SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (0-1) hits the road for the first time in 2021 by traveling to 23rd-ranked Arizona State (1-0) Saturday night ... It will mark the Rebels' first appearance on ESPN or ESPN2 since winning at San Diego State on Nov. 11, 2018 ... UNLV head coach **Marcus Arroyo** looks for his first victory leading the Rebels after UNLV dropped a heartbreaking, double-overtime 35-33 game to Eastern Washington last Thursday in Las Vegas ... The Sun Devils, meanwhile, downed Southern Utah 41-14 ... UNLV's Super Senior RB **Charles Williams** last week became the fourth Rebel to reach 3,000 on the ground in a career with a 177-yard night ... The Chuck Wagon heads into this week with the most career net rushing yards gained on the FBS level (3,117) among all current players.

Former Georgia Southern QB **Shai Werts**, who is now a WR at Louisville, stands No. 2. Two current FBS players (Liberty's **Joshua Mack** and Hawai'i's **Calvin Turner**) have more career rush yards than Williams but a majority of them were gained on the FCS level before transferring to their current schools.

REBELS vs. SUN DEVILS NOTES...

Although located only 300 miles apart, these two schools have remarkably only met one time on the gridiron and UNLV brings in a 1-0 lead in the all-time series (see next page for recap) ... The Rebels and Sun Devils were supposed to meet at Allegiant Stadium in 2020 before COVID-19 wiped out the teams' non-conference slate. ASU is now scheduled to make that game up in Las Vegas on Sept. 18, 2027 ... UNLV is 2-4 in games played in the Grand Canyon State as the Rebels lost at Arizona in 2001 and 2014 and went 1-2 in trips to Flagstaff to face Northern Arizona before elevating to the Division I level (1971, '74 and '76) ... The Rebels are 6-31 all-time vs. teams currently making up the Pac-12 Conference, a number that includes a 2-14 mark vs. Utah played before the Utes jumped to the league ... The Rebels last played a Pac-12 team by opening the 2018 campaign at No. 15 USC ... UNLV lists five players from Arizona: S **Bryce Jackson** (Chandler); DL **Connor Murphy** and **Kolo Uasike** (Mesa); and LS **Rex Goossen** and LB **Seth Robinson** (Scottsdale).

REBELATIONS...

UNLV is scheduled to start a different quarterback for the second straight game this week as redshirt freshman **Doug Brumfield** is listed No. 1 on the depth chart ... Former TCU transfer **Justin Rogers** made his first collegiate start in the opener vs. EWU before Brumfield came off the bench to lead UNLV to 27 of its 33 total points scored ... Brumfield played in the final two games of the 2020 season, spelling six-game starting senior **Max Gilliam** ... Still looking for his first TD pass as a collegian, Brumfield does have two scoring runs (8 yards vs. Wyoming last fall and 19 yards in the second overtime vs. EWU) ... UNLV's roster includes nine Super Seniors made possible when the NCAA did not count 2020 against player eligibility because of COVID-19. The unusual group of Rebels includes four sixth-year players and one -- offensive lineman **Clayton Bradley**, who transferred to Las Vegas as a sixth-year graduate of USC a year ago and chose to play one more fall -- who is one of 18 players lining up for their SEVENTH season across the FBS this fall ... Of UNLV's 13 touchdowns last fall, five came on drives longer than 80 yards and only two were shorter than 70. In fact, the Rebels staged 13 drives consisting of double-digit plays, including at least one TD drive of 10 or more plays and 74 yards or longer vs. all six opponents) ... UNLV features four new full-time assistant coaches in 2021 (OL coach **TJ Woods**, WRs **Jonathan Krause**, CBs **Clay Jennings** and TEs **Nate Longshore**, the latter of whom spent 2020 as offensive analyst) as the staff continues to bring impressive combined on-field experience to Las Vegas. Not only is head coach **Marcus Arroyo** the first former Power Five coordinator to take over the Rebels, of his 10 current full-time assistant coaches, five came directly from P5 programs spread out among the Pac-12 (3) and Big 12 (2). UNLV's head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator also boast NFL experience on their resumes. Arroyo was the interim offensive coordinator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2014, defensive coordinator **Peter Hansen** spent three years with the San Francisco 49ers in between stints at Stanford, and offensive coordinator **Glenn Thomas** spent six years with the Atlanta Falcons ... UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 20 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... UNLV attracted no less than five Power 5 transfers from the portal this off-season: Former USC lineman **Connor Murphy** and former Arizona lineman **Kylan Wilborn** are both grad transfers on the two-deep while WR **Jordan Jakes** (Indiana), RB **Jayvaun Wilson** (Oregon) and walk-on QB **Tate Martell** (Ohio State & Miami) are competing for time.

THE CATCH

The only previous meeting of UNLV and Arizona State was a memorable one for Rebel fans. Played nearly 13 years to the day of this week's outing (Sept. 13, 2008), head coach **Mike Sanford's** squad trailed No. 13-ranked ASU by 10 points in the fourth quarter and then still by a touchdown with 3:03 left and no timeous remaining. That's when QB **Omar Clayton** calmly led his team down field, sparked by big plays from RB **Frank "The Tank" Summers**



who would finish with 103 rushing yards. With 18 seconds left, Clayton found freshman star **Phillip Payne** from eight yards out on a sensational, one-handed TD grab that is still known around Las Vegas as *The Catch*. In overtime, **Kyle Watson** made a short field goal for the visitors. After the UNLV defense held, DT **Malo Taumua** blocked ASU's 35-yard field goal attempt by reigning Lou Groza Award winner **Thomas Weber** to stun the crowd of 59,582 at Sun Devil Stadium and ignite a wild celebration by the Rebels in the 23-20 final.

HEAD COACH @COACHARROYO

Marcus Arroyo was formally introduced Dec. 13, 2019, as the 12th head coach in the history of UNLV Football. Arroyo then used his next two months to hire a staff, win a Rose Bowl and then secure a record-setting recruiting haul of future Rebels.

Case in point: on Feb. 5, 2020, Arroyo announced his first UNLV recruiting class and the impressive group set multiple program records, including earning the No. 1 ranking in the Mountain West by Rivals and No. 2 by 247Sports. One year later, the 2021 class turned heads nationally, ranking eighth among all Group of 5 schools. Its standing of 67th overall was a stunning 36 spots higher than the average ranking for UNLV's classes in the decade previous to Arroyo's arrival on campus (averaged 103rd from 2010-19). In addition, the Class of 2021's average 247Sports per-player rating of .8324 shattered Year One's school-record mark of .8145. This also marked the first time since the introduction of the recruiting rankings that the Rebels finished in the top two of the Mountain West in consecutive years.

Arroyo, who turned 41 in January, took over the Rebels after most recently serving as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Oregon. Behind his play-calling, the Ducks won 2019 Pac-12 Conference Championship and then defeated Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl, which marked the eighth bowl game of Arroyo's

career. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks went 28-12 overall, including winning 15 of their last 17 outings.

Arroyo was instrumental in the development of quarterback **Justin Herbert**, the MVP of the Rose Bowl who became the No. 6 overall NFL draft pick and went on to be named the NFL Rookie of the Year after setting multiple league records for a first-year player. Another one of Arroyo's players, offensive lineman **Penei Sewell**, became the first Oregon player to win the Outland Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding interior lineman in college football. Arroyo joined Oregon after spending two years as the running backs coach at Oklahoma State, and brought experience as a coach for every offensive position except the offensive line. Prior to going to Stillwater, Arroyo spent the 2014-15 season in the NFL as interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Before making the move to the NFL, Arroyo spent the 2013 college football season as the offensive coordinator and outside receivers coach at Southern Mississippi. Arroyo's first stint in the Pac-12 saw him spend 2011 and 2012 as the passing-game coordinator and play-caller at California. He spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns at Wyoming as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, developing quarterback **Austyn Carta-Samuels** into the Mountain West Freshman of the Year in 2009. In fact, with UNLV rookie receiver **Kyle Williams** earning Freshman All-America and MW Freshman of the Year honors in 2020, Arroyo has now coached four freshman honorees in the last decade alone: WR Williams (UNLV), QB Carta-Samuels (Wyoming), QB **Nick Mullens** (C-USA All-Freshman Team at Southern Miss) and RB **Justice Hill** (Freshman All-America and nation's top rookie rusher at Oklahoma State).

Prior to his time in Laramie, Arroyo was the co-offensive coordinator for two seasons and quarterbacks coach for three campaigns at his alma mater, San Jose State. He was the quarterbacks coach and play-caller for the Spartans in 2006, and added co-offensive coordinator duties from 2007-08 under head coach **Dick Tomey**.

Arroyo began his coaching career with the Spartans in 2003 as an undergraduate assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Prairie View A&M in 2004 before returning to SJSU as a graduate assistant in 2005.

A native of Colfax, California, Arroyo was a three-year letterman at San Jose State, where he played quarterback from 1998-2002. In 2000, he passed for 2,334 yards and 15 touchdowns while leading the Spartans to seven wins, their most in eight seasons. Arroyo graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a degree in kinesiology. He is married to the former **Kelly Thoni** and the couple has one daughter, Cruz, born in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, in 2013, and recently welcomed a son, Noble Fox Arroyo, in July 2021.

A veteran tailback who is one of nine Rebels returning for a Super Senior season this fall, **Charles Billy Dee Williams Jr.** was the 2019 regular-season rushing champion of the Mountain West and an honors candidate in what is his sixth and final campaign ... Has led the team in rushing in three different seasons ... In July he became the first Rebel football player ever named a CoSIDA Academic All-America Team member as he was one of four RBs on the 2020-21 list ... Named 2021 Second Team Preseason All-MW by Athlon and Mountain West Wire ... His 3,117 career rushing yards gained on the FBS level are the most for any player in the nation ... The "Chuck Wagon" headed into 2021 ranking fourth on the school's career rushing list and after one game needs just 32 yards to move into third and is only 616 yards short of UNLV record-holder **Tim Cornett**, who posted 3,733 from 2010-13 ... Williams is now also tied for fourth among all Rebels with 11 career 100-yard rushing games and sixth with 21 all-time rushing touchdowns ... A year ago he was a unanimous choice for Preseason All-MW by preview magazines after becoming just the fourth Rebel to lead a conference in rushing yards during the regular season, joining former UNLV backs **Dominique Dorsey** (2004), **Ickey Woods** (1987) and **Kirk Jones** (1984) ... The top freshman running back in the conference in 2016 earned the starting spot as a sophomore in 2017 but suffered a season-ending injury in the opener and was instead awarded a medical redshirt while **Lexington Thomas** emerged as the team's top runner for the last two seasons ... Also an impressive student who already earned his bachelor's degree in May 2020 in journalism & media studies and is currently pursuing a master's in general studies ... Welcomed a daughter, Kamiyah, in March 2021

STATES OF THE PROGRAM

From Hawaii to Florida, from Alaska to Australia -- the 2021 Rebels come from hometowns spread across the continent and beyond. In fact, no less than 19 different states and two countries are represented on this year's roster. While a vast majority of Rebels naturally hail from California (45) and Nevada (12), a state that continues to become even more fertile recruiting ground is Texas as a dozen UNLV players are products of the Lone Star State. Six Hawaiians are here as part of the Ninth Island. Meanwhile, Arizona and Georgia are home to no less than five current Rebels and talent-rich Louisiana and Oregon state supply four apiece. Washington and South Carolina both have three while Tennessee volunteered two Rebels. Florida, Alaska, Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey and Utah all are home to one UNLV player. In addition, punter **Charlton Butt** is the first Aussie to sign a scholarship with the program.

HISTORY MADE: PRIME CHUCK



This summer, running back **Charles Williams** became the first UNLV football player in history to be voted an academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The Chuck Wagon, returns as a Super Senior this fall and was announced as one of four running backs on CoSIDA's 2020-21 Academic All-America® Division

I Football Teams. The native of Fresno, California, and graduate of Bullard High School ranks fourth on UNLV's career rushing list with 2,940 yards and needs 739 more to pass all-time leader **Tim Cornett** (2010-13). Also, named in May as UNLV's Mehdi Bouras Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Williams is pursuing his master's degree in general studies after earning a bachelor's in journalism & media studies in 2020. He has earned a spot on the Mountain West Academic All-Conference Team for four consecutive years and was a member of the Dean's Honor List his last four semesters as an undergraduate.



FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

On October 3, 2019, UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex. Just over three years ago the department announced the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged an initial \$10 million toward the construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. The FFC is now the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

SCHOLARSHIP-HIP-HURRAY

Veteran place-kicker **Daniel Gutierrez** was surprised with a full scholarship during a scrimmage at Allegiant Stadium on August 11. The final play was a field-goal attempt and as expected, the senior nailed it with ease but then something unexpected happened as he was surprised with a highlight video on the stadium's big screen that closed with a special message that he was being put on full scholarship this fall. A two-year returning starter who has earned three letters after walking onto the squad out of Granada Hills Charter High School in California, Gutierrez

responded by turning in a career night in the opener vs. EWU, nailing all four of his field-goal attempts, including a personal-best 51-yarder. His current combined field goal numbers of 25-of-31 rank him first in school history with a career percentage of 80.6 and he heads into this week an impressive 17-of-18 all-time from 39 yards or closer. In 2020, he rebounded from missing his first field goal and extra-point attempt in the season opener at San Diego State to make all 16 of his remaining attempts on the year as a junior.



WATCHING THE REBELS



A trio of Rebels made official Watch Lists during the preseason for their on-field talents. Senior wide receiver and kick returner **Tyleek Collins** is one of 57 players up for the 2021 Paul Hornung Award, which goes out annually to the most versatile player in major college football from the Louisville Sports Commission in honor of the late football legend **Paul Hornung**. Collins has led the team twice in kickoff returns and punt returns during his career, including both categories last fall. UNLV sophomore offensive lineman **Leif Fautanu** (LEEF faw-TAH-new) is one of 63 players from 31 FBS schools around the nation named to the 2021 Watch List for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. Finally, UNLV senior long snapper **Rex Goossen** is one of 31 players on the 2021 Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List, which was named after former Duke University and longtime Chicago Bears long snapper **Patrick Mannelly**. The award goes to college football's top player at the special teams position each year and Goossen is in his third season as the team's starting long snapper.

UNLV has played 47 teams ranked in at least one of the two major polls at the time of the game. The Rebels hold a 5-42 record against such competitors. The Rebels' most recent win over a ranked team came in 2008 when they upset No. 15/13 Arizona State, 23-20 in overtime (pictured, below). In fact, the last four UNLV wins over ranked opponents have come on the road.

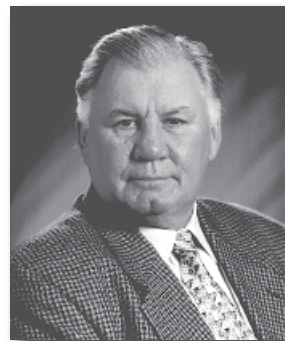


GARCIA WINS WIESNER



Athlon, Garcia is the fourth offensive lineman to earn the Wiesner. A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.

Before UNLV's home-opening football game vs. EWU, Super Senior offensive lineman **Julio Garcia II** was recognized as this year's recipient of the Tom Wiesner Award (pronounced "WEEZE-ner"). For the 20th consecutive year, the team selected the player who best exemplifies the courage, enthusiasm, dedication and toughness of the late Mr. Tom Wiesner. Garcia, who has started games in every season as a Rebel and is the team's nominee for the Wuerffel Trophy, was also a team captain in Week 1. An honors candidate who was named preseason Fourth Team All-MW by Phil Steele and Third Team by

REBELS RALLY BUT FALL FOOT SHORT IN OPENER

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV finished a foot short of tying the game in double-overtime, being stopped at the goal-line on a two-point conversion attempt and falling 35-33 to Eastern Washington Thursday night at Allegiant Stadium.

In the first-ever meeting with the Eagles, the Rebels, who rallied from a 20-6 deficit to send the game into overtime at 20 apiece, lost their first game played in their new stadium with full capacity for fans. Former TCU transfer Justin Rogers made his first career start at quarterback as UNLV led 6-3 at halftime. Freshman Doug Brumfield replaced him in the third quarter after EWU scored 17 unanswered points. The hosts kicked two field goals and then a 16-yard Charles Williams rush to draw within two before Brumfield threw a two-point conversion to Courtney Reese to knot the game.

The teams traded touchdowns twice in overtime but EWU made its two-point attempt to force the Rebels to go for two on what became the final play of the game.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Senior place-kicker Daniel Gutierrez tied a school record with four made field goals, including a career-long 51-yarder, which saw the former walk-on score his team's first 12 points, allowing them to mount the big comeback. Gutierrez was awarded a scholarship during fall camp.

STAT OF THE GAME: Senior running back Charles Williams finished with his second-most rushing yards as a Rebel, carrying the ball 27 times for 172 yards and the two scores.

- Williams' 11th career 100-yard rushing game moved him into a tie with Dominique Dorsey (2001-04) in fourth place all-time at UNLV
- Williams' two rushing touchdowns moved him up two spots on the school's career list as his 21 all-time scores pushed him to sixth place
- UNLV got two interceptions vs. the Eagles, one by Phillip Hill and one by true freshman Cameron Oliver, to match the team's entire pick total from the short 2020 season
- The Rebels won the turnover battle 3-2 after Kue Olotoa forced and recovered a fumble on an EWU kickoff return to help complete the comeback in regulation
- Jacoby Windmon and Austin Ajiaka each had 10 total tackles to pace UNLV
- Evan Silva made his Rebel debut at punter, finishing with six attempts for a 35.2-yard average
- Former Oregon transfer Jayvaun Wilson got his first college carry, gaining nine yards
- UNLV fell to 24-30 all-time in season-openers and 19-10 when they happened at home
- The Rebels fell to 36-16-1 vs. teams that currently make up the Big Sky Conference
