#### DEVILS CHALLENGE NO. 22 DUCKS IN EUGENE

TEMPE - Arizona State took a short break from conference play a week ago to take down the LMU Lions in Tempe, but the Sun Devils are back on their tour of the Pacific Coast this weekend to take on a surging 22nd-ranked Oregon side.

"They've added a couple of new players and had a pretty great year," Sun Devil head coach Sheila McInerney said. "They've beaten three top-25 teams, so their ranking is justified, and they've got three lefties on their team, so that's a little unusual, but it just means we're going to have to play well like always."

The Ducks (10-6, 1-3 Pac-12) come into the match having dropped three straight to Washington State, UCLA and USC on consecutive weekends after winning their first Pac-12 matchup of the season against Washington back on March 9.

Oregon's No. 1 singles player, Alyssa Tobita, has had herself a great senior season and is ranked No. 102 in the most-recent Oracle/ITA rankings. With her rank and status on the squad, court one in Eugene will likely be another ranked match for true freshman Lauryn John-Baptiste.

It will be John-Baptiste's second-straight ranked opponent as last week she knocked off No. 30 Veronica Miroshnichenko of Loyola Marymount to clinch the match win for the Devils at home. The meeting in Tempe was John-Baptiste's fifth ranked foe of the season and she will take her 5-0 record into Eugene.

The Devils rebounded in a big way in doubles play a weekend ago, and ASU will look to keep that trend going against the Ducks, who also field one of the better doubles tandems in the Pac-12 and in the nation.

With unbeaten and newly ranked No. 48 John-Baptiste/Hattingh expected to be on court one, and No. 35 Kolarova/Slaysman on court two, the Devils have as good a chance as any school to take the doubles point from the Ducks.

"It really is one match at a time in the Pac-12," McInerney said. "There's not that much difference between the lot of the teams. This one is tricky because it's on the road, but I think we've played well on the road."

ASU has been dominant against the Ducks since the turn of the century, winning 16 of their last 17 matchups, including last year's meeting in Tempe, 4-1.

The match gets going at 11 a.m. PT and will be live streamed on GoDucks.com. For live results, check out GoDucks.com and follow @SunDevilWTennis on Twitter.

### TEAM NOTES

#### **RANKINGS UPDATE**

A successful home stint against Loyola Marymount and five-straight wins has Arizona State moving up in the latest Oracle/ITA poll where this week they sit at No. 35, two spots higher than last week's table.

Coming in at 35, the Devils are the fourth-highest ranked Pac-12 program of the six in the top-50. No. 13 UCLA and this weekend's opponent Oregon check in at Nos. 15 and 22, and defending conference champion Stanford is just outside the top-25 at 26.

Behind the Devils are No.39 Washington State and No. 47 Washington, and in the Pac-12 standings, ASU sits in second-place behind the Cardinal.

After defeating the, at the time, 30th-ranked woman in the NCAA from Loyola Marymount last weekend, Lauryn John-Baptiste soared 30 places to No. 56 in the latest singles rankings. Savannah Slaysman also improved her ranking to 108.

In doubles, the reassembled team of Kolarova/Slaysman checked in at No. 35, and unbeaten duo John-Baptiste/Hattingh jumped back into the rankings to 48 after they took down a ranked duo in their first outing on court one.

### **HOW SWEEP IT IS: JOHN-BAPTISTE. GEERTS TAKE PAC-12 HONORS**

The freshman England international, Lauryn John-Baptiste earned her second Pac-12 Player of the Week honor for her outstanding performance this past weekend at home that included a win over the 35th-ranked woman and 28th-ranked doubles duo in the NCAA.

With the honor, she becomes the first woman this season to claim it twice and only the third Pac-12 tennis player regardless of gender to claim multiple of-the-week honors in 2018 along with Geerts and one other player from Stanford.

John-Baptiste herself soared nearly 30 spots in the latest Oracle/ITA poll to 56 for her win in straight-sets over LMU's Veronica Miroshnichenko who actually entered the weekend clash at 30 and unbeaten against ranked opponents. Both the Sun Devil and Lion freshman met on court one with unblemished records against ranked women Saturday, and John-Baptiste kept hers intact, moving to 5-0 in 2018 with a 6-3, 6-2 win.

In doubles play, John-Baptiste is half of the No. 48 squad with fellow newcomer Ilze Hattingh. Together, they have amassed an 11-0 record and have been bumped up to court one for their stellar start to the season.

#### **FEARSOME SIXSOME**

Coming into the season, coach Sheila McInerney had a roster of eight, but after a couple of key injuries, the Sun Devils have been down to six for the spring season.

Of the six women taking the court for ASU, four of them are newcomers to the squad and only one is a senior in Nicole Fossa Huergo.

True freshmen Sasa Klanecek and Lauryn John-Baptiste have been the most successful of the six this season, compiling a combined dual-match record of 17-3, with Klanecek recording a perfect record through her 10 matches, until a loss to Colorado.

John-Baptiste has been playing on courts one and two in 2018 and has won all five of her matchups this year against ranked opponents.

Sophomore newcomer Ilze Hattingh is a part of a doubles tandem with John-Baptiste that hasn't dropped a match this season, and has helped the Sun Devils win 10 doubles points in their 13 matches.

One of the two active returners, Savannah Slaysman, got off to a slow start, but has since won six of her last 10 and losing only twice in that span.

Despite having a thin squad, the Devils have won 10 of 13 and sit near the top of the Pac-12 standings after the first two weeks of conference play. They took Nos. 11 and 19 Ohio State and Oklahoma State to the wire on the road, and remain unbeaten at the Whiteman Tennis Center in 2018.

### **GET TO KNOW THE DUCKS**

The No. 22 Ducks are led by fourth-year head coach Alison Silverio and Oregon came into 2018 off the wings of their best season in over a decade.

Their 10-6 record this season includes wins over No. 5 Northwestern, No. 28 Baylor, No. 50 William & Mary and hard-fought losses to No. 17 Kansas, No. 6 Georgia Tech and No. 2 Pepperdine.

U of O has one ranked woman in singles in Alyssa Tobita at No. 102, and two of the top 80 doubles squads in Tobita/Sangwan (24) and No. 80 Eshet/Sangwan.

In the past 33 years, Sheila McInerney has seen a vast amount of change at Arizona State, from new athletic directors, new head coaches, schools added to the conference, and numerous renovations to athletic facilities. Through the countless changes across Arizona State, McInerney has continued to lead the women's tennis program in a successful direction heading into her 33rd

In Arizona State's history, no coach has the number of accolades that Sheila McInerney has accumulated during her 33-year tenure as a Sun Devil. Since her first season as head coach in 1985, Sun Devil women's tennis has won 495 matches, advanced to 31 of 32 NCAA Tournaments, including 29 straight, and has finished each season in the top 38 nationally. That's the second most wins by any Arizona State coach in school history. In the 2016 season, McInerney was named the Southwest Region Coach of the Year by the ITA, as well as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year. She also was awarded the 2016 ITA Meritorious Service Award, which is given to an ITA coach who has gone "above and beyond" in their commitment and contributions to the ITA and college tennis in general.

In recent years, Arizona State's tennis program has continued to thrive on and off the court.On the court, the Sun Devils have 86 wins against ranked opponents since 2008. Leading the way for the tennis program have been 45 All-Americans and 41 All-Pac-12 student-athletes. Of these integral players in Arizona State's history, there have been 40 players ranked in the Top 50 of the singles season-end ranking and 21 in the Top 25 of the doubles season-end ranking.

In the classroom, McInerney has recruited bright student-athletes. She has had four Academic All-Americans, 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes (since 2002), and 80 Academic All-Pac 12 studentathletes (since 1991). Of those 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes, four were named in 2015 - Alexandra Osborne, Aubria Solares, Gussie O'Sullivan and Kassidy Jump. Her players have had majors such

Bioscience, Business Management, Criminal Criminology, Justice and Journalism, English, Kinesiology, Science, English, Marketing, Sociology.

McInerney has also been fundamental in helping players' development to reach high achievements in the NČAA. Among the achievements include Jacqueline Cako named Arizona State Female Athlete of the Year (2013), Michelle Brycki awarded Cissie Leary ITA National Sportsmanship Award  $(20\dot{1}2),$ Kelcy McKenna selected as the



Pac-12 Post-Graduate Scholar (2011), four singles and four doubles All-Americans since 2009, 14 players ranked in the singles season-end ranking and seven doubles teams ranked in the doubles season-end ranking since 2009.

Prior to coming to Arizona State, McInerney served as assistant women's tennis coach at the University of Southern California during the 1983-84 season, in which the Trojans were NCAA finalists. In addition to her success as a collegiate coach, McInerney has traveled with various USTA junior and national teams. At the 1986 Goodwill Games, McInerney coached the team to gold and silver medals. In 1987, she led the U.S. Pan American Games doubles squad to a gold

McInerney attended USC, where she captained the Trojans during her senior season. The fourtime All-American also was a four-time Trojan Spirit Award winner, as voted by her teammates. The Trojans won three national championships during McInerney's collegiate career, and she was the national collegiate doubles runner-up three times and a singles semifinalist in 1977. McInerney collected a half-dozen USTA national titles and was a member of the 1977-80 USTA Junior Federation Cup team. As a professional, she played on the major international tour, earning a world ranking in the top 75. McInerney competed at three grand slam venues -- Wimbledon, French Open and the U.S. Open where she reached the round of 32. She also served a short term as assistant pro at the highly acclaimed L.A. Tennis Club.

McInerney earned a bachelor's degree in public relations from the University of Southern California in 1980. A member of the Dean's List at USC, she won the USC Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the USC Junior Student-Athlete and Senior Student-Athlete awards.

Head coach Sheila McInerney announced in 2015 that Matt Langley would join the program as an assistant coach and in 2017, Langley was named associate head coach.

Langley joined the Sun Devils from Middle Tennessee State University, his alma mater, where he most recently served as assistant coach for its women's tennis program. At MTSU, Langley helped coach the Blue Raiders to one of their best seasons in program history, recording a 19-5 overall record, 7-1 in Conference USA competition.

A member of the MTSU men's tennis team from 2009-12, Langley was a two-year co-captain and three-time Sun Belt Conference Champion, earning two Most Outstanding Player honors at the Sun Belt Conference Championships. Langley also recorded three career appearances at the NCAA Championships.

Langley graduated from MTSU with a degree in exercise science, and was a two-time Academic All-American and ITA Scholar-Athlete.



Ebony Panoho is a graduate student assistant for the Sun Devil women's tennis program and former Sun Devil tennis standout. The Brisbane. Australia native won the Pac-12 doubles championship in her senior season with teammate Alexandra Osborne to give ASU its first conference doubles title. She once partnered with 2003 U.S. Open champion Andy Roddick for a mixed doubles exhibition match.
