Home Again

Last weekend, Arizona State defeated UCLA while eclipsing the seventh highest team score in program history with a 197.800. ASU is one of seven teams in the NCAA to have scored a 197.800 or better this season. Overall, 12 routines scored at least a 9.900, and 15 routines either set new or tied career highs.

A season ago at Cal, Arizona State earned their best road score since 2003 with a 196.650 and finished in second place to Berkeley. The Sun Devils' last win over the Bears came in 2020 when ASU edged out a win by .050.

Weekly Awards

Sophomore Emily White is the reigning Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week after winning the all-around with a 39.600 to help ASU upset UCLA at home. She got a career high on vault (9.925) and in the all-around, as well as season highs on bars and beam (9.900s). Her all-around total is tied for 21st in program history.

Junior Hannah Scharf is the Pac-12 Coaches Choice of the Week for her efforts in the win over the Bruins. On her birthday, she scored season highs on floor (9.925) and in the all-around (39.525), as well as matching her career highs on bars (9.900) and beam (9.900).

Oh, Canada

The team is led by junior All-American Hannah Scharf, who has done the all-around in every meet. So far this season, she has eight scores of 9.900+ and six event titles. Following the historic win over No. 15 UCLA, she earned the Pac-12 Coaches Choice of the Week.

Last season, she went to the NCAA Championships as an individual and earned Second Team All-America honors, adding to her WCGA regular season nod in the all-around. She led the team with 14 total event titles, with seven coming from the all-around. On Road to Nationals, she finished the season ranked No. 16 in the all-around. She was named to the All-Pac-12 All-Around First Team along with being an honorable mention for floor and vault.

Record-Breaking Meets

On Feb. 20, ASU beat UCLA for the first time since 2001 with the seventh-highest score in program history (197.800). The 49.525 floor score was the highest since 2004.

In the season opener at No. 1 Michigan, the Gym Devils took second with a score of 196.275, the highest season-opening team score in program history.

Strength of Schedule

Arizona State faced the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in back-to-back meets for the first time in program history. On the schedule, there are seven teams who finished the 2021 season in the top 25, with four of those teams finishing in the top 10.

Cancellations

Arizona State's first two meets of the season were canceled due to COVID-19 protocols. The meet at Michigan was the season opener for the Gym Devils.

Co-Head Coaches

After five seasons of working to build Sun Devil Gymnastics to a top-10 program alongside Jay Santos, Jessica Santos was promoted to co-head coach back in June, elevating her position from associate head coach. Since coming to Tempe in May 2016, Jess Santos has helped bring Arizona State to new heights. She and Jay have built the team from a No. 41 final ranking in 2017 to the No. 9 finish in 2021. They have coached

two All-Americans in Cairo Leonard-Baker (3x) and Hannah Scharf (2x), helping both to qualify for the NCAA Championships as individuals (Leonard-Baker in 2018, 2019 and 2021, Scharf in 2021). Jess Santos has earned three regional assistant coach of the year awards in her career: 2007 with Pittsburgh, 2016 with Eastern Michigan and 2021 with Arizona State. With the Sun Devils, she has coached bars and beam while being the recruiting coordinator.

Senior Class

There are just two seniors on the 2022 roster. Seniors Jasmine Gutierrez and Megan Thompson made an impact in the lineups as well last season. Gutierrez brought in some big scores on beam and floor, including a careerhigh 9.900 on beam at the regional finals after beginning competition halfway through last year's season. Thompson led off on beam in every meet in 2021, scoring a 9.800 or better 10 times.

Newcomers

The Gym Devils welcome two newcomers to the team for this upcoming season in freshmen Mallory Marcheli and Alex Theodorou that will bring high-level experience to Tempe. Marcheli, a Texas native, competed on some big stages in 2018 such as J.O. Nationals, U.S. Elite Classic and the American Elite Classic. Theodorou, a local gymnast, won 11 state and regional championships during her level 10 career and competed at J.O. Nationals three times. She additionally scored a perfect 10 on the vault, which she did at the 2020 Valley of the Sun Challenge.

Last Season

ASU wrapped up the 2021 season ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish for the program since 2006. On Road to Nationals, the team was ranked in the top-25 all season. They scored 196.000 or better in all but two meets during the season, including a streak of ten meets in a row reaching that mark to end the season.

The team finished fourth overall in the Pac-12 regular season standings, as well as in the Pac-12 championship. They earned the No. 11 seed in the NCAA tournament, the Gym Devils first time earning a seed, where they advanced to the regional finals for the first time. Scharf qualified for the NCAA Championships as an individual, where she placed seventh on bars to be named a Second Team All-American in that event.

197.000s, plural

Arizona State scored four team totals of 197.000-plus in 2021. The ninth-highest score in program history was a earned at the NCAA Regional Finals. This was the first season since 2004 that the Sun Devils scored above a 197.000 multiple times in the same season.

G-PAC

Junior Izzy Redmond is Arizona State's representative in Gymnasts for Peace, Action and Change (G-PAC), a student-athlete driven organization. G-PAC facilitates an environment where diversity and inclusion is both welcomed and encouraged. It strives to ignite lasting change by sharing experiences, providing others with education and outside resources, and creating an authentic safe space for fellow student-athletes. It inspires others to thrive at the edge of their comfort zone furthering the journey to true equality.

Vice President for University Athletics and Athletics Director Ray Anderson named Jay Santos the head women's gymnastics coach on May 27, 2016. In June 2021, his wife Jess was promoted to co-head coach, he and Jess becoming co-head coaches for the Gym Devils.

Jay Santos' impact has been immediate for the Gym Devils. He has led the team to postseason each season since 2018 and has coached two All-Americans (Hannah Scharf and Cairo Leonard-Baker). Both of those All-Americans also qualified for nationals an individuals, Scharf in 2021 and Leonard-Baker in 2018, 2019 and 2021. He was the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2018 and the WCGA Regional Coach of the Year in 2021.

Jay's' fifth season was historic as he led Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time. The success came off of an abbreviated 2020 season where Santos helped a young team, with seven making their collegiate debuts, reach new heights. The team went out on a high note before the caancelations began, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

Santos led the Gym Devils to a another successful season in 2019, the first since 2014 to have a winning record (11-10) in the regular season. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. They scored a 196.000 or better six times.

Santos has led ASU to arguably one of the most substantial turnarounds in recent collegiate gymnastics history after his first season as head coach in 2017. Santos' 2018 squad improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, capping the season ranked at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). Ranking in the top-20 of the national standings for 12 consecutive weeks, Arizona State made its first team NCAA regional appearance since 2014. Santos was named the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

Santos coached Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation – the highest national ranking in the history of the program. He earned NCAA Central Regional Head Coach of the Year honors.

Santos has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Ohio State. Santos also spent eight years coaching at Somersault Gymnastics Center in Stoughton, Mass., serving as the women's team director and head coach for his last four years. Santos served as a nationally-rated men's gymnastics judge from 1997-2001, working numerous college dual meets as well as Junior Olympic state and regional championships.

Santos earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration in Operations Management from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1995, and was a member of the Minutemen's gymnastics team from 1990-95. At Amherst, he was a three-time co-captain and founding member of the department's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

Jessica Santos started at ASU as the associate head coach for Sun Devil Gymnastics, being named so on May 27, 2016, joining her husband Jay Santos, who was named head coach of the Sun Devil Gymnastics program on the same day. In June 2021, Jess was promoted to co-head coach, she and Jay becoming co-head coaches for the Gym Devils.

Since joining the team, Jess has helped bring Arizona State to new heights. Her fifth season was historic as she helped Arizona State to its most successful season in 15 years in 2021, wrapping up the year ranked No. 9 on Road to Nationals, the best finish since 2006. She was named the WCGA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year. The team ended the season with an NQS of 197.088 and finished in fourth in the Pac-12 regular season standings as well as in the Pac-12 Championship, making the night session for the first time. The best team score was 197.600, which Arizona State scored in the NCAA Regional Finals for the ninth best score in program history and the best postseason score the Sun Devils have ever earned. She helped Hannah Scharf and Cairo Leonard-Baker advance to the NCAA Championships. Scharf earned Second Team All-America honors on bars at nationals, in addition to her WCGA Second Team Regular Season All-America nod in the all-around.

In her fourth season with the program, Santos helped a young team finish with a winning record (7-6-1) for the second-straight season, including a win over No. 10 Cal. Due to COVID-19 concerns, the season was cut short the week before the Pac-12 Championship, meaning NCAA regionals did not happen as well. However, the team went out on a high note, finishing ranked No. 21 on Road to Nationals, the highest ranking of the year. The four meets before the cancellations were all 196.000s or better, with a total of five team scores surpassing that number in 2020.

In 2019, the team earned the first winning record (11-10) in the regular season since 2014. The team was ranked in the top-25 on Road to Nationals all year and earned four wins over top-25 teams throughout the season. In 2018, the team improved 18 spots from their 2017 national finish of 41, finishing the season at No. 23 nationally (highest finish since 2007). All-American Cairo Leonard-Baker has qualified for nationals in each of her two seasons. In 2017, they had the best season since 2014, capping it off by scoring the best Pac-12 team total since 2004.

Santos helped coach Eastern Michigan to the 2016 Mid-American Conference Championship, the program's first-ever NCAA Regional appearance, and finished the season ranked 17th in the nation – the highest national ranking in the history of the program. She has also coached at the University of Illinois-Champaign, Iowa State and Pittsburgh.


