#BYTHENUMBERS

The Sun Devils are fourth in the Pac-12 this year with 24 home runs by 10 different players. That total is notable as those 10 players had combined for just seven Division I collegiate home runs in their lifetimes combined entering the season (Canning 3, Shaps 2, Lillard 1, McCuin 1). ASU has six home runs in the last four games and five of those had at least one runner on base - notable as the Devils had 15 solo home runs on the season and was riding a streak of eight consecutive solo shots entering the current run.

Lyle Lin enters the UNLV contest having reached base in 21 consecutive games. It is the longest active streak by a Sun Devil and eight games longer than any other player this season. Lin has reached base in all but one game this season and has recorded a hit in 28 of the team's 35 games to date and multiple hits in 14 of those games. His 14 multi-hit games and seven mutli-RBI games lead the Sun Devils. The 21-game reached-based streak is tied for the third-longest among all ASU freshmen since 2000.

Gage Canning enters the contest riding a season-high ninegame hitting streak - the longest active streak by a Sun Devil. He has batted .462 on 18-of-39 hitting in that span with a team-best .744 slugging percentage with two home runs and three doubles and a triple in that time. The defending Pac-12 Player of the Week, Canning leads the team with six games this season with three or more hits - surpassing his 2016 total of four as a freshman. He leads the Sun Devils with nine doubles this season a five triples, a total good for seventh nationally and first in the Pac-12

> Eder Erives has been among ASU's hottest players after a slow start to the season. The senior started the year with a 9.00 ERA in his first three appearances. Since the Long Beach State series, Erives has posted a team-best 2.74 ERA in seven appearances, with a team-leading three saves in that span. Erives has struck out 21 batters in that time, good for third on the team, and also started two games in which he kept ASU in the game against #2 Oregon State and then didn't allow a run en route to a team victory over Washington State.

Arizona State will typically host weekly media availability every Tuesday and Wednesday at Phoenix Municipal Stadium prior to practice at approximately 1 p.m. On weeks of a Tuesday midweek game at home, the Tuesday postgame press conference will serve as the week's availability. Media planning to attend must contact Jeremy Hawkes ahead of time and inform him of their plans. Throughout the season's schedule, ASU will host postgame interviews in the Omaha Room located in the home locker room following after coach's postgame talk with the team. Media members must request players at the beginning of the ninth inning (or earlier in games that look to be blowouts). Please contact Jeremy Hawkes or a member of the media relations staff in the press box to coordinate those interviews. Media members who wish to schedule an interview outside of practice must contact Jeremy Hawkes.

Photography/Videoography

Accomodations for B-Roll purposes at practice can be made through Jeremy Hawkes (jdhawkes@asu.edu). During games, credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times. Shooting areas are designated camera wells on the far side of both the visitor's and home team's dugouts. Contact Jeremy Hawkes for any details regarding shooting game action.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed. ESPN networks (i.e., ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU) will also televise all NCAA College World Series games from Saturday, June 17, through Wednesday, June 28. No other broadcast network or Internet entity, other than ESPN, may air these games, nor show highlights of these games until the ESPN broadcast is off the air. Broadcast networks / television stations may use up to three (3) minutes (per newscast) of video footage from any one game or five (5) minutes total of video footage from all games played on that particular day of competition for up to 72 hours following the game / broadcast. No media entity (commercial or noncommercial) is allowed to display any game video on its website. If a commercial broadcast entity wishes to license video footage beyond the previously described time period (72 hours), all requests to obtain clips or copies of NCAA championships / events (e.g., game / program records, melt / highlight tapes) need to go through the NCAA / T3 Media online footage request system, which can be found at the following website: http://www.t3licensing.com/video/home/ncaa.do.

2017 Media Coverage

There will be no shortage of ways to follow the Sun Devils throughout the 2017 campaign as a record 43 of ASU's 55 total games this season will be broadcast on television or via live stream. Every single one of the Sun Devils' 33 home games will be available to fans via the Pac-12 Networks or the Pac-12 Live Stream online and a total of 17 games overall are scheduled to be televised live through the Pac-12 Networks.

The Sun Devil Sports Radio Network is scheduled to broadcast 35 Sun Devil Baseball games this season between NBC Sports Radio AM 1060 and 100.7 KSLXHD. Fans can listen to the broadcasts on the radio or via the Tuneln app on thesundevils.com. Links to the streaming audio can be found on the online baseball schedule.

Tim Healey is set to serve his 19th season as the "Voice of the Sun Devils" on baseball broadcasts and will be joined for the second-straight season by color analyst Max Rossiter, who was an all-conference catcher for the Devils from 2012-13.

Head Coach Tracy Smith's weekly radio show, "Dugout Chatter," will debut on March 29 on NBC Sports Radio AM 1060. The 30-minute show will run each Wednesday at 8 p.m. for nine weeks and is hosted by the Tim Healey.

GAME NOTES

Eli's Comina

- Eli Lingos, who earned first team Pac-12 All-Academic honors in 2016, has quickly solidified himself as the team's ace this season after entering the year as the Friday Night Starter.
- Lingos has been solid in 2017, going 4-3 with four quality starts in his 10 appearances of the season.
 No other Sun Devil has more than one quality start this season.
- Among those wins were an upset over then-No. 1
 TCU and a career-best 7.2 IP outing against LMU in
 which he allowed no runs.
- Lingos went over 6.0 IP in his first five appearances this season after neving having consecutive games over 6.0 IP in his career prior to this season.
- The junior lefty has allowed no earned runs in two starts this season, something he had done in a start just once in his career prior.
- His four wins this season surpass his 2016 total
 while he has issued no walks in two his starts this
 season, something he had accomplished in just two
 starts prior to 2017.
- He is seven in the league with 50.0 innings pitched this season and eighth in the conference with 40 strikeouts. He is tied for third nationally with nine starts this year.

Mr. Friday Night

- Lingos is the sixth pitcher since 2014 to assume the Friday Night role, joining Ryan Burr, Brett Lilek, Seth Martinez, Ryan Kellogg and Hever Bueno.
- ASU used four pitchers in the Friday night role in six seasons between 2008 and 2013 with Mike Leake ('08, '09), Seth Blair ('10), Brady Rodgers ('11, '12) and Trevor Williams ('13).
- Lingos joins a long and illustrious line of Mr. Friday Night's at ASU that includes nine Major Leaguers and numerous ASU Hall of Famers, including Eddie Bane, Floyd Bannister, Kendall Carter, Mike Esposito, Larry Gura, Gary Gentry, Mike Leake, Trevor Williams and Brady Rodgers.

Lin-Sanity

True freshman Lyle Lin continues to be the highlight

- of the freshmen class, ranked 10th in the Pac-12 Conference with a .349 average this year.
- Lin has had three or more hits in three games on the year while registering multiple hits in 14 games on the season overall. No other Sun Devil has more than 11 such games.
- Lin enters the weekend having reached base in 21 consecutive games. It is the longest active streak by a Sun Devil and tied for third among all ASU freshmen since 2000 for the longest in a season with RJ Ybarra (2013) and Drew Maggi (2009), trailing only Gage Canning (28, 2016) and Dustin Pedroia (26, 2002) for the longest streak by a freshman since 2000.
- Lin has reached base in all but one single game this season and has a hit in 28 of the team's 35 games.
- Lin's prowess of the plate is further exemplified by his team leading 14 walks as opposing pitchers have begun pitching around him in recent weeks.

Re-LYLE-able

- Lyle Lin has an approach at the plate that is tough to find in many freshmen. The youngster leads the team's starters with a 18 two-out hits and is second with a .400 average (18-of-45) with two outs on the board.
- Lin leads the team with nine two-out RBIs and also holds a team-leading 16 hits with runners in scoring position on 41 at bats (.390), five more than the next closest Devil.
- Lin has started every game this season, one of just three players to do so - with a team-leading 19 RBIs in the process.

And All That Chaz

- In his first eight appearances, freshman Chaz Montoya struggled with a 14.29 ERA and an 0-1 record.
- In his last five appearances, Montoya has a 3.90
 ERA and a 3-1 record, striking out 23 in the process.
- Of ASU's last seven wins, three of those belong to Montoya.
- He had a streak of 17.1 innings without allowing a run come to an end in his start against UCLA.

Zach Cer-Bomb

- One of the most pleasant surprises of 2017 has been the emergence of senior catcher Zach Cerbo, a fouryear veteran who is seeing his most significant action as a Sun Devil this season.
- Cerbo's .344 average is second on the team with a team-leading .430 on-base percentage. He is second on the team with his 11 walks and while sitting pacing the squad with a .516 slugging percentage.
- Cerbo's defense has been another much-needed addition to the team as the senior has thrown out eight batters attempting to steal a base this season compared to just 14 stolen bases against. Those eight batters caught stealing are currently second in the Pac-12.

12-Gage

- Gage Canning has been among the hottest Sun
 Devils in the lineup this season, entering the week as
 the defending Pac-12 Player of the Week and riding a
 nine game hitting streak.
- He is 18-of-39 (.462) in that span with two home runs, three doubles and a triple with a team-best nine runs scored and nine RBIs, slugging an incredible .744 and a perfect 3-for-3 on stolen bases while going errorless on 18 chances from the field.
- Canning leads the team with six games this season with three or more hits - surpassing his 2016 total of four as a freshman.
- Canning has spent time at the leadoff spot and turning the order back around in the lower part of the lineup this year and done exactly what's expected of him in that role, second on the team with five stolen bases and leading the way with 27 runs scored.
- Canning also leads the Devils with nine doubles and five triples this season (the latter leading the Pac-12 and seventh nationally).

Shaps Blasts

 After missing the first five games of the season to suspension, junior Andrew Shaps matched the Sun Devil season lead with 13 consecutive games reaching base, a streak that was snapped in the finale against No. 2 Oregon State.

- The outfielder had a career-best 10-game hitting streak entering that OSU finale and is already second on the team with 13 runs scored this year.
- Shaps is currently in the midst of a 11-game reachedbase streak.
- Despite missing five games, Shaps is second on the team in walks this season with 12 and also second on the team in home runs with four notable as he had just two in his career prior.

Big Willie Style

- Tyler Williams has provided some much needed pop in the lineup this season, leading the team with five home runs on the year after having none in his freshman campaign - a total good for a tie for fifth in the Pac-12.
- His 19 RBIs this season are second on the team and he has a knack for pushing runners across even with an out, logging seven RBIs with an out and leading the team in advancing runners with an out, doing so 14 times.
- Williams leads the team when it comes to advancing runners, doing so 23 times on 41 chances (.561).
- The sophomore has also brought home a runner from third with less than two outs a team-best nine times on 12 chances (.750).

Turning The Tides

- Connor Higgins was in pretty dire straights in the first 13 games with a 27.00 ERA in three appearances with just 1.1 innings pitched. Since then, Higgins has a 4.50 ERA in eight apperances with 16 strikeouts to six walks in 12.2 innings pitched while picking up two wins and two saves in the process
- Eder Erives had a 9.00 ERA in three appearances and just 2.0 innings pitched and that's down to a 3.07 ERA in his last five relief apperances with 16 strikeouts and all three of his season's saves, good for eighth in the Pac-12
- Jake Godfrey had a 6.35 ERA early in the year that is now 2.38 in his last five relief apperances. The junior college transfer has been solid in keeping his team out of trouble all season, inheriting a team-leading 13 baserunners on the year and stranding 12 of those.

Ten Sun Devils (Tyler Williams 5, Andrew Shaps 4, Carter Aldrete 3, Zach Cerbo 2, Ryan Lillard 2, Hunter Bishop 2, Gage Canning 2, Jeremy McCuin 2, Lyle Lin 1, and Jackson Willeford 1) have combined for ASU's 24 home runs this season - an interesting note as those 10 combined entered the 2017 season with just seven Division I career home runs between them (Canning 3, Shaps 2, Lillard 1, McCuin 1).

Clutch Hitting

- The Sun Devils have lived and died by their clutch hitting this season, currently batting 58-of-180 (.322) with runners in scoring position and 66-of-190 (.347) with two outs in the team's wins but struggling to get timely hits in the team's losses at just 31-of-170 (.182) with runners in scoring position and 40-of-198 (.202) with two outs.
- On the flip side, ASU has struggled defensively to get out of some innings, allowing 87 two-out RBIs of the 209 total by the opposition this season while allowing opponents to bat .313 (130-of-415) with two outs.

- Since 2016, the Devils are 7-2 in extra-inning games (1-1 in 2017), with six walk-off wins (two this sea-

- son) and are 16-3 (4-2 this year) in one-run games including 5-2 in Pac-12 play. ASU has driven in the game-winning run in the eighth inning or later 13 times (three times this year).
- Arizona State has notched 10 wins since 2016 when trailing after six innings (four times this season).

- ASU drew more than 78,000 fans last season, finishing in the top-30 nationally in total attendance and attendance per game.
- The Sun Devils have had a pair of big attendance games this season, including 6,010 against Oregon State in the series opener - the second largest crowd since moving back to Phoenix Muni - as well as 4,107 fans against UNLV in the largest mid-week attendance since returning to Muni and fifth-largest overall since returning.
- The Devils are currently 24th nationally with 61,263 cumulative fans this season (second in the Pac-12) and 24th with 2,553 fans per game (third in the Pac-12).
- ASU ranked 13th in total attendance and was
 the only school west of Texas to draw more than
 100,000 fans in 2015, and ranked 18th in average
 attendance with 3,082 fans per game. ASU's
 107,010 fans were the program's most since 2010

Erives On Fire

- Sun Devil Baseball senior RHP Eder Erives has been named to the preseason watch list for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball, members of the association announced Monday.
- Erives is the first Sun Devil to be named to the preseason watch list for the award since Ryan Burr in 2014.
- Erives, a Pac-12 All-Conference Honorable Mention in 2016, notched a 6-2 record with a 2.95 ERA last season. His 10 saves trailed only Oregon State's Max Englebrekt, whose 11 saves top the list of returning relievers in in the Pac-12.
- Last season, Erives struck out 73 batters and walked 36 in 76.1 innings. The 76.1 innings pitched rank fourth among the 55 players named to the watch list while his 73 strikeouts are good for seventh. Erives held opponent batting average to .192, a career-low for the right-handed pitcher. He made 23 appearances with three starts and finished fourth in the conference in saves.
- Erives holds a 3.00 career ERA and a 9-4 record overall with 61 total appearances, three starts and 11 saves over 129 innings.

- ASU has the highest winning percentage among all Pac-12 schools and the fourth-highest winning percentage among all NCAA schools at .708 (2,524-1,037-4) behind Texas (.728), Florida State (.729) and Miami (FL) (.710). ASU only includes its modern era (1959-present) in its record books, while the NCAA record book goes back to 1907.

- Four Sun Devils made their debuts in the MLB during the 2016 season, bringing ASU's total to 108 all-time the most among all NCAA schools since 1959. Jake Barrett (Diamondbacks) and Tony Barnette (Rangers) each saw their first Big League action in the opening month of the MLB season last year while Brady Rodgers (Astros) and Trevor Williams (Pirates) bookended things, appearing in the final month of the season.
- The Sun Devils have now had at least one major league player on their varsity roster each year from 1961 through 2013, which is the longest current streak in the nation. Thirty-three ASU baseball players have made their MLB debuts since 2002.

season at the helm of the Sun Devil baseball program.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 50 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school.

In 20 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 68 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 61 draftees since 2000 and 31 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 36 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past eight seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In 2016, Smith piloted the Sun Devils to a regional final for the time since 2013. The Sun Devils' 36 wins were the most in the past three years and they finished tied for third in the Pac-12. Five players were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft, marking 14 total players who have been taken in the draft during Smith's tenure.

Eight Devils earned All-Pac-12 honors on the season, including first team selections David Greer, Seth Martinez, Brian Serven and Colby Woodmansee. All four players would go on to be selected in the MLB draft with Greer (third team), Martinez (second team) and Woodmansee (third team) earning Louisville Slugger All-America accolades.

Smith was instrumental in Sun Devil Baseball's signing of the nation's top recruiting class in 2016, which included eight players who had been drafted by the Major League out of high school.

In his first season at ASU, Smith led the Sun Devils to a postseason berth, a third-place finish in the Pac-12 and 30-plus wins.

He became one of five active coaches, and one of eight all-time, to bring three different Div. I schools to NCAA Regional play as he guided the Sun Devils to a No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional

He has amassed a 675-503-1 career record in 20 seasons as a head coach at three different schools, including nine seasons at both Miami (Ohio) and Indiana, and one year at Arizona State. His 675 victories rank in the top 50 among active coaches in the NCAA, and his 20 seasons represent the sixth-shortest number of years on the list.

Smith instituted a change in culture at Arizona State and his demand for excellence both on and off the field was represented as the Devils led the Pac-12 in both all-conference and all-academic honorees in 2014.

Nineteen players have earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors in Smith1s first two seasons, tied for the most in Sun Devil history for a two-year span. ASU's 10 selections in Smith1s first season led the Pac-12.

His emphasis on defense became evident right away as ASU vastly improved its fielding percentage and lowered its number of errors committed in Smith's first season. The Devils finished fourth in the Pac-12 in both categories in 2015 after ranking near the bottom of the conference from 2010-14.

An accomplished fundraiser, Smith played a huge role in helping transition the Sun Devil Baseball program into Phoenix Municipal Stadium. His vision saw a renovated clubhouse, complete with an alumni locker room and an academics center, as well as an increased prominence on the program's historical accomplishments. Capital improvements included a state-of-the art video board, batting tunnel, a weight room and training room, creation of a grass berm and patio installations, and premium seating options.

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

Smith came to Tempe with 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach, including nine at Miami University (Ohio) and nine at IU, where he was two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year. He led both programs to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances and more than 600 combined

He tallied more than 40 wins in each of the past two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown

since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big


Smith took an IU program that had finished 10th in the Big Ten six times in an eight-year stretch between 2000 and 2007, and led the Hoosiers to an NCAA Regional in 2009 and to the College World Series in 2013. IU notched a program-best 21 conference wins in 2014 and secured eight first team All-Big Ten selections to tie a conference mark for most first team honorees from one school.

He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization. He also participated in 1992 Major League Scouting Bureau's Professional Scout School as a representative of the Cubs.

Born Feb. 14, 1966, Smith graduated with a bachelor's degree in Education from Miami (Ohio) in 1989 and completed a master's degree in Sport Organization from Miami (Ohio) in 1992.

A native of Kentland, Ind., Smith and his wife, Jaime, have three sons, Casey, Ty and Jack. Casey was a four-year letterwinner on the Hoosier baseball team while Ty was a member for the IU football team. Jack is currently a wide receiver on the Sun Devil football team.




- BEN GREENSPAN ASSISTANT COACH/RECRUITING COORDINATOR

 Ben Greenspan enters his third season at Arizona State University as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator, and works primarily with the team's offense and catchers.
- Excelling in his recruiting coordinator position, Greenspan assembled the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation in 2016 according to Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The class is headlined by Hunter Bishop, who was rated the 15th best outfielder in the nation by Perfect Game. Bishop is joined by Chaz Montoya, the No. 1 left-handed pitcher in Arizona, and Carter Aldrete, the 23rd best shortstop in the nation according to Perfect Game.
- Catcher Brian Serven earned First Team All-Pac-12 recognition in 2016, as well as Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention and was a semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the nation's top catcher. His prowess on both sides of the plate was evident as he became just the fifth catcher in school history to lead the team in home runs and he caught 17 runners stealing, the most by a Sun Devil since 2009. Serven was the first Devil to go in the 2016 MLB Draft, going in the fifth round to the Colorado Rockies.
- Also excelling at the plate under Greenspan was first baseman David Greer, who also earned a First Team All-Conference selection as well as earning a spot on the Louisville Slugger All-America third team. The Arizona-native finished his junior campaign first in the conference in doubles and total bases, second in slugging percentage and third in runs scored. Greer was taken in the 10th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners.
- Greenspan mentored some of the most prolific hitters in IU program history, including two-time All-American catcher Kyle Schwarber, current Oakland Athletics catcher Josh Phegley, and 2010 Big Ten Player of the Year Alex Dickerson. He also played a large role in developing talent at IU as 11 of his position players were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft,


including five in the top five rounds. In the eight years Greenspan has served as a catching coach, his guidance has produced a First Team All-Conference player at that position in five of those seasons with two of them currently playing MLB (Schwarber and Phegley).

- Additional hitting protégés include 2012 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Sam Travis, two-time All-American Dustin DeMuth and current major leaguers Micah Johnson and Ethan Wilson.
- Played for two seasons under coach Smith at IU, and was a Hoosier team captain and Academic All-Big Ten performer in 2007. He spent two years at the University of Connecticut as a catcher and first baseman before joining the IU program. He earned a bachelor's degree in Sport Marketing and Management and a master's degree in Sport Administration from Indiana University.




FRED NORI - ASSISTANT COACH

- Fred Nori, who owns more than 30 years of coaching experience, enters his second seasons in three years on head coach Tracy Smith's coaching staff at Arizona State.
- This marks Nori's fifth stint working with Coach Smith after he served as the volunteer assistant for Indiana University in 2014 and 2007, for Miami University in 2005 and for the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Nori has three conference tournament championships, three NCAA Regional berths and two regular season conference crowns in four seasons as a Div. I assistant coach.
- He was a member of the 2014 IU team that won the Big Ten Conference championship and tournament championship, and became the first program in Big Ten history to earn a national seed. The RedHawks finished first in the Mid-American Conference, won the MAC Tournament championship and were an NCAA Regional participant in 2005. Nori was also a member of the 2009 Xavier Baseball staff, where he helped the Musketeers win the Atlantic 10 Tournament title and advance to an NCAA Regional.
- Nori has a long history of excellence in Ohio high school baseball and owns more than 20 years of head coaching experience that includes a Class A State Championship.
- Nori went on to play professional baseball for three seasons after his playing days at IU ended and he hit .284 with five home runs and 55 RBI as a member of the New York Mets organization. He was a student-athlete at IU from 1961-65, and earned his IU degree in 1965 and a master's degree from Xavier in 1969.



- Spent time in 2016 as an associate scout for the New York Mets.




