### **SCOUTING THE SERIES**

The new kids on the block battle the blue bloods of college hockey as the Arizona State ice hockey team (1-1-0) hosts the Michigan Wolverines (1-1-0) in the Sun Devils' home opener on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 11-12, at Mullett Arena.

On Friday, Oct. 11, puck drop is slated for 3:30 p.m. MST to allow fans to attend both the home hockey and football games in Tempe. Sun Devil Football kicks off against the Utah Utes at 7 p.m. MST on Friday from Mountain America Stadium. On Saturday, Oct. 12, ASU returns to normal puck drop time slot with a 5:00 p.m. start time at Mullett Arena.

### PREGAME INFO

Fans are encouraged to arrive early to enjoy the pregame show courtesy of Gus Farwell. A Sun Devil Football letterwinner and 1996 Rose Bowl participant, Farwell will sing God Bless America on Friday and the National Anthem on both nights. Farwell's singing was spotlightted after video of him singing opera from his balcony in Barcelona, Spain during the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown went viral on social media. He is the infamous "Go Devils Goooo" opera singer voice that plays during Sun Devil Football games.

### HISTORY VS. THE WOLVERINES

Michigan holds a 6-0-1 record over ASU who will look to collect its first win over the maize and blue in program history. During the 2020-21 abbreviated season due to COVID-19, ASU spent the entire hockey season on the road competing in the Big Ten. In Oct. 2020, ASU also opened its season against then-No. 12 Michigan, ultimately suffering a series sweep. In the final of the four games from Yost Ice Arena, ASU collected a 1-1 tie, the first non-loss against Michigan ever.

### WATCHLIST

- Lukas Sillinger broke the ASU single season record for points during the 2023-24 season with 48 (11G, 37A). Healthy Jackson twins return to reunite the Sillinger - Ty Jackson - Dylan Jackson line.
- Cullen Potter became the 11th Sun Devil rookie to score in his collegiate debut game. He is the second-youngest active skater in the NCAA (17 years old until Jan. 10. 2025).
- Gibson Homer continues to top the national leaderboards with his goals against average and save percentage both ranked in the top five in the NCAA. The 6-5 , 210 netminder finished the regular season with the best save percentage in college hockey.
- -Bennett Schimek leads the nation in points with four goals and two assists in two games so far this season.
- -Noah Beck leads all defensemen in the NCAA in points with five.

## **SUN DEVIL NOTES**

### MARGIN OF VICTORY

On opening night, ASU put on a show-stopping performance with an 8-1 victory over Air Force. The eight goals tied a program high for goals scored in a single game - a feat the Sun Devils have accomplished five times over the decade-long history. With only one goal allowed, ASU set a new high for margin of victory at seven. The previous high was six vs. Lindenwood on Feb. 17, 2023.

### YOUNG GUN

Rookie Cullen Potter got the monkey off his back immediately - scoring his first collegiate goal in his first NCAA game on Friday night at Air Force. He became the XX skater in ASU history to score in their first collegiate game. The highly touted ASU rookie is the second-youngest player in the NCAA. The U.S. National Development Program product is 17 years old and turns 18 on Jan. 10, 2025. He's only seven days older than the youngest player in college hockey (Sascha Boumedienne, Boston University).

MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY With the NCAA Tournament and Pairwise chase off of the table for the 2023-24 season, the team set its sights on accomplishing a new goal: the most wins in a single season in program history. With the final game of the season marked as a 5-2 win for the Sun Devils, ASU completed the year with 24 wins, the most in ASU history. The previous record was held by the 2019-20 squad who accomplished a 22-win season before the season was ultimately cut short due to Covid-19.

### **NHL DEVILS**

Joey Daccord signed a five-year, \$25 million contract with the Seattle Kraken on Wednesday. It has an average annual value of \$5 million and begins next season. The 28-year-old goalie could have been an unrestricted free agent after this season. He's in his second full season in the NHL after going 19-18-11 with a 2.46 goalsagainst average, .916 save percentage and three shutouts in 50 games (46 starts) for Seattle in 2023-24.

Former Sun Devil Hockey captain Josh Doan made the NHL opening day roster for the Utah Hockey Club's inaugural season in Salt Lake City. Doan spent one season with the AHL Tucson Roadrunners and made his NHL debut for the Arizona Coyotes at Mullett Arena on March 27, 2024.

Forty-eight skaters from the NCHC made NHL rosters. Along with those 48, another 12 alumni of NCHC teams, who didn't play in the NCHC (two of which are Daccord and Doan), landed a spot on opening-night rosters. In all, a total of 60 alumni from NCHC teams will begin the 2024-25 season on NHL rosters.

### **BETWEEN THE PIPES**

Gibson Homer started at the crease for the Sun Devils on Friday night at Air Force. The redshirt junior allowed one goal and earned a .964 save percentage. Both his goals against average and save percentage rank top-five in the nation. The next night, transfer Luke Pavicich took the helm and finished with four goals against, including overtime. The senior made 29 saves for a .879 save percentage.

### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Junior Bennett Schimek and graduate Noah Beck made the most of their debuts in the maroon and gold over the opening weekend at Air Force. Schimek and Beck won the KJ Branding NCHC Forward and Defenseman of the Week, respectively. Additionally, they are the first players in Sun Devil history to earn performance recognition from the conference.

Schimek notched a six-point weekend in a split at Air Force, including his first career hat-trick in the 8-1 victory. The Providence transfer ended his weekend with four goals, two assists, six shots on goal and a +3 plus/minus.

Beck was named NCHC Defenseman of the Week after his stellar weekend on both ends of the ice, collecting five points and a +5 plus/minus. In Friday's win, the Clarkson transfer paced the team with three assists on the night, including the lone assist on Schimek's first short-handed goal. Beck notched an additional two assists in Saturday's overtime loss, bringing him to five assists on the weekend in the 1-1 series split.

### LET THEM COOK

Special teams contributed to five out of the eight goals on Friday night and set a new record 40 minutes into the season as ASU scored three short-handed goals, the most in a single game in program history. Junior transfer Bennett Schimek netted two of the three, becoming the first player to score multiple short-handed goals in a single game for the Maroon & Gold.

### **HEAD COACH GREG POWERS**

Coach Powers enters his tenth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2024-25, and his 17th overall at the helm at ASU. He was a finalist for the 2019 and 2020 Spencer Penrose Award, which is awarded to the Division I Coach of the Year. Coach Powers was also named the 2018-19 Frank Kush Sun Devil Coach of the Year, as voted on by the 26 head coaches at Arizona State. On July 7, 2022, Arizona State University and Greg Powers agreed to a five-year contract extension through the 2026-27 season. In 2023-24, Powers led the Sun Devils to a program record 24 wins on the season. Matthew Kopperud finished as an NCAA statistical leader with 17 power play goals. A true Sun Devil coached by Powers all four years of his NCAA career, Kopperud completed his time at ASU as the fourth-best career power play scorer in NCAA history with 41 through his four years in college. Lukas Sillinger also topped the charts in 2023-24 as he set the ASU program record in single season points (48). In the final year of Oceanside Arena, Powers coached ASU to five-straight wins versus USCHO.com Top-20 opponents for the first time in program history (the previous record for consecutive wins against ranked opponents was three-straight games). In 2021-22, the team boasted three of the top-10 scorers in the nation in Colin Theisen, Matthew Kopperud and Josh Doan. ASU scored 116 goals in 35 games for a 3.31 goals per game average, ranked No. 10 in the country. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.



### A HOME IN THE DESERT

- On Wednesday, Dec. 16, 2020, Arizona State University and Sun Devil Athletics announced all required approvals have been received for the
  commencement of construction on a new Multi-Purpose Arena, which will host university and community events and serve as the future home for Sun
  Devil men's ice hockey and wrestling. This project continues the development of the Novus Innovation Corridor, and will be sited south of Rio Salado
  Parkway on the east side of Packard Drive, immediately north of the existing Packard Drive Parking Structure.
- Construction began in January 2021 and recieved its certificate of occupancy on Friday, September 30, 2022.
- Over 8,000 square feet is set aside for a ASU state-of-the-art ASU locker room, weight room, lounge and coaches' offices on the north side of the arena.
   Eight additional locker rooms are accounted for on the west side of the arena between the main arena and community ice sheet that can be utilized for visiting teams, youth programs, ASU club programs, and live events.
- On February 14, 2022, ASU and the NHL's Arizona Coyotes formed the first agreement of its kind between a college and NHL team in 100 years. The last time an NCAA college team and an NHL team shared an arena was the Boston Bruins and Boston University from 1924-28 at Boston Arena, now known as Matthews Arena. Other improvements will now be made, at the Coyotes' expense, to prepare the arena to temporarily house Coyotes home games. These improvements include constructing coaches' rooms, equipment rooms, technology and other aspects of the new ASU arena according to NHL standards. The added cost is up to \$30 million, which will be paid in advance by the Coyotes.
- The 5,000-seat venue is managed and operated by Oak View Group, SCI Architects have designed the arena, while Mortenson Construction will serve as the design builder.
- The second full-size ice sheet will also be accessible to students, the community and youth ice hockey programs at every level, providing an additional public sheet to one of the fastest-growing states for youth hockey participation in the country.
- The seating configuration for Mullett Arena includes 20 luxury suites, two group suites, a large club lounge and event-level premium club seats. The club lounge will consist of a Center Ice Club on the main concourse that runs along center ice and can host up to 500 fans. On the 300-level, a social deck will run the length of the east side of the venue, providing an open-air, aerial view of the arena where fans can interact while still experiencing exceptional sightlines to the competition. The arena would also be able to serve as a backup for sports played on hardwood, such as volleyball.
- · A 942-seat student section occupies the entire west side of the venue to provide an enhanced gameday experience for ASU students.

This partnership with FOX 10 will bring our fans into new and exciting moments throughout the year. 




