Oklahoma earns top spot in preseason poll

BOWLING GREEN, OHIO (December 11, 2019) – Oklahoma, winner of the 2019 NCAA National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championship, earned the top spot in the 2020 preseason poll as voted on by the coaches of the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association. The Sooners, coached by KJ Kindler, Lou Ball, and Tom Haley, will open the season at home on January 4, 2020 against Cal.
