DROPPING THE PUCK ON 2025-26

The puck drops on the 2025-26 season for the No. 14 Arizona State ice hockey team this weekend as the Sun Devils take on No. 5 Penn State on Oct. 3-4. The top-15 matchup is set for 7 p.m. MST on Friday and 5 p.m. MST on Saturday at Mullett Arena. Both games will air live nationally on NHL Network, locally on FOX 10 and stream live on NCHC.tv.

Coming off a storybook season in its first year of conference play after previously being independent, ASU continues to put the college hockey world on notice. In 2024, the Sun Devils were ranked eighth in the NCHC preseason media polls and tied for 20th in the NCAA. After a 21-14-2 season and second place finish in league standings, ASU enters 2025-26 ranked 14th in the nation and top four in the NCHC preseason polls including two votes to finish atop the conference.

The ranked showdown in the desert is a battle between two programs that both have their history rooted in the collegiate club hockey ranks. Penn State's program turned Division I in 2013-14 followed by ASU two years later in anticipation of the 2015-16 season. Last season, Penn State reached the Frozen Four before falling to Boston University, 3-1, in the semifinals.

HOW TO TUNE IN

ASU's own Tyler Paley and Alex Coil will bring the game to the airwaves on a national stage on NHL Network, in addition to locally on FOX10 and FOX10-KUTP. Both games also stream on NCHC.tv for a subscription fee. Listen to Alex and Tyler on the radio with Sun Devil Hockey's radio partner, FoxSports910AM.

JOEY DACCORD'S JERSEY RETIREMENT

Sun Devil Hockey will retire Joey Daccord's No. 35 jersey to honor his storied career in maroon and gold during its home opener. Sun Devil Athletics will celebrate Daccord with a pregame ceremony and banner unveiling before taking on Penn State for the first game of the 2025-26 season. Daccord will attend Friday night's ceremony and game against the Nittany Lions.

Daccord spent three seasons in the desert representing the Sun Devils from 2016 to 2019. He played 82 total games and finished his final season as a Sun Devil with a 21-13-1 record, .926 save percentage and 2.35 goals against average. In his final season with ASU, he backstopped the Sun Devils to their first NCAA Tournament appearance. Daccord owns school records for goalie appearances, starts, saves and shutouts. He graduated from ASU in 2020 with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration.

Drafted 199th overall in the 2015 NHL Draft by the Ottawa Senators, Daccord became the first ASU player to sign an NHL entry-level contract and the first to play in an NHL game in program history. Entering his seventh season in the NHL and fifth year as a member of the Seattle Kraken, Daccord has a career save percentage of .906 and a 2.76 goals against average in The Show.

SUN DEVIL NOTES

HISTORY VS. PENN STATE

The Sun Devils have taken on the Nittany Lions eight times dating back to the 2016-17 season. ASU has been on the road for three of the four series holding a 1-7 record in that span. The state schools faced off most recently in December of the 2020 season where both matchups pushed to overtime to determine a winner. The Sun Devils' lone victory also came in overtime in the 2018-19 season as Johnny Walker's game-winning goal handed the then-No. 6 Nittany Lions their first loss of the season.

NCHC'S TOP RETURNING SCORER

Heading into his senior year, forward Bennett Schimek looks to build on his career-best season after transferring to ASU in 2024. He is the NCHC's highest point scoring player returning to college for 2025-26. The Minnesota native finished his junior year campaign doubling his point totals from his first two collegiate seasons at Providence ending with 15 goals and 22 assists in 35 games. Schimek was also top 10 in points in the NCHC with 37 and top 10 in goals with 15 on the year.

IN THE CREASE

Connor Hasley transferred to ASU in the summer of 2025 from Bentley University. The senior goaltender spent three seasons with the Falcons boasting a .925 save percentage and 1.96 goals against average complete with a 21-13-2 record last year. Hasley also posted 11 shutouts with three of which coming in the postseason and made 41 saves against Boston College in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. He's backed by Samuel Urban who arises from juniors after three seasons with the Sioux City Musketeers. The Slovakian freshman appeared in 40 games in the 2024-25 season with a 22-15-1 record, 2.96 goals against average and .899 save percentage.

DEVILS AT THE NHL DRAFT

made program history on opening night of the 2025 NHL Draft when selected 32nd overall by the Calgary Flames. He became the hockey program's highest draft pick and first NHL first-rounder in school history. Potter going in the first round of the draft means ASU produced first-round picks in MLB, NBA, NFL, WNBA, and NHL drafts. The Minnesota native excelled in his rookie season in maroon and gold, tallying 13 goals and nine assists for 22 total points in 35 games played. He finished fourth on the team in goals and eighth in points. His 13 goals was second among NCHC rookies. His 81 shots on goal led rookies in NCHC action, while he helped ASU finish in second place in its inaugural NCHC season. He earned NCHC All-Rookie Team honors after compiling 15 points in 22 conference games, with his nine goals third among freshmen. The next day at the draft, incoming freshman Ben Kevan was selected by the New Jersey Devils in the second round (63rd overall).

PRO TURNED DEVIL

Jack Beck spent the last season playing 40 professional games between the American Hockey League (AHL) and ECHL and joined the Sun Devils in late September after the NCAA ruled on his eligibility. Beck was drafted 168th overall (6th round) of the 2021 NHL Entry Draft by the Calgary Flames. He has since waived his draft rights and is a free agent. The 22-year-old left-handed winger joins ASU after a point-per-game performance in his first year of professional hockey. According to the NCAA Eligibility Center, Beck will have three seasons of eligibility to play in five years. As part of the NCAA's delayed enrollment rules, Beck is not eligible to compete in the first six games of the 2025-26 season. Beck lost one season of eligibility as a penalty under the NCAA delayed enrollment rules. If an athlete plays seven or more games in another league once delayed enrollment has begun, one season of eligibility is removed. The games played by Beck in the AHL and ECHL, dating from his 21st birthday on April 12, 2024, through April 11, 2025, cost Jack a season of eligibility. The six-game suspension for 2025-26 comes into play to address the six games played by Beck from April 12, 2025 (his 22nd birthday) through his initial enrollment at Arizona State University in September 2025.

CHL PIPELINE

Before the CHL rule change was a sure thing, Braxton Whitehead (Regina Pats) and the Sun Devils were the first to take a risk and make an official move, shaking up the hockey world in anticipation of the results from the a class action lawsuit, Rylan Masterson v. NCAA, which accused the NCAA of illegally preventing Canadian Hockey League (CHL) players from competing for American university teams. "I've always thought that rule was antiquated in so many ways," said Sun Devil Hockey Head Coach Greg Powers. "With Braxton, I simply believed in getting ahead of the curve by handicapping the situation. Change was coming, and it felt right. It's going to make college hockey so much better."

ASU now boasts seven players who competed previously in the CHL including Sean McGurn (London, OHL), Austin Zemlak (Tri-City, WHL), Ty Nash (Edmonton, WHL), Justin Cloutier (Soo, OHL), Sam Alfano (Erie, OHL), and Whitehead (Regina, WHL). Before turning pro and competing in the ECHL and AHL, Jack Beck played for the Soo Greyhounds (OHL).

HEAD COACH GREG POWERS

Coach Powers enters his 18th overall season on the Sun Devil Coaching Staff and his 11th as head coach of ASU's NCAA Division I Hockey program. Under his leadership, the 2024-25 season marked a significant milestone as ASU competed its inaugural year as members of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference (NCHC). He was a finalist for the 2019 and 2020 Spencer Penrose Award, which is awarded to the Division I Coach of the Year. Coach Powers was also named the 2018-19 Frank Kush Sun Devil Coach of the Year, as voted on by the 26 head coaches at Arizona State. The Sun Devils concluded the 2024-25 season with a 21-14-2 overall record and a 14-9-1 mark and second place finish in conference play. Powers' players shined in NCHC play, including Shlaine who won the conference's Three Stars Award and First Team All-Conference honors. Shlaine went on to become only the second Sun Devil in program history to earn CCM/AHCA All-America honors (Second Team West). He joins the ranks with Sun Devil alum Joey Daccord who was named an AHCA All-American in 2019. Four-year Sun Devil Ty Murchison won the NCHC's Defensive Defenseman of the Year after a stellar season at the blue line which included a program record 98 blocks in a single season. Noah Beck and Lukas Sillinger were named to the NCHC Second Team All-Conference, Ryan Kirwan was added to the Third Team All Conference and Cullen Potter landed on the All Rookie Team. In 2023-24, Powers led the Sun Devils to a program record 24 wins on the season. Matthew Kopperud finished as an NCAA statistical leader with 17 power play goals. A true Sun Devil coached by Powers all four years of his NCAA career, Kopperud completed his time at ASU as the fourth-best career power play scorer in NCAA history with 41 through his four years in college. Lukas Sillinger also topped the charts in 2023-24 as he set the ASU program record in single season points (48). In the final year of Oceanside Arena, Powers coached ASU to five-straight wins versus USCHO.com Top-20 opponents for the first time in program history (the previous record for consecutive wins against ranked opponents was three-straight games). In 2021-22, the team boasted three of the top-10 scorers in the nation in Colin Theisen, Matthew Kopperud and Josh Doan. ASU scored 116 goals in 35 games for a 3.31 goals per game average, ranked No. 10 in the country. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in 2009. BEST FRIENDS REUNITED

Growing up in Minnesota, Bennett Schimek and Cruz Lucius played hockey together as children and continued to be on the same team through the 2019-20 season. In 2020-21, Schimek went to the USHL's Sioux City Musketeers and Lucius moved onto the USNTDP Juniors. In 2022-23, they both started their collegiate careers - Schimek with Providence and Lucius with Wisconsin. Each did two years with their programs before entering the transfer portal. When the opportunity arose for the duo to reconnect in this next phase of their NCAA careers, they jumped at it.

Lucius was injured to start the 2024-25 season and the pair finally played their first game together on Jan. 10, 2025 in Lucius' debut in maroon and gold vs. North Dakota. The wingers were paired with rookie center Cullen Potter.

"It was special. It was something that we've dreamed about since we were little so it's cool to finally see it happen and get the chance to play with him," said Schimek.

CANCER SURVIVOR

At age 15, Tony was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma, a type of cancer that affects the lymphatic system.

When Achille was diagnosed, his life turned upside down. His daily routine was interrupted, and he had to step away, competitively, from the sport he loved the most.

"I had a big lump on the side of my neck," Achille said. "My family and I went to a bunch of doctors, and they all thought it was a swollen lymph node. But the lump stayed on my neck. I went into surgery, and I got the lump removed. About two or three days later, my parents got a phone call."

"[It's] not the phone call that anyone wants to receive. Doctors told them that I had Hodgkin's Lymphoma."

Achille, following his diagnosis, underwent chemotherapy for several months. Keeping busy is what kept Achille sane. His love for hockey persisted throughout his entire journey with the disease. Even though he didn't skate competitively for two years, he skated sparingly on an ice rink near his house. This ice rink was owned by the father of his best friend, Tim Lovell.

Having a strong support system has been a primary motivator for Achille to give back. During quarantine, he and his family found-

ed Mission 16, a website designed to sell merchandise. This merchandise consisted of sweatshirts, t-shirts, and other apparel with the number 16, which is the number Achille used to wear in competition. His family raised over two thousand dollars, and all profits were donated to the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in Boston, Massachusetts, where Achille underwent his treatment.

"There's always someone in a worse position than you," Achille said. "Going into the hospital every week made me realize that, especially seeing the young kids that were going through the same thing. They were honestly the happiest kids I've ever seen... You couldn't break their spirit."

FOLLOWING MOM'S FOOTSTEPS

The story is tried and true in hockey - a player grew up watching his dad play hockey and wanted to follow in his footsteps. ASU freshman center Cullen Potter puts a refreshing spin on the hockey legacy story. His mom, Jenny Potter, is a 14-time medalist on the international hockey stage whose U.S. Women's National Team career spanned 15 seasons. She is one of the most decorated players in the history of women's ice hockey in the United States. Highlighting her career were four appearances in the Olympic Winter Games, including helping Team USA to a gold medal at the 1998 Games in Nagano, Japan. She is one of only three U.S. women's players to compete in four Olympics. Further, her 32 career points (11G, 21A) in Olympic competition are tops in U.S. history and second in the overall Olympic record books. Potter, who also participated in 10 Three/Four Nations Cups during her time with the U.S. Women's National Team, finished her career with 237 points (101G, 136A) in 204 games played. The mastery she displayed on the international stage transitioned with ease from her prolific collegiate career, which included recognition as an All-American in each of her four campaigns. Potter played one season with the University of Minnesota (1998-99) before finishing her final three years with the University of Minnesota Duluth (1999-00/2002-04).

INNOVATION ON ICE

No. 1 in innovation. Returning ASU students and alums are familiar with how deeply this mantra is ingrained in the university's identity — but it's not just a mantra. It's a lifelong commitment to excellence and delivering solutions that meaningfully impact everyday life.

Sun Devil Hockey and incoming freshman Braxton Whitehead are the epitome of ASU's proudest statement in the athletic world.

Thanks to a new and complicated rule change within the NCAA, Braxton was the first to take advantage of a rule change that will alter the college hockey landscape for years. In 2024, a class action lawsuit, Rylan Masterson v. NCAA, accused the NCAA of illegally preventing Canadian Hockey League (CHL) players from competing for American university teams. But before the rule change was a sure thing, Braxton and the Sun Devils were the first to take a risk and make an official move, shaking up the hockey world and going viral in the process.

"I've always thought that rule was antiquated in so many ways," said Sun Devil Hockey Head Coach Greg Powers. "With Braxton, I simply believed in getting ahead of the curve by handicapping the situation. Change was coming, and it felt right. It's going to make college hockey so much better."

Growing up in Alaska, Braxton fell in love with hockey. Growing up, he played on various travel teams that went to several places in Canada. However, "Arizona was always the most fun place to go to tournaments," his mother Alyson remembered fondly.

By the time Braxton was 16 years old, he had caught the attention of - and made - the CHL's Regina Pats, a longstanding program known for producing several NHL players, including current Chicago Blackhawks superstar Connor Bedard (Braxton's former teammate), the Seattle Kraken's Jordan Eberle, and legendary Hall of Famers like Al Macinnis.

As a family, the Whiteheads believed that after Braxton's time with the Pats, his options would be to play for a college in Canada or try out for a minor league team in the ECHL or AHL.

Luckily, the lawsuit shakeup began during Braxton's fifth year with the Pats, and things progressed quickly.

The phones started ringing. Different schools were calling, and hypotheticals were being asked. "What will you do if this happens?" and "Where could you go if that happens?" became the hot topic of family conversation.

"This is amazing. We never thought this would be part of the plan, but we had to pump the brakes," Alyson recalled. "We had to ask Braxton, 'Where do YOU want to go?'"

It wasn't a tricky question.

"It didn't take him four seconds before he said, 'If I could be anywhere, I want to be at ASU.'"

SUN DEVILS IN THE NHL



#35 Joey Daccord
Goaltender
Played at ASU: 2016-19



Daccord played at ASU from 2016-2019 before becoming the first Arizona State player to sign an NHL entry-level contract on April 1, 2019, and the first to play in an NHL game against the Buffalo Sabres on April 4, 2019. He was selected in the seventh round, 199th overall, of the 2015 NHL Entry Draft by the Ottawa Senators, becoming the first drafted Sun Devil to not play anywhere collegiately but Arizona State.

The Boston native appeared in eight games for the Senators, notching a .897 save percentage. He recorded his first NHL win against the Toronto Maple Leafs on March 14, 2021.

On July 21, 2021, Daccord was selected by the Seattle Kraken in the National Hockey League's Expansion Draft. The goaltender joins the newest and 32nd NHL team after three seasons with the Ottawa Senators organization.

Daccord played five games in the 2021-22 season with the Kraken and spent time in the AHL with Coachella. The following season, Daccord primarily played with Coachella and led the team to the Calder Cup Playoff Finals against the Hershey Bears.

The 2023-24 season with the Seattle Kraken saw Daccord finish with several career highs en route to going 19-18-11 with a 2.46 goals/against average and a .916 save percentage. The netminder had a career year setting new NHL highs in games played, games started (46), wins, SV%, GAA, saves (1,258) and shutouts (3). He also set new franchise records for SV% and GAA for Kraken goalies who played in at least three games in a season as well as total saves in a single win (42). His three shutouts also tied the franchise record for most in a single season since Martin Jones' three in 2022-23.

On Jan. 1, 2024, he blanked the Vegas Golden Knights stopping 35 shots in a 3-0 win at the 2024 NHL Winter Classic at T-Mobile Park, recording the first shutout in Winter Classic history.

In October 2024, the Kraken signed Daccord to a five-year contract extension (\$5 million AAV) set to begin in the 2025-26 season.

In his three seasons at ASU, Daccord etched himself in the program's record books and exemplified the team's #BeTheTradition motto. He stood between the pipes in ASU's first ever NCAA tournament appearance in 2018-19 and was a finalist for the Mike Richter Award. Despite making his NHL debut after his junior year, Daccord still owns ASU's most wins in program history at 34.

In 2018-19, Daccord set program records, including starting all 35 games for the Sun Devils at 21-13-1. He ranked among the top goaltenders in all stat lines, including NCAA-leading seven shutouts during the regular season, and finishing with a .926 save percentage and 2.35 goals against average.

He finished his collegiate career with a 32-40-7 record, .913 save percentage and 3.07 goals against average.



#91 Josh Doan
Forward
Played at ASU: 2021-23

Josh Doan was drafted in the 2021 NHL Entry Draft on July 24, 2021 by the Arizona Coyotes, the same club his father Shane Doan played for and captained for 20 years (1996-2017). Doan completed two seasons (2021-23) at ASU and then signed a three-year, entry-level contract with the Arizona Coyotes in Spring 2023.

He spent the remaining 14 games of the 2022-23 season with AHL's Roadrunners and almost the entirety of the 2023-24 campaign in Tucson before being called up to the Coyotes for their last 11 games. While with the Roadrunners, Doan recorded 29 goals and 23 assists.

Doan debuted in the League near the end of last season, finishing with nine points (five goals, four assists) in 11 games. That included two goals in a 6-2 win against the Columbus Blue Jackets in his first game on March 26.

Following his debut, Doan moved to the NHL's Utah Hockey Club upon the acquisition of the Arizona Coyotes' players, coaching staff, and draft picks to Ryan and Ashley Smith's expansion team in Salt Lake City.

In Summer 2025, he was traded to the Buffalo Sabres.

The Scottsdale native played with the Sun Devils for two seasons, including the last year of Oceanside Ice Arena and the first of Mullett Arena. In Mullett Magic fashion, Doan scored the first-ever goal in Mullett Arena on Oct. 14, 2022, against Colgate. In his sophomore year, he was named the team's 12th captain in program history. He played in all possible 39 games in 2022-23, tallying 38 points and leading the team in goals with 16.

During his rookie season, Doan set a new ASU single season record for total points scored by a freshman with 37 (12G, 25A). His 25 apples also set a new single season record for assists by a freshman. He was named a Tim Taylor Rookie of the Year finalist.
