SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will kick off its eighth season of play and third under head coach Frank Wilson when it travels to Tempe, Ariz., to face Arizona State on Saturday, Sept. 1. Kickoff is set for 9:30 p.m. CT at Sun Devil Stadium. The Roadrunners are 6-1 all-time in season openers, including a 4-1 record in lid-lifters away from San Antonio. UTSA and Arizona State are meeting for the second time in three seasons. The Sun Devils rallied from a 28-12 third-quarter deficit for a 32-28 victory on Sept. 3, 2016, at the Alamodome in the inaugural matchup.

TUNING IN

The game will be televised nationally on Fox Sports 1. Chris Myers (play-by-play) and James Laurinaitis (analyst) will have the call. Fox Sports 1 subscribers also can tune in at <http://foxsportsgo.com> or with the Fox Sports Go app. The contest will air live on the Roadrunners Sports Network and can be heard in the San Antonio area on Ticket 760 AM. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Pat Evans (sidelines) will call all the action. The pregame show will begin at 7:30 p.m. CT and there will be a 45-minute postgame show. The broadcast also can be heard live online at goUTSA.com and Ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app.

OPENING ON THE ROAD

For the sixth time in the program's eight-year history, the Roadrunners will open the season away from the Alamo City. UTSA is 4-1 in such games, winning three straight lid-lifters in 2012-14 before dropping a season opener for the first time at No. 22 Arizona in 2015. The Roadrunners opened Baylor, 17-10, in Waco to open the 2017 campaign, marking the program's first win over a team from a Power 5 conference.

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

UTSA has won six of its seven previous season openers dating back to its inaugural 2011 campaign. UTSA won each of its first four lid-lifters before suffering a 42-32 defeat at Arizona in 2015. The Roadrunners rebounded to win the 2016 opener against Alabama State, 26-13, before making it back-to-back season-opening wins with a 17-10 road triumph against Baylor last year. The Roadrunners downed Northeastern State at the Alamodome by a score of 31-3 in the program's inaugural game on Sept. 3, 2011, and the next three years saw them open the fall on the road. UTSA picked up its first-ever Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and road victory with a come-from-behind 33-31 victory at South Alabama on Sept. 1, 2012. The Birds then outlasted New Mexico by a 21-13 count on Aug. 31 in their 2013 opener and the following year saw the Roadrunners stun Houston, 27-7, on Aug. 29 in the first-ever game at TDECU Stadium.

GAME 84

Saturday's season-opener at Arizona State will mark the 84th game in UTSA football history and its 42nd road contest. The Roadrunners hold a 38-44 overall record, including a 16-25 mark away from home. By comparison, this will be the 1,020th game in Arizona State's history, which dates back to 1897. The Sun Devils are 602-393-24 all-time.

EYE ON THE THERMOSTAT

With a predicted temperature north of 100 degrees on Saturday in Tempe, this game may go down as the hottest in UTSA history. The Roadrunners' previous warmest two kickoffs both came during the 2013 season with a 92-degree reading at New Mexico on Aug. 31 and a 91-degree reading at Arizona two weeks later (Sept. 14).

A LOOK AT ARIZONA STATE

Arizona State is led by former NFL head coach and ESPN analyst Herm Edwards, who is in his first year with the Sun Devils. Arizona State went 7-6 in 2017, including a 6-3 mark in Pac-12 play. Headlining the Sun Devils is consensus preseason All-American N'Keal Harry. The junior wide out was a first-team All-Pac-12 performer last fall, as he racked up 82 catches for 1,142 yards and eight touchdowns. Defensively, linebacker Jay Jay Williams returns for his senior season after posting 47 tackles, including four for loss, and two sacks along with three passes defended in 2017.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday will mark the second all-time meeting between UTSA and Arizona State. The Sun Devils claimed a come-from-behind 32-28 win in the Alamodome on Sept. 16, 2016.

LAST MEETING

Arizona State rallied from a 16-point deficit for a 32-28 victory against UTSA in the inaugural meeting between the two teams on Sept. 3, 2016, at the Alamodome. UTSA built a 28-12 lead midway through the third quarter behind the arm and legs of quarterback Dalton Sturm, who passed for 229 yards and three touchdowns ran for 82 and a score. He completed TD passes of 10 yards to JaBryce Taylor and 11 to Jalen Rhodes to help stake the Roadrunners to a 14-3 advantage after one quarter of play. Sturm dodged several Sun Devils defenders on a 34-yard scoring scamper early in the third stanza and later found Shaq Williams on a 24-yard touchdown connection to push the home team ahead, 28-12. Arizona State used a pair of field goals from Zane Gonzalez, who booted four on the evening, including a pair from beyond 50 yards, to pull within 10. Manny Wilkins completed a 45-yard TD pass to Frederick Gammage and Kalen Ballage found paydirt from two yards out with 3:15 left to play to put the Sun Devils on top for good.

WILSON ENTERS THIRD YEAR AT HELM

Frank Wilson is in his third season as head coach of the Roadrunners. The New Orleans native has guided UTSA to back-to-back seasons of being bowl eligible, including leading the program to its first-ever postseason appearance at the 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, as UTSA tied the NCAA modern startup program by reaching a bowl game in its sixth season of play. He has coached 13 All-Conference USA selections and a pair of Freshman All-Americans in his first two years at the helm. Wilson came to San Antonio after a six-year stint as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at LSU, where he also was the associate head coach in 2012-15. Armed with more than a decade of coaching experience in the Southeastern Conference, Wilson also has been an assistant coach at Tennessee (2009), Southern Miss (2008) and Mississippi (2005-07). He has coached or recruited 36 individuals who have made it to the NFL, including 2018 NFL First Round Draft pick Marcus Davenport of the Saints.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

UTSA's defense emerged as one of the best in the nation last fall and more than half of that unit returns in 2018. The Roadrunners led Conference USA in seven different statistical categories and ranked in the top 10 nationally in five in 2017. UTSA allowed an FBS-low 166 first downs and yielded just 287.8 yards per game, which ranked fifth among all FBS programs. The Birds gave up a mere 160.1 passing yards per contest, the second-best average behind Michigan's 150.1. UTSA also appeared in the top 10 in the final NCAA statistics rankings in red zone defense (6th/72.0%) and scoring defense (8th/17.0 ppg.). The Roadrunners return six starters on that side of the ball, including preseason all-conference selections in defensive lineman Kevin Strong Jr. and linebacker Josiah Tavaeafa, along with defensive end Eric Banks, defensive tackle Baylen Baker and safeties Carl Austin III and C.J. Levine.

More than 800 high school, junior college and four-year college football coaching staffs will wear American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) patches on their shirts to promote the association and bring awareness to its programs. AFCA patches will be worn during games from August 25 through September 3.



C-USA TO HONOR MIKE SLIVE'S LEGACY THIS FALL

Conference USA Football teams will honor former C-USA commissioner Mike Slive and promote prostate cancer awareness in partnership with the Mike Slive Foundation by wearing custom helmet stickers this fall.

Slive, a respected and accomplished leader in college athletics, passed away in May at the age of 77. He was named the first Commissioner of Conference USA when the 12-team league was introduced on April 24, 1995. Under his direction, C-USA quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. Slive served as the league's Commissioner until 2002, when he became Commissioner of the Southeastern Conference.

As a prostate cancer survivor, Slive founded the Mike Slive Foundation for Prostate Cancer Research in 2017. The Foundation's mission is to save lives by funding cutting-edge research and by raising awareness of prostate cancer. For more information, please visit: www.MikeSliveFoundation.org

Additionally, the C-USA Board of Directors approved naming the C-USA Athletes of the Year in Mike Slive's honor earlier this summer. The annual awards are announced in June and have been changed to the Conference USA Michael L. Slive Male and Female Athletes of the Year.

THE POWER (5) OPEN

UTSA will open its 2018 season with three consecutive games against Power 5 conference opponents. The Roadrunners commence the season at Arizona State (Sept. 1) and then host Baylor (Sept. 8) before closing the stretch at Kansas State (Sept. 5). BYU is the only other non-Power 5 team to open the season with three straight Power 5 opponents (at Arizona [Sept. 1], vs. California [Sept. 8], at Wisconsin [Sept. 15]).

UTSA TRIO ON NATIONAL AWARD WATCH LISTS

Three Roadrunners have earned their way onto several preseason watch lists for national awards. Jalen Rhodes appears on three different watch lists: Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and Wuerffel Trophy. Josiah Tauaefa joins Rhodes on the Wuerffel Trophy watch list and the junior linebacker also is a candidate for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. Jared Sackett is one of 30 players on the Lou Groza Award watch list one year after the sophomore place-kicker was one of 20 semifinalists for the award.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE RECOGNITION

Senior defensive lineman Kevin Strong Jr. and junior linebacker Josiah Tauaefa were named to the Preseason All-Conference USA Team in a vote by the league's 14 head coaches. Strong Jr. was a second-team all-conference selection in 2017 after posting 27 tackles (12 solos), seven tackles for loss, three sacks and four quarterback hurries. Tauaefa, a Freshman All-American, the C-USA Freshman of the Year and a first-team all-league choice in 2016, posted 29 stops, two tackles for loss, a sack, two PBUs and a fumble return for a touchdown despite missing most of four contests during his sophomore campaign.

UTSA PICKED FIFTH IN C-USA WEST DIVISION

In a vote by the league's media, UTSA has been picked to finish fifth in Conference USA's West Division. North Texas is the preseason favorite in the West, followed by Louisiana Tech, UAB, Southern Miss, UTSA and a tie between Rice and UTEP. In the East, 2017 C-USA Champion Florida Atlantic is picked to defend its title, followed by Marshall, Middle Tennessee, FIU, WKU, Old Dominion and Charlotte. The 14th annual Conference USA Football Championship Game, pitting the champions of the East and West Divisions, will be held Saturday, Dec. 1.

SENIOR STANDOUT NEXT IN LINE

Despite its young history, UTSA has developed a long line of accomplished defensive linemen; four who moved on to the professional ranks, including 2018 NFL First Round Draft pick Marcus Davenport. UTSA senior Kevin Strong Jr. has his sights set on being the next on that list. The Cleveland, Texas, native collected second-team all-conference accolades in 2017 after posting 27 tackles (12 solos), seven tackles for loss, three sacks and four quarterback hurries. The preseason All-Conference USA selection enters his final campaign with 82 career stops, including 20 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, a pair of pass breakups, a school-record two blocked kicks and one fumble recovery. He ranks third on the program's all-time TFLs list and is just 1.5 sacks shy of the Roadrunners' top five.

RUSHING UP THE CHARTS

Senior running back Jalen Rhodes is rushing his way up several of UTSA's career charts. The Rowlett, Texas, product enters his final season with 1,728 career rushing yards and he needs just 25 yards to move past David Glasco II into second place and 666 to surpass Jarveon Williams' school record of 2,392 yards. Rhodes, who set the program's single-season rushing touchdowns record with nine in 2016, also ranks third all-time with 17 rushing TDs, just three shy of matching Glasco's record of 20, and he is tied for third all-time with 19 total scores, three behind Glasco's 22. Rhodes also has 349 career carries and is chasing Williams' UTSA standard of 474. He owns three 100-yard rushing games, including a career-high 174 on 15 totes in the 44-14 win against Texas State last fall.

TACKLE MACHINE

UTSA linebacker Josiah Tavaeafa has been a tackling machine for the Roadrunners since bursting onto the scene as a redshirt freshman in 2016. The 6-2, 245-pound junior set a school record with 115 tackles en route to being tabbed a Freshman All-American, the 2016 Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a first-team all-conference performer. Despite missing nearly half of his sophomore season, the Lake Dallas High School product still registered 29 stops, two tackles for loss, a sack and a fumble return for a touchdown for a defense that led C-USA in seven statistical categories and ranked in the top five nationally in five. The preseason all-conference pick enters his third season with 144 tackles (50 solos), 11 tackles for loss, seven sacks, four pass breakups, one interception and a fumble recovery for his career.

YOU CAN'T SPELL ROUTSAS WITHOUT UTSA

UTSA punter Yannis Routsas has established himself as one of the best at his trade in the conference. The Houston native enters his senior season with a 40.84 career punting average and 179 punts, both school records. Last fall, Routsas was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award after registering a 41.55 average on 47 punts, 10 of which sailed more than 50 yards. He pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line 28 times and induced 14 fair catches to help UTSA lead C-USA and rank fifth nationally in punt return defense (2.88 avg.). Routsas, who also serves as the Roadrunners' holder, set the single-season punting average standard of 42.0 in 2016 and he owns three of the five longest punts in program history, including a career-best 62-yarder against UTEP in 2015.

SPLITTING THE UPRIGHTS

UTSA place-kicker Jared Sackett returns for his sophomore season after a successful debut campaign in 2017. The Fort Worth native, who was named to the Lou Groza Award preseason watch list, became the program's second Freshman All-American when he was honored by USA TODAY last fall after setting the school's single-season record with 19 field goals despite only kicking in 10 games. Sackett, who was one of 20 Lou Groza Award semifinalists last year, ranked third in the FBS in field goals per game (1.9) and ninth in field-goal percentage (.864). The C-USA All-Freshman Team selection made his first eight field goal attempts after not kicking in the season opener and he booted all three attempts, including the game-winner with two seconds left, in UTSA's 9-7 victory against Marshall last November.

UTSA PAIR HAS NFL TIES

Two UTSA players have significant family ties when it comes to relatives who have played in the National Football League (NFL). Junior defensive tackle King Newton is the son of Nate Newton, who was a three-time Super Bowl Champion (1992-93, '95) and six-time Pro Bowl offensive guard (1992-96, '98) for the Dallas Cowboys. Meanwhile, senior wide receiver Marquez McNair is the nephew of the late Steve McNair, who played quarterback in the NFL from 1995-2006 after winning the 1994 Walter Payton Award (NCAA Division I-AA's top player) and finishing third in the Heisman Trophy balloting.

ROADRUNNERS ROSTER MAKEUP

UTSA's 108-man roster features 20 seniors, 23 juniors, 27 sophomores and 38 redshirt or true freshmen. Eighty-one Roadrunners hail from Texas. There are six players from both Florida and Mississippi along with three from California, Louisiana and Tennessee. The squad is rounded out with a player each from Arizona, Indiana, Kansas, Oklahoma, Nigeria and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

TV BIRDS

All 12 of UTSA's regular season games this fall have been selected for broadcast across a total of seven networks, including CBS Sports, ESPN and Fox Sports networks. The Roadrunners, who have seen their last 60 outings appear over the airwaves, will make it 72 straight televised/streamed appearances by the end of the season.

FEW CAN CALL A DOME HOME

The Roadrunners are one of only two FBS teams to play their home games indoors. UTSA, which boasts a 22-19 all-time mark inside the Alamodome, joins Syracuse (Carrier Dome) as the only FBS programs to play in enclosed facilities.

UP NEXT

UTSA will open its home slate against Baylor on Saturday, Sept. 8. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. at the Alamodome and the game will air on CBS Sports Network on Facebook.

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — The touchdowns came more easily back home in the desert. Down in Texas, the Arizona State Sun Devils found themselves in a grinder where every yard and score was tough to earn.

Kalen Ballage scored on a 2-yard run with 3:15 to play and Arizona State rallied from 16 points down in the second half for a rugged 32-28 win over Texas-San Antonio on Friday night.

Heavy favorites against a Conference USA program still in its infancy, the Sun Devils found themselves down early and fighting from behind nearly the entire game a week after putting up 68 points in a win over Texas Tech.

"Never give up," Arizona State linebacker DJ Calhoun said, adding his team was probably a bit "cocky" after its previous win. "We came in here thinking we could just run past this team. We fought. Never give up."

Arizona State scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns. Ballage, who tied an NCAA record with eight touchdowns against Texas Tech, capped the rally when he took a direct snap and powered over the goal line. The touchdown was set up by a defensive pass interference penalty on third down one play earlier.

Zane Gonzalez kicked four field goals, including two from 54 yards, for Arizona State (3-0) and became the Pac-12 career scoring leader.

Manny Wilkins passed for 264 yards and two touchdowns for the Sun Devils. Wilkins threw a 27-yard score to N'Keal Harry with 3 seconds left in the first half. His 45-yard pass to Frederick Gammage in the fourth quarter cut the UTSA lead to 28-25.

Wilkins shook off what looked like a ferocious hit in the first quarter and didn't miss a play.

"I don't ever sit on the floor," Wilkins. "I'm going to get up and go to the next play. I've got a fighter's mentality."

Dalton Sturm passed for 229 yards and three touchdowns for UTSA (1-2). He also ran for 82 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown in the third quarter that had the Roadrunners thinking about a program-changing upset.

"Proud of the effort we had," Sturm said. "But I felt like everybody else in the locker room: It hurts."

RUSTON, La. (AP) — Boston Scott had 20 carries for 138 yards and a touchdown on Saturday night to help Louisiana Tech become bowl eligible with a 20-6 win over UTSA.

Scott covered most of the ground on an eight-play, 80-yard drive and capped it with a 35-yard run to make it 20-6 with 2:23 left. The Bulldogs' Darryl Lewis intercepted Dalton Sturm's pass four plays later to secure the win.

The Louisiana Tech (6-6, 4-4 Conference USA) defense twice came up with big stops deep in its own territory to cover for what could have been two costly second-half turnovers. Early in the second half, Nate Gaines' interception of J'Mar Smith's pass set up UTSA (6-5, 3-5) at the Bulldogs 13. But the Roadrunners were held to a field goal after getting a first-and-goal from the 1.

Then, near the midpoint of the fourth quarter, Louisiana Tech's Teddy Veal muffed a punt return that gave UTSA the ball at the 11 trailing 13-6. But Amik Robertson intercepted Sturm's pass into the end zone on the next play.

Tyrell Clay had 50 yards rushing on 17 carries for UTSA, which was held to 201 total yards.

Introduced as UTSA's head coach on Jan. 15, 2016, Frank Wilson has led the Roadrunners to new heights in his first two seasons at the helm.

Armed with more than a decade of coaching experience in the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and a proven track record as a highly successful high school head coach, the New Orleans native has had an immediate impact on UTSA in his short time in the Alamo City.

Wilson's debut campaign made history, as he led the Roadrunners to six wins and the 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl to match the NCAA modern startup program record by reaching a bowl game in their sixth season.

After leading UTSA to a second-place finish in Conference USA's West Division with a 5-3 league ledger that included upset wins against Middle Tennessee (45-25) and Southern Miss (55-32), Wilson saw seven of his players earn all-conference honors. Josiah Taaefa garnered Freshman of the Year, first-team all-conference and all-freshman team accolades at linebacker, while defensive end Marcus Davenport and safety Michael Egwuagu were named to the second team. Long snapper Matt Bayliss, offensive tackle Jevonte Domond, safety Jordan Moore and wide receiver Josh Stewart all collected honorable mention certificates. Additionally, Taaefa was named to the Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America Team, a first for the program.

Wilson guided UTSA to bowl eligibility for the second straight season in 2017. The Roadrunners pulled off another program first when they defeated Baylor, 17-10, in the season opener in Waco for UTSA's first victory against a team from a Power 5 Conference. The Roadrunners also improved to 2-0 all-time against Texas State with a 44-14 triumph in the H-E-B I-35 Showdown and they posted a 9-7 win against Marshall in the home finale.

Six Roadrunners collected all-conference accolades, headlined by C-USA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team defensive end Marcus Davenport, who became UTSA's first-ever NFL First Round Draft pick when he was selected 14th overall by the New Orleans Saints. Bayliss and defensive lineman Kevin Strong Jr. picked up second-team honors, while linebacker La'Kel Bass, safety Nate Gaines and place-kicker Jared Sackett were named honorable mention. Sackett also became UTSA's second Freshman All-American when he was honored by USA TODAY Sports. Additionally, wide receiver Brady Jones garnered Academic All-Conference USA honors and was a semifinalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy.

Wilson came to UTSA after a six-year stint as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at LSU from 2010-15, where he also served as associate head coach for his final four seasons with the Tigers. He also has been an assistant coach at Tennessee (2009), Southern Miss (2008) and Mississippi (2005-07).

While at LSU, he was recognized as the nation's top assistant coach at his position in 2011. Wilson also was named the 2011 Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com, the 2014 NFL.com Top Recruiter in College Football and the 2015 Scout.com SEC Recruiter of the Year.

As the recruiting coordinator at LSU, Wilson led the Tigers to back-to-back top-five recruiting classes in 2014-15 among five total groups that ranked among the top 10 nationally. He served as the lead recruiter for a long list of prominent players, including Odell Beckham Jr., La'el Collins, Jeremy Hill, Jarvis Landry, Tyrann Mathieu, Zach Mettenberger and the nation's No. 1 overall recruit in 2014 in Leonard Fournette, a 2014 Freshman All-SEC honoree and consensus first team All-American a year later.

Overall, Wilson has coached or recruited 36 individuals who have made it to the NFL. That list includes Davenport and Jarveon Williams from UTSA, Beckham Jr., Collins, Fournette, Hill, Landry, Mathieu and Mettenberger along with Lamin Barrow, Kendall Beckwith, Alfred Blue, Will Clapp, Malachi Dupre, Ego Ferguson, Russell Gage, BenJarvus Green-Ellis, Derrius Guice, Jerald Hawkins, Kenny Hilliard, Anthony Johnson, Deion Jones, Arden Key, Kendrick Lewis, Terrance Magee, Ronald Martin, Dexter McCluster, Denarius Moore, Eric Reid, Stevan Ridley, Duke Riley, Trai Turner, Mike Wallace, Spencer Ware and James Wright.

In six seasons at LSU, Wilson developed seven running backs that were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-team All-SEC performers in Fournette, Guice, Hill and Ridley. During his tenure, the Tigers posted a 61-17 overall record, captured the 2011 SEC Championship and appeared in the National Championship Game that same season.

Under his guidance, LSU rushed for at least 200 yards 39 times, including 12 300-yard games. The Tigers also recorded 45 100-yard individual rushing performances and four 1,000-yard individual rushers.

Wilson joined the LSU staff after spending the 2009 season at Tennessee, where he coached the wide receivers under Lane Kiffin.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff, Wilson spent the 2008 season as the running backs coach/recruiting coordinator at Southern Miss under Larry Fedora.

From 2005-07, Wilson served as the running backs/assistant special teams coach at Mississippi, where he recruited prominent future NFL stars Kendrick Lewis and Mike Wallace. He also developed a first-team all-conference running back in Green-Ellis.

Wilson joined the Rebels' staff after serving one year as director of athletics for the New Orleans Public School System after spending three-and-a-half seasons as head football coach and offensive coordinator at O. Perry Walker High School.

Wilson led O. Perry Walker to two District 10-4A championships and the Louisiana Class 4A State Championship game in 2002. He was honored by the NFL as the 2002 Louisiana Coach of the Year and was voted by his peers as the Louisiana Class 4A Coach of the Year. Wilson also was a finalist for the 2002 Nike National Coach of the Year.

During his head coaching stint at O. Perry Walker, Wilson developed 22 players who earned Division I scholarships, including 11 in 2002 to rank as the nation's largest high school class of D-I signees. The 2002 team defeated national-power John Curtis Christian School, 20-0, during the regular season, which snapped a 136-game district winning streak for John Curtis and marked the first time that team had failed to score in 303 consecutive games, a national record.

Wilson spent three years as an assistant coach at Edna Karr High School, also in New Orleans, from 1997-2000. He served as offensive coordinator at Edna Karr during the 1999 season in which the team reached the Class 3A state finals and recorded its best statistical season on offense in the program's history.

Wilson got his start in coaching as a student assistant at his alma mater, Nicholls State, working with the running backs while he finished his degree. While in Thibodaux, Wilson helped coach the first 1,000-yard rusher in school history and was part of the biggest turnaround in NCAA history at the time for the Colonels, who improved from 0-10 in 1995 to 8-2 in 1996.

A three-year letterman at Nicholls State, Wilson earned honorable mention all-conference honors as a running back his sophomore year.

Wilson attended Geneva University in Beaver Falls, Pa., his freshman season, earning conference Freshman of the Year honors as a running back and kick returner. He also earned first team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention NAIA Division II All-American.

Wilson received his bachelor of arts degree in general education from Nicholls State in 1997.

Wilson and his wife, Tiffany, have three children: Alaina, Sabree and Frank IV.

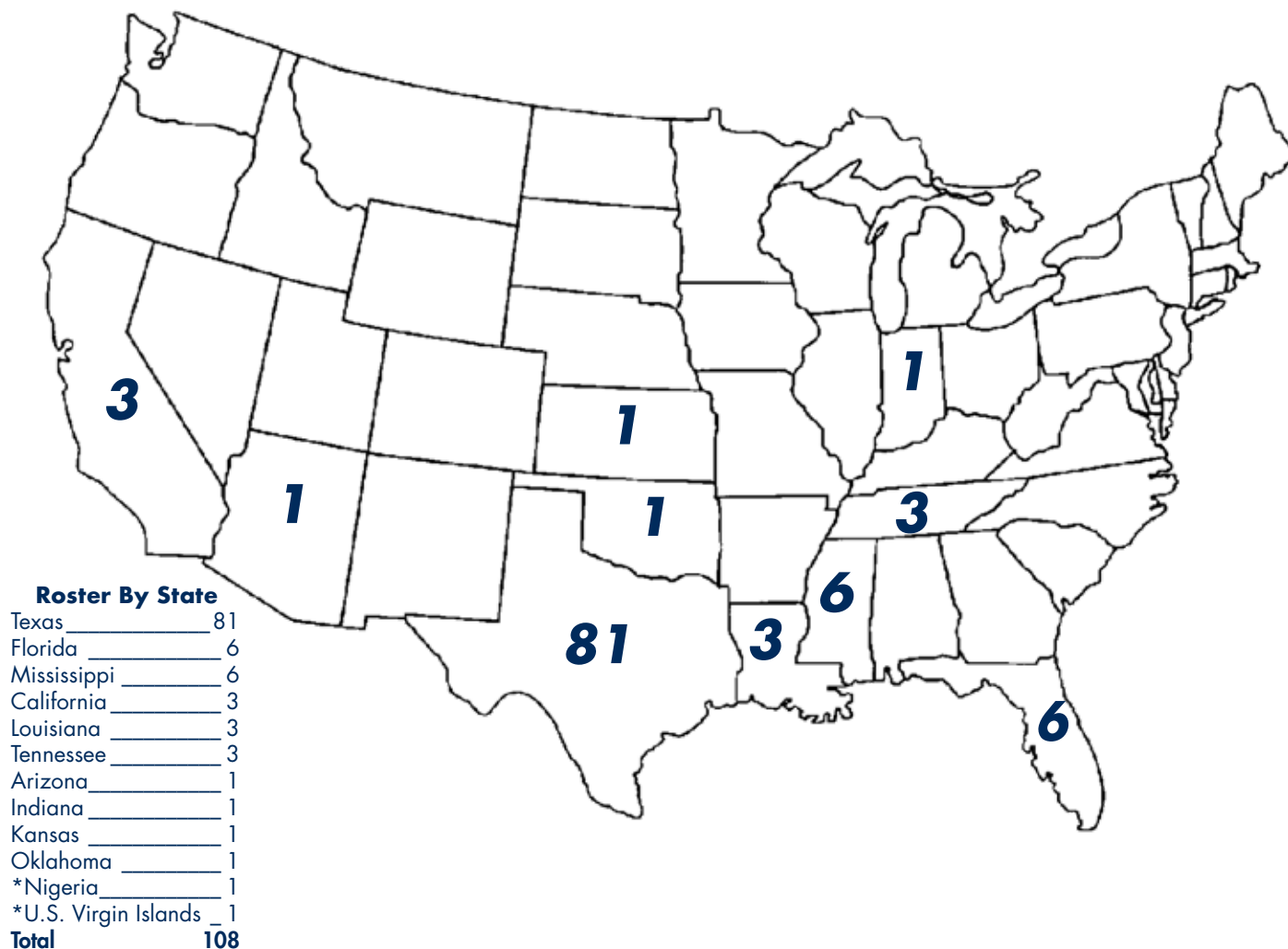
