@SunDevilMTennis Welcomes Wildcats on Senior Day

OJAI, Calif. – In their first postseason appearance since being cut as a program in 2008, Sun Devil men's tennis looks to take California by storm this weekend as the No. 6 seed at the 2018 Pac-12 Championships.

"We're happy that in our first year with the program we're competitive, and our seeding is a representation of that," coach Matt Hill said. "We're excited that we've been extremely competitive in the conference against all of those schools, and it's exciting to get ready for the weekend."

After a 4-0 sweep of in-state rival Arizona, the Sun Devils carry serious momentum headed into Ojai for the four-day event beginning Wednesday. ASU easily glided past the Wildcats last Saturday, taking the doubles point with two-straight wins on courts two and three followed by singles wins from Michaël Geerts, Makey Rakotomalala and Benjamin Hannestad to secure the victory.

The win marked the 14th on the season for the Devils, with ASU taking nine victories in their last 15 matchups. The 14-win mark is a highlight that the program has reached only four times since 1992: 14 this season, 15 in 2008, 16 in 1999 and 14 in 1995.

As the No. 6 seed, the Sun Devils face off No. 3 seed USC at 6 p.m. on Thursday, whom ASU took on just two weeks ago in Tempe. The Trojans swept the doubles point with wins on courts one and two, leaving the tandem of Hannestad/William Kirkman to go unfinished holding a 5-2 lead.

"We just played them recently and it was a really competitive match, and we're excited for it, and we're excited for the challenge," Hill said. "We like the draw that we have and we're excited to go to war on Thursday."

Hannestad came out firing in singles play, representing the only point scored by the Sun Devils in the 4-1 loss. The Dane notched a win over No. 84 Daniel Cuckierman in straight sets, 6-4 6-4, while Geerts went unfinished for the first time this spring holding a 4-6, 7-5, 2-1 lead over No. 13 Brandon Holt.

"Obviously, [Michaël] Geerts has been playing exceptionally well, and Benjamin [Hannestad] is getting back to his normal form and that's been really exciting for us," Hill said. "We really feel like all nine spots we're putting out there - the three doubles and the six singles - feel confident in each position and that they have a great chance to win when we step out against anybody."

The Trojans look to defend their 2017 Pac-12 title in Ojai again this year, as they defeated the No. 1 seeded UCLA for their third conference championship in the past five years. Holding a 15-7 record this spring, the Trojans have played some of the toughest opponents in the nation in No. 1 Wake Forest, No. 3 Ohio State, No. 17 Oklahoma State and No. 18 Georgia.

First serve for Thursday's matchup is set for 6 p.m. at Libby Park in Ojai, Calif. Fans can follow the action all week long by following @SunDevilMTennis on Twitter.

Team Notes

Rankings Are Here, Rankings Are Here!

ITA released its newest team ranking on April 24, and the Devils remain in the poll at at No. 36, down from No. 34 last week. The Devils have six wins in their last 10, and picked up two wins over No. 41 Oregon and Washington for a perfect final road trip.

ASU roared into conference play with an eight-game win streak, but were halted by two of the top-ranked teams in the country in No. 2 Stanford and No. 4 Ohio State. The Devils created serious momentum heading into the tournament by sweeping in-state rival Arizona, 4-0.

Oracle/IT(YAY)

ITA released its ninth singles poll of the season on April 24, and the usual suspects found themselves on the list. No. 20 Michael Geerts and No. 84 Benjamin Hannestad remained on the list after ranking 20 and 76, respectively, in the last poll. Both were ranked in the preseason poll and never fell out.

Geerts' second-consecutive No. 20 ranking makes him the highest-ranked Sun Devil since Sargis Sargisian in 1995, who finished the season ranked No. 1 after a NCAA Singles National Championship.

Playing solid doubles all season long, two of three Devils duos also earned a spot in the rankings this week: Andrea Bolla/Makey Rakotomalala and Michael Geerts/Tim Ruehl. Bolla/Rakotomalala earned a season-high No. 45 spot last week, but dropped to No. 48 after a win against Arizona. Geerts/Ruehl broke the list for the first time list season at No. 88.

Bring It On

ASU played one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation in its comeback season, and that is something first-year mentor Matt Hill plans on making a tradition.

The Sun Devils faced back-to-back Big Ten champion Ohio State and began its season hosting No. 29 Duke, back-to-back Big 12 champion No. 7 TCU and back-to-back SEC champion No. 5 Texas A&M. Ohio State who has won the Big Ten title eight times, including a title this season.

Mr. Worldwide(s)

With just one Devil from the United States, the men's tennis team is one of the most diverse teams within ASU Athletics. Every single Devil represents a different nation, as the nine men hail from nine different countries across the world: Italy, Belgium, Denmark, Switzerland, the Dominican Republic, France, Germany, the U.S. and Great Britain.

Thomas Wright, Will Kirkman, Benjamin Hannestad, Michael Geerts and Makey Rakotomalala arrived at Arizona State for the Spring 2017 semester, taking classes and practicing as a team before the team would officially become a program the following spring. The remaining four were all incoming freshman this fall, joining the team in August.

Up Hill Battle

Coach Matt Hill is no stranger to adversity. Upon taking the helm at South Florida in 2012, the Bulls hadn't been to the NCAA Division I Championship since 2009. Hill's team finished 8-14 in his first season, but the tide quickly changed under his mentorship, as they compiled a 12-10 record the following year and then found themselves in the Championship for the first time in five years the next season. team made it to the second round and were eliminated by Florida, but Hill's team made the tournament the next two years as well, finishing as high as the Sweet 16 in 2015.

USF were back-to-back-to-back AAC Champions in Hill's final three years in Tampa, compiling a 82-47 record. He was a three-time American Conference Coach of the Year and mentored a three-time American Athletic Conference Player of the Year in Roberto Cid.

Southwest Regional Champions

The doubles pair of Benjamin Hannestad and Tim Ruehl won the 2017 ITA Southwest Regional Championship in the fall, and then Hannestad decided he wanted more and took home the singles title. Held at both Malibu's Ralphs-Straus Tennis Center and the Crest Tennis Courts and hosted by Pepperdine, Hannestad and Ruehl defeated Pedro Iamachkine and Lautaro Pane of Pepperdine 6-4, 6-3 to earn the doubles title, and then Hannestad closed the deal with a 6-4, 3-6, 6-4 win over Nicolas Moreno de Alboran of UCSB.

USC and UCLA had dominated the tournament in the past, winning every singles titles since 2009 and five doubles championships. Hannestad defeated three Pac-12 competitors on the way to his singles title.

Bolla, Shot Caller

Andrea Bolla is on fire as of late. The Italian has six victories in his last 10 matchups, snapping a six-game win streak in Salt Lake City two weeks ago. He has also clinched three victories for the Devils with his singles wins.

He and doubles partner Makey Rakotomalala have also found success as a tandem, reclaiming a place on the Oracle/ITA rankings at No. 48. The two debuted as a pair at Pepperdine with a 6-2 victory and haven't slowed down much since, notching six victories and just four losses.

The tandem had a huge victory against No. 2 Stanford, handing the 27th-ranked tandem of Axel Geller/Tom Fawcett an easy 6-2 loss to even the advantage and put Geerts/Ruehl in perfect position to eventually clinch the doubles point. Bolla. Rakotomalala came up big this past weekend as well, handing No. 11 Jack Jaede/Laurens Verboven of UCLA to put ASU in prime position to clinch the doubles point, which Geerts/Ruehl eventually clinched with a victory on court one.

Geerts the Dub

Senior Michaël Geerts has continued his tear since hitting the collegiate scene, racking up two Pac-12 Players of the Week honors so far this season. The Belgian notched a win over the No. 1 player in the country in Martin Redlicki of UCLA in his last outing, taking straight sets en route to the victory. With the win, Geerts now has wins over the top two players in the country, upsetting No. 2 Mikael Torpegaard of Ohio State in the Blue Gray Tennis Classic last month. He is one of three players in the country to have two wins over top-5 ranked players.

Geerts is 14-6 on court one for the Devils, and 2-1 in three-set matches. The senior has been a consistent cog in the Devils' success, stepping up to claim five wins against ranked opponents this year.

Head Coach Matt Hill



Before arriving at ASU, Hill spent the previous four seasons as the head coach of the University of South Florida, leading the Bulls to three consecutive AAC team championships and a No. 17 final ranking among Division I programs this past season. USF advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season in 2016 after qualifying just twice in 10 previous campaigns prior to Hill's arrival.

Prior to his time at South Florida, Hill had two successful stops at a pair of nationally ranked SEC programs in Mississippi State and Alabama. Hill will be the Sun Devil program's first head coach since Lou Belken led the program from 1983 through 2008.

The 2016 Bulls reached a program-best ranking of No. 13 in the nation before finishing in the Top 20 at No. 17. Hill coached two-time All-American Roberto Cid to a ranking of No. 2 in the nation, the best ranking of any tennis player, men's or women's, in program history. USF also played one of the toughest schedules, notching 16 wins over ranked opponents and playing just four matches against unranked foes.

In 2015, Hill guided the Bulls to their best finish as USF advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA tournament after winning their second-straight conference championship while Oliver Pramming earned Most Outstanding Player honors.

The Bulls won the inaugural American Athletic Conference tournament in 2014 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Hill coached Cid to the first-ever All-America honor in USF history as he made an impressive run in the NCAA singles tournament.

An accomplished recruiter, Hill took over the USF program and immediately brought in five players in his first recruiting class that were either ranked among the top 100 juniors in the world or had already earned professional ATP points. His 2013 and 2016 recruiting classes were both ranked in

the top 10 in the nation.

Additionally, Hill oversaw the start of a capital fundraising campaign geared toward a \$3 million renovation of the tennis facility and personally helped secure over half a million dollars toward that goal.

During Hill's five years as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, he helped the Bulldogs improve from a No. 58 ranking in 2008 and a No. 72 ranking in 2009 to top 20 finishes in his final two seasons, including a No. 11 final ranking in 2012 – the program's best finish since 1998. The Bulldogs posted the program's best record (20-7) since that same 1998 squad went 21-5.

MSU earned a No. 20 final ranking in 2011 after producing a 14-9 record, while winning the SEC Western Division title with an 8-3 mark. Hill was instrumental in helping five Bulldogs to All-SEC honors, while supporting Per Nilsson to SEC Coach of the Year honors. He was recognized for his efforts by being named ITA Southern Region Assistant Coach of the Year and SEC Assistant Coach of the Year.

Hill's recruiting prowess shined with the Bulldogs as he served as the team's recruiting coordinator, bringing in seven players that were either ranked in the top 100 among the world's juniors or became ranked in the top 125 players in the country upon arriving at Mississippi State. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked 13th in the nation.

While at MSU, Hill and the Bulldog staff had one of just three programs with five singles players ranked in the Top-75 nationally while his efforts in promoting the team helped grow the fan base by over 600 percent with the Bulldogs ranked in the top 5 nationally in average attendance during the 2009 and 2011 seasons.

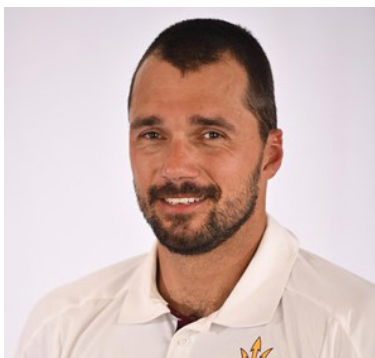
Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Hill served as a volunteer assistant coach at Alabama for two seasons. He helped the Crimson Tide improve from a No. 56 final ranking the season before he joined the staff to a No. 14 ranking in 2007, his second year with the program. Hill helped coach five nationally ranked players and helped Alabama reach two NCAA Tournaments during his stint, including a trip to the round of 16 in 2007.

A native of Holt, Mich., Hill earned a degree in business marketing with a specialization in professional tennis management from Ferris State University in 2005 and a master's degree in human performance from Alabama in 2007. Also a member of the tennis team while at Ferris State, Hill helped lead the Bulldogs to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals for the first time in school history.

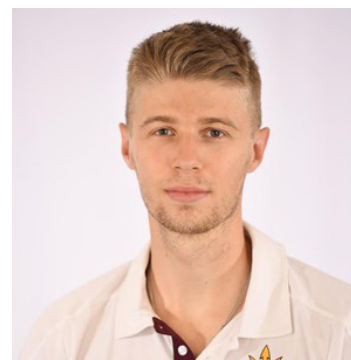
Kokta joined Matt Hill's staff after a two-year stint at Purdue where he was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers improve their record from 4-20 to 17-10 in the span of a year.

Prior to his appointment at Purdue Kokta was at Baylor where he served as volunteer coach at his alma mater for three seasons. During his three seasons, Baylor captured a pair of Big 12 Conference regular season titles and won the Big 12 Championship in 2014. The Bears advanced to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships in 2012 and 2013, followed by a quarterfinal appearance in 2014.

Prior to his collegiate career Kokta was ranked as high as No. 8 in singles and #3 in doubles in the ITF's juniors rankings. He reached the semifinals of the Australian Open juniors in singles, the semifinals of Wimbledon juniors in doubles, and was the European junior doubles champion. After juniors, Kokta was ranked as high as #356 ATP in singles and #480 in doubles.



Dom Cotrone is a volunteer assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and former USF tennis standout. The Bradenton, Fla. native played under Coach Hill from 2012-16. Cotrone became the second All-American in USF history, advancing to the round of 16 at the NCAA singles tournament during his senior season while posting a 13-7 singles record.



Jan Meyer is a graduate student assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and former Azusa Pacific University tennis standout. The Heiligenhaus, Germany native entered his season as the No. 1 player in the nation. Meyer was the 2015 PacWest Player of the Year and was also earned ITA All-American status as both a singles and doubles player and was a CoSIDA Academic All-American.
