### SUN DEVIL LACROSSE PREVIEW

Arizona State lacrosse (7-9, 2-4) wraps up the 2024 regular season against UC Davis (9-6, 2-4) on Saturday, April 27 at Sun Devil Soccer/Lacrosse Stadium. The game is slated to start at 12 p.m. MST and will be shown on Arizona State Live Stream-3. The team will be celebrating its 12 seniors and graduates in a postgame ceremony.

The players set to be recognized in the team's postgame ceremony are: Shannon Urey, Lindsey Dean, Katie Haley, Gigi Gaspar, Bella Gaspar, Zoe Mazur, Flynn Murphy, Grace Lilla, Cate Duhig, Riley Forman, Rosie Davis, and Mina Scott.

#### Program History:

The two teams have faced off three times in program history, with ASU holding the 3-0 series edge. The Sun Devils have averaged 17 goals per game against the Aggies and have allowed just over 12 goals per game to UC Davis. Two of the wins have come on the road, while just one matchup has taken place in Tempe, a 19-14 win on March 21, 2021.

#### **Sun Devil Notes:**

Last week, the Sun Devils dropped a road contest to the University of Oregon by a final score of 20-12. Graduate attacker Shannon Urey led the offensive charge with three goals, while all three goalies on the defensive end saw time in net for ASU. A win on Saturday would clinch a spot in the Pac-12 Tournament next week for the Sun Devils. In the event of a loss to UC Davis, a loss by both California and SDU would send ASU to the Pac-12 Tournament.

#### **Scouting the Opponent:**

UC Davis has complied a 9-6 record this season and is in a four-way tie with ASU California, and Oregon for fourth place in the Pac-12. Seven of their nine wins have come at home, while the team owns a 2-2 record on the road. In a neutral site game at Sun Devil Soccer/Lacrosse Stadium against Niagara, the Aggies fell 13-9 in Tempe.

#### IN THE RECORD BOOKS:

-Senior attacker Mina Scott is 5th all-time in program history with 82. She is 6th all-time with 102 points in the program's career recordbooks behind Kaylon Buckner's 137.

-Sophomore attacker Lydia Oldknow is also on the list with Scott sitting at 54 career goals, which is 6th place in the career recordbooks. Oldknow is 7th in all-time points with 75. Her 20 career assists is also 8th all-time behind Kylie Kroeger's 20.

-Zoe Mazur's 126 draw controls have her on the single-season leaderboard, sitting at first all-time passing Maura Cissel's 111 draw controls which came in 2021. Mazur also holds the program's career draw control record with 289, 60 more than the next closest player.

#### **TEAM NOTABLES:**

-ASU earned their first road win of the season against SDSU on March 17. The Sun Devils outscored the Aztecs 10-2 in the second half to secure the 17-9 win.

-ASU has held opponents to a 85.5% clear percentage allowing 183 clears in 214 attempts.

-The Sun Devils' 3-0 start to the season was the first time in program history, but was halted after a loss to Stony Brook in the team's first road game.

#### **PLAYER NOTABLES:**

-Zoe Mazur's 8.40 draw controls per game are the ninth-best individual mark in the NCAA and second best in the Pac-12.

-Attackers Mina Scott (34) and Lydia Oldknow (38) each have 30+ goals on the season.

-in the Pac-12 opener against SDSU, junior goalkeeper Katie Vahle hit the 400 career save mark and was the second active goalie in the Pac-12 with 400 career saves.

-Oldknow has eight hat tricks this season, which leads the team.

#### PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

-Katie Vahle earned the first weekly award for ASU this season after being named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the week on 3/19.

-Zoe Mazur was named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week on 4/8/24 after recording 24 draw controls in two games. It was the first career Pac-12 honor for the graduate defender.

### Head Coach SECOND Season Loyola Maryland '15

Sun Devil Athletics hired Taryn VanThof as the new Lacrosse Head Coach, Vice President of University Athletics Ray Anderson announced on July 5, 2022

VanThof comes to Arizona State after an extremely successful six-year stint as the Assistant Coach at national power Florida. There she served as the Offensive Coor dinator, Goalie Coach, Draw Specialist, and Recruiting Coordinator for the Gators.

"Thank you to Vice President for University Athletics Ray Anderson and Senior Associate AD/SWA Christina Wombacher for this opportunity to lead the Sun Devil Lacrosse program," VanThof remarked. "I could not be more thrilled to coach at this extraordinary university."

Under the direction of VanThof and Head Coach Amanda O'Leary, Florida has emerged as one of the nation's premiere programs over the past six years. In 2022, the Gators made their fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament, earning a bid every year of VanThof's tenure. She arrives in Tempe coming off two straight appearances in the NCAA Quarterfinal Round (Elite Eight) with Florida.

"Taryn VanThof is a tremendous addition to the Sun Devil Family." Vice President of University Athletics Ray Anderson stated. "We identified her as the right person to lead this program on the rise because of her energy, passion, and desire to be at Arizona State."

Prior to launching a budding career in coaching, VanThof was a standout All-American midfielder at Loyola Maryland from 2011-15. She competed at the professional level as recently as the 2021 season in the Athletes Unlimited League.

While she was an assistant coach at Florida, the Gators combined to go an incredible 85-24 (78%) from 2017-22. That stretch included five NCAA Tournament appearances, six NCAA Tournament victories, all five possible Conference Tournament titles, and two of the three Elite Eight appearances in program history.

As the Offensive Coordinator, Goalie Coach, Draw Specialist, and Recruiting Coordinator, VanThof had an impact on all aspects of the program for the last six years. The Gators finished the season ranked in the Top-10 all but one of those seasons, proving to be one of the most consistent and well-coached teams in the country.

She began her coaching career at Rutgers in 2016, getting a taste of Big Ten action immediately following the completion of her collegiate career.
