM LOCATION

Kabam Field at California Memorial Stadium is located on Piedmont Avenue in Berkeley between Bancroft Way and Hearst Avenue, adjacent to the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance at 2227 Piedmont Avenue.

### MEDIA PARKING

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the Recreation Sports Facility garage along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website ([pt.berkeley.edu](http://pt.berkeley.edu)) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.
