QUICK LOOK

- Fresno State won its 11th-straight game with its double overtime victory in the 2023 home opener against Eastern Washington last Saturday.
- With a Troy loss to No. 15 Kansas State last weekend, Fresno State now owns the second-longest active winning streak in the FBS behind Georgia with 19-straight wins.
- The 11-game winning streak for Fresno State ties the program's third-longest winning streak. It is the longest streak for the Bulldogs since 1986.
- Fresno State has started the season 2-0 for its first time since 2013, and just the fifth time since 2000.
- If the Bulldogs earn a win at Arizona State this weekend, it will be the first time since 2018 that Fresno
 State has defeated two P5 opponents in the same season. In 2018, coincidentally, it was wins over UCLA
 and Arizona State (Las Vegas Bowl).
- The last time Fresno State defeated two P5 opponents with both games played in the regular season (bowl games not included) was in 2004, having defeated Washington (35-16) and then-No. 13 Kansas State (45-21) both on the road and in back-to-back weeks.
- For the second week in a row, senior wide receiver and former walk-on Erik Brooks led the Bulldogs in receiving. Already this season, Brooks has totaled 17 receptions for 265 yards and three touchdowns. His three touchdowns in just two games this season already ties his single-season career best in his six-year career. The senior ranks 6th in the FBS in receiving yards and 7th in receiving touchdowns.
- For the second week in a row, it was senior captain Levelle Bailey who called game. At Purdue, Bailey batted down a fourth down pass attempt by Purdue late in the fourth quarter, forcing a turnover on downs on the Boilermaker's final offensive possession of the game. Last weekend, Bailey grabbed his first interception of the season and his first since 2021 in Eastern Washington's first play of its offensive drive in the second overtime period, ending the game and sealing the deal for a Fresno State victory.

ABOUT THE MATCH UP

- Fresno State and Arizona State will meet for the fifth time and first time since 2018 this Saturday in Tempe. This is the first regular season meeting between the programs since Nov. 20, 1941.
- The teams last met at the 2018 Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl, where Fresno State came off with the 31-20 win behind head coach Jeff Tedford. The bowl game win marked the 12th win for Fresno State in the 2018 season, the program's first 12-win season in program history.
- The series dates back to 1931 with the teams playing each other three times in a 10-year span before a hiatus through the 2018 season. The Sun Devils lead the series 3-1.
- Former Fresno State offensive line coach Saga Tuitele now holds the same title at Arizona State after spending just one season (2022) in the Central Valley.
- Fresno State has five players that are Arizona natives on its roster in QB Mikey Keene (Chandler), DE Merhauti Xepera (Maricopa), LB Zeke Branham (Mesa), DT Jacob Holmes (Phoenix), and OL Kingsley Ugwu (Tucson).

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

Scouting Arizona State

The Sun Devils begin their season with first-year head coach Kenny Dillingham. ASU opens the season 1-1 and are coming off of a 27-15 loss to Oklahoma State last Saturday. Their win came in a 24-21 defeat over Southern Utah on Thursday, Aug. 31. Saturday's contest will be the third-straight home game for the Sun Devils.

Jaden Rashada was named ASU's starting quarterback. He is just the second player in program history to start at the quarterback position as a true freshman. Rashada made his first start for the Sun Devils against Southern Utah on his birthday and threw for 236 yards which ranked third most in Sun Devil history for an ASU quarterback in their first career start.

Arizona State ranks No. 2 in the Pac-12 and No. 32 in the FBS in passing yards allowed, giving up an average of 165.0 yards per game. The Sun Devil kickoff units rank among the best in the FBS as the kick return defense is No. 15 in the country and the kickoff return unit is No. 6. Elijah Badger ranks No. 1 in the Pac-12 and No. 4 in the FBS in kickoff returns, averaging 40.7 yards per return.

Sun Devils have six seniors on the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List; Cam Skatteboo (RB), Ro Torrence (DB), Xavier Guillory (WR), Aaron Frost (OL), Jalin Conyers (TE), Elijhah Badger (WR)

The history

Fresno State and Arizona state will meet for the fifth time and first time since 2018 this Saturday in Tempe. This is the first regular season meeting between the programs since Nov. 20, 1941.

The series dates back to 1931 with the teams playing each other three times in a 10-year span before a hiatus through the 2018 season. The Sun Devils lead the series 3-1.

Last time was a fun one

The teams last met at the 2018 Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl, where Fresno State came off with the 31-20 win behind head coach Jeff Tedford. The bowl game win marked the 12th win for Fresno State in the 2018 season, the program's first 12-win season in program history.

Then-sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers was named the game's Most Valuable Player after accounting for 286 all-purpose yards, the fourth-most in program history. He totaled 212 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 24 carries, while also posting 41 punt return yards and 33 receiving yards.

The Sun Devil and Bulldog Connection

Former Fresno State offensive line coach Saga Tuitele now holds the same title at Arizona State after spending just one season (2022) in the Central Valley. In his time with the Bulldogs, Tuitele's offensive line was the second highest graded run-blocking unit in the Mountain West.

Nick So'oto, on staff at Arizona State as senior assistant of player personnel was recently at Fresno State as the director of on-campus recruiting in 2022.

I guess we can call it a homecoming

Fresno State has five players that are Arizona natives on its roster in QB Mikey Keene (Chandler), DE Merhauti Xepera (Maricopa), LB Zeke Branham (Mesa), DT Jacob Holmes (Phoenix), and OL Kingsley Ugwu (Tucson).

Arizona is the home state to the second-most Bulldogs on the 2023 roster, behind California.

Bulldogs against the Pac-12

Anybody. Anytime. Anywhere.

Fresno State is 29-48 all-time against the Pac-12. Its most recent win was a dominant 29-6 victory against Washington State in the 2022 Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl.

Fresno State has defeated a Pac-12 opponent in each of the last two years, and in three of the last four years with one on its schedule.

FRESNO STATE TEAM NOTES

The streak continues

Fresno State won its 11th-straight game with its double overtime victory in the 2023 home opener against Eastern Washington last Saturday.

With a Troy loss to No. 15 Kansas State last weekend. Fresno State now owns the second-longest active winning streak in the FBS behind Georgia with 19-straight wins.

The 11-game winning streak for Fresno State ties the program's third-longest winning streak. It is the longest streak for the Bulldogs since 1986.

The last Mountain West school win a win streak of more than 10 games was San Diego State between 2015 and 2016 (13 straight).

2-0

One game at a time.

Fresno State has started the season 2-0 for its first time since 2013, and just the fifth time since 2000.

The Bulldogs are one of three undefeated teams remaining in the Mountain West - Air Force (2-0) and Wyoming (2-0).

Overtime thriller

Last Saturday's game was Fresno State's first overtime game since 2019. The Bulldogs picked up just their second-ever double overtime win since 1996. It was their first double overtime win since 2008, and first overtime win since 2013.

Fresno State last won a double overtime game on Sept. 20, 2008, 55-54 at Toledo, after four consecutive double overtime defeats.

No stage too big

Fresno State travels into Power 5 territory this weekend and for the second time in 2023.

The Bulldogs opened the season at Purdue (Big Ten) in front of a crowd of 54,898, and came home with a 39-35 victory on the road, securing the first win over a Big Ten opponent and as the visiting team since 2009. Fresno State used 366 yards passing behind the arm of quarterback Mikey Keene, who in his Bulldog debut, had a historic performance throwing for the most passing yards ever by a Bulldog QB in their first game as the starter.

Defensively, the Bulldogs held Purdue to 363 yards of total offense. Purdue was the 14th P5 opponent that Fresno State has held below 375 yards of total offense since 2000.

Fresno State is 11-4 against P5 opponents since 2000 when holding them to under 375 yards of total offense.

The Bulldogs run defense was a bright spot in the win at Purdue, holding them to only 109 yards on the ground. The 109 yards rushing allowed to Purdue was the fifth-fewest allowed to a P5 opponent in the last 20 years. Fresno State is 12-3 against P5 opponents since 2000 when holding them to under 130 or less on the ground.

Let's do it again

With the win over Purdue, Fresno State now has 41 wins over current Power 5 programs.

If the Bulldogs earn a win at Arizona State this weekend, it will be the first time since 2018 that Fresno State has defeated two P5 opponents in the same season. In 2018, coincidentally, it was wins over UCLA and Arizona State (Las Vegas Bowl).

The last time Fresno State defeated two P5 opponents with both games played in the regular season (bowl games not included) was in 2004, having defeated Washington (35-16) and then-No. 13 Kansas State (45-21) both on the road and in back-to-back weeks.

Let's rewind real quick

The 2022 season was a roller coaster of emotions, from wins and losses to injuries to championships – it was truly a "trust the process" season.

The Bulldogs opened the season 1-4, but finished the season with a 10-4 record becoming the first team in FBS history to open a season with one win and finish that year with 10 wins.

FRESNO STATE TEAM NOTES

The two new guys on staff

Tedford brought in two new coaching staff additions, both to the offensive side of the ball in offensive line coach Brian Armstrong and running backs coach Aaron Prier. Both coaches were added to the staff prior to the start of spring ball, so had a full spring, summer and fall to work with their position groups.

Armstrong comes to Fresno State from Montana State. With the Bobcats, Armstrong wore many hats in his seven-year tenure (2016-22) including offensive line coach, tight ends coach, run game coordinator and offensive coordinator.

Prier joins the Bulldog staff after spending two seasons (2021-22) at Eastern Washington as running backs coach and community relations coordinator. Prier got his collegiate coaching experience started at Idaho State, his alma mater.

While not new to the staff, he is new to the role of quarterbacks coach. Matt Wade spent the 2022 season as
an offensive quality control assistant and was promoted to quarterbacks coach in December 2022.

New guy in that spot, again

For the second-straight year and the fourth time since 2017, Fresno State has a new offensive coordinator calling plays. Head coach Jeff Tedford promoted Pat McCann to offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach in Jan. 2023 after just one year of working together. McCann is Tedford's fourth offensive coordinator that he has hired during his tenure as head coach at Fresno State. All three Fresno State offensive coordinators prior to McCann have current positions at Power 5 schools - Kalen DeBoer (head coach - Washington), Ryan Grubb (OC - Washington), and Kirby Moore (OC - Missouri).

McCann, Moore and Grubb all won their first games as offensive coordinators under Tedford, averaging a combined 497.3 yards and 43.3 points in those games.

The JuCo Route

Fresno State has had good success with recruiting junior college players, and helping them have great careers at Fresno State and beyond. With the new age of the transfer portal, Fresno State has still made a point to recruit players to The Valley out of junior college.

The Bulldogs have added 13 junior college additions for 2023 – Tim Grear Jr. (WR), Artis Cole (WR), Antoine Sullivan (WR), Jaceon Doss (WR), Tyler Carr (TE), Jake Tarwater (TE), Hayden Pulis (OL), Edward Fonua (OL), Kavika Baumgartner (DL), Camryn Bracha (DB), Ezra Christensen (DL), Dupre Mendoza (DL), and Landon Ogles (P).

The portal did good for us too, though

Sure Fresno State added in its fair share of junior college additions, but it also did some work in the transfer portal adding 12 Division I transfers for the 2023 season. QB Mikey Keene (UCF), DB Dean Clark (Kent State), WR Jaelen Gill (Boston College), OL Campbell McHarg (Oregon State), and OL Kingsley Ugwu (Kansas State) are all on the Bulldogs' two-deep.

Who doesn't love a good walk-on story?

10 players on Fresno State's two-deep all have at least one thing in common, and that is that they all began their Fresno State careers as walk-ons.

Going from walk-on to two-deep to possibly a starter and even further, to scholarship is no easy path, but for Erik Brooks (WR), Jordan Brown (WR*), Jake Boust (TE), Osmar Velez (OL), Campbell McHarg (OL*), Charles Remlinger (DE), Malachi Langley (LB), Phoenix Jackson (LB), Camryn Bracha (DB*) and Morice Norris Jr. (NKL) -- they did that.

Brooks, Langley and Norris Jr. are slated as starters in their respective positions. Brown, Boust, Velez, McHarg, Remlinger, Jackson and Bracha are each listed as the No. 2 at their positions.

Why not run it back?

Since the NCAA approved the waiver to allow an extra year of eligibility, several Bulldogs have been with the program for two Mountain West Championship runs - both under the direction of Tedford in 2018 and 2022. Erik Brooks, Steven Comstock, Emoryie Edwards, Isaiah Johnson, Carson King, and Tyrone Sampson Jr. have earned two Mountain West Championships in their careers, and have the chance at a third in 2023.

Fresno State has a total of 14 players who are using their extra year of eligibility in 2023 - Brooks, Comstock, Edwards, Johnson, King, Sampson Jr., Raymond Scott, Levelle Bailey, Morice Norris Jr., Johnny Hudson Jr., Nick D'Ambra, Daniel Taumalolo and Jacob Isaia.

Dudes with degrees

Fresno State has 12 student-athletes on its roster with a degree. Four of those 12 are graduate transfers into the program this season – Mikel Barkley (Psychology), Dean Clark (Management Information Systems), Jaelen Gill (Communications) and Tuasivi Nomura (Business Administration).

In addition to the four above, Levelle Bailey (Communication), Tanner Blount (Sociology), Devo Bridges (Exercise Science), Jordan Brown (Sport Administration), Malachi Langley (Sociology), Abraham Montano (Broadcast and Multiplatform Journalism), Morice Norris Jr. (Sociology) and Osmar Velez (Agriculture Business) have their degrees and are currently in a master's program at Fresno State.

STUDENT-Athletes

Fresno State had a program record 53 football players who were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team last season. To be eligible for 2022 Fall Academic All-Conference honors, student-athletes must have completed at least one academic term at the member institution, while maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better and must have competed in 50 percent of the team's completed varsity contests.

Orgullo del Valle (Pride of the Valley)

Fresno State's Sept. 9 home opener against Eastern Washington made history as the first exclusively Spanish-language television broadcast in FBS college football history. In partnership with Univision Fresno and Bakersfield, the game was broadcast on UniMás throughout the Central Valley, and it was the first American college football game to air on a Univision channel.

The broadcast featured six-time Emmy Award winning sportscaster Jessi Losada as the play-by-play announcer.

Fresno is the ninth most diverse city in the nation, with a Hispanic population of nearly 60%. Fresno State is designated by the U.S. Department of Education as a Hispanic-Serving Institution, with an enrollment of 57% Hispanic students.

Fans who were seeking an English-language broadcast could stream the game via the Mountain West Network, which incorperated the radio broadcast from the Bulldog Sports Network, featuring Paul Loeffler, Pat Hill and Cam Worrell. Fans could also utilize LEARFIELD's Varsity Network app to sync the Bulldog Sports Network radio broadcast with the UniMás television broadcast.

Shoutout the Red Wave

Fresno State has been on the rise when it comes to attendance numbers in the last few years, trending towards 40,000-plus crowds for nearly all six home games of the 2022 season. Fresno State averaged a conference-high 39,067 fans per game in 2022, nearly filling the 40,727 capacity stadium that is Valley Children's Stadium. Fresno State had three crowds of more than 40,000 fans in attendance last season, including two sellouts.

Fresno State's average attendance in 2022 was its highest in a season since 2005. Fresno State was third among all G5 schools for average attendance in 2022, while also having a higher average than several Power 5 schools including Cal, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Vanderbilt, Oregon State and others.

2023 was off to a hot start as Fresno State announced a sellout for its home opener against Eastern Washington (Sept. 9). It was the first time Fresno State sold out its home opener since hosting Nebraska in the 2014 opener. It was the first sellout for Fresno State against an FCS opponent since 2004.

FRESNO STATE TEAM NOTES

Taking "Family" to another level

Programs always preach "family" and "brotherhood", but at Fresno State it goes far beyond just a recruiting pitch or casual phrase. It's much more than that here. It's quite literal here.

Fresno State has two sets of brothers – Joe and Mac Dalena, and Augustus and Charles Remlinger – and a set of cousins – Seth and Steven Scheidt – on its current roster.

The program also welcomed son of former Bulldog great David Carr and nephew to Derek Carr in sophomore tight end Tyler Carr.

Legacy player Devon Rivers (RB) enters his freshman season and looks to follow in the footsteps of his father Ron Rivers (1991-93) and older brother Ronnie Rivers (2017-21) as greats in the program. Brother Ronnie left the program as the all-time leading scorer. Both Ron and Ronnie are among the top in rushing records in Fresno State history.

The Dalena duo just missed playing on the same team with older brother Frank who was a Bulldog wide receiver from 2016-19. Joshua Johnson, a current Bulldog wideout, is the younger brother of former Bulldog receiver Justin Johnson (2012-15).

Former Bulldog head coach Pat Hill remains around the program as the analyst on the Bulldog Sports Network, calling the games as a part of the radio crew for nine seasons. Hill's son Zak Hill, who was a Bulldog safety from 2008-11, is also around the program in 2023 as one of the team's doctors.

Ring of Honor

Fresno State Athletics announced in July that it will transition its football retired jersey recognition format to a Ring of Honor format. The adjustment will allow the department to appropriately honor the contributions of the deserving individuals throughout its history who have made a transformative impact on the Bulldog football program.

The inaugural 2023 Ring of Honor class will feature two Bulldog legends in former head coaches Jim Sweeney (1976-77, 1980-96) and Pat Hill (1997-2011). Jim Sweeney was inducted posthumously during halftime of the Sept. 9 home opener against Eastern Washington and Pat Hill will be inducted during halftime of the Homecoming game against UNLV (Oct. 28).

The Fresno State football alumni who previously had their jerseys retired will continue to hold that distinguished distinction and are now also considered charter members of the Ring of Honor. Those include nine former players – #4 Derek Carr, #8 David Carr, #9 Kevin Sweeney, #12 Trent Dilfer, #14 Vince Petrucci, #15 Davante Adams, #21 Dale Messer, #22 Lorenzo Neal and #83 Henry Ellard.

FRESNO STATE OFFENSE NOTES

Big Play Brooks

For the second week in a row, senior wide receiver and former walk-on Erik Brooks led the Bulldogs in receiving. Although not as flashy as the season opener at Purdue, Brooks managed 95 yards receiving and one touchdown in the home opening win.

Brooks had the showing of his career at Purdue (Sept. 2), leading the Bulldogs with nine receptions for 170 yards and two touchdowns. That game marked his first career 100-yard receiving game. His 170 yards receiving were the third-most by any receiver in the country in Week 1, and the most by a Bulldog in any game since 2020.

Brooks continued his success on the big stage, while lower on the depth chart in previous years, he still managed to show up when his number was called. He scored the first touchdown for Fresno State in 2023. Brooks has eight touchdowns in his career. Of those eight, five were against Power 5 opponents.

Already this season, Brooks has totaled 17 receptions for 265 yards and three touchdowns. His three touchdowns in just two games this season already ties his single-season career best in his six-year career.

The senior ranks 6th in the FBS in receiving yards and 7th in receiving touchdowns.

Jack of all trades

We are finally getting to see the good that comes with a healthy Tre Watson on the field again for the Bulldogs.

Watson, a junior tight end from New Mexico, has battled injuries throughout his career but 2023 is off to a promising start. Watson is fresh off a career-high 47 yards receiving on five catches against Eastern Washington last weekend. He is third on the team in receiving yards with 87 yards on nine receptions in two games played. He has the third-longest average per catch among the receivers on the year.

Watson leads the MW in targets and receptions per game among all tight ends in the conference. Not only has Watson proved to be a more critical part of moving the ball down the field by pass receptions, but he is used as a blocker as well.

Tote the rock

With the graduation of Fresno State's 1,000 yard rusher in Jordan Mims last season, the Bulldogs offense was looking to fill a void at running back entering 2023.

Malik Sherrod assumed the starting position in the season opener at Purdue, and true freshman and legacy player Devon Rivers was listed as the backup to Sherrod. With Sherrod and Rivers both getting dinged up, the offense saw more of Elijah Gilliam.

Gilliam, one of the bigger backs in the room, has already ran for a single-season career-high with 179 yards on 40 carries. He has two rushing touchdowns on the year.

The junior set a new career-high with 93 yards rushing at Purdue, and followed up with 86 yards and two scores last Saturday. It was the first multi-score game of his career. Gilliam leads the team in rushing yards entering Week 3.

What a debut

QB Mikey Keene lit up the stat sheet in his Bulldog debut at Purdue (Sept. 2) -- 366 yards. 4 touchdowns. 31-of-44 in his pass attempts.

Keene solidified the best performance by a Fresno State quarterback in their first game in program history as his 366 yards are the most ever in a Bulldog QB debut. It was also the most passing yards by a Mountain West QB against a Big Ten school since 2013.

Background on QB1

Keene transferred into the program from UCF in January, and brought playing experience to the Valley as he compiled an overall record of 8-3 as a starter in two seasons at UCF. He played only four games in 2022, allowing the use of a redshirt season. He completed his passes at a 72.29 percent clip (60-of-83) for 647 yards last season. As a true freshman in 2021, he appeared in 11 games and threw for 1,730 yards and 17 touchdowns on 173-of-272 pass attempts.

The Chandler, Arizona native was a standout at Chandler High School, not losing a game as a starter in his career at the high school level.

At the time of his signing to Fresno State (Dec. 2022), Keene was rated the No. 13 transfer quarterback nationally. In high school, he was rated the No. 18 player overall in the state of Arizona.

FRESNO STATE DEFENSE NOTES

The captain will get the job done

For the second week in a row, is was senior captain Levelle Bailey who called game.

At Purdue, Bailey batted down a fourth down pass attempt by Purdue late in the fourth quarter, forcing a turnover on downs on the Boilermaker's final offensive possession of the game.

Last weekend, Bailey grabbed his first interception of the season and his first since 2021 in Eastern Washington's first play of its offensive drive in the second overtime period, ending the game and sealing the deal for a Fresno State victory.

From the freshman to the veteran

Bailey leads the defense, and has been one of its leaders for many years. The Sacramento, Calif. native has played in more Fresno State football games than anybody else on the roster, having played in every game of his career (47 games) and started in 38 over the years.

As a true freshman in 2019, Bailey was one of the youngest players to see the field both on special teams and on defense. That season, he played in all 12 games and earned five starts. Recruited to Fresno State by Tedford, Bailey proved his talents quickly.

A trusted and respected leader of the defense, Bailey is starting to get recognition as one of the top linebackers in the conference. Elevating himself each season, Bailey has totaled 207 tackles, 22.0 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and four interceptions. This season, Bailey was named to a handful of watch lists. He is a three-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection (2020, 2021, 2022), and looks to build on that in his final year of collegiate football.

New guys on the DL

Depth at the defensive line position has been something Fresno State feels comfortable with in its additions from the transfer portal and junior college.

Four new faces were in the defensive line rotation at Purdue (Sept. 2) and again last weekend against Eastern Washington -- Kemari Munier-Bailey, Dupre Mendoza, Ezra Christensen and Kavika Baumgartner.

Winning the turnover battle

Fresno State's defense had its first pair of turnovers of 2023 last weekend -- one fumble recovery and one interception. Both turnovers proved to be critical in the win as points were eventually scored due to the fumble recovery and the interception was the game-winner in double overtime.

Munier-Bailey (DE) was responsible for the first Bulldog turnover of the year, recovering the fumble in the second quarter that set Fresno State up at the EWU20. The Bulldog offense used only four plays to find the end zone in its next drive. LB Levelle Bailey grabbed the game-winning interception, his first pick since 2021.

Bringing the pressure

Fresno State's defense was able to turn up the pressure a bit more last week than in the opening week as the defense totaled 7.0 TFLs, 1.0 sack, and eight quarterback hurries.

The defensive line alone was responsible for seven of the eight QBH on the night, and 4.0 of the TFLs.

Devo Bridges. He's that guy.

Bridges closed out the 2022 season as the Defensive MVP of the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl, going out on a high with a promising senior season ahead in 2023.

Bridges, for the first time in his career, led the 'Dogs with a career-high nine tackles against Eastern Washington. He also added 2.0 TFL which tied his career-high that he last set during the bowl game in 2022. He had two quarterback hurries in last weekend's win.

Fresno State fans, meet Dean Clark

Fresno State got its first glimpse of what a Bulldog defense looks like with Kent State transfer Dean Clark lined up at safety, and it was a good introduction. Clark, who joined the program as a mid-year addition from Kent State, led the Bulldogs with seven tackles in his debut at Purdue (Sept. 2).

Along with his seven tackles in Week 1, Clark recorded a huge pass breakup in the end zone in the fourth quarter on third down that saved Fresno State from falling behind with just over eight minutes to go in the game. Fresno State forced a turnover on downs on the next play at the 1-yard line.

FRESNO STATE SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

The man, the myth, the legend

When it comes to special teams, John Baxter is your go-to guy. Baxter. With nearly 40 years of coaching on his resume, he has experience coaching special teams, tight ends, wide receivers, running backs, linebackers and the defensive line. With the Bulldogs, he leads the special teams efforts and the tight ends. Baxter previously spent the 1997-2009 seasons on staff at Fresno State. In 13 years at Fresno State, Baxter was the associate head coach and special teams coach in addition to also handling either the tight ends (1997-01, 03, 09) or wide receiver (2002, 04-08) position groups.

The 2022 season showed just how special and critical special teams play can be for games. Baxter did just what he was expected with the special teams units in his first season back. Fresno State's special teams ranked No. 15 overall in the FBS, according to Football Outsiders and its efficiency index ratings.

Fresno State led the FBS, averaging 19.92 yards per punt return in 2022. Behind the legs of senior returner Nikko Remigio, Fresno State was able to cross something off its list that it hadn't done in nearly 10 years -- a punt returned for a touchdown. Remigio had two last season, and Fresno State was one of 14 schools from across the FBS to have multiple punt return TDs in that same season.

Fresno State led the Mountain West in kickoff returns. The 'Dogs ranked No. 26 in the FBS in kickoff returns last season. The 'Dogs also were in the Top 20 nationally in blocked kicks with two blocked punts and one blocked PAT. It was the first time since 2018 that Fresno State blocked a punt in a game.

This isn't his first time here

In his first stint at Fresno State (1997-09), Baxter turned the Bulldogs' special teams into one of the top units in the nation annually. During his time, Fresno State blocked 84 kicks and punts (including a national-best 49 from 2002 through 2009) and scored 39 special teams touchdowns (with 3 safeties). The Bulldogs topped the nation in fewest punt return yards allowed in 2004 and 2005. A.J. Jefferson led the nation in kickoff returns in 2007. Clifton Smith's 189 punt return yards with 2 touchdowns against Weber State in 2005 were Fresno State game records, while his 5 career scoring punt returns also was a school mark. Six of Baxter's Bulldog kickers and punters earned All-Western Athletic Conference first team honors.

Along with his coaching duties at Fresno State, Baxter developed the highly-successful and nationally-regarded program, "Academic Gameplan." His innovative and comprehensive study-skills program teaches students the rules, fundamentals, techniques and life skills needed to succeed in the classroom. "Academic Gameplan," which is now being used at schools throughout the country, was a key reason for the academic success of the Fresno State football program, which during Baxter's tenure produced 141 Academic All-WAC players and an NCAA APR score nearly 20 percentage points higher than the national average.

Stacked specialist group

If there is one thing that you can't argue, it's that Fresno State has the numbers when it comes to specialists.

There are eight specialists on the 2023 roster -- three kickers, three punters and two long snappers.

Kickers: Jordan Kennedy, Dylan Lynch, Abraham Montano Punters: Carson King, Landon Ogles, Nick Verdugo Long Snappers: Nick D'Ambra, Michael Munoz

Kennedy (Mississippi State) and Verdugo (Old Dominion) were both summer additions as Division I transfers. Ogles was a mid-year addition out of Palomar Junior College.

Maybe THIS will be the year

Fresno State hasn't had a kickoff return for a touchdown since 2008 - a 92-yard return by A.J. Jefferson vs. Nevada.

Fresno State has had 633 kickoff returns since its last return for a touchdown on Nov. 7, 2008 vs. Nevada. Will 2023 be the year that dry spell ends? Tedford brought in all-purpose player Jaelen Gill as a transfer from Boston College. The senior is expected to be productive on offense, but also as Fresno State's kickoff returner. He was the KO returner at Boston College, and has been recognized as one of the nation's top versatile athletes, being on the preseason Paul Hornung Award watch list.

Can your specialists say they did the same?

Seniors Nick D'Ambra (long snapper) and Carson King (punter) set a goal this offseason to row the length of the San Joaquin River – the longest river in California. The river is 366 miles long.

The duo was not asked to or assigned this workout, but held each other accountable. With some help from a handful of teammates, D'Ambra and King rowed a combined 366 miles on the weight room's rowing machine.



COACHING STAFF HISTORY

HISTORY AT FRESNO STATE:



The Fresno State coaching staff is loaded with former Bulldog players and coaches, and years of experience in coaching at the college and professional level. Below are some notes about the staff:

- Eight coaches on staff (including Tedford) have previously coached at Fresno State at one point in their careers.
- All but one coach from the defensive side of the ball (Nelson) coached together under Pat Hill in the late 90's.
- Notably, Tedford (OC), Kevin Coyle (DC) and John Baxter (ST) were all coordinators at Fresno State under Coach Hill.
- Tedford also coached under Jim Sweeney alongside Jethro Franklin as offensive coordinator while Franklin led the defensive line.
- Four members of the coaching staff are Fresno State alums, including Tedford. Joining Tedford as Bulldog alumni are Franklin (DL), Williams (DB) and Tim Skipper (LB).
- Since 1981, at least one member of the current coaching staff has been in the program each season outside of the four years from 2012-16.
- Combined, the staff has over 200 years of collegiate coaching experience and 36 years of professional football coaching experience.

Additional staff notes:

- Fresno State's Assistant Athletics Director for Football Operations and Chief of Football Staff Mike McHugh has ties to Coach Tedford that run far deeper than their time together as Bulldogs. The 2023 season is the 14th season that the pair has spent together dating back to 1999. Tedford and McHugh were together as Bulldogs in 2018 and 2019, as well as 10 seasons (2003-12) at California. The two were also on the same Oregon staff (1999-2000) when Tedford was the Ducks' offensive coordinator.
- Fresno State's offensive graduate assistant Matt Smith is in his second season in this role, having graduated as a Bulldog offensive lineman in 2021. Smith also played under Coach Tedford, as his six-year career span over the 2016-21 seasons.

Since taking over the reins of his alma mater, Jeff Tedford has taken the Bulldog football program to new heights. In four seasons as the head coach, Tedford led Fresno State to three West Division titles, two Mountain West Championship wins, three Bowl Game victories, and two Top 25 finishes to cap a season.

Tedford coached Fresno State to three 10-win seasons in his tenure (2017, 2018 and 2022). He has the second-most 10-win seasons as head coach in Fresno State football history, behind Jim Sweeney (1976-96). Tedford coached the Bulldoas to their winningest season in program history with 12 wins in 2018.

In his first stint as the Bulldogs' head coach, Tedford inherited a 1-11 football program when he was first announced as head coach. In four seasons as head coach, he has led the program to a 36-18 overall record and a 23-9 record in Mountain West play.

Summary:

Tedford, who coached the Bulldogs for the 2017-19 seasons, made his return to the helm of the program for his second stint as head coach of his alma mater. Tedford was hired as head coach of the program on Dec. 8, 2021.

The 2022 season was one that will be remembered for years to come. Fresno State became the first program in FBS history to begin its season 1-4, and finish with 10 wins. Fresno State closed the 2022 season with 9-straight wins to end the year with a 10-4 record, highlighted by a Mountain West Championship title and a dominant 29-6 win over Washington State in the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl. Fresno State's winning streak enters the 2023 season as the third-longest active winning streak in the FBS.

The Bulldogs finished the season ranked No. 24 in the final release of the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll for 2022. It was just the fourth time in program history that the Bulldogs closed out the year as a nationally ranked team, and the second time under Tedford. After finishing in the Top 25, Fresno State cemented itself as the only program in the Mountain West to appear in the Top 25 at any point in the season.

In 2022, Fresno State had 12 All-Mountain West selections, including first team honorees in quarterback Jake Haener, wide receiver Jalen Cropper, running back Jordan Mims and defensive end David Perales. Fresno State's four first team selections in 2022 were the most for the Bulldogs since the 2018 season. Also of note, Haener became the first Bulldog to earn a first team All-Mountain West nod since Derek Carr in 2013.

Tedford stepped away from coaching following the 2019 season due to health concerns, although still residing in the Valley.

In 2019, Fresno State finished 4-8. Five of Fresno State's eight losses that season were decided by one possession, notably falling by a small margin to both USC and Minnesota that season. The Bulldogs were highlighted by first team All-Mountain West linebackers Mykal Walker and Justin Rice in 2019. Six Bulldogs were honored by the conference that season, in addition to Walker and Rice, running back Ronnie Rivers earned second team honors, and defensive lineman Kevin Atkins, punter Blake Cusick and defensive back Juju Hughes were honorable mention selections. Rice was tabbed the preseason Defensive Player of the Year by the conference, entering the 2020 season. Walker and Hughes went on to have professional NFL careers.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This, one season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The renaissance under Tedford has led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West Loam

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also quided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies – a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level – having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League – a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-IO Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn. Quinn and his wife Randi have two sons, Tanner and Tyce - Tedford and Donna's first grandchildren.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – In dramatic fashion, redshirt sophomore quarterback Mikey Keene led Fresno State to a 39-35 come-from-behind win in the final minutes against burdue on Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. Trailing by three with 4:30 remaining, the signal caller led a 79-yard scoring drive in just over three-and-a-flat minutes in his Bulldon debut.

Keene finished with 366 yards passing on 31-of-44 attempts while throwing four touchdowns. It was the most yards passing by a Fresno State quarterback in their first start in at least 25 years. Two of Keene's scores found the hands of Erik Brooks who had a career-high day with 170 yards on nine receptions.

Fresno State's win was its first on the road against a Big Ten opponent since Dec. 5, 2009 at Illinois (53-52).

How It Happene

Purdue was not from the start, using a three-play 92-yard drive to get on the scoreboard. The Bulldog defense gave up an 84-yard touchdown pass on the Boilermakers' opening score.

Once settled, Keene and the Bulldog offense began to click. Keene connected with Mac Dalena and Tre Watson in back-to-back attempts to move the ball down the field. Keene found Brooks on a 29-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at seven with 7:26 left in the first quarter. The Bulldog defense held Purdue to six attempts at the 1-yard line to end the first quarter. Purdue opened the second quarter with the punch-in to take a 14-7 lead.

The shootout began as Keene led the offense to a game-tying drive on Fresno State's following possession. Keene found Brooks for a 49-yard completion. Three plays later, Keene scrambled and found a wide-open Jalen Moss in the back corner of the end zone to tie the game at 14.

Purdue scored on its following possession to take a 21-14 lead. Fresno State trekked down field, but couldn't find the end zone. Dylan Lynch's kick from 21 yards out was no good. The Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out, and the 'Dogs had 22 seconds of clock time before the halftime break. Lynch redeemed himself as he kicked a career-long 52-yard field goal to put the 'Dogs within four at the half, 21-17.

Purdue returned the second half's opening kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, extending the Boilermakers' lead to 28-17.

The Bulldog offense had a glimpse of some new faces in its next scoring drive as freshman running back Devon Rivers had the first two carries of the drive, including a 14-yard gain. The Keene and Brooks connection stayed strong with a 24-yard reception to set the 'Dogs up at the Purdue 19-yard line, Jaelen Gill recorded his first touchdown as a Bulldog on an 18-yard completion from Keene. The 'Dogs were successful in their 2-point conversion attempt as Keene found Moss to make it a three-point game, 28-25.

The legs of Elijah Gilliam got the 'Dogs a total of 42 yards in their next offensive drive. The running backs continued the power as Malik Sherrod took the pitch from Keene and scampered in from one-yard out to take the lead 32-28 at the start of the fourth quarter.

Purdue answered with positive gain on its next drive, but the Bulldog defense stayed strong at the goal line. In a pass attempt to take the lead, Bulldog safety Dean Clark was there on the protection to force a fourth down for Purdue. The Boilermakers chose to go for it, but were met by a tough Bulldog front who kept them out of the end zone with 8:13 left on the clock.

Facing a third-and 8, Keene was intercepted at the Purdue 45-yard line. Two plays later, the Boilermakers took a 35-32 lead with 4:36 remaining.

That's when Keene took over. The Bulldogs' newest quarterback went 6-of-6 on Fresno State's final drive, culminating in a 22-yard strike to Brooks in the end zone giving the Bulldogs a 39-35 lead with 59 seconds remaining.

Purdue got down to its own 44-yard line, but on fourth-and-2, defensive captain Levelle Bailey got a hand on a Hudson Card's attempt to seal the game.

FRESNO, Calif. – Playing in its first double overtime game since 2019, Fresno State defeated Eastern Washington 34-31 in its home opener on Saturday night. Levelle Bailey ended the game with an interception on the Eagles' first play of the second overtime.

Elijah Gilliam finished the night with 86 yards rushing and a career-high two touchdowns. Mikey Keene finished with 233 yards passing on 23-of-39 attempts and two scores.

How It Happened

Fresno State's defense opened with a quick turnover on downs on the opening drive of the game, allowing the Bulldog offense to take over at the EWU 42-yard line. It took Fresno State just three plays to score as Mac Dalena opened with a 33-yard run. Keene connected with Jalen Moss on a short completion, then Gilliam ran in from five yards out to finish off the drive with a score.

EWU was held to a 23-yard field goal on its next drive to make it a 7-3 game, but ate 8:51 of clock time.

Eastern Washington fumbled on its first play of the second quarter, and Kemari Munier-Bailey recovered to bring possession to the Bulldogs. Fresno State used only four plays to find the end zone on its next drive with Devon Rivers totaling 14 yards on the ground before Keene found Jake Boust open in the end zone for a 6-yard touchdown pass.

Fresno State took a 14-3 lead into the break.

EWU scored its first touchdown of the game on its first drive of the second half, making it a 14-10 lead for the Bulldogs with 11:15 left in the third quarter. The Bulldogs answered back three minutes later, quickly moving the ball down the field, ending in a 29-yard touchdown from Keene to Erik Brooks.

The Eagles scored 14 unanswered to claim their first lead of the game, 24-21 with 10:01 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Lynch leveled the game at 24, with 6:44 to played with a 44-yard field goal. Following a stop, the Bulldogs had one last chance. Lynch lined up a 35-yard attempt with seconds left but his kick drifted wide right.

Opening the overtime period, it took Eastern Washington four plays to score a touchdown to go up 31-24. The Bulldogs answered back in five plays, finishing with a 1-yard plunge from Gilliam to tie it up at 31-31.

In the second overtime, Fresno State took a 34-31 lead on a 25-yard field goal from Lynch. On the Eagles' first play of their possession, Bailey intercepted Kekoa Visperas to seal the game.
